June marks the beginning of summer in the northern hemisphere with warmer temperatures, longer days and Wimbledon. This year the tournament begins on June 29th, a week later to allow players a three week rest period after the French Open. It is amazing how many people pick up a racquet during or after Wimbledon. I did for a while but my coordination leaves much to be desired when it comes to hitting a ball. In the Diocese of St Albans covering Bedfordshire, Hertfordshire and a bit of Buckinghamshire we celebrate St Alban, the first Christian martyr, on June 22nd although the street celebration in St Albans this year will be on the 20th. This coincides with a 3 day visit by the Archbishop of Canterbury. Looking at the programme for his visit he'll not have much time to rest. I will get to meet him having arranged his visit to Shuttleworth College where he will meet a number of people involved in rural life from all over the Diocese.

Talking of rural life I've decided this year to turn the large grassy area, more moss than grass, in the vicarage garden into a meadow. Intensive farming, the use of land for building, a desire to grow exotic plants and treat nature's own as weeds has seen a decline in wildflowers and other plants we might at one time have called weeds. Looking out of my office window the meadow looks beautiful. Cowslips, cow parsley, bluebells, daisies, daffodils, dandelions, cuckoo flower and the beautiful pale blue rosemary flowers that edge the drive are all glorious. There are others I have not yet identified along with a few primroses still in flower and lots of different types of grass. The late winter early spring snowdrops were also amazing.

One of the benefits of my new approach to the vicarage garden is the increased bird life. Putting aside the wood pigeons I have also seen, robins, sparrows, wrens, thrush, blackbirds, blue tits, woodpecker (not green) and a chaffinch. There are others I'm sure and I do hear an owl somewhere in the surrounding area.

If you like meadows and are passing do drop in and have a look. The meadow will have to be maintained and I am currently researching ways and means. For me it's all about the glory of creation and giving nature a chance to thrive.





Would you like to Have a Say in the Future of our Village?

Eaton Bray Neighbourhood Plan

Eaton Bray Parish Council are considering the need to draw up a Neighbourhood Plan document to set out the Village's wishes in terms of infrastructure, facilities and future development.

The Government and Central Bedfordshire are encouraging parishes to set out Neighbourhood Plans that demonstrate how communities would like to improve the villages and their surroundings in the future. It will also help provide some protection to this village when it comes to unwanted over-development and support the need for infrastructure improvements. What is a Neighbourhood Plan? Put simply, it is a document that describes the desired plans for a village over a 5-10 year period and contains the areas that village residents feel are important and specifies what the majority wants.

It covers topics such as housing and development, schooling and amenities, environmental protection, transport and highways, to name but a few.

The document is something that would require a great deal of consultation with everyone in the village, planning and work to bring it all together. The challenge, once the village has agreed its content, is then to have CBC approve it. Once approved, it means that it provides some protection against the things we don't want in the village and support towards getting the things we do.

It is worth noting that the Plan is not something that is a clandestine way to get property building through and overdevelop the village or to try and pass unwanted schemes in the village without consultation. Quite the opposite.

We think the best approach is to first see if having a plan for the village is something that we, as a village, all want. There are a lot of positive reasons for having a Plan, most notably protection from Government schemes being imposed upon us without our consent, along with finding out what ideas residents have for the village.

What happens now? We would like to hear from everyone in the village to see if everyone thinks it's a good idea to have a Neighbourhood Plan. Once we have consulted the village, it will indicate whether this is something that we should then action, setting up a working group to manage the project and starting the next stage of actual consultation.

Should you feel that, like our other neighbouring villages, we too should have a Neighbourhood Plan, we'd like to hear from you. Equally, we'd also like to know why you think we should not have one.

Knowing Your Consumer Rights

Jonathan Vernon Smith is the Sony Award winning mid-morning show presenter for BBC Three Counties Radio. During his consumer hour he helps listeners with their consumer

problems and now shares his advice with you.

I am becoming increasingly fed up with dealing with retailers right across Beds, Herts, Bucks and beyond who either don't familiarise themselves with consumer law, or who deliberately attempt to pull the wool over their customer's eyes. That makes it so important that we all understand the law as consumers. That way, when a retailer talks rubbish, we spot it straight away.

I thought this month I would take the opportunity to explain 'Statutory Rights'. You may have seen on a receipt or contract 'This does not affect your statutory rights'. This means that anything the retailer has offered you (in terms of returns policy etc) does not change the things you're entitled to by law.

When you purchase any brand new goods or services in the UK you are protected by your 'statutory rights' (sale of goods act 1979).

All goods must be:

- 1. Fit for purpose
- Of 'reasonable' quality (based on the cost)
- 3. Last for a reasonable amount of time (based on the cost)

Therefore, if you buy (for example) a fridge for £300, it should last for a 'reasonable' amount of time. I would suggest a minimum of 5 years' worth of 'reasonable use' before it blows up. If

it develops a manufacturing fault at any time during that period, the retailer IS LIABLE! Any attempt to fob you off, should be met with a firm, but polite explanation of your consumer rights.

Bear in mind, the retailer is at liberty to take into account usage you've had from a product before it breaks though. For example, if your 4 year old fridge blows up, the retailer could offer to replace it, but will ask for a contribution from you for the 4 years use you had from the previous model.

For the first 6 months after purchase, it's up to the retailer to prove that the fault with the item is NOT their responsibility. After the first 6 months it's your responsibility. Therefore, my advice when dealing with an obstructive retailer, is to obtain an independent report to confirm that the product has a manufacturing fault, then ask the retailer to not only fix the problem, but also reimburse you for the cost of the report.

It is also worth noting that when you first purchase an item, during the first 4 weeks you are entitled to return faulty goods and get a full refund. After this period of time, generally you will have to permit the retailer an opportunity to repair the item if they so wish.

So, remember next time the manager of a shop says 'oh sorry, there's nothing we can do I'm afraid'. Tell them you understand your statutory rights and if they still fail to help, then call my team on 01582 637450 and I'll have a little 'word' for you!

The four babies are, as yet, unnamed, as their sex has yet to be determined by keepers.

Senior Keeper Jane Storr said: "The new-borns

are doing really well. They are just at the point where they start to show some signs of curiosity about the world, climbing around onto their mothers' backs and shoulders to get a better look around.

"Daphne, Hannalies, Pien and Naomi, who are experienced mums, are all brilliant with the babies, and Quaker, the

Treating Injuries with RICE

With the sun finally shining we are busy enjoying sports and gardening and, with our increased activity levels, accidents can happen. Here is a little reminder of how to treat some common injuries using the RICE principle – Rest, Ice, Compression and Elevation.

Injuries involving the lower limb are predominantly soft tissues, i.e. ligaments (joining bone to bone), tendons (joining muscle to bone) and muscles themselves.

A strain is the overstretching of muscle and a sprain is the overstretching of a ligament or tendon. However, the body's reaction is similar in all structures. Initially. when an iniurv happens. inflammation occurs, small blood vessels are damaged and bleed at the injury site, chemicals are released and cause an increase in blood flow - this results in heat, redness and swelling in the area. The pain is caused by chemicals and extra pressure irritating the nerve endings.

The success of an injury healing is boosted by appropriate, timely and effective action in the first 72 hours – so what can you do to help yourself?

Follow the R.I.C.E. principle:-

R - REST: This helps to decrease the energy requirement of the area by reducing unnecessary blood flow. So avoid aggravating activities but keep the area moving.

I - ICE: This initially constricts the blood vessels, so reduces bleeding and decreases swelling. It also helps reduce pain by numbing the nerve endings.

C - COMPRESSION: This limits the accumulation of inflammatory fluid and the over production of scar tissue. A Tubigrip bandage could be used and the area should be compressed well above and below the sight of injury.

E - ELEVATION: This lowers the blood pressure and helps limit the bleeding into tissues. It also encourages excess fluid to drain to the lymphatic system.






Effective Book Croup Sweet Tooth by Ian McEwan

Usually when one picks up a work by Ian McEwan, it is with a sense of pleasant anticipation. He is an excellent author and his books on many varying subjects have won him a loyal following of readers.

This book, however, is not one of his best and it is hard to pinpoint the reasons. It has a good plot, with two very smart twists. Ian McEwan writes well and the story is very easy to follow, but at the end, one puts down the novel feeling slightly dissatisfied.

The story is told by Serena Frome, who in 1972 has recently graduated from Cambridge with a poor third class maths degree. She is recruited by MI5 and seems a very unlikely candidate, until we learn that she has been secretly promoted by Tony Canning, an ex lover from university days and also an ex MI5 operative. Serena is young, pretty and naive and very soon is having to cope with the misogynistic environment of MI5 and the hierarchy within it. She seems to cope with these difficulties and before long she is offered, and accepts, a role in a 'honey trap'

mission. Code named Sweet Tooth, it purports to establish a 'foundation' which will promote and support young writers who are openly critical of Communism. One such is Tom Haley, and it is Serena's job to offer him



a grant for three years, in order to promote artistic freedom. Tom is a talented writer and many of his stories are reproduced in the novel. Inevitably, Serena and Tom fall in love and they spend happy weekends together in Brighton before the denouement.

As a group, we found the book easy to read, but didn't think that it was up to McEwan's usual standard. Although the book takes many sideswipes of the literary world and its prizes and seems to be a book about writing, we are never quite sure what we are meant to believe until the end. That twist could explain the difference in McEwan's style, but I leave that to the reader to decide.

Buying Safely on EEsy



Jonathan Vernon Smith is the Sony Award winning mid-morning show presenter for BBC Three Counties Radio. During his consumer hour he helps listeners with their consumer problems and

now shares his advice with you.

EBay has been around for years now. You would imagine therefore that everyone knows the way to use the site effectively and safely. Sadly, based on the continual number of stories I hear on my show from unhappy buyers and sellers, this is not the case.

It staggers me how trusting some consumers are of people selling goods on eBay. It can be a wonderful site for finding and purchasing rare items and bagging a bargain. However, if you don't know what you're doing, you may just end up crying into your keyboard.

So how can you ensure you don't end up an unhappy eBay customer?

Firstly, ALWAYS look at the feedback for the seller you're purchasing from. Anyone can theoretically sell stuff on eBay whether they're a decent person or an absolute toerag. Avoid buying from sellers that have received negative feedback recently. Also look at similar items they have sold, to see if customers are happy with them.

When you feel comfortable with the seller you're planning to buy from, remember to inspect the product description thoroughly. Watch out for underpriced items and expensive items where the seller offers free delivery. If the deal seems too good to be true, it probably is.

Be extra cautious when buying presale items (eg music and concert tickets). Check the seller's feedback and selling history before purchasing and don't leave feedback until you've actually received your tickets.

Be cautious of strange item descriptions – they're often an indicator of a fraudulent listing. For example, if the item description looks like an automatic online translator has translated it chances are you're never going to receive it!

So when you feel happy with the seller, their feedback and the item being listed, how can you pay in the most secure way? When possible, always choose to pay by paypal. That way you are likely to be protected by their moneyback guarantee (if the transaction is eligible). Be very very wary of any seller who tells you their paypal account is not working, or tries to persuade you to pay without using paypal. What are their motivations? Is it that they're trying to defraud you?

I would never pay by a bank/international money transfer or using money vouchers. The con artists often ask for payment in this way. Once they've got your money, they close their eBay account and vanish into the ether.

Finally where payment is concerned, always complete your transaction via the eBay site. If you suddenly agree to take the sale/purchase offline and deal independently with the seller, you are not protected by the eBay money back guarantee. Be very suspicious of any eBay seller who suggests doing a deal without concluding things via the site.

Where delivery is concerned, my advice is that if the seller is offering a more expensive and secure method of sending, use it. You'll be grateful you opted for this if the item goes missing or gets damaged in transit.

If you follow all of these tips, you'll hopefully ensure your eBay experience is a happy one. Remember though, if you

Weather Conditions for April 2015


Elevation: 450 ft - Latitude: 51° 50' 13" North - Longitude: 0° 33' 34" West
