# Letter to the Editor...



Dear Editors.

As had heard that discussions would take place on housing issues in and around the village, I attended the parish council meeting for July. This was the first time for many years that I have attended, and it all looked familiar.

It was gratifying to hear that the local councillors are totally opposed to the planning of any large scale new housing on several possible sites, which would turn us into a town and not a village. I wonder however if the ultimate planning authority will listen to them. What concerned me however, no worse than that angered me, was a proposal put forward for a funfair to visit School Lane recreation park, particularly as I had just listened to the police representative give out the increased crime figures for this area; the use of drugs in the village being highlighted. "Children have to go out of the village for activities" was the reason put forward for the fair, AND THEN in the next item our representative Parish Council turn down the opportunity for the children to play football in the village on the grounds that it would interfere with people walking in the recreation park! This is the second time the Parish council have asked for village opinion on a football issue and totally ignored the feedback.

Admittedly the funfair would be only one week instead of a regular occurrence, but I know which I rather see my grandchildren attend. Is the way forward for our children and grandchildren in Eaton Bray to attend funfairs not football or other recreational activities.

Members of the public who attend Parish council meetings are not allowed to comment

on the agenda topics, one can only sit in total frustration and listen to the committee pontificate, and then vote contrary to any mini referendum outcome.

Considering that a proposal was passed to spend a further £1000 on yet another questionnaire/information leaflet, I really wonder what is the point, when the views expressed in any responses seem to be completely ignored.






# Heritage Open days at Edlesborou Church - 10-13th September 2015

# A Reflection on Carnival 2015

The Sea

When I arrived home after Carnival Day I found the most delightful 'thank you' letter (which I have modified slightly to make it more readable).

"Our first time - our daughter works at Edlesborough school, we live in MK. We have a foster child and take him to as many events as we can. This carnival was by a long way the best. We loved the fact vou let the carnival come into arena, the varied stalls, the lovely tea and cake tent, and the friendly helpers, the atmosphere was awesome. Lewis loved the classic cars: I did as well, telling him lots about the cars. There was the dog show and the red kite above in the sky. Well done to you all, we will be back. It's good to see village life working together, and to hear a prayer before the show began. Great job to vou all."

To everyone who contributed to the success of this year's Carnival, from the youngest child in the procession (a little majorette called Molly on her 4th birthday) to the biggest business that supports our Carnival, this letter is for you.

Early in the afternoon I looked around – I was astonished at what has been created in our villages – not, of course, as the result of one year's effort but through years of building, development and improvement. So the 'thank you' letter above is also dedicated to all those people (many now into their 80s, but still as supportive as ever) who, over the years, have grown the Carnival into what it is today.

My preferred weather for Carnival is calm and overcast - last year it rained all day until 3pm - but there could be no complaints about the weather this year; it was a lovely English summer's day -

though I admit to having been worried when the days before had seen record high temperatures for July and violent thunderstorms around the country.

The 'thank you' letter says that our Carnival was "by a long way the best". That is very flattering, but if it is true then it's thanks to a very dedicated and talented team of organisers. But I would throw out a challenge to our community – the event could be even better. Here are just a few of the ways I think it could be improved:

- I'm baffled as to why more families or businesses don't take part in the procession. Please don't leave it to others – why not join in and have some fun?
- We had a serious congestion problem as a result of some very poor parking in Edlesborough High Street so we are going to have to implement even better Road Closure and parking protocols. We need a dedicated team to manage this before the authorities stop us from holding the event. (Does anyone have any contact with an organisation that could supply us with lots of cones?)
- Many businesses have realised that the Carnival is an important shop-window for their produce. However, in many cases great ideas came too late for us to promote them in the Carnival Programme. Please plan early and help us to help you promote your business.
- The success of the event depends on lots of volunteer helpers. I spent some of the afternoon collecting names of willing volunteers for next year, but the more help we have the easier it becomes to put on an even more pleasant day. Please offer your help!

I believe that our Carnival is one of the most important days in the calendar of our villages. It is an event that brings together both young and old, rich and poor for a common goal. But when I look around the country I see that such events are dying out, for a variety of reasons. If you share my belief that this event is of immense value to our community then I would love to hear from you – maybe you have good ideas, maybe you are an organiser, maybe you could give up a few hours as a volunteer (Email me at gordon@gordongray.plus.com).

There are so many people to thank – a magnificent organising team and those who are close to that team. Adam and Jimm, our parish and county councils who are so helpful to the organisation of the event, on-duty and off-duty police, everyone who manned stalls, those who made cakes, the logistics team and drivers, the Road Closure team, the marshals. the car park attendants, the ladies (and gentlemen) in the Tea Tent, individuals and businesses who were so generous in donations of money, prizes and goods, suppliers of lorries and other vehicles, local schools and other organisations who were in the procession, bucket collectors. those who marked out the Green, the Dog Show organisers, those who entertained us in the arena, those who advertised in the programme, the person who contacted advertisers for the programme, the people in the Registration tent, those on the sound system, those who picked up litter, those who provided storage facilities, those who went out selling Grand Draw tickets to friends and neighbours, our outside stall holders, the owners of the Classic vehicles, those who offered to help at next year's event, all who pray for us, everyone who came to the event, especially those who spent a few pounds (or more) on

one of the St Mary's Charity Stalls - and anyone else whom I have failed to thank. Ah ves, that's the first mention of money and vou will want to know how much has been raised this year. Well, I'm sorry to say that, two days after the event, I have no idea vet but it would be disappointing if, after an incredible day such as we have just had, we don't have 12 or 13 thousand pounds to distribute to local good causes. We know that 3/4 of the money will go to the principal charities (St Mary's, Medical Detection Dogs and Joss Searchlight) but that leaves a substantial sum to be distributed among local good causes; if your organisation could benefit from a donation that please let me know, via the Email above or via the Carnival website www.stmarvsvillagecarnival.com.

A final word of thanks to the people of Northall, for the warmth of their welcome and their generosity when I was collecting in the two weeks prior to Carnival. It was the village's most productive year ever; 8 households from the village won Grand Draw prizes, including the winner of the trip to Rome. I look forward to seeing you all again next year (God willing) when Carnival will be on 2nd July.

# Are Extended Warranties Worth the Money?

Jonathan Vernon Smith is the Sony Award winning mid-morning show presenter for BBC Three Counties Radio. During his consumer hour he helps listeners with their

consumer problems and now shares his advice with you.

It doesn't seem to matter what product you're buying, there's now an extended warranty available for everything.

The question people often ask me on my radio show is whether it's a good idea to pay the extra and take one out?

My answer is generally a big, fat NO! Under your statutory rights you are protected for a 'reasonable' amount of time if a manufacturing defect occurs with a product. Depending on the item and the initial cost, this is generally as long as an extended warranty would last anyway. Remember when the retailer says that after 12 months there's nothing they can do, they're fobbing you off. The extended warranty is normally a way of charging you for something you really don't need. Sadly some consumers are so trusting of retailers that they believe the company's advice to be sound. I went to a well known shop once and bought a radio for £15.99. The retailer tried very hard to sell me a 3 year extended warranty for £20. I explained that if the radio failed after a couple of years I would simply purchase a new one at another cost of £15.99. The shop assistant seemed amazed that I was so hostile to the idea. Sadly I would imagine many people go ahead and pay an additional £20 that's totally pointless.

You should however remember that often when claiming under your statutory rights that a battle will probably ensue. A battle that will require you to hold your nerve. For most things I would urge you to fight that battle (and call me if you need help), but for other essential products (stairlifts / electric wheelchairs etc) you may consider buying the extended warranty just to give you hassle free piece of mind, and you know what? I wouldn't blame you.

The rule of thumb is always think long and hard before you hand over your money for something you probably don't need.

It is also worth looking into the idea of purchasing insurance policies that cover all of your white goods for mechanical failure. For consumers looking for hassle free piece of mind at a lower cost these can be a good alternative to the 'extended warranty. Please read the terms and conditions though beforehand and understand exactly what the policy will cover.

#### Keeping Backache at Bay for Kids

Does your child ever complain of backache? Do you just put it down to growing pains or one of those things that will

pass? There are numerous reasons why children may develop backache or pain but some of the causes could easily be avoided.

Studies have shown that 30% of school age children get back and neck pain\*. Don't let your child be a statistic - here are some easy tips to help your child get into good habits for later life:

- 1. School bags rucksacks are best or those with a wide adjustable strap worn across the body to distribute the weight better. Adjust straps so that they keep the bag close to the body and not hanging down the back of the legs.
  - Packing put the heaviest things at the bottom and closest to the spine to help the back muscles cope better with the weight.

Posture – get your child to stand tall

when carrying a bag and take care to lift their bag properly to avoid increasing strain on the back by bending their knees and lifting the bag close to them. Big is not necessary best – they should be right for your child's size and tell them to pack just what they need for that day only.

2. School lockers - are not always available but if they are, get your children to leave their heavy PE kits and cooking materials etc. in there instead of lugging around in their bag between lessons.

#### Progress Report on New LED Street Lights

Following the trials of the LED light on a new column in Main Road North, Dagnall, a comprehensive survey was carried out on Thursday 4th June 2015 of all the street lights in the Parish. Teams of two local Councillors and two representatives from the manufacturer and installer visited every street light and recorded the following actions to be taken:

- repairs to, or replacement of, the existing brackets and arms etc.
- rotating the arm/bracket where necessary to improve the spread of light on road junctions or cul de sac areas etc
- which type of lens to be used on the new light ("narrow" so as to throw as much light as possible along the pavement or, "broad" so as to throw more light onto the road junction or cul de sac area etc
- the angle of the lamp head so as to reduce light infiltration to bedrooms etc

Each new light will have a total of 12 LEDs and will be programmed as follows:



- the amount of light (lumens) will be just slightly more than that being emitted by the existing sodium lamps
- the colour of the light will be white, (whereas the existing sodium lights appear orange)
- practically all the light will be projected onto the ground rather than all around as now
- the combination of all of the above will make the new LED lights "appear" to be somewhat brighter

- as now, the lights will come on when it's dark
- rather than turn the lights off completely at mid-night, the Council has decided to dim them by 50%, thereby still obtaining some savings in electricity but giving parishioners a continuity of lighting through out the hours of darkness

The next phase of the programme will be to carry out any necessary repairs and to replace all the 12 lights in Northall with the new LED lamps. The 5 lights in Edlesborough which are currently not working will also be replaced by the new LED lamps.

The existing light on the very dark bend in the road between Churchgate and No. 98 High Street will also be replaced by a new LED lamp. This stretch of pavement is well used by children going to and fro to school and by local residents. Accordingly, in view of the very dark location, and the fact that there are no bedroom windows etc opposite, the LEDs will be programmed to give two and a half times as much light as all the other new LED lights.

It is hoped that all these 18 new lights will be installed by early September. Feedback from parishioners will then be very much welcomed, following which a decision will be made for the next phase of the programme to be implemented (all the Dagnall lights and any lights in Edlesborough which may not be working at that time). The final phase will be to replace all the old sodium lamps in Edlesborough.





## Edlesborough Eook Group The Legacy of Elizabeth Pringle by Kirsty Wark

Kirsty Wark, the well known television presenter and journalist, has set her first published novel on the Isle of Arran. It tells the stories of two women. Elizabeth Pringle, a native of the island and Martha Morrison, who visited the island as a child with her mother. Elizabeth's death in 2006 brings Martha back to the island, because in her will she has bequeathed her beloved house. Holmlea to Anna Morrison, Martha's mother, Years ago, on a whim, Anna had written a note to Elizabeth saying that, if ever the house came onto the market, she would like to buy it. Unknown to her, Elizabeth had remembered Anna pushing her baby in her pram, singing to her and looking full of life and energy. Alas, now that Anna has fallen victim to dementia. Martha is left with the task of dealing with her mother's unexpected legacy.

Elizabeth and Anna's stories are told in alternate chapters throughout the book. Elizabeth's is rather sad and told as a

memoir, whilst Martha's deals with the present day and her experiences as she comes to know and love the island. Anna is changing before her eyes and Martha has to deal with the emotional and practical problems that are occurring, also the change in the relationship with her mother.

Kirsty Wark's descriptions of the island, which she obviously knows well, are vivid and paint an affectionate picture of Arran. However, the story is very predictable and the ending very contrived and a little too good to be true. The prose gets a little overblown and although the book is very easy to read, as soon as it is finished it is very easily forgotten. There are far better books I am sure that have been written by non celebrities, but they do not get published. I hope that one day soon the rash of "celebrity" authors will go out of fashion and we can look forward to books written by genuine writers.

### Edlesborough W.I.

Our June meeting was held in the Memorial Hall on 9th June, when

our speaker, Chris Ward, accompanied by his wife Caroline, spoke on the subject, '101 Things You Never Knew About Garden Birds'

A lively, entertaining evening was started by Chris showing photographs of garden birds and asking the audience to identify the creatures. The ladies were able to identify all the birds. Chris then proceeded to reflect his remarkable knowledge on the subject through his informative talk and amazing photography. We were surprised that £400 million a year is spent in the UK on wild bird food and the earliest record of a wild bird being tamed by a person was recorded in the 6th century, in Scotland. The bird was a robin and it was tamed by being fed worms. Robins have an average life span of 15 – 18 months, whereas, two years is the average age for small birds. Male robins can be very aggressive and have been known to attack anything red. Although small in stature, wrens are remarkable in that their song can travel over a distance of between half a mile to one mile. The male is able to produce a sound of 92 decibels. All the more amazing when one realizes that a sound consisting of 85 decibels requires a health warning. Often regarded as our smallest bird, this is apparently not so. This particular fact belongs to the gold crest, which often appears in our gardens during the autumn and winter. Although tiny in both size and weight the gold crest is able to produce ten eggs in one clutch, with each egg weighing .8gr.

The song thrush remains a favourite with its beautiful song. Food becomes thrush and blackbird, with the song thrush stealing the blackbird's snails.

The finer points of distinguishing between male and female birds were pointed out to us, such as the great tit with the female having the narrow strip and the male the wider strip down their middles. The reason being the female tends to choose the male with the widest strip. The male blue tit also has the bluest cap, which under ultra violet light really glows. The male with the bluest cap is chosen very quickly by the female. The female is also attracted to the male with the yellowiest feathers. These fine yellow feathers are the result of the amount of food he has eaten. The more vellow the pigment the better he is at collecting food, in the form of caterpillars. Hence the female choosing him because he will be a good provider as a father.

Hearing about the different types of nest constructions was fascinating. For example the long tailed tit has a soft, elasticated nest which contains over 2,000 bird feathers, with each parent flying about 700 miles in order to collect the material. The nest is completely enclosed except for the entrance. House martins reuse their nests, which are constructed usually under door porches, with each parent participating in the construction, which comprises 1,000 pellets of soft mud. House sparrows nest within holes and are very faithful to each other with 90% paired for life. The female selects the male with the most red plumage. The red comes from food, so again the female is looking for the best male at collecting food for the offspring. The number of eggs produced is linked directly to the number of feathers collected (by the a competitive issue between the song male) to line the nest. These feathers are

collected from moulting birds and pecked from live pigeons. The warmer the nest the more eggs produced. For one week the male sparrow looks after the young while the female prepares the nest for the next brood.

Another fascinating aspect of the talk was finding out how the birds were experts at adaptation. Swifts, swallows and house martins feed on midges, flies and insects. However, if their food supply is limited the birds can survive on their fat deposit. They can survive up to ten days without food. The swift, in particular, is extraordinary. After leaving the nest, the swift flies for four years, feeding and sleeping on the wing. The brain is divided in to two parts; half the brain remains awake while the other half of the brain sleeps.

Wrens, tits and finches have adapted in order to survive during the winter by huddling together in order to keep warm. An example of this was a single nesting box which contained 63 huddling wrens. Jays are very aware and have good memories. In order to protect the food supply of acorns from thieves the jay will routinely move the acorns.

The evening came to a close after Maureen, our secretary, gave the meeting a report of her attendance at the WI's special AGM at the Royal Albert Hall, which celebrated the WI's centenary. The Queen, the Princess Royal and Sophie, Countess of Wessex, were in attendance, all of whom are members of their local Womens Institute.

Contrary to popular belief, the WI is not all about jam, singing Jerusalem, wearing hats and confined to ladies of a certain age. Here is a brief outline.

The WI originated in Canada in 1897 and appeared in Britain in 1915, during the First World War, in order to encourage ladies living in rural areas to grow food.

One hundred years later the WI has become the UK's largest voluntary women's organisation; for all ages, based on the values of 'fellowship, truth, tolerance and justice'. The WI has charity status, is non-sectarian and non-party political. June began unsettled with strong winds reaching 38 mph on the 1st. It was unseasonably cool for the next few days with night temperatures dropping to 4.2°c.


Through the middle of the month it was more settled but feeling cool for June by the end of the month the temperature rose to 30.6°c.

#### Tempus Fugit - Time Flies!!

August. The Romans called this month "Sextilis" - the sixth month. It changed its position in the calendar and became the eighth month and not satisfied with the name they changed it to Augustus, after their Emperor Augustus Caesar. Originally only 30 days long, an extra day was added so that Augustus would not be inferior to Julius Caesar!!

 $Anglo\ Saxons\ called\ it\ ``Woed-Monath'',\ the\ month\ of\ weeds,\ because\ it\ seemed\ to\ them\ that\ more\ weeds\ were\ in\ bloom\ then\ than\ at\ any\ other\ time\ of\ year.\ (But\ they\ never\ saw\ my\ garden!!)$ 

There are two special days in August - Lammas and St Bartholomew's day; 1st and 24th.

Lammas was always a quarter day in England when rents or interest were paid. It was a religious festival which probably originates from pagan customs. Some believe that it relates to "Lambs Mass", referring to the newborn lambs which were presented to the church as "Peter's Pence" on the day dedicated to St. Peter ad Vincula (St. Peter in fetters or chains), on Hlaf-masse or Hoofmass; which springs from the Bible, Deuteronomy ch.26 v1 and 2, because Lammas was the festival of the first fruits, when our forefathers cut the first ripe corn, ground it into flour, made it into cakes and presented it to the priest.

St Bartholomew is the patron saint of bee-keepers and honey-makers. He was the son of Tolmai and was one of the twelve disciples (Matt. 10 v3) and always seemed to be in the company of Philip. Our Lord appeared to him after his resurrection (John 21 v2) he also witnessed the Ascension (Acts 1 v4,12,13).

When we read the Bible we are reading about local happenings, about rural people, village people, each of their feast days had to be a feast of gratitude to the giver of all good things. Time has changed the way we live, the way we work and the way we eat. In 1796 Anne Hughes, a farmers wife wrote these recipes down for "A Satday Dinner" - A "Jinnie Jones" to start, "It be made this way - chop up a big sliver of boiled ham with 3 egges boiled verrie hard, a cup of bread crumbs, pepper and salt, some sage and onion, all chopt verrie fine. Then mix all together with 3 egges beatan to a froth, so that it all do stick together, then put to bake to 20 minutes of the clock. This be verrie good when eatan with potatoes baked in the oven in their skins and eatan with plentie of butter. Followed by a good Honnie Pie - it be verrie nice and simple to make - put plentie of fat on the sides and bottom of a dish, then put in a goode layer of crumbs and cover very thick with honnie and swete plums, then more crumbs, cover all with 4 egges beatan up with a measure of cream. Then put swete plums in divers ways all over the toppe and cook in the over for 10 minutes of the clock. They do go down well with sum cider or primyrose wine." (Bang goes the diet.)

For most people days of the week pass by all too quickly and our special days are those we celebrate with family and friends like birthdays and anniversaries or Christmastime - but I do feel that the real reason behine the celebration is often forgotten - in a world where profit and loss, modem technology and "keeping up with the Jones's" seem to be the most important things of daily life, sometimes I wish we could 'stop the clock' and let good old fashioned values catch us up but I'm rambling, so I'll end with a lesson in mathematics - from someone named J.M. Robertson.

Subtract - The kind of worry, that can constitute dismay.

Divide - Your time by turning each frown into a smile.

Multiply - Your efforts for a total that's worthwhile.
