

Easter is done and dusted, most of the chocolate has been consumed (probably all of it!) and the children are back at school. January and February flew by and I cannot believe that my Extended Study Leave is over. When I've finished this letter I must settle down to write a report relating to my research into Rural Mission and Ministry in the Diocese of Brecon and Swansea.

It was both an education and a privilege to meet people who minister in villages and communities that seem to be a million miles away from many of the facilities that we sometimes take for granted in our villages which are in such close proximity to Dunstable and Leighton Buzzard.

As I travelled around the rural areas my 'satnav' went into meltdown on more than one occasion. I put it down to the narrow, winding, hilly roads and a dearth of signs in some places. The scenery was beautiful, rounded hills in all directions and lots of sheep, of which I am very fond. On a sunny day driving over the moors between Builth Wells and Brecon with the Beacons beyond was glorious. The road was excellent and with very little traffic and no potholes there was a sense of peace. This rural scene took me back to the poetry I studied for A Level English Literature, particularly some verses from William Wordsworth's *Ode (Intimations of Immortality from Recollections of Early Childhood)*. Here are some excerpts with my apologies to Mr Wordsworth – it is a very long poem...

There was a time when meadow, grove and stream, The earth, and every common sight, To me did seem Apparelled in celestial light......

The Rainbow comes and goes,
And lovely is the Rose,
The Moon doth with delight
Look round her when the heavens are bare,
Waters on a starry night
Are beautiful and fair;
The sunshine is a glorious birth,




- Manning stalls





Following the Parish Council becoming aware of the recent development application on land off Totternhoe Road, the Council unanimously agreed that Eaton Bray does not have any requirement for a development of this size and nature, and the following letter has been submitted to CBC in objection to the application ...

PLANNING APPLICATION CB/16/00717/OUT LAND OFF TOTTERNHOE ROAD, EATON BRAY, DUNSTABLE BEDS LU6 2BD

With reference to the proposed development made under the planning application as detailed above, having reviewed all aspects of the documentation publicly available at the Parish Council meeting held on 7th March 2016 in respect to the application it was agreed by all councillors that we strongly object to the application.

After thorough consideration of the proposal it is for the following reasons with which

Eaton Bray Parish Council OBJECT to the planning application:

- 1) The land of the proposed development is designated Green Belt and that, according to Government guidelines, only in 'exceptional circumstances' can development be approved on Green Belt land and that this is NOT considered an exceptional circumstance.
- 2) There has been no identified need for a development of such magnitude in Eaton Bray and the surrounding areas.
- 3) The recent affordable housing survey identified, across the whole of the parish, an interest for up to 12 small properties of the 'affordable' housing designation but that the scheme developers (Grand Union) have struggled since then to really identify any suitable location or real interest for a small development.
- 4) The area identified suffers heavily from flooding that is not accurately reflected in the environment agency's flood plain area map. A recent correspondence from Anglian Water and the Environment Agency have confirmed in writing to us that they do not recommend or support the development in this area given the flood risk and additional pressure it will put on the water courses.
- 5) The existing road network could not support the increase in the additional traffic 145

homes would bring. The property size proposed suggests that each one will average 3-4 people. Given that there is little or no public transport network in Eaton Bray that would be suitable for those who would need to use it to get to and from work, each property will almost certainly bring with it 2 cars – which then increases the road usage significantly to an additional 300+ vehicles.

New build residential requires one parking space per bedroom, up to and including 4 bedrooms, plus 0.25 visitors' parking spaces per property. The proposed development at The Rye/Totternhoe Road clearly contravenes CBC's own parking policy.

The Highways Working Group of the Parish Council have already identified that the road network is already heavily under strain with the high level of HGV and 'rat run' traffic using the village as a cut through to avoid the Dunstable gridlock. The main carriageway through the village is breaking up and in many places (Totternhoe Road entry into Eaton Bray and Bower Lane) the carriageway is simply not wide enough. This, in addition to both the construction traffic and the additional resident vehicles, would mean that it is only a matter of time before a serious and possible fatal accident were to occur on roads that are simply not big enough for the present volume.

The proposed development estimates that 50% of the residents of the development would use public transport and walk to/from the bus stops. The recent cancellation of a bus service through Eaton Bray at critical commuting times would make it almost impossible for these new residents to travel using the proposed method of public transport.

- 7) The proposed site location is on an already dangerous junction, particularly at the weekends when the Rye playing field is heavily used by children playing football. This has historically been a dangerous and difficult junction but with the addition of an additional 300+ cars using the junction would increase the level of congestion and danger.
- 8) The village's drainage and sewer system in already under threat. The past few years have seen unprecedented levels of flooding in that exact area of the proposed development with some residents of Totternhoe Road being flooded out of their homes for many months owing to the proximity to the flood plain region. Inadequate drainage and sewerage mean that without significant investment in the village's entire drain and sewer system raw sewerage would make its way out and into the open. This is supported by Anglian Water's response to us in respect to the application (copy attached).
- 9) There is only one small junior school in the village and this is already also at capacity and would not support the increase in the number of young children in the area. For the older children, it is our understanding that the vast majority go to Leighton Buzzard for school. However, there is little or no bus route with regular provision that would support such an increase in the number of children. The Transport statement is inaccurate and we suggest that the TRICS data bares no correlation to our current rural public transport service.

In addition, correspondence received from the Head Teacher of Edlesborough School had confirmed that they would not accept any additional volume of intake from a proposed development given their already high-usage.

10) There is one, small food shop that would struggle to cope with an increase in the number

of residents and the next nearest shops of any size would require those to use their car to travel there.

- 11) The Section 106 contributions are wholly inadequate for the reasons stated thus far.
- 12) The proposed size of the development would be one that increases our rural village by 10%+/- and this would have a significant and damaging impact on the village's character.
- 12) The development is in an unacceptable and dangerous proximity to our historical and scheduled ancient monument (the 900+ year old moat and castle).
- 13) The green curtilage of this site borders that of the proposed development.
- 14) Given CBC's ownership of the land, we would seek their (CBC) assurance that, clearly given the uplift in the value that CBC would receive from the scale of the development, this is not merely a commercial development. The application is unnecessary and overdevelopment in an area that has no demand for the property.

Finally, it is also worth noting that the supporting scheme documents of the proposal contain many inaccuracies, such as the A41 going through Eaton Bray and this, in our opinion, supports the fact that this is simply an ill-thought-out planning application that is not needed or wanted by any of the 4,200+ residents of Eaton Bray.

To reiterate, it is for the above reasons, but not limited to, that we object to the proposed large scale development in Eaton Bray.

Ju Jitsu





A TIMELY REMINDER FOR DOG WALKERS

Spring is upon us and hopefully summer not far away so this is a reminder to all dog walkers in and around the villages. In last years May addition of the Focus an article was written about advice from The kennel Club and NFU regarding grazing cattle



/sheep and keeping dogs under control and in particular the picking up of dog faeces on farmland as it can cause abortion in cattle and brain damage and death in sheep.

This is an increasing problem all over the country as the vast majority of dog owners are not aware of the problems that can be caused and assume because it is not on a public area they can just leave it lying around.

For those who "Escape to the Country" and purchase a dog/bitch please remember it is your responsibility to pick up after your dog and more importantly take it home and bin it. There have been several incidences where faeces have not been picked up and then when it has been picked up the bags have been left "hanging" on gates and trees and even discarded into the bushes. Most of these bags are not biodegradable and therefore will never rot down. Like all living creatures dogs do have to empty once or twice a day and it is the responsibility of the owners/dog walkers to NOT leave dog faeces anywhere. It has been noted that dog walkers do not keep to designated footpaths and still allow their dogs to empty in that area. Please keep to the footpaths unless specific permission has been given by the landowner/farmer. It has been noted that people are climbing over barbed wire fences, damaging the fence and leaving the wire trailing on the ground which is dangerous for wildlife and walkers.

Whilst owing a dog/bitch is a wonderful healthy experience and to walk in the fresh air and fields to take away the stresses of everyday life but whilst out thinking about the next job to do or texting or problems that have to be overcome in daily life dogs/bitches have to be watched as to what they are up to either worrying livestock and where they chose to empty.

From puppyhood to old age get in the habit of bagging your dog's faeces. I am sure you would not like Tom, Dick or Harry allowing their dog to defecate in your garden and not pick up SO PICKUP AND BIN IT responsibly, if you cannot do that then you should not be the owner of a dog/bitch.



If you think you might like to help, the amount of time you volunteer is entirely up to you - even a couple of hours a month helps! Volunteer expenses are reimbursed and all volunteers are fully insured and DBS checked, (formerly CRB). You could be

Better Backs for Gardeners

Spring has finally sprung and the sunshine has sent us into our gardens in droves. Although gardening can be good for the mind, it can play havoc with your body. Follow our tips for

better backs and don't let an injury spoil your

- Before doing any physical exercise, warm up first with a walk and some gentle stretching.
- Take regular breaks and change position between jobs to avoid tiredness, overuse and iniury.
- · Keep your back straight when lifting and use your knees, thighs and arms to help. Don't try to lift too much at one time – particularly those bags of compost!
- When digging, avoid twisting and straining and don't forget to take regular breaks.
- Use kneeler seats or mats when planting and don't overstretch by working too far in front

of you.

- Mow a little at a time, keeping upright.
- Avoid overstretching when pruning by using long-handled shears and use secateurs with a cut and hold action.
- If using electric hedge trimmers don't hold them too far in front of you.
- Consider the planning of your garden raised flower beds may save you twinges in the long run.

PEAR AND GINGER TIRAMISU TRIFLE

I've long said that the best home cooking needn't be in any way complicated. In fact, the simpler the better as far as I am concerned. Also, there is no need to come up with revolutionary creations. Often the tastiest recipes are just simple twists on much-loved classics. This pear and ginger tiramisu recipe, created by food writer and blogger Ren Behan, meets all of these criteria. Easy to prepare, it looks great and tastes wonderful. It also misses out the coffee which is a bonus for anyone who has to avoid caffeine. A lovely treat to serve at a relaxed family meal, a posh dinner party or after a barbecue (if and when the weather improves!).

Makes 4-6 tumblers (dependent on size) or one medium-sized trifle bowl

Ingredients:

3 large free-range eggs – yolks and whites separated

100g caster sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla bean paste or extract 250g tub Mascarpone

2 very ripe pears

250ml sherry

½ packet Ginger Snap Biscuits or Ginger Cake

100g grated dark or white chocolate for sprinkling on top

A dusting of cocoa powder (optional)



The ingredients will combine better at room temperature Whisk the eggs yolks, caster sugar and vanilla



together with an electric whisk for around 5 minutes until the mixture is pale and fluffy. Add in the tub of Mascarpone and mix until smooth.

In a second, clean bowl, beat your egg whites until soft peaks form. With a metal spoon, fold the egg whites into your egg and Mascarpone mixture.

Have a large trifle bowl or six small glasses/tumblers ready.

Peel, core and finely slice the pears.

Pour the sherry into a small bowl, dip six ginger biscuits into the sherry and then place one in each glass, or lay them all flat across one bowl, working quickly so that the biscuits don't get too soggy.

Add a few slices of pear on top of the ginger biscuits. Next, spoon some of your creamy mixture into the bottom of your tumblers/bowl.

Repeat until all the mixture is used up.

Cover with clingfilm and refrigerate, preferably overnight. Just before eating, sprinkle with grated dark or white chocolate, dust with a little cocoa powder if you wish and then serve.



Litter Bins & Dog Bins

Dog bins in Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall are maintained by the Parish Council and are emptied by AVDC at considerable expense to EPC.

The dog bin inside the main gate to Dagnall allotments will shortly be relocated to Main Road North near Hog Hall Lane. A new dog bin is also being installed at the start of the footpath on Eaton Bray Road, Northall.

Extracts from County Councillor Report January/February 2016

County Council grant settlement means higher taxes and fewer services.

On 17 December councils were notified by government of their grant allocation for 2016/17. It is not good news. The cuts have been far greater than expected and come on top of year on year reductions since 2010. Instead of the anticipated 30% cut for this coming financial year 2016/17, Bucks County Council suffered a grant cut in excess of 40%, being allocated only £23.7 million instead of the £28 million expected. Next year it will receive £8.1 million and grants will cease from then on. This should be offset to an extent by the council receiving a portion of the business rate previously retained entirely by central government, and permission to raise council tax by 2% over and above the 1.9% previous limit, specifically to meet adult social care costs.

However the government applies a funding formula called a top up grant adjustment which has reduced Bucks' funding this year by a further £1.6 million, and up to a total of minus £52.7 million in the next four years. This negative grant settlement is achieved by holding back the business rate and re allocating it to poorer authorities.

Although the County Council budget is still £335 million, excluding schools, there are continuing new costs to meet for additional duties in health and social care, children

services, flood prevention, and more, as well as increasing numbers of people needing care and the introduction of the national minimum wage.

I could continue, but you get the overall gloomy picture of reduced budgets and services and increased taxes. The conservative administration are vociferously blaming the very government they helped to elect. My group, while equally angry, will face up to the realities of the situation, and challenge them on every priority and 'difficult choice' they have to make to try to prevent the baby going out with the bath water, and protect those most reliant on services.

Tring Station and the London Midland rail franchise renewal

Aldbury parish council have written to me and others about the need to have a plan for Tring Station to improve the parking and reduce the impact on local residents, which I fully support. Although the use of Cheddington station has remained about the same since 1997, Tring station usage has increased by 72%. The West Midlands rail franchise document published on 15 December is now out for consultation.

It is vital that Bucks and Herts, Dacorum and Aylesbury Vale Councils work together to put their views into this consultation and include in their own local plans of the needs of local residents and the impact of future development. The head of Transport strategy and growth Joan Hancox is attending the next Local Area Forum in Wing on 21st January at Wing.

I have added to the case made by Aldbury Parish Council by reminding them that Hertfordshire is still sitting on money to construct a cycleway along Northfield Road, and that Tring Station is restricted by Green Belt and Chilterns AONB designations which led to the restoration to farmland of the temporary car park created 10 years ago during the West Coast Main Line improvement programme. The bus from Castlemead to Tring Station was withdrawn when funds run out as only about seven commuters used the service regularly at that time.

Ivinghoe conservation area

Gladman Developments lost their Station Road appeal because the proposal failed to meet one of the Government's criteria for sustainable development - the environment. The deciding factor was the high quality of the revised Ivinghoe Conservation Area policy and associated document. It was worth waiting for this to be completed and adopted by the new District Council. It might be obvious to all who live in Ivinghoe that the open aspect from the lawn to Mentmore is unique, but the documentation shows that it is recognised by the whole district, distinguishing Ivinghoe's case from many others.

McCann Planning Application for 57 Houses on land off Edlesborough High Street

The McCann planning application for 57 houses on land off Edlesborough High Street was discussed at AVDC's Strategic Development Management Committee on the 9th March 2016. The Parish Council, several residents and our District Councillor, Chris Poll, all made presentations to the Committee opposing the application, but despite this the Committee agreed to defer and delegate it to the planning officers for approval. This means that the planning officers are authorised to approve the application once they are satisfied that the necessary \$106 legal agreement is in place. The webcast of the entire meeting is

Edlesborough Parish Council Meetings

The next Edlesborough Parish Council Meetings will take place in Edlesborough Memorial Hall on:

- Thursday 21st April 2016. This evening will include the Annual Parish Meeting where the council will review the achievements of the past year and set out the plans for the future. Parishioners are invited to raise issues and debate them with the council. The Annual Parish meeting will then be followed by the Ordinary Parish Council meeting.
- Thursday 19th May 2016. This evening will include the AGM and will be followed by the Ordinary Parish Council Meeting.

The meetings will commence at 7:30pm.

All Parishioners are welcome to attend all Ordinary Parish Council meetings and may ask questions, raise issues and give suggestions during the Open Forum before the formal start of the meeting. The full minutes of the Parish Council meetings are normally available to view on the website or from the Parish Clerk.

Bucks CC Devolution, Your Precept and Future Plans

We hope you have kept in touch with what has happened and what is about to happen regarding the pressures on Bucks County Council. For several years their grant from Central Government has been cut steadily. At the same time they have been capped on the amount they can add to the Council Tax each year. Their main budget drivers are roads, social welfare and child welfare. In order to meet the cuts they have looked at every area to find savings.

You will know, we hope, that the grass-cutting service has been reducing steadily each year. Last year it got to the point where Edlesborough Parish Council paid for extra

cuts in certain areas to try to maintain a standard. Other items such as cleaning road signs, clearing weeds, clearing pavements etc. stopped some years ago.

You may also know that the budget for the current financial year is so tight that BCC has stopped all 'discretionary' spending since January.

Faced with falling standards and a virtual promise that in three years grass-cutting except for safety reasons at road junctions would cease, BCC invited Parish Councils to take on some of BCC's activities. Your council has resisted this until now. We believe that the service being provided is now so poor that we decided to take these from BCC. BCC offered to 'sweeten' the deal by giving us some money towards it. However, the amount does not cover the annual cost of the service nor does it cover the 'catch-up' costs of those services they failed to perform in recent years.

We believe that this piece of localism in the long run will prove beneficial to the parish as we are able to respond to the needs of the community and have a better appreciation of the seasonal effects on the grass, hedges etc.

As a consequence, we have had to raise the precept this year, in part, to cover the shortfall between providing the full service and what BCC has offered us to take it on. In addition we have determined that preparing a Neighbourhood Plan is vital to manage developments in the Parish. From April the parish precept will increase by 8%, meaning that the Band D amount will increase from £70.95 to £76.60. This equates to an increase of just under 11p per week.

A team of councillors is working, together with the clerk, to have these local services in place by April 1. Just to add to the challenge our local handyman/gardener, Dave Thompson, who has fixed so many things around the parish for many years and who has lovingly tended the churchyard and the cemetery has had to retire through ill-heath. We thank him and wish him well in his battle to return to better health. This has added to the task of providing comprehensive services to the parish.

Also, as we hope most of you know, in January we launched a series of public meetings to announce our intentions and outline the opportunities we believe a Neighbourhood Plan will give us. More information will be shared throughout this year.

April is when the parish council holds the statutory Annual Meeting of the Parish. This will take place in the Memorial Hall, Edlesborough on Thursday 21st April at 7.30 pm when we will review the achievements of the past year, update parishioners on our current projects e.g. Neighbourhood Plan, Devolved Services etc. and outline our projects for the new financial year. We look forward to having the opportunity to share these with you and answer any questions you may have on these and any other topics you may wish to raise. This meeting will be followed by the normal monthly Parish Council meeting.

There will be a Coffee Morning in aid of Smile Train in May and an outing to Stratford on Avon in August.






Home by Marilynne Robinson

In her Pulitzer prize winning novel Gilead, published in 2004, Marilynne Robinson tells the story of John Ames, a Congregationalist minister living in the small town of that name in rural Iowa. Written as a letter to his small son, born to him late in life, it charts his own family history and that of the town.

Four years later, Marilynne Robinson wrote the novel Home, which also won many literary prizes, including the Orange prize in Britain. Home is a retelling of the story of Gilead. Written at the same time as the letter to John Ames's son, this is from the point of view of Glory, spinster daughter of John Ames's best friend, the Presbyterian minister. Reverend Boughton is dying and Glory has come home to care for her father. Although the family is large, all of Glory's siblings have families of their own and although they love their father, they only visit occasionally. The exception is Jack, the black sheep of the family, who left the

town twenty years ago in mysterious circumstances. Now, he writes to his father wishing to return home. After weeks of anticipation and preparation, Jack returns home. obviously troubled unwilling but confide in his sister.



Gradually, Glory and Jack become closer and try to understand one another. The two books Gilead and Home take place during the ame time span, examining the same events from the Ames and Boughton families experiences. The story takes place in the mid 1950's and both books question Christianity, its views, particularly those regarding segregation and family loyalties.

Home is a complete novel, but to understand the stories of the two families fully, I would recommend reading both books. Our book group was divided in its opinions. The majority found the domestic detail tedious and the novel overlong, some enjoyed the detail and the various themes that were explored. We all thought the writing excellent and the division of opinions made for stimulating discussion.



Baby giraffe born at ZSL Whipsnade Zoo

Zookeepers are welcoming a new baby giraffe to their neck of the woods at ZSL Whipsnade Zoo after mum Savannah gave birth just in time for Mother's Day.

Fourth-time mum Savannah kept zookeepers guessing for weeks after her expected due-date, finally giving birth to a female calf on Wednesday 24 February. Keepers named her Nuru, the Swahili word for light.

Nuru the baby giraffe already measures 5ft 6in, and is a fluffy, miniature picture of her 16-foot tall mum. Keeper Cassie Taylor said: "Savannah is a fantastic mum, so it was particularly lovely

to have the calf arrive in time for Mother's Day. We were lucky enough to be there to observe the birth, and watched Nuru as mum Savannah gently helped her stand up and delicately cleaned her new arrival. Savannah is attentive and protective, but also relaxed enough to let dad Bashu and the other members of the group play their roles in childcare too."

The baby giraffe was born at 9am and after less than an hour of wobbly attempts, soon figured out how to use her long legs to stand up to her full height. At just eight days old, Nuru has already been spotted exploring her surroundings and interacting with other members of the herd, showing similar personality traits to her bold and inquisitive parents. Keeper Cassie Taylor continued: "Calves don't usually wean from their mothers' milk until they are a few months old but Nuru is already showing an interest in leaves, and at one point dunked her whole head in the water bowl! She's a really wonderful addition to the group and will

make a great playmate for 18 month old Luna and two year old Willow."

Salvation Sound



The Salvation Army in its wisdom has published a new Hymn Book-I have found hymn books in my possession and now at services the words of the songs are also shown on a large screen. So my thoughts turned this day



towards some of my favourites and their writers; for we often sing the words but never think past them

A poem "The Brewing of Soma" was published many, many years ago; twelve years after this event the final verses of it were being used as a Christian hymn; few people now remember their origin. The poem describes at first how 'Soma', an intoxicating drink was made to prepare Indian worshippers for their frenzied Vedic (Hindu) rites. In contrast at the end of the poem John Greenleaf Whittier, who was a Quaker, turned his thoughts to God and wrote:

'Dear Lord and Father of mankind,

Forgive our foolish ways!

Re-clothe us in our rightful mind,

In purer lives thy service find,

In deeper reverence praise.'

The second half of the twentieth century saw an upsurge of "modern" hymn writing coinciding with new versions of the Bible. A man, named Timothy Dudley-Smith was sent a review copy of the 1961 New English Bible. He was very taken with the beginning of St. Lukes Gospel; the magnificat or the song of Mary as it is known, which inspired him to write a paraphrase, which became a very popular hymn which we know as:

'Tell out my soul, the greatness of the Lord!

Unnumbered blessings, give my spirit voice;

Tender to me the promise of his word;

In God my saviour shall my heart rejoice.'

Francesco Bernardone was the son of a wealthy merchant draper, and as a young man spent a frivolous, empty life, but sickness and civil war steadied him down. One day in the church of San Damiano, he seemed to hear a voice saying, "Francis repair my falling house!" He took the words literally, sold a bale of goods from his father's warehouse and with the proceeds, paid for the repair of the church. Subsequently, his father disinherited and disowned him. Francis was now penniless! Three years later Pope Innocent III authorised him and eleven others to be roving preachers of Christ in 'simplicity and lowliness'. Thus began the Friars Minor - He never became a priest, and died in 1226 bearing the scars of stigmatization, the five wounds of Jesus Christ. Francis wrote his Canticle of the sun, which we sing as:

'All creatures of our God and King

Lift up your voice and with us sing

Alleluia, Alleluia'

He was canonized in app. 1228 and hence known as St. Francis of Assisi.

John Newton was a little boy who felt involved! His mother died when he was six years old and his father later re-married. On John's eleventh birthday it was decided that he should 'go to sea'. He soon became a teenage rebel with a talent for writing verse. In his early days on board ship he used this gift and taught the crew a song he had written. The lyrics were about the Captain, his character, family and the ship. Sadly they were such, that they were unprintable!- He was flogged for desertion, press ganged and became involved with slave trading. At the age of twenty three, on board a cargo ship in the midst of a violent storm, he called out for God's mercy; and was amazed

to be saved from what was almost certain death. He became a Christian, but was still involved with slaving for some time. Eventually he renounced this and became a minister of the church at the age of thirty nine. Using the name of Jesus in a very different way, his gift of words re-directed to

writing beautiful hymns such as 'Amazing Grace! How sweet the sound

That saved a wretch like me!

I once was lost but now am found,


Was blind but now I see'

And

'How sweet the name of Jesus sounds In a believer's ear!

It soothes his sorrows, heals his wounds, And delivers away his fear.'

Psalms, have always been inspired people to write; they themselves are songs or poems and have encouraged others to reward them. Psalms
