In many cases I imagine, it went something like this:



"Well, hello, nice to meet you but, (slight mumble) I'm not exactly a churchgoer/believer myself"

"That doesn't matter! As vicar, I'm here for everyone, you too, if you ever need me."

And need her many people did, often in times of sadness and difficulty but also in times of family joy and celebration. Coralie has been the epitome of what a Church of England vicar should be – one who lives alongside the people and shares the many ups and downs of their lives; one who is warm-hearted, open and accessible and above all, a supportive friend and prayerful pastor.

During her time with us, Coralie has been by the side of those in illness and those in their last days; she has comforted and supported their families; she has affirmed strong links with the three schools, the other churches and community groups; she has made friends with young couples preparing for marriage and with the many grandparents, parents and children who have come along to TOTs and Messy Church at St Mary's. She has also helped people discover or rediscover their Faith and we have been very pleased to welcome them in church. In addition to all this, and aptly, as she is a farmer's daughter, she has been at the heart of rural ministry as Rural Affairs Officer in the Diocese.

Now, it is time for Coralie to retire – the little Welsh cottage, a retirement project for Ralph over several years, is nearing completion and the 'Brush up your Welsh' book beckons! Coralie plans to take a few months well earned rest but it is difficult to imagine she will sit still for long. She has already been sizing up the local area and has plans to give much needed support to rural ministry in the Swansea & Breacon Diocese where there are dozens of tiny, rural parishes. Watch out down there – it's your turn for the whirlwind!





Edlesborough Parish Council Neighbourhood Plan Update

The Draft Vale of Aylesbury Local Plan (VALP) was published at the end of June. Consultation is taking place currently across the district and details of how to find out more and take part are on the AVDC website. The plan is ambitious and challenging and covers all aspects of living in the Vale.

At our recent events some parishioners feel that the requirements placed on villages such as ours are not justified. The place to challenge this is via the VALP consultation. Our Neighbourhood Plan must comply with the requirements of VALP so unless VALP is changed we have no choice if we want a Neighbourhood Plan.

The current draft plan requires more house building in our parish than we were originally advised and teams of parishioners have worked to prepare proposals on how this might be achieved.

In July three 'Open House' public consultation sessions took place where key aspects of our Neighbourhood Plan were displayed for comment and attendees were asked to complete a questionnaire to guide our work. The response to these was, at times, overwhelming. In Edlesborough village we had to print additional questionnaires during the session, such was the volume of parishioners wanting to share their views. We thank you for the keen interest shown in this vital activity for the future of our parish.

Apart from outline options for where we might see the new houses being built we also asked for feedback on our Vision, Objectives, Policies, Community Facilities, Green Spaces and Heritage features that you consider important to be taken account of in our plan.

Landowners have submitted their land to be considered for development and AVDC have made a preliminary assessment of the suitability for us to consider. The next step is for the village teams and the Steering Group to look at the feedback from the consultation and put conclusions into the Draft Neighbourhood Plan for our parish.

We will feedback the results of the input and it will guide our work on the next stage. Our draft plan will be shared with parishioners and key stakeholders for comment before we assemble the final plan that will need to be approved firstly by AVDC and then by an independent Government appointed inspector. Assuming we pass those two approvals the final plan will then be shared with parishioners who will have simple Yes/No vote on the plan.

We are doing all we can to share information and progress with parishioners via public information sessions, flyers, articles in Focus and information on the parish website. www.edlesborough-pc.gov.uk

We have to, as a minimum, build the number of houses we have been allocated in the Draft VALP. If we don't our plan will fail the basic government requirement for a Neighbourhood Plan and we will have no protection from opportunistic development until the next plan cycle comes into force in 2033. Similarly, if you, our parishioners, don't approve the plan the same applies. So it is very important that you stay engaged in this process until we have our Edlesborough Parish Neighbourhood Plan finalised with all the approvals stated previously. It is unlikely that we can meet all the expectations of parishioners as we know some don't want any development and some don't want development next to where they live currently. Others welcome development and want to see more new people come into the village and increase the vibrancy and support for village activities and services.

We look forward to continuing this journey with you until we have a final approved Edlesborough Parish Neighbourhood Plan, early next year.

Remember, if you wish to challenge the number of new houses that Edlesborough has been allocated, you must do that via AVDC's VALP consultation referred to above. The Neighbourhood Plan cannot reduce the allocated number, but it does give us the opportunity to at least limit the amount of new houses to that number and distribute them in accordance with the wishes of the majority of the community.

BCC Services Devolution

In April of this year Bucks CC devolved some of its services to Edlesborough Parish Council this included the cutting of the grass verges within the 30mph limit, keeping some of the Rights of Way clear and maintenance of street signs etc. BCC has now informed us that they are unable to carry out some of their retained responsibilities as they have no funds for it.

The Council is currently investigating the costs of taking responsibility for the spraying of weeds in the kerbside and clearing additional Rights of Way. We expect to be able to address these issues this year.

Hedge Cutting

Following guidance from the NFU, RSPB & RHS the parish council will not be carrying out any hedge cutting throughout the villages between 1st April and 31st August unless the hedge, tree or shrub overhangs a highway or any other road or footway to which the public has access so as to endanger or obstruct the passage of vehicles or pedestrians, or obstructs or interferes with the view of drivers or vehicles or the light from a public lamp, overhangs a highway so as to endanger or obstruct the passage of horse-riders.



The Brownlow Avenue and Pastures hedges are planned to be cut in early September.

The parish council asks parishioners to ensure that the planting around the boundaries of their properties does not cause a danger or inconvenience to others.

Key Lime Pie

Often the most popular editions of the Weekend Kitchen feature loads of cakes and bakes Our recipes are tried, tested and wholly makeable at home, making them extremely popular with listeners

This all-American key lime pie, created in July to mark American Independence Day by Bedford cake designer Charlotte White (www. restorationcake.com) is rather epic. The biscuit base is topped with a very limey centre and the whole thing is finished off with show-stopping Italian meringue. It is wonderfully over the top! To make it easier, you can completely ignore the meringue layer (it will still be delicious) or replace it with piped whipped cream.

For the Base

80g unsalted butter

250g chocolate chip cookies or digestive biscuits

Crush the biscuits thoroughly and stir them in melted butter until completely coated. Press the damp, sandy rubble into the bottom of a lined springform cake tin. Make sure that the biscuits are pressed into the very edges of the cake tin. Bake at 150C/gas mark 3 for 30 minutes and leave to cool.

For the Lime centre

Zest and juice of 5 limes 2 cans of condensed milk

8 egg yolks

½ tsp lime extract (optional)

green food colouring paste (optional)

Mix together all the ingredients and pour them onto the cooled base. Bake for 25-30 minutes until set on top and with a little wobble remaining. Allow to cool completely before topping – this will take at least 2 hours at room temperature (and can be done the day before for convenience).

For the Italian Meringue Topping

225g caster sugar 50ml water

4 egg whites



Place the egg whites (at room temperature) in a bowl.

Meanwhile, dissolve the sugar and water in a small saucepan and bubble to 118C over a high heat. It's worth having a sugar thermometer here - they take the guess work out of the task and they needn't be expensive.

Once the sugar reaches 100°C, whisk the egg whites on top speed until they hold stiff peaks. This should happen just as the sugar reaches 118°C.

Pour the hot sugar syrup into the egg whites whilst the mixer is whisking - the syrup will incorporate quickly into the egg whites and a further 5 minutes of whisking is required to create stiff, shiny peaks of meringue.

Pipe or spread meringue on top of your lime centre and finish with a flourish of flames from a chef's blowtorch (or under a grill, although the effect is less dramatic). Alternatively whip up 300ml of double cream and pipe it on to the pie.

Nostalgia

The Dunstable Repertory Company

The Dunstable Repertory Company presented "The Wizard of Oz" at the Civic Hall in January, 1966. The production was deemed a great success, but with only a few hundred in the audience, it was clear that the Hall was far too large for the Rep. Dunstable was going to get a brand new library almost opposite the Civic Hall which meant that the old library in High Street South would fall vacant. The Rep were quick to seize their opportunity - the Chew's Trust governors leased them the vacated building and they formed themselves into the Dunstable 'Rep' Theatre Club, turning the old library into a delightful Little Theatre. In the meantime, the Rep presented their plays at Brewer's Hill School and Luton's Library Theatre. They also toured their productions around the Bedfordshire villages. After months of alterations, decoration and sheer hard work, Dunstable's Little Theatre was opened by Bernard Bresslaw on 5th October, 1968. At first, the theatre had just eighty seven seats on a flat floor. These were later replaced

When the Dunstable Town Hall was demolished, the Dunstable Repertory Company lost their home. Various venues were used but, in 1968, they opened their own Little Theatre which has proved to be a huge success.



with the seats and the raked floor from Whitbread's Lecture Theatre. When these seats came to the end of their life, the rake remained, but with major changes to the auditorium. the Little Theatre now had the ninety nine seats plus space for a wheelchair it can offer to this day. The stage, with a proscenium opening of twenty one feet and a depth of sixteen feet, is small but totally adequate. There's also room for set-building and storage with dressing-room facilities to suit the Rep's needs. With workshop facilities and extensive wardrobes, the company is self-contained and well able to present five full-length productions during its season from September to May. There's no doubt that the Dunstable 'Rep' Theatre Club has become a resounding success, fully justifying their affiliation to the prestigious Little Theatre Guild. Their membership is so large, nine performances of each production are required to satisfy demand. Such a long run for an amateur company demands a considerable commitment from its members. The Theatre Club encourages young people and offers "open" auditions to local actors in Dunstable, Luton and the surrounding district. Both Luton and Dunstable now had facilities for stage performances. Exactly eleven years later, Leighton Buzzard would join their ranks. However, there were other developments before the western side of the county got its own venue. (Information gleaned from 2007)

Rock, Pop and Dancing in Dunstable

The Dunstable California Pool Ballroom, a venue for regular pop and rock concerts, opened in a blaze of publicity on Saturday, March 12, 1960. A newspaper ad in *The Dunstable Borough Gazette* said it all:

"THE SPECTACULAR OPENING

built high above the town, overlooking thousands of illuminations

TV Personality * Recording Star
RONNIE CARROLL
Stage and Film Star
NON-STOP DANCING TO TWO STAR BANDS':

Admission on that opening night was 7/6, while additional benefits included fully licensed bars, spacious lounges and late coaches to Luton, Bletchley, Leighton Buzzard, etc. The California meant business; popular groups and bands were booked on a regular basis and proved to very successful. The Rolling Stones came in January 1964 and the Beatles were expected in July 1965. In January, however, there were rumours that the California Ballroom was to be sold and the Beatles didn't come after all.

Totternhoe Quarry and Totternhoe Knolls

Totternhoe Quarry

Last winter saw many volunteers carrying out a large amount of scrub work on the reserve. This was to create and maintain suitable habitat for the Duke of Burgundy butterfly and to control the growth of scrub encroaching on the rich chalk grassland flora. This spring was very late to arrive and the first sighting of the Duke of Burgundy was not until

the 5th May. This rare and declining butterfly has only a short flight season and will only be seen for 4-6 weeks in May and early June. This year is already proving to a better year for butterflies than 2015, with common blue, small blue, green hairstreak, dingy skipper and grizzled skipper all being recorded this spring. The Wildlife Trust has a team of volunteers monitoring them, if you would like more information on getting involved please contact Reserves office Richard Knock. Other highlights of this spring on the reserve has seen the Corn Bunting and Grey Partridge back nesting. These are both farm birds which are in decline; they make their nest on the ground and can easily be disturbed by dogs. This is why we are asking dog walkers to keep their dogs under close control from April - September in certain areas of the reserve. I am saddened to say that for the second year running no Turtle doves have been seen on the reserve. Totternhoe Quarry was once a stronghold for them, with Turtle doves nesting most years in the scrub behind the working stone pit. This very rare farmland bird has seen a massive 90% decline since the 1960s. We still live in hope that like the spring they are just running late this year.

Totternhoe Quarry and Totternhoe Knolls Orchids Monitoring

Following the long wet winter and the slow start to spring, the reserves have both

sprung into life. The late change of season has seen the orchids flowering slightly later,

creating an explosion of colour all around the reserve and it is now the reserve starts looking at its best. Totternhoe Knolls and Totternhoe quarry are both very important sites for orchids, with 8 different species of orchids being found there, two of which are rare and one locally rare. Totternhoe is the only place in the country where both Man orchids and Musk orchids can be found. Man Orchids flower from the end of May to mid-June, with Musk flowering afterwards from mid-June to mid-July. These orchids have both been monitored for many years, with some success in increasing their numbers. This year is set to one of the best years yet for Man Orchids on the reserve with the highest number in recent years being recorded.

Crackle, Pop and... Snap!

Four baby dwarf crocodiles hatch at ZSL Whipsnade Zoo

Four West African dwarf crocodiles (Osteolaemus tetraspis) have hatched at ZSL Whipsnade Zoo for the first time in 18 years.

Zookeepers are celebrating the arrival of the four dwarf crocs, which measure only eight inches long and are already exploring their



spacious, tropical enclosure and deep pool within the Zoo's colourful Butterfly House. Amara and Kojo, the Zoo's 39-year-old West African dwarf crocodiles last produced offspring in 1998, but on Christmas Eve 2015 the pair were spotted mating, and in March this year, female Amara laid eggs.

Amara closely guarded the nest for three months, and on Friday 17 June four eggs finally hatched, to the delight of Zoo visitors.

Team Leader Alex Cliffe said: "When the eggs were in the nest, we were monitoring them closely, ensuring that they were kept at the perfect temperature and humidity levels. Amazingly, even before hatching, the baby crocs can actually call to their mum from inside the egg. That means that she can help excavate them from the nest and carry the hatchlings down to the water for safety.


"Mum Amara is very protective of her little ones, so we are being careful not to disturb any of them during feed times.

"We are so excited to have four tiny new additions to our dwarf crocodile group. It's great to see them out and about in the pool, bonding with their parents and learning that crickets are tasty!"

Classified as vulnerable by the IUCN Red List of Threatened Species, the four little reptiles will be added to the European Studbook (ESB) for West African dwarf crocodiles.

Since the beginning of mankind itself primitive baskets, woven in some kind of nearby natural material, were in everyday use and still are in many poorer countries of the world, where they are still made in great numbers and are in daily use as housing as well as for carting, carrying and storage purposes.

Sandra has been weaving natural materials for 44 years and after many years of studying and hard work is now a yeoman basket maker and is a respected member of the Worshipful Company of Basket Makers and as such enjoys the freedom of the City of London, which permits her the honour of participating in the annual Lord Mayors Show parade, which she greatly appreciates. Her dedication and talent has given her the opportunity to travel all over the world teaching, exhibiting and demonstrating as well as studying and learning even more skills herself. She is excellent at what she does!

She was able to assist the British Army in Basra, for instance, helping them to resettle groups of swamp dwelling people who had been displaced by the war. Their homes, woven from local materials, having been destroyed, had to be reconstructed in their traditional style. some of them being large and very elaborate.

Did you know that when you watch them changing the guard outside Buckingham Palace, inside every Guardsman's bearskin there is a shaped frame made of willow over which is stretched the actual bearskin? They have to be precisely made in numerous different sizes and

are notoriously time consuming to make - think about it, there are an awful lot of Guardsmen - whole regiments of them in fact!

Sandra further demonstrated how to make a willow garden obelisk, plus displayed an array of willow objects and baskets in all shapes and sizes. These are still in use today for a variety of purposes, i.e. catching eels and cockles, fruit and veg picking, baby cradles, traction engine filters, repairing furniture and much more. Each and all of the items were truly a work of art and the talented Sandra is "master" of them all. A very much enjoyed evening.





This was localised while in Little Gaddesden and Dunstable the heavens opened flooding Dunstable town centre but here in Dagnall it was just a short burst of heavy rain recording only 6.4mm. The month continued cloudy with rain on most days with the dominant wind coming from NNE making it feel on the chilly side.

With night temperatures above 10°c and humidity exceeding 90% for much of the time this the was ideal conditions for potato blight, on inspecting the allotments I found blight on a few plots including my own which had been totally been destroyed.

Summer Holiday Tips from St Judes

The summer holidays are just around the corner so follow a few tips for a happy, healthy summer:

Gardening

when faced with a mountainous backlog of jobs, don't try to do everything in one go: break up tasks and take a rest.
 Tackle jobs like weeding at a

low height and cutting back of plants at a higher height. Take regular breaks - your joints will thank you for it.

Happy Feet – we see a huge increase in



foot pain and plantar fasciitis cases in the summer often due to poor footwear. Ordinary flip-flops give no support and

little shock absorbency and affect the fascia under the foot (it's a bit like a piece of gristle that acts like a bow-string to lift the arch of the foot). This feels like you're walking on sharp stones and if not treated properly, can take ages to clear so try some supportive sandals instead. Feet looking a bit tired? - use a pumice stone to remove hard skin and then apply a specialist foot cream such as CCS Foot care cream which is recommended by Podiatrists to

manage and help prevent dry and rough skin (available from St Judes)

Sunbathers back – too much of a good thing lazing around is not actually good for you. Try



to support your spine when sunbathing - if your back hollows when lying on the sunbed on your tummy, put a rolled towel or cushion under you to prevent backache. Look after your neck – it's better to keep your neck straight and place your hands on a rolled towel under your forehead than turn your head to the side.

Wet walkies? If it's raining cats and dogs avoid wearing your wellies as they don't offer much support - you are far better off wearing some walking boots.

Bracing Walk to the Carpenters Arms. Slapton

This should be regarded as a flat, comfortable walk that would take between 45 minutes to an hour (one way). Starting these directions from the Swan at Northall, you turn down South End Lane just off the A4146. Continue along the lane until you come to a right hand turning, where you bear right along this lane and continue until you reach a small gate. Follow this route, passing under trees that line the path, and you have a stream meandering on your left hand side. To your left, you

notice dwellings and eventually you come out at Slapton Lane. You cross over this road and rejoin the Two Ridges Link, clearly signposted on the other side of the road. You walk across a couple of fields with the stream now on your right hand side.

You can now just see the spire of St Mary's church in Slapton peeping out over the trees. As you walk towards this, there is a stile that you cross and you are in the back of the churchyard. When you get to the entrance of the church, you can either go through the lych gate or climb over the stile. At the main road you turn right and walk for a minute until you reach the pub on the left hand side.

It is a beautiful part-thatched inn with huge flagstones in the main bar area. You are always guaranteed a warm friendly welcome and there are always real ales ready to sample. The buffalo farm is also only a couple of minutes away if you fancy a visit.

8 Mile Hike to the Village Swan. Ivinghoe Aston via Ivinghoe Beacon

This is a more challenging walk that (excluding pub stops) takes approximately 90 minutes (one way). Starting these directions from St Mary's Church in Edlesborough, you walk along the bridlepath with beautiful open views towards the Beacon, Ivinghoe Aston and Coombe Bottom. You can often see pheasants, wood pigeons and the occasional dog walker along this path. This is a fairly flat bridleway and as you walk along it, you cross the ubiquitous footbridge. At the end of the path you reach the main road into lvinghoe Aston. At this point you can either pick up the Two Ridges Link on the other side, or turn left and walk up the road to join the B487. The first route is more scenic but brings you out at the Beacon at the steepest angle and this is a very steep climb.

Alternatively, if you walk up the road for 5 - 10 minutes you cross the B489 by a car park, and can reach the Beacon with a much easier climb. After climbing the Beacon and recovering at the top, you can walk back down the Beacon and retrace your steps along the main road into lvinghoe Aston. If you continue along this road instead of rejoining the bridleway you continue into lvinghoe Aston and come across the Village Swan.

This pub has a beautiful garden with plum trees and benches. The pub serves excellent food and also has seasonal drinks on tap such as mulled wine.

After recovering from the first leg of your walk, you continue along the road out of Ivinghoe Aston, heading towards Slapton. Here you reach Vine Farm and Moses Cottage and there is a signpost for a public footpath. You head down the drive and bear left to pick up the footpath. You cross a little bridge and after walking under mature trees, you walk along the boundary of the field and cross another footbridge - to your right is the site of an old moat. Here you eventually meet up with the road, which brings you back to The Swan at Northall, finely placed for another rest where you can enjoy the real woodburning stove in winter or the huge beer garden in the summer months.



Growing up in privileged surroundings in Khartoum, where her father is a Government official, Najwar is a young university student who although a Muslim officially, lives a secular life, greatly influenced by Western clothes, music and attitudes.

Her wealthy family pay lip service to the Muslim religion, but in their household, it is only the servants who Circumstances change radically when a coup overthrows the Government and Najwar's father is accused of corruption and executed. Najwa, her mother and twin brother Omar flee to London, where they own a flat. Over the course of time their lifestyle becomes straitened, Omar becomes addicted to drugs and turns to crime to support his habit, and is eventually sent to prison for what appears to be a long sentence. Meanwhile, their mother succombs to a long illness and dies. Orphaned and with few resources, Najwar struggles to survive. Not wanting to abandon her brother, she decides to stay near to him in London and becomes a maid, first to a relative and then, finding solace in the companionship of the women at a local mosque, she accepts a post to one of the young women there as a nursemaid cum maid of all work, whilst her employer, ironically, studies for a

degree.

Her employer's younger brother Tamer, begins to spend a lot of time with her as she looks after his little nephew. Inevitably, despite their age difference, they start to fall in love He is a rather serious boy, committed to his religion and gradually Najwar becomes more involved with Islam, starting to pray and wear a scarf. Her conversion becomes her security.

We had hoped that the novel would give us an insight into the Islamic culture and would help us to understand more about the Muslim faith and traditions, but felt that Leila Aboulela skimmed the surface rather and didn't go deep enough. We felt it a brave attempt to describe the differences between the two cultures, but would have liked a little more depth for a very serious subject.
