I was too young to be aware of the Cuban Missile Crisis so, perhaps for the first time in my life, it feels that world events are beginning to look scary. What a turbulent year 2017 has been already, we have a new president in the United States making and implementing radical decisions and picking fights with all and sundry whilst, here, steps are being taken to extricate this country from the European Union. Everything seems to be leading us away from stability and security; the lives with which we have become so familiar.

What is going on and how can we tell? We are told that we live in a post-truth world, that fake-news is rife. What, for goodness sake, is fake-news? Maybe it's another name for propaganda; maybe it's a new phenomenon, to distract us from truths the powerful would rather we didn't know about or think about. The media don't tell us – they seem to have their own agenda. It used to be that the fourth estate – the press and media – would report on events and expose crime and corruption among the powerful. Now the media shape opinions and tell governments what they should be doing; they have become all powerful. For us ordinary folk, the people who are going to become the beneficiaries or victims of our new political world, things seem so distant; after all, what influence do any of us have? What can we do? Is there anything we can do? Well, I suspect the answer to that question is "on our own, probably nothing," but we can work together as a community for the good of everyone.

One of the great strengths of the community here in our villages is the mutual support its people provide for one another. When I look at events like our Carnival, organisations like, for example, the Wednesday Club, St Mary's Parish Lunch, Salvation Army lunches, the work of our Parish Councils, the Good Neighbour Scheme, donations to the Foodbank, people who visit the sick and housebound there is so much going on here to provide mutual support. The people involved in those organisations may not know it but they are following an ancient truth known as the Golden Rule – the principle of treating others as one would wish to be treated oneself.

Jesus said, "Love your neighbour as yourself," but the maxim was already 2000 years old in his day. People throughout history from Ancient Egypt, China, India, the Near East, Greece Persia and Rome have all lived by this maxim.

The Golden Rule is an eternal truth; it is found in the writing of every religious tradition. In a world of lies, half-truths, alternative facts, fake-news we can rely on such an eternal truth and try to live our lives in accordance with its message. Do to others, do for others, for your neighbours, what you would like for yourself.

Do! Do, it's an active verb – not something to be hidden behind the walls of our homes, our places of worship. Make the effort, get involved in making this an even better community in which to live. The world we have known may seem to be crumbling around us but if we all pull together, if we love one another, we can protect our own little bit of paradise.



Edlesborough Parish Council News

Including Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall

Edlesborough Play Area

At the time of writing this report it is anticipated that the improvements to Edlesborough Green Play Area will be commencing in early March. Our contractor will be:

- Removing the central fence and bark chippings
- Laying new top soil to replace the bark chippings
- Installing RAPRA Approved safety matting and sowing grass seed.

When this work commences it will be necessary to temporarily close part of the play area for approximately six to eight weeks to allow the grass seed time to germinate. EPC ask that parishioners do not enter the area during this time. The main gate to the play area will also be replaced.

Neighbourhood Plan Pre-Submission Plan

The consultation period for the Pre-Submission Plan has now ended. EPC thanks parishioners for attending the meetings and their responses. EPC and the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group will now analyse all the responses, in addition to closely monitoring the situation with VALP and the CALA Homes planning application. Changes may be made to the plan where appropriate. It is imperative that EPC and the NP Steering Group follow due process, so as not to risk having the plan thrown out, which WOULD result in the villages having NO protection against even MORE and quite possibly even larger developments. EPC will then submit the Neighbourhood Plan to AVDC for approval.

If AVDC approve it an independent Government Inspector will examine it to see if it meets the requirements laid down for a Neighbourhood Plan. If so it may then be approved. Finally, the plan will be put to all parish residents on the Electoral Register to vote Yes or No. A simple majority of those who vote is needed to determine the result.

We have to have a plan that allows for the building of the minimum number of dwellings required by the Aylesbury Vale Local Plan. This should then give us protection from additional opportunistic developments until the next planning cycle in 2033.

If we fail to get an approved plan for our parish then AVDC and the developers will decide what, when and where to build for the next 15+ years.

Dog Bins

As many parishioners are aware there was an issue with the dog bins being emptied in January. It is the responsibility of AVDC to empty these bins for EPC. EPC reported the issue several times to AVDC but to date no explanation as to why the bins were not emptied has been received.

Should this issue occur again EPC reminds parishioners that poo bags may be placed in the green rubbish bins around the Parish. Poo bags are NOT placed in the

Green bins on the village greens. Alternatively please take the poo bag home. Please do not dump it on or around the overflowing bins as this creates a health and safety hazard to other parishioners.

Siding Out and Parking in the Parish

As you will be aware Bucks CC has devolved many responsibilities to EPC, this includes the siding out of pavements within the 30mph limit. In addition to this EPC have put extra funding towards siding out other pavements in the parish, including the following pavements:

- From Pine Road to Ivinghoe Way
- From Sparrow Hall Farm to Northall



• The pavements surrounding the Travellers Rest roundabout.

Our contractor has been working hard to restore many pavements to a minimum width of 1.1m. Unfortunately this is not possible in some locations due to the road layout.

Despite previous requests from EPC some drivers continue to ignore the Highway Code and EPC's requests to refrain from parking on

the pavements and the grass verges in our parish. EPC will forward photographs, with times and dates of repeat offenders to Thames Valley Police. Parking in this way is an offence and obstructs and seriously inconvenience pedestrians, people in wheelchairs or with visual impairments and people with prams or pushchairs.

Edlesborough Memorial Hall Improvements

EPC are currently considering quotes for panels to be installed in EMH to improve the acoustics of the hall. In addition EPC are also giving consideration to quotes for the interior of the building to be redecorated.

Streetlights

Please report failed streetlights in Edlesborough, Dagnall and

Northall to the Clerk for repair. When making a report please ensure you provide the Clerk with the information displayed on the lamp post.

Resurfacing of Edlesborough High Street

TfB have advised EPC that Edlesborough High Street has been scheduled for resurfacing and lining. If you notice any other road markings in need of repainting please report those to Bucks CC.

Allotments

Edlesborough Parish Council currently has vacant allotments. Anyone wishing to take on an allotment should contact the Clerk. Fees are £2 per pole and plots range in size from 10-20 poles.

The new Pavilion – current situation

Summary

The project to replace the tired pavilion on Edlesborough Village Green with a new efficient building serving sport and community activities and enhancing the enjoyment of the Green has been active since 2013. In that time we have many new parishioners and perhaps some who have been in the parish longer have lost contact with the project. It is the object of this report to help understanding of what the project is for, and give an update on its progress.

Background

There has been increasing concern over many years, often voiced by Edlesborough Parish Council (EPC), about the cost of maintaining and the suitability for purpose of the existing pavilion on the village green. Whilst the current building was erected to further the enjoyment of the green by EPC many years ago, it would not now match even the basic requirements, legal and otherwise, of sporting and other bodies and current building regulations. It is also not energy efficient.

EPC faced a decision in 2013 on what to do next. Demolition was even considered.

A public parish meeting was called and attended by over 100 people in Edlesborough Village Hall. A "post-it" note poll taken halfway through the meeting showed that there was no appetite to demolish the building, but also suggested a wide range of ideas for its future. A steering group was elected by the meeting with the responsibility not only of rationalising those ideas but also collecting views across the Parish before presenting recommended ways forward to EPC, based on perceived needs.

The steering group collected data in several ways, including many public parish meetings, stalls at local events and circulated questionnaires. All results were recorded and the resulting documentation is still available.

In January 2014, the steering group presented a possible design solution with some variants to EPC, based on a realistic evaluation of current and future needs as voiced by parishioners.

What the Parish asked for.

It should perhaps be said that views and data were being collected at a time when there was a heightened perception that Edlesborough village was losing community facilities. The last remaining village pub had closed and further housing development was being discussed putting pressure on other resources. The consensus of parishioners by a large majority was that the existing pavilion should be demolished and replaced by a more attractive and cost effective building offering facilities for both sport and community activities. There was a general view that these facilities should be for local parish use and not available to the wider public. This fits well with the EPC objective of the building further enhancing the enjoyment of the village green. The recommended solution includes majority requests to includes changing rooms, accessible toilets, a general purpose or gym room, a cricketer teas/community café area and bar, a committee/card/meeting room and storage and support facilities. The combination is meant to encourage sustainable 7 day a week operation throughout the year.

Where is the design now?

The proposed scheme was put to three parish meetings and some modification made. The steering group agreed in general to continue their involvement in the project and became trustees of a newly formed charity, the Edlesborough Community Sports Club C.I.O (ECSC) which secured a grant from a Government body of £15,000 to further the design and legal processes required to prepare documentation and apply for planning permission. Having taken considerable advice from a London based legal firm, a local architect and quantity surveyor and following pre-application advice from AVDC, planning application was made in February 2015 and full permission granted in March 2015. The permission has a 3-year term. The project has been costed by several quantity surveyors, whose estimates vary according to finishes and local volunteer work. An average figure is £600,000, which compares with local housebuilding costs. It is the intention to use local tradesmen wherever possible and hopefully keep cost to a minimum.

How will it be paid for and where are we now?

A condition of the project is that it will not impact the public or local purse beyond the level currently spent in supporting the existing pavilion. This, then, supposes that grants or similar, charitable or local donations will be forthcoming. Major funders usually available to this type of project include the Big Lottery, sports funders such as the Football Association and Sport England, and local development levies, often know a Section 106 payments (S106).

- The Big Lottery will not under their present rules consider an application from Edlesborough as it is regarded as an "affluent area" and should be able to fund the project by local donation.
- The Football Foundation initially approached ECSC via EPC. They wanted to make the green part of their sports development programme, having identified it as an ideal location for a regional sports hub. As part of that development they would have invested in the new pavilion. Two meetings were held but it became obvious that their plan would have restricted use of a considerable part of the common land part of the green and hence it was mutually agreed that it was not viable or desirable. Unfortunately, this also means we are unlikely to see funding from them for the pavilion.
- Sport England have a substantial amount of project funding available (up to £150,000), particularly from a new scheme which opened in February 2017. They need us to show how our project will impact on sports and community development in the parish, relating to Government initiatives for sport across all age groups. Two of our trustees are working on an application but need further input from local sports clubs (whether they use the green or not), to show how sport can be developed in the parish with activities for young and old.
- With the amount of development proposed or already completed included in the Edlesborough Parish Neighbourhood Plan it is likely that significant sums will accrue from S106 allocations. This can only be spent on projects relating to sport and leisure and the new pavilion is currently the only applicable local project. EPC has identified this with AVDC and S106 is expected to make a major contribution to funding.

• There have been successful local fund raising events including quiz nights, wine tasting, Pilates taster sessions, a fete for the Queen's birthday etc. and more are planned, including a black tie Ball in a marquee on the Green in September. There is also a "buy a brick" campaign where donors can have a brick in the building engraved with their name or that of someone close to them. These events not only raise needed funds but further involve people in the project. As the current committee members have already been working for more than 3 years fresh younger help would be much appreciated.

Summating the funds from these and some other sources we believe we have identified at least 2/3rds of the required funding.

Who will own what?

EPC has offered a lease to ECSC C.I.O. to manage and operate the pavilion for 25 years as a sport and community club for parishioners and related sports organisations. EPC will own the building. ECSC are cooperating with EPC to find sources of funding and where necessary to assist in their administrative processes. Under the terms of their charitable trust ECSC C.I.O. cannot own property.

Conclusion

The project to replace the existing pavilion is progressing well, if perhaps more slowly than many would like. From public reaction, particularly in local fund raising events, it still maintains an excellent measure of local support. It is suffering from a lack of volunteers willing to spend some time working for the good of the village/parish, but never the less is expected to enter a building phase during 2017/18 and we hope to be able to show significant progress by the black tie event in September.



January Update from the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group Not just about housing!

EBPC's Steering Group (made up of Parish Councillors and volunteer residents) are continuing to write the Neighbourhood Plan in order to protect our village from unwanted housing development.

We have been busy this month, the Environment Group continues their work collecting data on our bio diversity, reviewing green spaces, and identifying land that will prevent Eaton Bray growing into the next village. The Infrastructure Group has contacted utilities to investigate capacity (how can an overstretched drainage system cope with additional houses?) and by the time this is published a traffic survey will have been completed. Our third group is Housing, we have collected housing statistics and reviewed potential development sites in and around Eaton Bray.

Edlesborough Parish Council is working on their Neighbourhood Plan and issued their "Pre Submission Plan", below is an extract from our response to the consultation:

"Eaton Bray and Edlesborough are close neighbours and any future development will have an effect on each other, we have a shared doctors surgery in Cow Lane, similar traffic problems, we both suffer from poor drainage and flooding etc. We see the need to stand back and view future expansion across the two villages ... We would however welcome an increase in parking around the Cow Lane surgery."

We hope you found this update useful and in coming months we will provide information of the further work of the Steering Group. If you feel you can offer any support please come along to our meetings. However support doesn't need to be attending monthly meetings, perhaps you have the time to help with data collection/research.



Nigel's Thoughts Methodist Minister

Dear Friends.

The first day of March this year is Ash Wednesday which marks the beginning of Lent. Lent has traditionally been observed as a solemn time of self examination and putting our lives right, in preparation for our Holy Week commemorations and Easter celebrations.

My feeling is that this year, many of us are looking at the state of our nation



You will see what I am getting at. The things that we moan about (and folk will know that I'm not averse to a good moan myself) will nearly always pale into insignificance beside the troubles, struggles and disasters which many people have to face on a daily basis.

Quite a number of people have asked me recently "Where is God in all of this?" My reply is that the God I know may be found at the heart of each individual's brokenness and pain. He cries along with them and us. He understands our frailty for he has embraced our humanity, becoming one with us, his creatures, when he came in Jesus. Any lesser God, who did not

enfold all his children (without distinction) with love, would not attract my interest, let alone my faith.

It is in the "suffering, dying Jesus" that we may discover the "Christ upon the throne", and know that as the old hymn puts it that "the travail of our spirit is the travail of his own" (Singing the Faith 188 v 2).

That hymn - "There's a light upon the mountains" by Henry Burton, has long been of comfort to me during Lent and at other times. Perhaps the conclusion to its first verse will answer our need of the Good News that it is "about time for"....



Quarterly Report from Bucks County Council Councillor Avril Davies - January 2017

Since September there has been progress on several of the issues I reported to you back then.

Planning for school places has been given a high priority, joint working between planners and education has started, and local headteachers have had a positive meeting with county officers.

At the annual Transport for Bucks conference a promise was made to begin work on an HGV strategy and I put my name forward for the working group which kicks off in February.

The local area forum has sent the proposed letter to the police and crime commissioner on the enforcement of speed limits in rural areas where significant breaches have been evidenced by the speed watch volunteers. After an exchange face to face in the County Council chamber, the Chief Constable has eventually responded on his behalf in writing, which will be put before the next LAF meeting in early February. The proposals to change home to school

The proposals to change home to school transport policies for secondary school pupils have been abandoned, which is good news for the Division

The joint bid from Pitstone and Marsworth Parish Councils backed by the Local Area Forum to the New Homes Bonus fund has been successful and work is beginning on designing and building the footway to make walking between the two villages a much safer enterprise.

A new 'Active Bucks' County Council walk has been launched from College Lake, every Wednesday at 10.15am free to turn up and join, very much like the Monday walk from Ivinghoe Lawn, which is such a success that it will feature in a County Council video.

I visited the Greatmoor Energy from

Waste plant at Calvert which I know several Parish Councils have also done recently, and had a detailed look at a risk management group confidential briefing into how this can not only pay for itself, but generate revenue for the County Council. The financial success also depends on maximising recycling household waste, and there is still room for improvement on that score. There are also big gains for the environment in no longer sending waste to landfill, and in safely generating electricity with lower CO2 emissions than carbon fuels.

I attend the advisory board meetings for the Aylesbury cluster of children centres and I continue to be impressed not only by the good work they are doing in Wing and Ivinghoe but also by their wide reach out to and appreciation by all families with pre-school children. Where they have had to share sessions between centres they are hoping to facilitate more informal sessions on a voluntary basis.

However £500K of cuts for children's centres is proposed in the current budget. The County is yet again looking to reduce its spending by £46M in the next four years, 75% of which by 'efficiencies' and

Eaton Bray Cricket Club is kindly sponsored by Meadow Marquees, Houghton Insurance & Giblin Property. only 6% by cuts, but where efficiencies are not achievable, cuts are the result. The County's total budget is about £340M, of which £58M is in ring fenced grants. The £23M general support grant will only continue for the next two years, and although due to be replaced by a share of the business rate going to central government council tax will inevitably increase as the £46M of savings still needs to be found.

A decision on whether local government will change in Bucks to one single tier authority, like Milton Keynes, more than one single tier authority, or no change at all, will be decided in the spring by the Secretary of State.

It is going to be very difficult to deliver public services at a local government level in the foreseeable future. The opportunity for Parish Councils to take more responsibility for their own locality is an attractive proposition for some and a step too far for others. How this will turn out will depend not only on the Secretary of State and any future Council but also on how a local plan or lack of increases the pressures on the environment, our quality of life, and our roads, schools and other services in our communities.

Changes to Bucks CC Pothole Reporting

As from February 1, the County Council is encouraging all residents and Parish Councils to use its online reporting system to make them aware of potholes.

Significant improvements have been made to this tool which allows customers to receive updates direct to their inbox on how the council is resolving the issue. If a customer who phones in feels that a pothole or streetlight defect presents a risk of serious injury, they will be put through to the council's Emergency Team.

In addition, online 'contact us' forms have been created on the County Council's website, making it easier to deal with enquiries. These forms will direct people to the appropriate page to assist them, alternatively there is a general enquiry form to complete if they cannot find the answer or page they are looking for.

The forms are designed to gather the appropriate information required to answer enquiries at the first point of contact as they ensure all the necessary information has been logged right from the start. Currently many emails sent to the council contain incomplete information, causing delays in response.

From March 1, residents and parish councils will only be able to contact the council for Transport for Bucks-related queries via the Transport for Buckinghamshire online Contact us form, our Online Reporting System or telephone.

These upgrades are part of a wider plan to improve the customer experience for residents and parish councils.

John Chilver, Cabinet Member for Resources, said: "These new online forms will save residents and parish councils time, by preventing delays due to missing information, while also allowing them to track the progress of their report. They will also save the council thousands of pounds, as it is much cheaper to respond to web forms than emails or phone calls."

LOCAL HERALDRY BY JOHN HOCKEY

In this series, we take a look around local villages to find interesting and unusual heraldry.

THE EGERTONS OF ASHRIDGE

If you have been to the Bridgewater Arms in Little Gaddesden then you will probably have seen the sign that abuts the car park. This shows the arms of the Dukes of Bridgewater, whose family name



Scroop Egerton (Egerton Impaling Russell)

was Egerton. It is a nice, simple arms, as were so many early heraldic shields. The description or blazon is 'Argent a lion rampant Gules between three pheons Sable'. A pheon was a broad arrowhead, barbed on the inner edges – nasty.

There is much heraldry connected with the Ashridge estate and a number of Egerton monuments are to be found at nearby Little Gaddesden church, not far from the pub. In Ashridge House itself you are spoilt for choice. Above the entrance to the current building is a coat of arms in stone, with the colours delineated by lines and dots, which is known as hatching. Inside the entrance hall is a large stained glass window full of

shields to earls, viscounts and dukes and supporting part of the roof are a number of corbels of figures holding coats of arms of families that were linked to the Egertons by marriage. One such is for the 1st Duke, Scroop, who married firstly the daughter of the Duke of Marlborough (Churchill) and secondly the daughter of the Duke of Bedford (Russell). Such families are keen to show their allegiances at every opportunity!



Egerton: Argunt, a flor rampour gules, between there phoene soble.

Brownlow Or, an inescutcheon within an cale of marriets sable.

Cust: Ermine, on a chevron sable 3 fountaines-4 Compton: Sable, a flor passant or; between three esquires helms argent:

The heraldry does not stop there as the Monks' Garden at the back is designed with formal beds showing the arms of the relevant families connected with Ashridge: Egerton, Brownlow

(later owners), Cust (the Brownlow family name) and Compton (maiden name of Marion Alford, ref. the Alford Arms, Frithsden).

To obtain the first Earldom, granted in 1617, en-route to becoming Dukes, Sir John Egerton handed over a sum of £20,000 – worth more than £1M today.

Francis Egerton of Bridgewater Canal fame, was the 3rd Duke and is commemorated by the Ashridge Monument.

Carole Pollard (Slave of the Ring), gave us a calm, controlled portrayal of this






normally forgotten character. The costume was superb!

Top Tips for Healthy Tendons

As we age it gets harder for our muscles and tendons to work efficiently and to absorb shock and load.

Here are some really simple ways we can help our tendons stay healthy at any age:

- If it hurts, stop, modify or reduce the exercise or sport you're performing. The old adage of 'no pain, no gain' does not apply to tendon injuries and the old fashioned approach of working into/through the pain has been found to increase pain and lengthen the duration of recovery. Exercise must be low impact and strengthening work should produce only the mildest level of pain.
- Work on the flexibility of your muscles without overstretching them. Self-release with a foam roller will relax and release muscle groups without applying any force or tension to the affected tendons. A long hold of a normal stretch may not actually reduce your pain, but increase it.

• Isometric exercises are often given to people after surgery as they place little strain on the joint, or in this case, tendons involved. Tense the muscle for 10 seconds, (whilst continuing to breathe,) and then relax for 10 seconds, usually this process is repeated up to 10 times. It's vital that these exercises aren't progressed to shortening and lengthening contractions (such as squats or calf raises) until they can be performed pain free.

Our first meeting of the New Year 2017 in January, held in Eaton

Our speaker for the evening was Victoria Poulton from Woburn Abbey. This was her second visit and her talk on the history of Woburn was delightful. It was a fitting evening for his talk on 'Coronations through the Ages' given the day was the 65th anniversary of our Queen's Ascension to the Throne. Since William the Conqueror, he reminded us that funny things can happen at Coronations. His talk was both informative and amusing.

Colin explained that at their Coronation, the Sovereign is first presented to the people in simple dress. After swearing an oath to uphold the law and the Church, the monarch is anointed with holy oil or chism, and invested with regalia, (riches) and then crowned. Mary Tudor was the first woman to be crowned in her own right in 1553, followed in 1559 by Queen Elizabeth I.

Many coronations have been very elaborate and were not always held at Westminster Abbey. Colin explained the Stone of Scone, also known as the Stone of Destiny or the Coronation Stone, was used for centuries in the coronation of the

monarchs of Scotland and later the monarchs of England. We enjoyed hearing about the sandwiches that some of the Peers would keep hidden in their coronets, and even bats flying around at one Coronation. Vast sums of money were expended by some of the Kings for their Coronations. Colin was thanked for a very entertaining evening.

A letter of thanks had been received from Emmaus with regard to the recent Rucksack Project. Our W.I.s contribution had helped to fill 36 rucksacks with items that were kindly donated from other customers and supporters of Emmaus. The Edlesborough Rose


If you are new to Edlesborough Parish or indeed even if you have lived here for some time, you may not know about the Edlesborough Rose. You will however, certainly have seen its image atop our lovely village signs and also part of the Edlesborough School logo which is emblazoned on the children's jumpers.

The Edlesborough Rose is a unique medieval memorial brass which has been associated with the history of Edlesborough Church for many centuries. It has travelled a bit in its time having had stays in both Pitstone Church and Ashridge House chapel during the 19th & early 20th centuries, and more recently it has languished for 33 years in a bank vault in Bedford where it was taken for safekeeping after the theft of another brass from the church.

As those 33 years ticked by, the memories of those who had placed the brass there or who had been active in the church at that time, grew dim, and when the newly reformed Friends group started to ask, there was no direct answer to the question of the Rose Brass's whereabouts; hence began a four year Quest to find this

precious artefact.



Traditional Sticky Toffee Pudding with Butterscotch Sauce



There was a time when no self-respecting restaurant or gastropub would dare to not have sticky toffee pudding on its menu. Luckily, this classic dessert has survived being so ubiquitous and remains one of my absolute personal favourites. This version has been created by chef Adam Whitlock, who holds two AA Rosettes at Gilbey's Restaurant in Amersham. His pudding is bouncy and fluffy and sits in the moreish butterscotch sauce. Plus with all those dates, surely it can count as one of our five-a-day? You can make everything in advance if you want and just give the pudding and sauce a quick blitz in the microwave before serving.

This will serve 4 and a few more so freeze any that you have left over.

Ingredients

225g butter 225g soft brown sugar 225g self-raising flour 225g pitted dates 4 eggs 290ml boiling water 2tsp bicarbonate of soda

Method

First, rehydrate the pitted dates in the boiling water. Once they have plumped up, pop them in a food processor to chop them up. Failing that, chop them finely with a sharp knife.

Melt the butter on a low heat in a pan or in a microwave and mix all the cake ingredients, including the dates.

Prepare a large square baking tin by lining it with greaseproof paper, pour in the cake mix and bake in a pre-heated oven at 150C/ Gas Mark 3 for around 35-30 minutes. You'll know it's ready when it is nice and golden, risen and a skewer comes out of it clean.

To make the butterscotch sauce, mix together 1 tablespoon of black treacle, 1 pint of double cream and 55g light brown sugar. Bring to a gentle boil and leave it to simmer until it starts to thicken. When the right consistency is reached, pass it through a sieve to take out any impurities. Cut the sponge into rectangles and serve them on top of a really good drizzle of the sauce in deep bowls.







Jumbo joy for elephants moving into new £2 million home

Centre for Elephant Care to open at ZSL Whipsnade Zoo this Easter

The Zoo's nine-strong herd of Asian elephants will be packing their trunks and moving into their new home this April; a luxurious new barn set amidst 20 acres of rolling paddocks.

With ZSL Whipsnade Zoo leading the way in elephant care, the new centre provides more than 700m² of indoor space for the elephant herd, including eight-month-old calf Elizabeth.

Visitors to the Centre for Elephant Care will be able to witness from a balconied viewing platform the strong bond among the herd as they socialise together and also get a unique insight into the daily attention lavished on the pampered pachyderms by their zookeepers. Custom-designed by award-winning architects, the Centre for Elephant Care will comprise a host of elephant-friendly features such as one-metre deep soft sand flooring to provide maximum comfort and dimming lights to mimic night-time conditions.

Other exciting details include timed feeding pods, which release food regularly during the night and six giant oak trees for the elephants to use as scratching posts.

The Centre for Elephant Care will provide the perfect complement to the herd's seven grass paddocks, plus the picturesque Chiltern Hills the elephants enjoy exploring during their daily 2.5-mile walk around the 600-acre zoo.

The whole family can also attend several intriguing talks to learn about Asian elephants' fascinating biology and behaviour, as well as the amazing conservation work carried out by ZSL (Zoological Society of London) to protect the species in the wild.

the WI

Our meeting was held in the Memorial Hall on 10th January. We had a local speaker, Paul Heley, who spoke on the

subject, 'Highwaymen and Highwaywomen'. Paul gave an informative and illustrated talk to the WI ladies, starting off with a rendition of a poem entitled, 'A Bedfordshire Farmer', which settled his audience into an interesting evening. Mention the word 'Highwaymen' today and for many people a romantic image often appears. During the seventeenth century, which was when these 'characters' began to appear; the word affected the general population in a similar manner. Wealthy young ladies apparently swooned over these polite, well-spoken, young sons of the landed gentry during the 1640's. These young men had been former Royalist officers, during the English Civil War. Before joining the army to support the king, there had been no need for them to learn a trade and as a consequence of losing the war; and their inheritance, the only thing that they were able to do in order to obtain money was by stealing it.

However, not all highwaymen at that time were English. A famous highwayman in England during the seventeenth century was the Frenchman, Claude Duval. While he was a youth in France, he met the exiled members of the English aristocracy and returned with them to England; probably as a page to one of the families. This employment did not last long and he was soon working as a highwayman, where he showed great charm, was adored by all who met him and had the ladies swooning over him. Apparently he was supposed to have stolen £400 from a gentleman but returned £300 after dancing with the gentleman's wife. After a ten year robbery spree, the young Claude Duval was captured, tried and hanged aged twenty six years. The most famous of all the highwaymen must be Dick Turpin, who was born in 1705, the son of a prosperous, decent innkeeper, in Essex. He was sent to school, apprenticed to a butcher and

bought a butchery business. However, the life of smuggling, deer poaching and robbery seemed much more appealing.

Dick Turpin became an extremely violent and sadistic villain. An example of this occurred when he tried to elicit from an old woman the whereabouts of her money. In order to make the old woman talk he forced her onto the fire. £100 was put on his head which later was raised to £200. Having escaped to Lincolnshire and Yorkshire from Essex, he was captured and hanged.

Dunstable and the surrounding areas were not exempt from those villains. One such villain was known as Gentleman Harry, who was born in 1717 and brought up by his grandmother. Having escaped London for Ireland, on route stopped at The Bull in Dunstable and then at The Star in Hockliffe, before falling asleep only to be woken by the Hue and Cry. He was sent to Bedford Gaol and from there was hanged in 1747 at Holborn, London aged thirty years.

Other characters Paul mentioned were: Henry Claydon who hid out in Flitwick, Jack the Lather of Edlesborough (surname was Leather) but was given that name because he was a highwayman and was caught at Church Farm, hiding in the stables with the horses he had been exercising, with their mouths foaming. His ghost is said to be roaming the area. Lastly, there was a highwayman known as Robert Snoaks, who lived at Boxmoor and was hanged for his crimes on 11th March, 1802.

Finally, Paul told the ladies about two highwaywomen in particular; although there were a number he referred to. The first was known as the 'Roaring Girl' who was very disrespectful and renowned for cutting off purses from their owners' clothing or body and also for receiving stolen property and then selling it back to the owners. Eventually she bribed herself out of being executed, which cost her £200 but she went on to lead a normal life until she died in 1659, aged 75 years, of dropsy.

Last but not least, Paul spoke about Lady Catherine Ferrers, otherwise known as the Wicked Lady. Born in 1634, Catherine was married when she was thirteen to Thomas Fanshaw, who was sixteen. Both families were Royalists. The story has it that Catherine was bored with her marriage and met Ralph, a farmer come highwayman. She was supposed to have dressed as a highwayman and together they were said to have robbed travellers between Markyate and Wheathampstead. One night however, Catherine was shot and fatally wounded. She

died on 13th June, 1660 aged twenty six years. She was buried quietly in the evening and the reason given for that was supposedly owing to her being a highwaywoman. It was not until work was carried out on her home, Markyate Cell, during the nineteenth century that a secret passage way was discovered.

On that exciting note, the talk came to an end. All the more interesting because a large amount of information was of local interest.



I recorded below zero temperatures on 18 days during the month which equalled 169.5 hours but there were many more hours of frost, as frost starts to form around 2°c. This plot shows the temperatures dropping as the Pressure/barometer rises 14th – 27th





Summer in February by Jonathan Smith

The book is set in Cornwall in the years just before the First World War. In West Cornwall, a group of artists are working together at Boskenna and become known as the Lamorna group, three of whom are destined to become famous Royal Academicians, namely Dame Laura Knight, her husband Harold and Alfred Munnings who was the Academy's president in later life.

At the start of the book Munnings was at the start of his distinguished career and was seeking recognition, sponsors and commissions. His character appears mercurial and driven, totally self absorbed and devoted to his art. Into this bohemian group comes a catalyst in the person of Florence Carter Wood, whose beauty has an effect on both the Knights, Alfred Munnings and a young land agent, Gilbert Evans whom the group has befriended. The artists want to paint her, Munnings falls in love and Gilbert Evans is fascinated from afar. Florence, with her brother as chaperone, has been sent by her parents to learn to paint. They come from a rather more privileged background than the artists and the dynamic of the group changes. Gilbert is the outsider, watching the group, observing their tempestuous lives and becoming more friendly with Munnings. When Florence announces that she and Munnings are to be married,

Gilbert's hopes are dashed. However the marriage does not prove to be successful. Munnings neglects Florence, leaving her in Cornwall whilst taking extended trips to London. Inevitably, she turns to Gilbert Evans for comfort and the scene is set for a tragic love triangle. The book creates a great sense of place and time and the atmosphere of creativity. The artists are drawn accurately from a great deal of research done by the author, although many of the more intimate details cannot be checked. The reader's interest is stirred by knowing that the main characters were real and the events written about did happen. Their works and lives can be researched further, giving the book an extra dimension. The book group enjoyed the novel, although we were all puzzled as to why Florence embarked on such an unsuitable marriage. A film has been been made from the book and is recommended. as the photography of Cornwall and the images of the paintings also add to the overall enjoyment of the book.

'We can praise God for the victories over sin and the devil we have seen during the past three months. When we first came things did not look very bright....


