# Eaton Bray with Edlesborough Parish News

One of the remarkable things about Jesus was the stories he told – we call them parables. They are stories that have a deep meaning, designed to challenge people's thinking. Even more remarkable, most of Jesus' parables are highly relevant to today's circumstances. For example, last year I had to preach on the Sunday before the European Referendum when the Gospel reading for the day was the story of Gerasene swine. Like a number of ministers around the country I was able to demonstrate just how much Jesus' parable had in common with the arguments on either side of the referendum vote.

Today I want you to recall a different story; it's a parable that is only found in Matthew's gospel - Chapter 25: 31-45. When Jesus first told the story it well and truly shocked those who heard it and it is just as profound today. Some people know the story as 'The parable of the sheep and the goats', others as 'The final judgement'.

In the parable Jesus identifies two sets of people. To one set of people he said "I was hungry and you fed me, thirsty and you gave me a drink; I was a stranger and you received me in your homes, naked and you clothed me; I was sick and you took care of me, in prison and you visited me." The other set of people, Jesus said, did none of those things.

The parable reports confusion in both groups — 'When did we see you hungry, thirsty, a stranger, naked, sick, in prison?' they said. Obviously neither group could recall having seen Jesus in distress, but Jesus' startling retort was "I tell you, whenever you did (or didn't do) this for the least important person, you did it for me". Once again Jesus turns upside down the concept of 'neighbour' — not just the person who lives next door but any person, anywhere, and especially those who are the most vulnerable and most in need.

It is easy for us to turn a blind eye to the suffering of poor peoples around the world – much of which has been inflicted on them through the actions of governments and big business so that we in rich nations can continue to live the comfortable lifestyles to which we have become accustomed.

The church talks a lot about the hope of life after death, but many of the world's poorest peoples get little chance to experience life before death. Today, sixty five million people worldwide face the terrible choice of fleeing conflict and disaster or making dangerous journeys in search of safety, perhaps risking their children's lives at sea in a plastic dinghy. Well this month there is no excuse for turning our back on the world's poorest people, for

Well, this month there is no excuse for turning our back on the world's poorest people, for the week from 14-20 May is Christian Aid Week. Christian Aid Week was set up 60 years ago to support refugees in Europe following the Second World War—today the world faces a similar international problem and once again there is an urgent need to help relieve suffering and build a world where everyone has a safe place to call home.

When someone knocks on your door and asks you to contribute to Christian Aid please don't ignore their request. How will you respond to Jesus' appeal on behalf of the world's neediest people?



### Felling/Trimming Trees on Parish Council Land

In line with procedures set out by Central Bedfordshire Council, it is the Parish Council's policy NOT to top, lop or fell otherwise healthy trees that would otherwise need no maintenance to alleviate problems such as the build of leaves, seeds, bernies or other minor debris on a neighbouring property to... allow more light to a property, where the trees in question would not otherwise require any surgery, improve television or satellite reception, prevent roots entering already broken pipes. If a tree/hedge does not have birds nesting or if a tree does not have a tree preservation order, we can only work on it if there is a health and safety risk or the tree is diseased. However, residents are entitled under law to cut back to the boundary line any branches/hedging overhanging their property line.







### Edlesborough Parish Neighbourhood Plan Update

Edlesborough Parish Council began the process of developing the plan in 2015 and a lot of time and hard work has been put into communicating with parishioners at every step of the way. We established a Core Team from the Council, a Steering Group including parishioners and Village Teams of parishioners to work on the content of the plan. As previously required we published our Pre-Submission Plan for consultation in December with a closing date of January 27th. The responses received were reviewed and modifications made to the plan where appropriate. We are now at the next formal stage of getting the plan approved. Our 'Final' Submission Plan was sent to AVDC on 6th April 2017 who posted the following message on their website.

'As the Local Planning Authority, we are now required to undertake a publication period to provide an opportunity for all parties to comment on the submitted proposals before the plan goes ahead to Examination. The consultation will commence on Thursday 06 April 2017 and run for a 6 week period, closing at 5pm on 18th May 2017.'

At the end of this consultation phase all comments received will be reviewed by the examiner.

Edlesborough Parish Council encourages everyone to submit their comments to AVDC whether or not you agree with the Plan. Don't just assume that because you don't have any objections that you don't need to comment. If the Examining Inspector only receives objections to the Submission Plan, he/she may assume that it has little, if any, community support and will be more likely to reject it and consequently it may never reach the referendum stage.

If you support the Plan and want it to succeed please send in your message of support. Previous messages of support you have sent cannot be carried forward to this stage of the process (government rules!) Please note that this time your comments need to be sent to AVDC and not the Parish Council. 

### EATON BRAY PARISH COUNCIL Neighbourhood Development Plan

### LOCAL HERALDRY BY JOHN HOCKEY

In this series, we take a look around local villages to find interesting and unusual heraldry.

#### A FLAMSTEAD HATCHMENT

In the wonderful church of St Leonard's in Flamstead there is much to delight the eye. Among the many treasures are seven *hatchments*, diamond shaped boards which adorn the walls and are a remnant from the funerals of well-to-do families in the area. These were hung outside the house of the deceased and then transferred to the church at a later date. The word hatchment is a corruption of the word achievement and on each board would be the relevant coat of arms, complete with supporters if any, helm, crest, motto etc., in fact all the trappings 'achieved' during their lifetime.

By looking at the background colour, one can tell who has died in a marriage, white for still living and black for death. If, as here, the background is all black, then both partners are now deceased.

This hatchment is to Sir John Saunders-Sebright, 7th Baronet who passed away in 1846. His wife Harriet pre-deceased him by twenty years.

Looking at the main shield, the top left quarter refers (as always) to the family whose arms these relate to, in this case Sebright. Additionally we know this man was a baronet as there is a small white shield charged with the 'red hand of Ulster' this being the accepted sign for a baronet, an hereditary honour brought in by James I in 1611. The rest of the main shield is quartered with other families that married the Sebrights. In the bottom right quarter are the arms of the Saunders family, which depict elephants, their trunks seemingly waving in some mediaeval breeze! The other quarters refer to the Ramsey and Ashe families.

One other point of interest is the small shield in the centre of the main arms. This is known

as 'an escutcheon of pretence' and shows the arms of Sir John Saunders' wife, Harriet Crofts. The description or blazon is 'Or three bulls heads couped Sable' i.e. on a gold background there are three black bulls heads. cut off cleanly. It is so positioned because she was an heiress in her own right and in time any sons would be allowed to quarter her arms with those already on the shield.

Loads of indulgent ingredients, bound together by a can of condensed milk, to create a perfect snack or lunchbox treat, especially for your children or grandchildren. It's also ideal, as traybakes often are, if you need to rustle together a cake for the school fete or a cake sale at work.

This is a big treat bar, packed with flavour, fun... and calories!

#### For the base

300g digestive biscuits or graham crackers 125g butter

#### For the topping

200g chocolate chips

100g fudge pieces or butterscotch chips 60g raisins

100g pecans, coarsely chopped

150g flake sweetened coconut desiccated)

60g toasted hazelnuts, halved or roughly chopped

398g can of condensed milk

I am not sure I know Equipment: food processor or blender, 35cm x 25cm deep baking tin, greased and lined

> Preheat the oven Gas Mark 4/180C/350F.







A warm and friendly welcome awaits new members. At each meeting there is an interesting speaker or demonstration, followed by social time and refreshments.



My Brilliant Friend by Elena Ferrante Due to a recent storm of publicity, there can be few people who are not familiar with the series of books, written by Elena Ferrante, that are known collectively as The Neapolitan Quartet. Elena Ferrante is a nom de plume and for twenty years the true author has remained unknown. Recently however, journalists have claimed to identify her and the resulting publicity has led to many press articles about the books, which already had somewhat of a cult following. 

Elena Greco narrates the story and she describes her daily life, her family, the neighbouring families and the ongoing struggle to survive, shared by all. Elena is quiet and studious and obviously bright. At school she meets Lila

Cerullo, the shoemaker's daughter and they become friends. Elena is fascinated by Lila who is her polar opposite, a free spirit, undaunted by rules and regulations. From an early age she challenges convention and flouts discipline. The girls become firm friends, but there is always an element of competition as they go through their school life. This introductory novel takes us through the girls' education and adolescence, finishing when they are sixteen. This leaves readers with a dilemma; are we engaged enough with Elena and Lila to carry on with another three books? This is difficult, as we only have childhood experiences and school life on which to base our interest. The author also gives us a picture of Neapolitan life in great detail, the teeming neighbourhood. the petty squabbles between families and also hints at the corruption and gang violence behind the scenes.

Our reading group, with only two exceptions, were unimpressed and felt that the book did not live up to its publicity. We found it easy to read but over long

and a little repetitive. The many families, some playing only minor roles, are difficult to assimilate and the English seems bulky and doesn't flow well at times: but perhaps that is because it is a translation. One of our group christened it a Marmite book, and the majority of us, although we should like to know what happens to Lila and Elena in adult life, did not think we would rush to read the other books.

### **HM** The Queen Opens Centre for Elephant Care

ZSL Whipsnade Zoo's brand new Centre for Elephant Care was given the royal seal of approval today (Tuesday 11 April) as HM The Queen, accompanied by HRH The Duke of Edinburgh, officially unveiled the elephants' £2m home.

Set amidst 30 acres of rolling paddocks, the custom-designed **Centre for Elephant Care** is the new home for the Zoo's herd of nine Asian elephants.

Highlighting ZSL Whipsnade Zoo's elephant-expertise, the Centre provides more than 700m<sup>2</sup> of indoor space, and is fitted out with a host of elephant-friendly features, including one metredeep soft sand flooring to provide maximum comfort and dimming lights to mimic night-time.



Interactive displays will allow zoo visitors to try their hand at a jumbo pedicure, as they practise on a life-size model elephant foot, highlighting just some of the extraordinary one-on-one care given to the animals at Whipsnade. The latest addition to the herd is ten-month-old calf Elizabeth, who was named by zookeepers in honour of Her Majesty, as she was born the day before The Queen's 90th birthday celebrations in 2016. The Queen, who is Patron of

international conservation charity ZSL (Zoological Society of London), which runs ZSL Whipsnade Zoo, enjoyed a private tour of the Centre where they met Assistant Curator of Elephants, Lee Sambrook and watched the elephants receive a pedicure.

HM The Queen, accompanied by The Duke– former president of ZSL – then unveiled a commemorative plaque commemorating the event, during a special ceremony where Her Majesty and His Royal Highness each fed Donna the elephant a banana.

Asian elephants (Elephas maximus) are classified as endangered on the IUCN Red List of Threatened Species, and due to habitat loss, human conflict and poaching their wild populations are in decline. The species are also listed on ZSL's EDGE (Evolutionarily Distinct and Globally

Endangered) list, meaning there is a particularly urgent need for conservation action. ZSL is working in Thailand – a major stronghold for Asian elephants – to reduce human-wildlife conflict and ensure the peaceful coexistence of elephants and humans.

Visitors to ZSL Whipsnade Zoo will be able to view the herd in their new home when the Centre for Elephant Care opens to the public on Wednesday 12 April, 2017.

#### Weather Conditions for March 2017



### Edlesborough W.I.

At our March (2017) meeting, Jeff Rozelelaar gave us an enlightening talk, explaining

what it was like being born in the 1940s in a Jewish family in the very deprived and poor East End of London. As he readily said, everybody living there was in the same situation- large families, overcrowded and small terraced houses, without any facilities, other than the outside loo at the end of the back yard and many too with the Father out of work. (Think the period of Call the Midwife.) The dawn to dusk bakery was opposite his home and Joe's café was immediately next door and his cramped bedroom permanently smelt of baking bread etc. and greasy bacon, invading its small space. Hence the title of Jeffs talk, "Bagels and Bacon."

He told us many anecdotes of his childhood, one being when a V2 Rocket blasted off the wall to the Public Bath House (remember these? I do), thereby exposing its clients in various states of 'the nuddy'.

He didn't feel that it was all bad for the many children living there as their playgrounds were the many streets, the bomb sites, disused factories and buildings, Hackney Marshes and even the cannons at the Tower of London. They were often cold and hungry. There were no restrictions placed upon them by anyone, regarding what time they had to go home or go to bed etc. Without toys and proper play areas etc. their imaginations were all that was necessary- they had so much freedom, and made up all their own games and sorted out all their own problems.

He attended a primary school where the children's playground was on the roof of the building.

When he joined the Secondary School, it was "more-or-less" in the complete control of the Teddy Boys (remember them? I do.) Their HQ was the outside school lavatories (I remember these as well.) The "Teds" created so much smoke from puffing away at "their fags" therein that the newly-appointed Headmaster sent for

the East End Fire Brigade and told them that the school lavatories were on fire. When the "Teds" appeared after their soaking, their drape jackets were "drapier" than usual and their creepers (shoes) like wet sponges. The reign of "The Teds" at this particular school was thereby, now at an end.

An intuitive teacher at this same school recognised Jeff's potential and he therefore went onto further education and eventually became a teacher himself. His whole talk was littered with Cockney Rhyming Slang and bursts of Cockney songs (Don't jump off the roof, Dad) springs to mind. He also sung one song in fluent French.

Jeff also said that the Cockneys were generally a cheerful and resilient lot of people.

It has to be said that quite a number of our ladies remembered and could identify with the period of Jeff's talk, and I certainly did, and yes it was tough, but not all bad.

It was altogether an entertaining talk, taking us back down Memory Lane.

#### **Salvation Sound**

I have just been to see the film Lion. The story is based on a true story of a five year old child in India in 1986 who comes from a poor but happy rural family. On a trip with his brother, Saroo finds himself alone and trapped in a moving decommissioned passenger train that takes him to Calcutta, 1600 miles away from home.



Totally lost in an alien urban environment and too young to be able to identify himself or his home to the authorities, Saroo struggles to survive as a street child. Eventually Saroo finds himself in an orphanage in India before being selected to be adopted by the Brierley family in Tasmania.

While Saroo grows up in a loving, prosperous home he finds that he is still plagued by his memories of his lost family. He tries to search for them, even as his guilt drives him to hide this quest from his adoptive parents.

His quest is painstaking and full of frustration but eventually his perseverance pays off and he recognises a landmark. Saroo tracks down his long lost family and an emotional reunion takes place. This idea of seeking the lost is a key theme in the Bible. Jesus tells us that He had come to seek (Luke 15). He gives us a deeper glimpse into his heart into His heart by comparing Himself with a shepherd who leaves ninety nine sheep to seek one who was lost, with a women frantically searching her house for a lost coin, with a father who constantly looks to the horizon for any sign of his returning prodigal son, and with a merchant seeking merchant seeking the pearl of greatest price.

The Bible portrays God as a seeking God who longs to be reconciled to us. Seeking is part of God's

nature.

In the parable of the merchant seeking the greatest pearl we see that we are the pearl that He gave everything for. Our God does not stand at a distance impatiently waiting for us to come to him, He reaches out to us. He did not just create us and leave us to make the best of it. The events of Easter show that His sacrifice was driven, and His obedience motivated by His desire that we would enjoy a close friendship, a loving family relationship with Him. He gave everything for us. He died on a cross.

Like Saroo, His quest is painstaking but a happy ending, an emotional reunion is promised to those who believe in Him.
