This year Harvest Festival will be celebrated at St Mary's on Sunday 17th September and at Dagnall Church the following Sunday. Over the centuries, celebrations of Harvest Festival have changed to reflect changing times. In the Middle Ages, the festival was at the beginning of the harvest gathering season on 1st August. Farmers

made loaves of bread from the new wheat crop and donated them to their local churches. These were used as communion bread in a service giving thanks to God for the harvest. The festival was known as Lammas or 'loaf mass'. Over time, the Lammas celebrations died out.

The tradition of celebrating Harvest Festival in churches was reintroduced by Reverend Robert Hawker in 1843. He was vicar of St Morwenna and St John the Baptist church in Morwenstow in Cornwall from 1834 until his death in 1875. When he arrived, there had not been a vicar in residence for over a century so he had much to do. On September 13th 1843, he put up a notice inviting his parishioners to a special thanksgiving service during which the old custom of making Eucharistic bread from the first corn would be revived. The notice read: 'Let us gather together in the chancel of our church, and there receive, in the bread of the new corn, that blessed sacrament which was ordained to strengthen and refresh our souls.'

The custom of gathering to give thanks for God's provision spread so that Harvest Festival celebrations became widespread. Victorian hymns such as 'Come ye thankful people come' became popular, as well as 'We plough the fields and scatter' which was translated from German. These all helped to make the Harvest Service a special occasion. Another custom which caught the public imagination was the idea of decorating churches with home grown produce from people's gardens and allotments.

Linked with thanksgiving for God's provision was the recognition that many people struggled to have enough to eat. School records of the Victorian era show numerous occasions on which children were absent because they were working to contribute to the family finances. Fortunately this no longer happens in the UK but in many other parts of the world, child labour is common.

This year at Harvest, St Mary's will be supporting the Bishop of St Alban's Harvest Appeal 'Full of Beans'. All money raised will go to a project in the Philippines where the lives of people in the remote rural villages in the Tinglayan Mountains are being transformed. They are being given the means by which to grow crops with plentiful harvests, especially beans which are well suited to their climate. Good crops of beans enable families to eat well and the surplus can be sold at market so that they have money to spend. This will provide basic household supplies such as soap, sugar and salt. It also means that children can have educational resources for their schooling.

The 'Full of Beans' appeal will enable more families to experience this transformational change, to become more self-reliant and hopeful for their futures. Churches and schools across the diocese will be participating in the appeal and there is a just giving page for those who want to give directly. I hope you will come along to our Harvest Festival celebrations and support the Bishop's Appeal to help transform the lives of some of the poorest communities in the world.







So how do you judge the success of the Carnival? Perhaps the weather is a contributory factor in the success of the Carnival. Well, I pray for calm and overcast – so when we have calm and overcast we can hardly grumble!

Perhaps another measure of the success of the Carnival is the atmosphere on the Green. My thanks go to the Parish Council who allow us to use this beautiful location and to everyone on the Carnival Committee who work so hard to create that atmosphere, organising the site to meet the requirements of all the stallholders. Related to the atmosphere on the Green it is remarkable how little trouble we experience. Thank you to so many members of the community and stallholders who act as the eyes and ears of the Carnival nipping any nuisance behaviour in the bud. But thanks, too, to PCSO Jackie Dodson and the paramedics team from Pro Medicus for everything they do to keep us safe.

Another measure of success might be the attendance; there seemed to be more people on the Green than ever. We write to all the households on the procession route requesting owner's vehicles to be parked off the road and, with the assistance of AVDC who loan us 100 cones, we try very hard to keep traffic flowing. Fortunately the procession managed to navigate the procession route safely, though the mast of the Scouting Vikings' did have a battle with trees behind the pavilion. Congratulations to everyone who contributed to the procession, especially to Edlesborough School and the Scouts each of whom won their Class. My thanks and congratulations, too, to everyone who decorated their houses. I cannot remember a year when there was more colour via displays and bunting.

My next measure of success is the increasing number of shops, tradesmen etc. who use Carnival to promote their businesses. This does have a financial benefit for the Carnival but the Organising Committee try very hard to ensure that the businesses get a good return for their money through publicity and goodwill.

My two final measures of success that may not be on your list but are very close to the top of mine. They both relate to the massive force of volunteers without whom it would not be possible to run our Carnival, including those who mark out the Green, stall holders, car park attendants, people who close the roads and who try to maintain a smooth traffic flow, those who erect marquees and the 'heavy gang'. My thanks to all of them – I'm sure you will enjoy being part of a highly inclusive team.

I've missed a measure of success for those of you who took part in the Grand Draw, Silent Auction, Chainsaw Carving or many of the other stalls involving draws. Maybe you are still waiting to hear whether or not you won the trip to Rome. Well, I'm sorry to say that if you haven't heard by the time you read this then you'll have to wait until next year. Thanks again to all those local businesses that were so generous in donations of prizes to these stalls and to those households throughout the villages who gave such a warm welcome to people selling Grand Draw tickets.

Already the Organising Committee is preparing for next year. Our first meeting will be on 5th September where one of our tasks will be to allocate money raised at this year's Carnival. Edlesborough Parish Council News

Including Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall

Dogs on Edlesborough Green

Edlesborough Parish Council and AVDC have both received complaints regarding dogs on Edlesborough Green.

EPC remind parishioners that the Byelaw No 4 states the following:

"A person shall not cause or suffer any dog belonging to him or in his charge to remain in the ground unless such dog be and continue to be under proper control and effectually restrained from causing annoyance to any person and from worrying or disturbing any animal."



Some people interpret that to mean all dogs must be on a lead at all times, but what constitutes effective restraint depends to some extent on the dog and the owner. An unruly dog on a longish lead can cause problems, whereas a well-trained dog that responds immediately to its owner's commands can be effectively restrained without the use of a lead. The problem with any byelaw of course is enforcement. Thames Valley Police have provided

the following information:
The law states that dog on dog attacks are a civil matter, where owners should exchange details and the offending dog's owner should cover any vets costs; however they do not

- have to.
 If the injury is a serious one, people can call the police who would look at whether or not
- that dog is a danger and could oversee payment by liaising between parties.
- Dogs being a nuisance and not in proper control, is a dog Warden issue and should be reported to AVDC Environmental Health.
- Dogs that bite a person causing injury is a police matter and the police should be called every time.
- In addition if a dog is seen fouling and it is not being picked up and photographic evidence is presented the police can issue an on the spot fine as can a dog warden.

EPC reminds dog owners that:

- Not all users of the Green are "dog people" and an excited dog bounding up to say hello can be terrifying to adults, children and other dogs.
- Dogs must not enter the play area under any circumstances.
- EPC provides numerous dog bins around the edge of the green, all dog owners must clear up after their dogs.

If you think you witness any users of the Green breaching the Byelaws please report this to Thames Valley Police on 101. A full copy of the Byelaws is displayed on the Pavilion, parishioners can also request a copy from the Clerk.

Potholes, & other road issues & Rights of Way

It is possible to upload pictures of potholes and road surfaces directly to the BCC website. On the main webpage click "Tell Us About A Problem", and then follow through to "Report a Pothole", "Report a Right of Way", or "Tell TfB" for any other highway issue. This allows BCC to log potholes and other issues and provide you with a tracking reference number so that you can see what progress is being made on the issue you reported. Vision Splays – Under Bucks CC Devolution EPC are responsible for cutting the grass verges within the 30mph limit. Any vision splays outside the 30mph limit are the responsibility of Transport for Bucks and should also be reported to the website above.

If the plan is approved by the examiner AVDC will organise a referendum. All parishioners registered to vote can participate. Hi again from the Parish Council Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group.

We missed reporting the last two months as we were waiting for the release of Central Bedfordshire Council's (CBC) **draft Local Plan** (LP). In law the Neighbourhood Plan cannot conflict with the LP.

The pre-draft Local Plan was issued on 20 June and the full draft LP formally released on 4th July. We have been very busy carefully reviewing CBC's intentions and plans along with the Green Belt Review which, for a village within the Green Belt, is key to future development. Housing within the Green Belt is only allowed under "very special circumstances" hence our desire to carefully review CBC's policies.

Following release of the LP on 4th July CBC commenced an 8 week consultation where we, the public, have an opportunity to comment and potentially alter the Plan. Should you like to attend one of CBC's "drop in" sessions the nearest is on 9th August at Caddington Sports and Social Club 2.00pm to 8.00pm.

The Steering Group have decided to hold two open public consultation meetings to inform and discuss our work so far and to give villagers an opportunity to have their say. Topics which we will present include:-

- The Green Belt
- CBC's proposals for development in Eaton Bray
- Sustainable housing
- · Built heritage
- Biodiversity

We will also ask you questions:-

- What development would you like to see in Eaton Bray?
- How many houses would you like built?
- What would you like to see protected, landscape / village character/ Flora & Fauna etc.?
- HAVE YOUR SAY!

We plan to hold two consultation meetings so that if one date is inconvenient then hopefully you will be able to attend the other. These meetings are important as we very much wish to obtain a consensus of opinion across the village. Dates are:-





HGV 7.5T RESTRICTIONS

There are still a number of Lorries ignoring the restrictions, the Council ask residents to continue to record any lorries breaking the ban (ideally with photographic evidence) and forward details to CBC/Highways (copying in the Parish Council). There are exemptions to the enforcement: emergency services, in connection with any building operation, highways maintenance vehicles, agricultural purposes, public service vehicle purposes such as buses, in connection with professional driver training or testing, local delivery.

AMENDMENTS TO ADVERTISING BOARDS/SIGNAGE IN THE PARISH

The Council have reassessed their current policy and are making the following amendments:

"There is to be no advertising on Parish Council land without the prior consent from Eaton Bray Parish Council, the Council will remove any unauthorized advertising within the parish. Sponsored



remove any unauthorised advertising within the parish. Sponsored advertising boards must be able to clearly show the sponsored event and not be overshadowed by the organisation sponsoring the signage. Inappropriate signage will be removed or the organisation sponsoring the event will be asked to replace them with more suitable signage. Advertising boards (if approved) can be placed in the following locations and must be removed immediately after the event:

- (1) Entry to village (Harling Road): 1x sign
- (2) Entry to village (The Rye triangle): 1x sign
- (3) Three Corners: 1x sign
- (4) Market Square: 1x sign"

The Council's current signage policy will remain for this year before being replaced with the new policy as of January 2018. All applications for advertising boards/signage on parish land must be applied for on an annual basis.

BUS ROUTE/TIMETABLE CHANGES

A communication was received by Transport/Central Bedfordshire Council with the following details:

"Over the coming months [CBC] will be liaising with the operator South Beds Dial a Ride to review their feedback and that of the drivers ... who have listened and taken on board comments raised by customers. Both the operator and [CBC] wished to allow the service to operate in its current form, to determine passenger numbers, movements, opinions and timetable schedules ... the 43 is an amalgamation of 2 areas, Studham to Dunstable service and the Dunstable to Leighton Buzzard, via Totternhoe and Eaton Bray service. Any amendment to one service will impact on the other ... the services have to interwork to ensure a service was provided to both areas, to separate them so they run independently would effectively double the cost of the contract ... this would also make both services inefficient and lead to the possibility of one being withdrawn completely and as Studham has no other service, the likelihood is that Eaton Bray with 2 other bus services serving the village would lose the 43 ... [CBC] will liaise with the operator to determine feedback and thoughts and any progress... please do however update us on any other comments or concerns that may have been raised, so that we can give them consideration when reviewing the service."



LOCAL HERALDRY BY JOHN HOCKEY

In this series, we take a look around local towns and villages to find interesting and unusual heraldry.

BERKHAMSTED

This time we are going to look at another funeral hatchment. This one is part of a set of four found in St Peter's, Berkhamsted.

Normally, on a hatchment you will find a shield with two coats of arms side by side, one for the husband on the left or Dexter side, one for the wife on the right or Sinister side. Occasionally (as found in one of the other four hatchments here) the wife's coat is placed on a small shield in the middle of the husband's arms—this means she was an heiress in her own right. In either case the background colour to the hatchment explains who has died, black

indicating dead, white meaning still living. Looking at the fourth hatchment, shown here, we can see that the shield is divided into three parts, rather than two, so what is going on? This is a case where the man has married twice. His arms are shown in the middle strip, his first wife's on the left and his surviving wife on the right. We know she is still living as the background behind the shield on her side is white. You can see that the crest which lies above everything else in this hatchment is a silver lion with a golden crown and that is shown within the black part of the hatchment - confirming that it is the deceased man's crest. Note that it is the same as the four charges on the middle shield surrounding the silver



(argent) cross. That cross has a ragged edge which is called 'engrailed'.

Turning to the surviving wife's arms on the right, this is unusual in that it uses a relatively



rare form of charge known as 'flaunches'. Always shown as a pair, they are curved shapes on the side of the shield. In between is a stag's head face-on and the correct description or blazon is 'Sable a stag's head caboshed between a pair of flaunches Argent'. The arms are for Parker. There is a monument to Elizabeth Parker in the church. The motto is 'Resurgam' meaning 'I will rise again' and is a message of hope rather than the family motto.

Messing About in Boats

Born in Hull, just a few miles from the river Humber, at the ripe old age of 17 my family moved to Liverpool as my father had a new job, with a salary of £1000 per year. Learning to park, oops sorry moor the boat is one thing, then there is reversing, well that's a trick in itself as it does not do what you expect! Plus how the devil do you flush the toilets?

The first lock you encounter is destined to send you into a frenzy, and why is it that at your first attempt a large crowd of people are watching hoping that you make a mess of everything, they are not to be disappointed. My desire not to embarrass myself soon came to a sticky end, it was

farcical mixed with slapstick and, "OH NO, someone wants to moor alongside of me in the lock, what are they doing!!" In time this manoeuvre soon became perfection, well perhaps that's a bit strong. Wanting to progress, I decided to take a Skippers course at the age of 59 in sunny Devon. My second day was spent in a force 8 for many hours off the coast of Plymouth, sea sick, are you kidding! I was fortunate to work for a company who owned a 38 foot yacht in Lymington, so weekends and yes, some week days were spent on the boat. "But boss, can you not see I am entertaining important customers" I was heard to sav.

Although we live in the Chilterns and many hours away from the coast, we are blessed with beautiful canals with lots of boating opportunities some as close as Leighton Buzzard, plus many other locations spread across the country.

One thing is for sure, you will relax, the pace is slow as the country side dashes past at 6 mph. It's easy to find a relaxing place to moor for lunch, honestly it's difficult not to find an unattractive place on the whole canal system, and in the evening enjoy the pub food on the canal side or eat on deck.

You can cycle along the footpath or watch a furry friend swim past you whilst you enjoy a coffee.

Once you master the locks, learn your knots and get the mooring right, and hey! how do you flush that flipping loo. You will be hooked.

It shows the censored information that my grandfather was allowed to send from the battle front at Ypres.

The postmark bears the date 17 July 17

On that same date Thomas Hale was killed in action.

The picture above was taken on Palm Sunday 7April 1968 being the very first time that any family member had seen the headstone for Thomas Hale

My diary entry for that day reads "Spent all day looking for Grandfathers grave in the area around Ypres. Absolutely dotted with graves of English, Australian and other soldiers, all kept as if they were a day old. We were successful after a very long search along dusty lanes and narrow footpaths. Photographs of the grave, cemetery and fields surrounding"

Three years later I took my father over to Belgium to see his fathers resting place.

Obviously I never knew my grandfather and sadly neither really

did my father as they only had a few hours together on a brief visit home from the Front when my father had recollections of a stranger, covered in mud, suddenly appearing in his home in Bath and being greeted lovingly by his mother.

To my knowledge Kate Alice Hale, widow of Thomas Hale, never left these shores and she brought up two



sons, three if the 1911 census of England and Wales is to be believed, on her own. She died in 1972 having been a widow for 55 years.

The ultimate sacrifice made by Thomas Hale and millions like him hopefully made the world a safer place, immediately post war.

The war to end all wars? Sadly it was not.

Now 100 years after the death of Thomas Hale, the photograph right, taken less than a month ago by a

lifelong friend, gives an indication of the continuing fantastic work carried out by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission in the upkeep of the memorial to the fallen.

Summer Holiday Tips from St Judes

The summer holidays are just around the corner so follow a few tips for a happy, healthy summer:



Gardening – when faced with a mountainous backlog of jobs, don't try to do everything in one go: break up tasks and

take a rest. Tackle jobs like weeding at a low height and cutting back of plants at a higher height. Take regular breaks - your joints will thank you for it.



Happy Feet – we see a huge increase in foot pain and plantar fasciitis cases in the summer

often due to poor footwear. Ordinary flip-flops give no support and little shock absorbency and affect the fascia under the foot (it's a bit like a piece of gristle that acts like a bow-string to lift the arch of the foot). This feels like you're walking on sharp stones and if not treated properly, can take ages to clear so try some supportive sandals instead. Feet looking a bit tired? - use a pumice stone to remove hard skin and then apply a specialist foot cream such as CCS Foot care cream which is recommended by Podiatrists to manage and help prevent dry and rough skin (available from St Judes)



Sunbathers back – too much of a good thing lazing around is not actually good for you.

Try to support your spine when sunbathing - if your back hollows when lying on the sunbed on your tummy, put a rolled towel or cushion under you to prevent backache. Look after your neck – it's better to keep your neck straight and place your hands on a rolled towel under your forehead than turn your head to the side.



Wet walkies? If it's raining cats and dogs avoid wearing your wellies as they don't offer much support - you are far better off wearing some

walking boots.


Heritage Open Days 2017







Rose to Swim the English Channel

At the end of August an Eaton Bray resident Rose Hawkins, aged 24, will be attempting to swim the English Channel! Rose has always loved swimming, having swam for the county and club whilst growing up. When Rose said she wanted to take on the huge challenge of swimming the channel, we knew her determination and positive attitude was going to benefit her. Not only in the commitment to a gruelling training regime but the actual swim ahead of her. As part of her training Rose will attend Swim camps at Lake Windermere, Dover and Bournemouth. Her six hour qualifying swim was achieved on the 3rd June 2017 in Bournemouth. On 2nd July 2017 Rose swam the length and back of Lake Windermere, allowing for crossing etc. the distance travelled was 24 miles. Rose entered the water at 4.30am and swam continuously for 13 hours. She was accompanied by two men in a small boat guiding her and feeding her every hour. This was a huge challenge in itself and a big incentive towards her final Challenge.



Rose is combining indoor pool swimming with open water sessions. Tiddenfoot Leisure Centre have been very supportive allowing her to have a lane allocated for endurance swims to just her.

The Channel swim is 21 miles (shortest distance from Dover to Cap Gris-Nez) but there is a big chance she will swim much further (up to 35 miles) than that depending on the tides and shipping lanes. Roses expectation is to complete the swim between 12 - 16 hours. A pilot boat will accompany her, with her parents, sister and cousin on to supply her with food, support and sustenance via a pole and net as no contact with the boat is allowed. The swim will be attempted wearing just a costume, goggles, grease, and swim hat. A wetsuit is considered a buoyancy aid so is not permitted. Some of the hazards Rose may encounter are jelly fish stings, sharks, tankers, ferries in the shipping lanes, sewage, hyperthermia, tide changes every six hours and weather changes. The psychological effect is every bit as challenging as the physical.

Rose is training every day despite holding down a full time job as a financial advisor

in Milton Keynes. The commitment and determination she is showing is making us all extremely proud.

Edlesborough W.I.

Our meeting was held in the Memorial Hall on 13th June when our speaker, Colin

Oakes, spoke on the subject of: 'Allotments and the Strange People Who Serve in Them'. Colin introduced his subject by explaining that he would be looking at the matter from a personal perspective and that working on allotments was a lovely occupation which involved fresh air, hard work and exercise. There followed a brief history of some of the different types of vegetables. for example carrots were originally purple. Apparently, the Dutch were the first to crop the orange carrots that we recognise today and there are also brown and yellow versions. Not only did Colin provide a history of the vegetables but he also gave an outline of the history of the allotment: which originated with the Normans, who 'allotted' land to the villeins; hence the name 'allotment', through the Tudor period; with the Poor Law and Land Enclosure Acts, the Victorian period; when in the 1840's, land was allotted with the aim to keep down crime and to the present; with the role of the parish councils. Working on an allotment provides one with the opportunity of growing many different types of vegetables and accompanying the growing of one's own food supply is the source of an enormous sense of satisfaction. However, allotments are not confined to the sole purpose of growing vegetables. Colin pointed out that it was fascinating to see how allotments were used as areas of relaxation, where people grew numerous varieties of flowers and constructed interesting sheds; many of which had interiors with curtains at the windows and the walls were book lined. Colin's love of allotments was first 'planted' as a young child when his grandfather introduced him to the strange and wonderful world of keeping an allotment. As a student of Archaeology at Leicester University, Colin was reintroduced to the world of allotments but this time it was

through necessity. Colin's grant took many

months to materialise and in the mean time he had to eat. He applied for an allotment and while Colin waited for the land to produce, he survived on mince, oval, melts (the lining of an animal's chest cavity), rabbit, hare, hedgehog and road kill. Road kill is not a straight forward matter. For instance, if a pheasant is killed by a car, the driver is not allowed by law to take that bird. If however, a pheasant is killed by a car and that driver leaves the body, anyone else who passes by is allowed to take the body for food.

After what seemed a long time, Colin's hard efforts in preparing the allotment began to pay off and he began to reap his harvest. All this time Colin was asking his fellow allotment holders questions such as: what is this vegetable called and are you growing that for the show? Apparently he asked so many questions that he became known as, 'Nosey Colin'. At the same time he began to notice that his fellow allotment comrades were rather strange characters. Homemade rhubarb wine was a favourite tipple on the site and tobacco was grown—for one's own use, to name a couple of enterprises. Allotment keepers are not allowed to sell their produce but there is nothing to stop them exchanging produce.

As a student of Archaeology, Colin was very interested to note that the manure pile was a good source of seventeeth century smoking pipes and glassware. He made a great fuss of this fact only to discover that the source was not the actual allotment site but that the manure had been brought in from several sources and dumped at the allotments. As a result of his fanatical interest he was asked to go to another allotment site.

Colin's interest in keeping an allotment was obvious but he ended his talk with a warning that pilfering can be a problem. However, this state of affairs does not hamper the enthusiasm allotment holders have towards the love they have for their 'hobby'.

From the 12th we didn't have any rain for 15 days, the total month's rainfall was 38.8mm that's only 70% of the 10 year average. On the 17th the temperature started to climb to 28°c and for the next 4 days we were


in the 30s with a maximum temperature 32.6°c, night temperatures above 15°c and humidity climbing above 90% which made it difficult to sleep.


Temperature Red Humidity Purple

The Gustav Sonata by Rose Themain

The book group welcomed the choice of Rose Tremain's latest novel. We were all familiar with her work and have read and enjoyed several of her books in the past. She is a well respected author, having won many awards for her writing and is now Chancellor of the University of East Anglia, and has also been made a CBE.

The Gustav Sonata, although a relatively small book, tells an immense story. It manages, succinctly to relate the stories of two central characters, their backgrounds and their lives over the course of sixty years: whilst also filling in historical detail, making the book feel more rounded. Rose Tremain does not deal in superfluity, every word she writes, counts.

The book is set in Switzerland. Its neutrality during World War Two and its post war difficulties makes for a very different and thought provoking setting. The story's main protagonists are Gustav

Perle and Anton Zwiebel, who meet as little boys at kindergarten. Gustav is a lonely child, whose father died when he was a baby, and Emilie his mother, seems unable to give Gustav the emotional warmth and love he craves. Life is a struggle for Emilie. When she married, her husband was the Chief of Police, but when

he helped Jewish people to cross the border to Switzerland illegally, he lost his position and her life changed radically. His early death has made her life even more difficult and she has remained embittered. She finds it hard to accept Gustav's new friend, who is Jewish and whose parents are wealthy. Anton is a very nervous little boy, who Gustav is encouraged to take under his wing at school. He is also a very talented pianist and his parents have great ambition for him. Because of his nervousness he is totally unable to perform on stage and every competition he enters brings more disappointment. Over the years, helped by Gustav's encouragement, he finds a solution and is able for a time to have career in music.

Gustav however, never leaves his hometown of Matzlingen. He is devoted to his mother despite her coldness and neglect and looks after her until the end of her life. His circumstances have changed and he is a wealthy, well respected citizen, but is still a very repressed, uptight individual.

The middle section of the book tells the story of Gustav's parents and this, together with the childhood of Anton and Gustav, gives the book depth and more information about the characters. It was astounding, how much the book managed to achieve in only 240 pages and left me with much to think about. I felt the book was about

the innocence of childhood, the effect of events outside on that innocence and the waste of life when bitterness and acrimony take hold.


The members of the book group all enjoyed the book and thought the characterisation excellent. We would recommend it as a very good read.
