When I was young I had a poetry book which was all about happiness. The poem began: 'Where does happiness come from? What makes happiness start? How does it come out of nowhere and into a person's heart?' It then went on to suggest different ways in which happiness is generated. What is the secret of happiness? This is a question which humankind has been asking for generations. Marcus Buckingham, whilst he was a researcher for the polling group Gallup, asked thousands of women a series of questions to discover the answer. The women polled came from a range of backgrounds- rich and poor, working, retired and full time Mums. He was intrigued to find from their responses that happiness for them was not linked to actual circumstances but was more about attitude.

Frederick William Harvey was a prisoner of war during the First World War. Whilst in the Holzminden camp in Germany, he wrote the humorous poem, 'Ducks'. His whimsical observations were prompted by discovering a fellow inmate had drawn a picture of ducks in a pool of water at the camp. He discovered beauty and humour even in the most difficult of circumstances.

'All God's jokes are good-even the practical ones!

And as for the duck, I think God must have smiled a bit

Seeing those bright eyes blink on the day he fashioned it.

And he's probably laughing still at the sound that came out of its bill!'

(Extract from 'Ducks' F.W.Harvey)

Taking delight in the natural world and the wonder of the moment is something which Christian teachers of prayer have advocated for centuries. The theory is that if we take time each day to notice the present moment rather than worrying about the past or fretting over the future, we will be more content. So, to go for a walk and notice the wonderful array of colours in the fallen leaves is a moment of wonder. A few moments sitting and listening to a favourite piece of music without doing anything else can be uplifting. Appreciating the aroma of a meal cooking, or relishing the feeling of getting into a warm and comfortable bed at the end of a busy day can be moments of delight.

All these are small instances which can easily be missed if we are too busy to take notice. And yet, they only take a few minutes of our time to appreciate them. That has a knock on effect of helping us feel more thankful for all the good things we enjoy. And this in its turn makes us feel happier and enables us to have a more positive approach to life. Cherishing the moments when we are happy helps us to face the times when it is very difficult to rejoice.

When people came to Jesus he taught them to trust in God. 'This is why I tell you not to be anxious about food and drink to keep you alive and about clothes to cover your body. Surely life is more than food, the body more than clothes. Look at the birds in the sky; they do not sow and reap and store in barns, yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not worth more than the birds? Can anxious thought add a single day to your life?' (Matthew chapter 6 verses 25-27)

The Lord's Prayer also encourages us to take each day one at a time, to give thanks for what we have, to ask God for what we need and to trust in him. Perhaps that really is the secret of true happiness!





Work on our Neighbourhood Plan (NP) has continued this summer, we held our first village "drop in" meeting on Monday evening 14th August 2017 and the second on Saturday 16th September 2017. 



New Housing Developments in Edlesborough. Dagnall and Northall You get your say on October 5th

Just when you thought we were done with referendums, along comes another one! But this one is just for us, affecting the residents of Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall. It will determine the future development of the villages until 2033. The referendum gives you the chance to vote for, or against, the Edlesborough Neighbourhood Plan. on October 5th.

Neighbourhood plans are a recent government initiative that give local communities some input into new developments within their areas. If a neighbourhood has an approved plan, then the local district planners must work within its recommendations, rather than consider every new planning application that they receive. The Edlesborough Neighbourhood Plan was developed over the last two years after several consultation phases with residents of the village. It limits developments in the village until 2033, and also makes some provisions for expansion of the school and the surgery sites.

Aylesbury Vale District Council has a target for new housing, set by the government. It divided up its total requirements and decided that our parish must accommodate 184 new homes. But recently approved developments - opposite the school, in Cow Lane and Dove House Close, for example - are already included in that number, leaving a requirement for about 60 additional

new homes, which are all provided for in the Neighbourhood Plan.

Graham Neill is a village resident and chairman of 'Yes for Edlesborough Parish Neighbourhood Plan', an independent group of residents hoping to protect the character of Edlesborough and the surrounding villages. "Of course, new homes will add to pressure on local services," explains Mr. Neill, "so we're concerned people may vote against the plan because they think it will mean fewer new houses. But voting yes to the plan is the best way to prevent even more houses

being built in Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall."

Graham Neill has worked as an architect for many years and is very familiar with the attitude of commercial developers. "If we vote no," he adds, "then commercial developers will be free to propose new builds for as long as they want to, with no provision for school or surgery expansion, and no concerns for local needs. It's important to remember that we don't have the option of getting a lower number of houses than the plan. That's why we're encouraging everyone to vote YES on October 5th, to limit new building until 2033."

So, it's no use complaining once the diggers move in! You have the opportunity to control new development in Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall, by voting in your very own referendum. YES to approve the plan and limit development until 2033, NO to leave new building in the hands of commercial developers.

Eaton Bray Good Neighbours has been one of the most successful Central Beds schemes in its first year, according to Simon Patterson, the BRCC organizer responsible for setting Neighbours up these projects. The AGM took place on 12 July with a relatively small but lively attendance of enthusiastic members. The

Chairman's report noted that in its first year the number of clients had reached 45, the scheme had attracted 44 volunteers and some 465 jobs had been undertaken. The existing honorary officers all agreed to stand again and were duly re-elected. Three weeks later a Members' Summer Social and Supper Party took place at the home of the Chairman, Kay Griffiths. It was a very pleasurable event with a wonderful array of delicious food and drink brought by all the participants.

The Befriending Group has been very active too. In addition to the normal individual visits there have been some happy and interesting outings. A group of clients and volunteers enjoyed a lovely visit to Ashridge in July and there was a very successful trip to (and on !) the Leighton Buzzard Steam Railway in August. Very warm thanks to all concerned, especially Bob and Liz Burton who are shortly leaving us to live in Scotland. Their kindness, commitment and support for the Good Neighbours will be very much missed.

LOCAL HERALDRY

In this series, we take a look around local towns and villages to find interesting and unusual heraldry.

WING

All Saints Church, Wing is much visited by historians because it has an Anglo-Saxon apse and crypt – architectural features occurring in only a few churches in the country. It also has a number of magnificent monuments to members of the Dormer family who lived at nearby Ascott House.

The smaller memorial to Anna Sophia Dormer (who died of smallpox aged 22 in 1694), situated in the nave has a shield which is a text book exercise in good heraldry. It is clear, unambiguous and attractive.

The first thing you would notice, without reading the inscription on the monument, is that the shield is lozenge or diamond shaped, rather than the normal design you might expect. This is because a lozenge shape is reserved for a woman – it being unthinkable



in mediaeval times that a woman would fight in battle and hence she would have no need of the traditional shield shape born by a knight. Sometimes this makes for a rather messy design as different *charges* as we call the lions, crescents, stars and the like that decorate a coat of arms are crammed into a space which is not really big enough for them. But here, the design fits nicely. The background or *field* is *azure* (blue) with ten *billets Or* (rectangular bars, in this case coloured gold). Above, coming out of the bottom of the *chief Or* – i.e. the top third of the shield, here coloured gold, is a *demi-lion*, which I think is self-explanatory. He is ready for battle (*rampant*) and is of Sable or black tincture, with a red tongue and claws. In heraldry we say *armed and langued Gules*. The adjective *langued* coming from the same root that gives us the word 'language', and *Gules* of course means red. The full description or *blazon* would therefore be:

Azure ten billets four, three, two and one Or. Issuant from a chief of the last a demi-lion rampant Sable, armed and langued Gules. Simple enough?

CORPORAL WILLIAM HENLEY DCM, MM

William Henley was born in 1886 at the top of Gammons Lane (later to become School Lane) Eaton Bray to John Henley an Eaton Bray man and Sarah Jane Henley nee Boarder born Ivinghoe Bucks. The family like many in the area were Duck breeders. William was the third and last child being a brother for Fred born 1880 and Rose born 1882.

Not an easy start for young William and the family as in 1890 father John died at the age of 37. Two years later Sarah Jane married Harry/Henry Varney 15 plus years her junior still living on what was now known as School Lane.

William on leaving school became a Duck breeders help and later was employed at Wallace's Fruit Farm.

There is a reference to him in Maurice Sanders' book "Wood Wurlitzer and Wesley" driving a horse drawn cart up Lancot Hill with 40 bushels of apples on board.

In 1911 William was boarding in School Lane with Alfred and Mary Fountain and grand daughter Mary Nichols who later on that year he married in Eaton Bray.

At the outbreak of war while still working at Wallace's it is thought that he volunteered and joined the 24th Battalion Royal Fusiliers London Regiment and was posted to France in 1915. His regiment fought in some of the fiercest battles of the war including

Loo's, The Somme and CambraI.

During his service he was awarded the Distinguished Conduct Medal (being mentioned in dispatches 3 times*) and the Military Medal.

Being demobbed in 1919 he returned to the village and his job at Wallace's where he continued to work until his death at Three Counties Hospital in Stotfold on 2nd September 1935 aged only 48.

He was buried in Bower Lane on 7th September 1935

London Gazette January 10th 1920 G/60813 Cpl. W. Henley, M.M., 24th Bn., R. Fus. (Eaton Bray, Beds.). In the operations against the *enemy's trench system east of the Oanal-Du-Nord, on the 12th September, 1918, he led the bombing, attack along the support line by which the enemy were 'driven out of their positions. The fighting at close quarters lasted for 12 hours, when the trenches were cleared and 12 machine guns captured.

ROSE HAWKINS CHANNEL SWIM UPDATE



1st September 2017, 6.45am Rose was taken to the Samphire hoe beach from the Viking Princess by dingy. With the sun rising in the sky, the Viking Princess sounded its horn to indicate Rose's swim had begun. Her parents Marian and Jim Hawkins, sister Sarah and Cousin Lizzie were on board to supply drinks, food, support etc. The tides were working in Rose's favour and the conditions were near perfect up to hour eight.

Also on the boat was an official channel swimming association observer, and two pilots, brothers Reg and Ray Brickell. The observer had to record Rose's stroke rate every hour and test her with simple questions to ensure hypothermia or disorientation had not set in. Whilst treading water Rose had hourly drink and snack breaks, refuelling with water, Ribena and peaches.


We kept Friends and family up to date via Rose's channel swim

Facebook page where they could leave messages for Rose and we could write them on a white board and show Rose as she swam! They could also track her on the channel swimming association website which highlighted her exact crossing.

The weather changed from hour 8, the winds picked up and the swell was greater. When we got to hour 12, the pilot informed us that although Rose was going at a good pace she needed to speed up to enable her to reach the closest land Cap Gris Nez. A flood tide was pushing us around the coast and if Rose missed it she could be



swimming for a further three hours to reach land. Rose had researched so many previous Channel Swims so she knew when we started shouting at her to increase her pace that it was about beating the flood tide. She was swimming against it for nearly two hours. After 14.5 hours continuous swimming Rose's knees hit the rocks at Cap Gris Nez, in her words she flopped onto a rock and hoped it was France. The observer told her to climb clear of the water and then he radioed the boat to say she had been successful, so to the sound



hungry but ecstatic that she achieved her dream to swim the English Channel. She can be quoted as saying "she would not have given up, if she had missed the Cap Gris Nez."

The next day Rose and the family visited the White Horse in Dover, where she signed her name on the wall among other successful channel swimmers. She wrote, Rose Olivia Hawkins 14.5 hours 1st September 2017. Best and worst day ever.

Rose has raised over £14000 for four charities Marie Curie, British Heart Foundation, Medical detection dogs, and Willen Hospice.

Rose would like to thank everybody for there support and sponsorship, she has been overwhelmed by people's generosity and interest.







Chickpea Fattet, Iced Salad, Cumin and Fennel Seed Yoghurt

We've had a run of desserts in this series of recipes so it is time to redress the balance with this brilliant vegetarian dish. A fattet is a Lebanese spiced stew, made up of complex sweet flavours and spices. It's a really wonderful dish, which will satisfy vegetarians and meat eaters alike. This version was created by Alfie Smith, a very talented young head chef at the Rump & Wade in Stevenage. He finishes off the stew with a very contrasting crispy iced salad. This dish may look like a winter warmer but it is surprisingly refreshing and satisfying even in the hotter months.

400g chickpeas in water, drained & washed 1 spanish onion, finely chopped

2 cloves of garlic, finely chopped

5g Fresh mint, finely sliced

1 cinnamon stick

½ tsp chilli flakes

½ tsp ground mixed spice

1tbsp pomegranate molasses

1 tin of chopped tomatoes

1 vegetable stock cube

200ml water

10ml vegetable oil

Iced Salad

1 khol-rabi, thinly sliced

1 red pepper, thinly sliced

½ small white cabbage, thinly sliced

5g corriander

Cumin yoghurt

100g Greek yoghurt

15g ground cumin

1 lemon juiced

5g fennel seeds

Serves 2-3

Take a medium heavy based sauce pan and place it on a medium heat. Put the cinnamon stick, chili flakes and mixed spice into the pan.

Dry roast the spices on the medium heat for 2-3 minutes.



Add 10ml of vegetable oil, onions and garlic. Sweat for 3-4 minutes until softened.

Now add the chickpeas, chopped tomato, stock cube, pomegranate molasses and water. Leave to simmer down for 40-45minutes stirring frequently.

Take thinly sliced, kohlrabi, cabbage and red pepper and place in iced water (you want about 1/3 ice to 2/3 water).

Pick the leaves from the coriander and add them to the ice water

Leave for 5-10minutes to crisp up in the iced water.

In a dry frying pan roast off the cumin for 2-3minutes take off the heat and squeeze the juice of one lemon. Add cumin and lemon paste to the yoghurt and the fennel.

Serve the fattet with the iced vegetables and the yoghurt. You can also serve it with couscous or bulgur wheat too.

Baby hippo born with 'tiny socks' at ZSL Whipsnade Zoo

Zookeepers celebrate arrival of baby common hippopotamus calf at UK's largest Zoo

Zookeepers are hip-hippo-hooraying at the arrival of a baby common hippopotamus (Hippopotamus amphibius) at ZSL Whipsnade Zoo.

The tiny male hippo calf weighed approximately 30kg at birth – about the same as an adult Labrador – and is dwarfed by his mother, Lola, who tips the scales at a mighty 1.5 tonnes.

Following an eight-month gestation period, keepers – inspired by Game of Thrones – have named the newborn calf

Hodor after the loveable gentle giant from the hit TV series.

The calf was born on July 21 and becomes the third offspring for parents Lola, 13, and 16-year-old male, Hoover.

The baby hippo sports the exact same pink skin markings – a natural variation in pigmentation – on its legs as his mum, giving the appearance that the calf is wearing a tiny pair of socks. Zookeeper Angela Robinson said: "I was lucky enough to be working on the day Lola gave

birth, which was an incredible moment to witness and I'm thrilled that the calf is doing so well.

"The calf and mother are both progressing exactly as we would hope and it won't be long before we see the pair venture outdoors and explore the outside part of their home for the first time.

"Hodor seems to be a very confident and playful young hippo and, like any youngster, he has taken a liking to winding up his mum by chasing and play biting at her tail.

"Lola is a very attentive and doting mother; she never takes her eyes off him and often allows the calf to rest on her in the water and will help nudge him onto land when getting out of the pool."

The new calf is part of the European Endangered Species Programme (EEP), which

helps ensure the survival of endangered species in Zoos across Europe.

Common hippos are classified as Vulnerable on the IUCN's Red List of Threatened Species, but their populations are in decline due to threats including hunting and habitat loss.



The plot shows the temperature drop after 11th and the rain in the second half of the month




August 2017



Better Backs in the Driving Seat

Nowadays, many of us spend a great deal of time driving. A study found that people driving over 25,000 miles a year averaged just over 22 days a year off work with a 'bad back'.

Here are few tips to improve your posture and help your back when driving:



Bring your seat forward so that you can easily reach the pedals without 6. over-stretching, which can cause increased strain.

2. Your backrest should provide adequate support.

The driver's seat should provide good support to the lower back, both lengthways and sideways. Many cars have a lumbar support which you can adjust. If not, consider purchasing a lumbar roll which can be attached to the backrest by a strap.

3. Ensure the headrest is in a comfortable position.

Comfortably rest your head on the headrest with your neck and shoulder muscles relaxed. Avoid sitting with your chin poking forwards.

4. Take care getting in and out the car. To avoid twisting, slide your seat

backwards. To get out of the car, turn your whole body towards the door, lower your feet to the ground and then stand up. To get in the car, sit on the edge of the seat first and then rotate your whole body into position.

5. Be careful loading or unloading items from your vehicle.

Be careful lifting items in and out of the boot. Minimise stretching and lifting by placing loads nearest to the bumper edge.

6. Keep calm and carry on.

Don't grip the wheel too tightly - this can increase muscular tension. In a traffic jam, take some deep breaths, lift your shoulders to your ears and then relax. Take regular breaks on long journeys. Get out of the car and have a short walk round and do a few gentle stretches.


