'Remember, remember the 5th of November: gunpowder, treason and plot' as the old rhyme goes. November is a month for remembering. It begins with All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day on 1st and 2nd of November when we recall all those who've died and give thanks for their lives. We will be holding a Memorial Service at St Mary's on Sunday 5th November at 3pm when we gather together to thank God for our departed loved ones, to light a candle and say a prayer. If you would like us to include a name please contact us via the church website. Everyone is welcome to attend the service.

November 5th is also Bonfire night when we recall the foiled plot by Guy Fawkes and his coconspirators to blow up parliament. Gunpowder, which Fawkes and his companions planned to use for destruction, is used instead in fireworks to thrill those watching with spectacular displays. Remembrance Day, 11th November, falls on a Saturday this year and you are invited to buy tickets for the Poppy Prom which will be held in St Mary's on Saturday evening. It is a very popular event, so book early to avoid disappointment! On Remembrance Sunday, 12th November the focus is on those who've lost their lives in war, serving their country both in the two World Wars and in more recent conflicts. On each of these occasions, we reflect on the past.

We continue to remember the events of the First World War one hundred years ago. Called the 'war to end all wars' the conflict was global, sucking in countries from Africa to Australia, from Europe to Asia. And it was war on an epic scale, causing millions of casualties and affecting an entire generation. The world changed forever in the aftermath of the First World War. Sadly, it was not the end to all wars. Today we are painfully aware of conflict in the Middle East which has repercussions for us here in Britain. So what is the value of remembering?

Some people look back and only remember the good bits. This can be done even in relation to war. A book published by the British Ministry of Information just after the end of the Second World War has been reissued. As one commentator remarks, it focuses on the successes and omits the failures. Sometimes, as we look back, we are in danger of looking through rose tinted spectacles. The danger in remembrance is that we see only a selective picture and in comparison, the present seems a complex mix of good and bad. Some people find it easier to live in the past than in the present.

But there is also a danger of living entirely in the present, without ever reflecting on the past. Henry Ford, pioneer of the motor car, told the Chicago Tribune, 'History is more or less bunk. It's tradition. We don't want tradition. We want to live in the present.' The problem with never looking back is that we're apt to repeat the mistakes of the past. And looking back, reflecting on

past errors as well as past successes can enable us to learn the lessons of history and improve things in the present.

Remembering is important, but only if we are prepared to learn from the past and use those lessons to help create a better future.

Not a lot of people know that Jack Horne, a long time resident of Edlesborough was awarded a medal by the President of the Republic of France making him the rank of Chevalier in the Ordre national de la Légion d'honneur for his involvement in the liberation of France during the Second World War. Jack is immensely proud of his medal and the fact that in France he is a Knight.

AMBASSADE DE FRANCE LONDRES

L'AMBASSADEUR No 2015 - 929481

19 October 2015

Dear Mr Horne,

I have the pleasure of informing you that the President of the Republic has appointed you to the rank of *Chevalier* in the *Ordre national de la Légion d'honneur*.

I offer you my warmest congratulations on this high honour in recognition of your acknowledged military engagement and your steadfast involvement in the Liberation of France during the Second World War.

As we contemplate this Europe of peace, we must never forget the heroes like you, who came from Britain and the Commonwealth to begin the liberation of Europe by liberating France. We owe our freedom and security to your dedication, because you were ready to risk your life.

I am happy to enclose your insignia of *Chevalier de la Légion d'honneur* and once again extend to you my heartfelt congratulations.

Since a large number of decorations has to be awarded between now and the end of this year, I shall be unable to present this honour personally to every single veteran. However, if you would like an award ceremony to be organized for you, I invite you to contact your region's French Honorary Consul, who has been informed and is at your disposal. The Honorary Consuls' contact details are enclosed with this letter.







Edlesborough Parish Neighbourhood Plan Gets a YES From Parishioners

'If I were you I wouldn't start from here!' This punchline of the joke about asking for directions could have been given to Edlesborough Parish Council's initiative to develop a Neighbourhood Plan.

Faced with a situation where there was no effective control on new housing developments, the opportunity to develop a plan that would introduce control seemed to be the right thing to do. The starting point however was a parish of residents that was largely opposed to any development. All the surveys conducted prior to the starting point of this initiative had clearly demonstrated that there was little or no desire for new housing.

The opportunity to have a stronger local say in local developments seemed to be the right way. It came with a clear statement from AVDC that whatever happened we had to have a minimum number of new houses most of which would need to be in Edlesborough Village under AVDC rules. So, we began with a situation where AVDC said 'this is the number' but you, Edlesborough, get to propose what is developed and where if you produce a Neighbourhood Plan that meets the rules laid down by the government.

Selling this was difficult and right to the end of the campaign it seemed that some residents still thought that saying NO to the plan was the same as saying NO to development ignoring the fact that we had a mandatory number to develop. Nothing could be further from the truth. Without a plan there would be <u>no limit</u> and it can be seen from current development applications that the number of houses that developers want to develop far exceeds the maximum number in our plan.

Fortunately, a significant number of people got the message and many volunteered to help develop and shape the plan. The Parish Council thanks those who gave up a considerable amount of time as part of a Steering Group that worked for 18 months to create the plan.

The Edlesborough Parish Neighbourhood Plan: -

- Limits the number of houses
- Puts constraint on the type of developments
- Includes design criteria
- Specifies locations

In addition, it applies a Settlement Boundary that further limits development outside the boundary of both Edlesborough and Northall. (A settlement boundary for Dagnall was unnecessary as it already benefits from Metropolitan Green Belt protection).

With a plan approved by both an independent examiner and AVDC, the final part of the process was to take it to all parishioners in a referendum on the 5th October.

Having spent over two years since the start of the process the Parish Council was prohibited, under the law, from campaigning for a YES vote. Fortunately, once again, parishioners stepped up to the challenge and a new group came together to form a YES Campaign group. These members had to pay all expenses relating to the campaign and had to commit to a considerable amount of time preparing and delivering flyers as well

as a devoted effort to knock on doors to explain the situation. Edlesborough Parish Council thanks all those in the YES campaign for their significant effort.

It didn't help that a leaflet containing inaccurate information, from those opposed to the plan, was delivered to households in Edlesborough village just days before the referendum.

The requirement was for a <u>simple majority</u> of those that voted and the result was a resoundingly positive response. **88% said YES!**

I speak for the Parish Council, The Steering Group and the YES Campaign group to give a big THANK YOU! to all those who voted for the plan.

AVDC will now build our requirements into their Local Plan.

Dear Friends, As I write there is a lighted candle in front of me. Candlelight has many facets.

LOCAL HERALDRY BY JOHN HOCKEY

In this series, we take a look around local towns and villages to find interesting and unusual heraldry.

TODDINGTON

Like many towns and villages, the most likely place to find good heraldry is in the church. Toddington is no exception, but the most interesting example to be found in this edifice dedicated to 'St George of England' is another of those funeral hatchments put up to the great and the good – in this case to William Dodge Cooper Cooper of Toddington Manor, who died in 1860. The hatchment is a little complicated so I will spare you the details, save to say that there is a small shield in the middle (an

escutcheon of pretence) which means that any sons would bear the father's arms quartered with those of the heiress mother.

Outside in Toddington, my heraldic eye is drawn to a pub sign, namely the Oddfellows Arms, not far from the church. This sign is also a shield and is itself quartered, each of the four components having a meaning. Named after a Friendly Society established in 1810, the different quarters on the shield represent: time (hourglass); security (crossed keys); work (beehive); and sacrifice (lamb and flag). The red rose of England is in the centre and the motto means 'Friendship, Love and Truth'.



Toddington Oddfellows Arms

Quartering was a formalised way of incorporating the arms of new families that had been married into, often happily included as it showed the acquisition of wealth or status. Bizarrely, in heraldry not every coat of arms which is quartered has four components. Say your coat of arms already has four different quarters and you marry an heiress and have children. A son would then have to include your wife's arms and theoretically would then have five components to the shield. For evenness the shield is often balanced by repeating the main paternal arms again at the end, giving six 'quarters'. In heraldry this is known as 'quarterly of six'. If you think that is odd, spare a thought for the heraldic artist who had to draw the complex coat of arms of the Dukes of Buckingham and Chandos, which would be correctly described as 'quarterly of 719'!

Neighbourhood Development Plan

Your Neighbourhood Plan!!!

What a turn out! At the two recent drop in sessions that were held at the Coffee Tavern to enable YOU, the Parishioner's, to shape the future of the village we had around 225 people sharing their views and learning about what's been going on around planning in Central Bedfordshire. Even some of the residents who were "born and bred" took something away, even if it was a nostalgic view of the old village pictures around the walls of the Coffee Tavern.

We also had a return of around 340 public consultation questionnaires which is a resounding success, representing the views of around 30% plus response which is really great. We've analyzed the responses and summarized the various comments that you made and list below a flavour of the main results.

- People generally wanted the Village to retain its rural character, its public green spaces and its autonomy.
- In terms of development, the benefit of being surrounded by Green Belt was appreciated and that any new development would be effectively infilling.
- There is a preference for medium sized properties (no more large executive style houses) and a greater emphasis on smaller starter homes and properties that the elder generation can down size into, thereby releasing under used larger properties.
- Aspects that were not popular were the instances of flooding, poor road conditions, speeding in the village, parking, and poor mobile telephone signal.
- Improvements in public transport and traffic calming would be welcome.

Whilst this is a very high level summary of the results, we have posted the full analysis on the Eaton Bray Neighbourhood Plan web site which any one is welcome to review and comment. The web site address is www.ebpc.co.uk and follow the link to Neighbourhood Plan.

The next step is for the steering group to develop specific policies that reflect this consultation and prepare a series of documents, for the Parishioner's to review and comment upon, prior to a public referendum of acceptance or otherwise.

This is public consultation planned for the New Year.

Eaton Bray Lawn Tennis Club

Well I did try to warn them. 'What's going on at our club then'? I

implored the committee. 'Let me have all the news, otherwise when I write for Focus....well you know what will happen...'. What did I get? Not a sausage. I can only guess that October must be a 'low news' month at EBLTC, and as such, and needing to fulfil my contractual obligations as Communications Officer, here we go. Brace vourselves. So, due to it being a bit of a quiet time, as a modern, entrepreneurial club, we've turned our attention to branching out into other activities. The appointment of a new 'Business Expansion Tsar' to our small and humble committee has already resulted in some exciting new opportunities to broaden our income base, increase our capital worth, strengthen our enterprise portfolio, and to obtain some quick cash so that we can spend a bit more time in the pub.

Airports: that's our new target focal point. How many times have we heard the good people of our four villages bemoaning the fact that they've a flight to catch first thing in the morning, and the M25 is blocked solid, or the M1's got roadworks for a change, or Luton's improvements are once again resulting in a 3 hour traffic queue from the mid-term car park. Drop-off there has increased to £250 for 5 minutes and you need a small mortgage to hire a luggage trolley. And don't get me started on the delays in Security.... (I should know)! Heathrow's 3rd runway won't be with us before Armageddon, Gatwick is the wrong side of London and thinks itself way above its station, and Stansted has Ryanair, enough said. So, our Tsar has come up with a proposal that will radically reduce the stress, anxiety and sheer panic that afflicts us every time we need to catch an aeroplane. It's so simple that we just can't believe anyone hasn't thought of it before. We have submitted proposals to the CAA, DfT and LOL, to finance, improve and develop the

small airstrip that lies somewhere behind the White Horse (other pubs are available), into a medium sized commercial airport handling up to 10 million passengers a year. Now we know this won't be easy, and could take up to 6 months to complete, but the logic is both compelling and convincing. We've done our homework, for example the runway will have to be rotated 90 degrees so that we don't get 747s lining up with the High Street to land, and probably taking the pub roof off in the process. That wouldn't be good for beer sales, and drivers may become distracted. Instead, the runway will head northwards, across the Rye (traffic lights will be installed to stop vehicles during the estimated 250 take offs and landings per day) and will continue to somewhere around Stanbridge, or even Eggington if we want to accommodate the new double decker Airbus A380. Clearly a few properties may have to be demolished to make way for this, but there's plenty of other houses being built in the villages so we're sure those affected will find somewhere else to live. We are after all a caring club.

The control tower will be built in the car park of the White Horse (o.p.a.a), as there's plenty of spare space there, but their November 5th bonfires will be banned. We can't have our new £20 million tower going up in flames just because the wind's blowing in the wrong direction. Short term parking will be up The Comp, (taking care not to block any driveways) and Long term will be situated up School Lane, next to the recycling bins. A minibus will run 3 times a day to transfer passengers, driven by our fixtures secretary in-between his existing cat feeding duties. We've further cut down on costs by not including any shopping or eating facilities; after all why take business away from our established corporations? Passengers can simply wander down to the High Street, picking up some tasty fish and chips, and maybe a nice cup of tea in Edlesborough. They can even buy a newspaper and get a haircut before they pop back to board their flight. Toilets? They can use the ones at the pub (we still have to clear this with the landlord). We have simply thought of everything. No stone has been left unturned in our highly detailed submission. A decision is due next month, and we'll let you know when building work starts so you can move your cars out of the way of the bulldozers, and if necessary drop into Giblin's for a chat (other estate agents are available).

Well that's it for another month. 

Three Men in a Boat by Jerome K. Jerome

Over the past few months our group has been reading books on fairly serious subjects and we decided that we would like to lighten the mood. The book we chose to read was Three Men in a Boat. It was published in 1889 and is an account of a boating holiday on the Thames, taken by three young men and a dog.. They set out to journey from Kingston to Oxford and intend to return the opposite way.




The men are based on Jerome himself (the narrator) and his two friends George Wingrave and Carl Hentschel (Harris).

The story describes their river journey on a hired boat and the misadventures that occur on the way, notably a "stuffed trout" that turns out to be plaster; one of many anecdotes which our group enjoyed.

Also popular, was the tale of Uncle Podger creating mayhem whilst hanging a picture.

Jerome intersperses these anecdotes with descriptions of famous landmarks along the banks of the Thames, whilst at the same time he and his friends get into difficulties as they try to overcome their inexperience and ineptitude on the water. The overall verdict of our book group was that the book had stood the test of time. most of us, with a few exceptions, had enjoyed reading it. The writing is very good and easy to read, although some of the set pieces seem a little contrived and the humour somewhat schoolbovish. Apart from that, in spite of its age, Three Men in a Boat is still quite an amusing book. Which brings to mind the subject of humour, by its nature very diverse and very personal. So, what is it about this book in particular that has kept it in publication for so many years and had so many film, T.V. and radio adaptations made. Is its humour somehow universal?

Sports Injuries in Young Athletes



adolescents are often more susceptible to some iniuries due to their growing bodies Thev

respond differently to adults when training and often aches and pains are labelled as "growing pains".

Here are some conditions that young athletes can be prone to developing:

SCHLATTERS OSGOOD DISEASE

- This is a common cause of knee pain particularly between the ages of 10 and 15. It presents with pain at the bony bit at the top of the shin - this area can also become swollen and more prominent. It is predominantly an overuse injury and occurs when there is a growth spurt and high level of sporting activity. Often, as the bones grow, the muscles and tendons take time to catch up, this causes a pulling force on the tendon Treatment involves activity insertion. modification as well as the PRICE principles (Protect the joint, Rest, Ice, Compression and Elevation). Other treatment can include using anti-inflammatories, taping and gentle stretching and massage.

SEVER'S DISEASE - This is a cause of heel pain affecting active children agreed 8 - 15 years. It presents with pain at the back of the heel which is aggravated by physical activity. It can be tender to touch and there may be a lump over the area. Often the calf muscles are also very tight. Again, it is often caused by a rapid growth spurt and the muscles/ tendons can't keep up with the bone growth. Treatment is aimed at reducing pain. The PRICE principles need to be applied as well as activity modification and gentle stretching and massage. Also, any biomechanical issues need to be addressed.

PERTHES' DISEASE - This children between 4 and 8 years but can also occasionally occur in teenagers. It presents

Young athletes and with pain and tiredness in the groin and sometimes the knee. They may walk with a limp and have reduced hip range of motion. It is more common in boys than girls. It affects the hip joint and the blood supply to the head of the femur (the ball in the ball and socket joint) can be disrupted. An early diagnosis is important via X-rays and scans. Often this can be treated conservatively but sometimes surgery is needed.

If you suspect your child may be suffering from any of these conditions, consult your GP or get assessed by a Chartered Physiotherapist.

Harissa Salmon Served with Apricot, Spinach and Olive New Potatoes



Here's an interesting way to jazz up your humble salmon fillet. I'll be honest, when Iraqi chef Firaz Khafadii first told me he was serving the fish with a potato, apricot, spinach and olive salad, I wasn't immediately convinced. But, as with all food, the proof is in the eating and this was a brilliant combination of texture, colour and flavour. The potato salad will accompany pretty well anything and it's actually lovely just on its own too, or in a lunchbox. Firaz, who is the head chef and owner at the Vine Leaves in Harpenden, is passionate about fusing the vibrant flavours of the Mediterranean and his native Middle East and this is a perfect example. Slathering the salmon with fiery harissa paste just increases the flavours on the plate. Pretty, and pretty delicious.

To serve 2:

2 x 170g salmon fillets2 tbsp vegetable oil2 tbsp harissa pastePinch of chopped parsleyDrizzle of balsamic vinegar

Heat a frying pan until almost smoking, then pour in the oil. Spread the harissa on top of the salmon then pop it into the pan, skin side down. Fry over medium high heat for 3-4 minutes until the skin is golden-brown and crisp.

Pop the fish into a hot oven (180C/ Gas Mark 4) for 5-7 minutes, depending on thickness, until cooked through. Try to leave it a little pink in the middle.

To serve, place the fish on top of the salad, and garnish with the parsley and balsamic.

For the potatoes:

200g new potatoes
Handful of dried apricots, finely chopped
Handful of olives, chopped
Knob of butter
Handful of baby spinach

Boil the potatoes until soft then gently crush them using the back of a fork. You are not looking for a fine mash at all here.

Stir through the butter. Season well, add in the apricots and olives and finish with the baby spinach, which will naturally wilt. Serve hot, with the salmon.

Two endangered Grevy's zebra foals have been spotted playfully horsing around in their paddock after being born in September at ZSL Whipsnade Zoo.

Keepers say that female foal Katie, who was born

to first-time mum Nafisa on 10 September, seemed delighted when she was joined by a playmate nine days later.

As soon as male foal, Kito, was born to mum Henna on 19 September, the two youngsters began tearing around their enclosure, much to the amusement of keepers and visitors.



Team Leader Mark Holden said: "Like all zebras, when Katie and Kito were born they just seemed to be all ears and legs.

"It wasn't long before they were bounding around together, running and jumping around at a huge pace, before eventually running out of steam and returning to their respective mums.

"It's all typical behaviour for young zebra foals, as they learn what their legs are for, then going back to mum for comfort. Katie and Kito are settling

in really well, interacting with the rest of the group of Grevy's zebras here at the Zoo and exploring their surroundings."

Grevy's Zebras are classified as Endangered by the IUCN Red List of Endangered Species, and there are thought to be only around 2600 Grevy's zebras left in the wild.


Weather Conditions for September 2017

September started with a weak ridge of high pressure over us giving us a few Sunny days. The rest of the month was unsettled, we had 150% of average rainfall with the station recording rain on 27 days. The temperatures were below average with the highest only reaching 21.6°c with a monthly mean temperature of 13.3°c. all this resulting in a cool wet month more like November. Comparing this with September last year 2016 when we had high temperature of 30.3°c mean temperature 16.2°c and only 12 rain days. To show this, see the plot below I have overlaid temperatures for 2016 with 2017 and you will see the vast difference.


Temperature - Red 2016 - Purple 2017


A History of Loneliness by John Boyne

Father Odran Yates is looking back over his life as a priest. He has spent his life dedicated to a faith and a church that he believes in wholeheartedly. He entered Cronliffe College aged seventeen, convinced by his mother that he had a vocation for the priesthood. Having been ordained, he spent twenty seven years at Terenure College, a boys school, where his priestly duties are routine and undemanding. He grows used to the way of life there, but change occurs when he is summoned to see the Archbishop, who tells him that he will be taking over a parish recently vacated by a friend from his days at the seminary. Tom Cardle and Odran were room mates and friends at that time. but since then Tom Cardle's career as a priest does not seem to have run altogether smoothly. He doesn't appear to have stayed in one place for very long before being moved on to another. Odran doesn't appear to question this and even when he takes over the parish and hears the altar boys referring to Tom as Satan, alarm bells don't ring. Perhaps having gone from school to seminary and then to a school, has left him completely without guile: or perhaps there are facts within the church that he so fervently believes in and trusts, that he refuses to face.

The book covers Odran's life between 1964 and 2013, moving backwards and forwards in time in what seems an haphazard way, but in so doing fleshes out Odran's troubled background, his family problems with his sister and her family and his mother, helping us to understand his feelings of repression, frustration and guilt.

John Boyne is an Irishman and one perceives him to be a lapsed Catholic. He draws a picture of the Catholic church and its difficulties from the innocent days when the priests could do no wrong, up to the present when so much evil has been uncovered. But he also sends the message that only a minority of priests were guilty, the vast majority were sincere men doing something in which they believed. The hierarchy let them down. The characters of Odran Yates and Tom Cardle are very black and white and while Father Yates seems to think that he has been a good man, we the readers must see him as weak and ostrich like, hiding from facts that must be staring him in the face.

Our group all enjoyed the book and would recommend it. However we found the central character and some of the situations a little hard to believe. The book is very well written and opens up lots of areas of discussion.
