On Sunday 3rd December, we will be holding an Advent Carol Service at St Mary's Eaton Bray. This will include music specifically for Advent, not Christmas carols. Our Christmas carol service will be held at 6pm on Sunday 17th December. 'A carol is a joyful religious song created and sung by ordinary people,' says the writer of Bethlehem Carols Unpacked. It is thought that carols originated in France, and the word comes from the Old French carole which means 'a song to accompany dancing'. In the Middle Ages in England that's just what carols were: dances accompanied by singing. At one time, there were carols for many seasons of the church's year. In addition to Christmas and Advent, there were carols for Easter and Saints' days. Unlike in the church where everything was sung in Latin, carols were in the everyday language of the people. They included ordinary subjects like plants and animals, food and drink and were sung in the streets, in people's homes and in the inns- in fact everywhere except the church! So having carols in supermarkets is much closer to their origins than we might think.

Carol singing in the streets is one of the oldest customs in Britain. In the Middle Ages, beggars seeking food, money or drink would wander the streets singing carols. Christmas carols were traditionally confined to the period from St Thomas' Day on 21st December to the morning of Christmas Day.

During the seventeenth century, the Puritans introduced laws banning dancing and all religious feasts including Christmas. Carol singing declined and was almost forgotten until the Victorian era. The Victorians had already introduced Christmas trees and Christmas cards and in 1871, Revd H.R. Bramley and Dr John Stainer published a book called 'Christmas Carols old and new'. From that time, the popularity of carols grew and they came to be sung in church for the first time. The annual broadcast of the Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols from King's College Cambridge has become a fixture on Christmas Eve and this too helped carols to gain a wider audience.

Some of the oldest carols are still popular. Good King Wenceslas and The Holly and the Ivy can both be traced back to the Middle Ages and are amongst the oldest musical compositions still regularly sung. Many of our popular carols today are Victorian, such as Once in Royal David's

City. And then there are new favourites like the Calypso Carol.

Carols help us to see religious significance in ordinary things. And that is the message of Christmas. Jesus, God's Son, was born as a baby and grew up in an ordinary family just like us. He lived as part of a community and shared in their joys and sorrows. Yet he was fully God as well as fully human, and through his life, death and resurrection he gave the promise of life in all its fullness to all who put their trust in him.





Edlesborough Parish Council wishes all Parishioners a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

#### **Community First Responder**

During the October EPC meeting Councillors listened to a comprehensive presentation from Peter Cooper who is a coordinator for the South Central Ambulance Service Community First Responders.

Community First Responders are vital to ensuring help reaches life threatening emergencies as fast as possible. The responders aim to respond within 8 minutes. CFR's are only sent to life threatening calls.

Currently the initial training and purchase of the kit for a CFR costs in the region of £2,500 and this service operates purely on fund raising and donations.

During the presentation Peter introduced Mrs Nicola Lack an Edlesborough Parishioner who has recently completed her training and is now a Volunteer Community First Responder.

Following the presentation EPC Councillors voted unanimously to make an annual donation to the scheme.

In the event of an emergency requiring an ambulance or CFR please dial 999.

#### Dogs in Edlesborough Churchyard and Cemetery

EPC reminds parishioners that dogs MUST be kept on the lead in Edlesborough Churchyard and Cemetery. Please ensure your clear up after your dog, a dog bin is sited on the bridle path near the entrance to the Church.

#### **Parking Issues in the Parish**

Inconsiderate parking continues to be an issue in the village. Drivers continue to park on the white lines near the school and shops, park dangerously at junctions and park their vehicles on the pavements.

Unfortunately EPC has no jurisdiction over parking issues, vehicles which cause an obstruction should be reported to Thames Valley Police.

When parking your vehicle please remember the Highway Codes states:

DO NOT park partially or wholly on the pavement unless signs permit it. Parking on the pavement can obstruct and seriously inconvenience pedestrians, people in wheelchairs, the visually impaired and people with prams or pushchairs.

EPC is currently entering into a dialogue with EB Lions FC with the intention of helping to improve the parking issues around the Green on Saturdays.

#### **Edlesborough Rocks**

Concerns have been raised to the Council about the hiding of decorated rocks on Edlesborough Green. EPC agreed that the hiding of decorated rocks for children to find is a lovely idea. However participants have been asked not to hide the rocks in the grass on the green and on the grass verges around the village. The reasons for this request being that the contractor's machines will "smash" the rocks to bits destroying the artist's work and can additionally create a hazard in these areas.

#### Streetlights

Please report failed streetlights in Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall to the Clerk for repair. When making a report please ensure you provide the Clerk with the information displayed on the lamp post.



#### **Allotments**

Do you have a keen gardener in the family? Are you looking for something different to give as a Christmas Gift? Whilst they are hard work allotments also give hours of pleasure, so why not consider this as a gift. Edlesborough Parish Council currently has vacant allotments at the Dagnall and Cow Lane sites. - Travellers Rest Roundabout including lack of bollards and poor & hazardous condition of traffic islands. EPC have been informed that there are plans to remove existing bollards on the islands and to paint the islands white, and to clear the vegetation from the traffic islands.
- Travellers Rest Bus Stop winter landscaping works will be raised to recover the kerbing and hard standing at this stop.

Should parishioners have concerns about any Highways issues these should be reported via the Bucks CC website.





#### Watercourse Maintenance/River Ouzel

An assessment on a section of damaged river bank in Mill End Close has been carried out which shows there are three areas within the bank where water is leaking into the drainage ditch. The cause of the leak is from crayfish burrowing into the riverbank and damaging the structure. Work is planned to be carried out on this section of the bank within the next six months (weather dependent), the first stage will be to clear the riverbank of overgrown trees and shrubbery, and a general tidy of the area. The second stage will be the actual repair to the river bank. Once the Council has confirmed dates of work from the Drainage Board, notices will be put on parish notice boards, Facebook and Focus.



# South Central Ambulance Service have appointed a New Community First Responder to serve Edlesborough and local villages



Nicola Lack from Edlesborough is the new Ambulance Service, Community First Responder for the Edlesborough area. Nicky served in HM Forces where one of her roles was in medical support. When she found out about the local first responder scheme she was really pleased to be able to give something back to her community and become part of something so vital. Nicky was trained for the first responder role by South Central Ambulance Service and has gained experience observing on front line emergency ambulances and the local community response vehicle.

Nicky said "The training is fantastic, it covers a range of scenarios, including Basic Life Support, Defibrillation, Oxygen therapy, Paediatrics, Strokes, and the whole range of serious medical conditions. It is a voluntary position and one to which I am very committed. I have already given over 50 hours of cover. I respond to 999 calls from the local villages and endeavour to be at the patients side in less than 8 minutes. The job is to stabilise and care for patients ahead of the arrival of the ambulance. Being able to provide additional, often life saving care to our local community is an absolute privilege and I am very grateful for the opportunity South Central Ambulance has given me."

In much the same way as the Air Ambulance, Community First Responders are funded by public donation via the South Central Ambulance Charity. Local support is vital, so please support Nicky in her future fund raising activities. To kick start the Local scheme Edlesborough Parish Council have kindly funded the initial set up costs for Nicky's response kit and communications equipment.

### LOCAL HERALDRY BY JOHN HOCKEY

In this series, we take a look around local towns and villages to find interesting and unusual heraldry.

#### **EDLESBOROUGH RE-VISITED**

This month I return to Edlesborough to look again at interesting heraldry in St Mary's – The 'church on the hill'.

There is an ancient ledger slab on the floor of the church with an inscription and a coat of arms. The inscription reads:

HERE LYETH THE BODY OF ELIZABETH HVTCHINSON DAVGHTER TO HENRY BRVGIS GENT AND WIFE OF RAPH HVTCHINSON CITIZEN AND VYNTNER OF LONDON DECEASED THE 28TH OF SEPTEMBER 1636

The date of Elizabeth's death is relevant as a quick trawl of the British History Online web site for Edlesborough (which has the Victoria County

History volumes digitised) tells us that the church plate includes a large cup and stand paten with inscription, given to the church in 1636 by Raph Hutchinson, complete with shield of arms, Hutchinson impaling Bridges. The ledger slab has those same arms, Hutchinson on the left (dexter) for the man, Brugis (or Bridges) on the right (sinister) for the woman. The plate is no longer kept at Edlesborough but is in safe keeping in St Albans Abbey and I can verify

that the silver shield still shines out clearly after some 380 years! By chance, if you visit Canons Ashby up the A5, you can see a stained glass

window with the Hutchinson arms on the right, so we know what the colours on the shield should look like. The Brugis family also have a distinguished history as in 1415 William Bruges was the first officer appointed as Garter King of Arms, the principal Herald in the body that grants all coats of arms. On the Brugis coat of arms we see a cheeky leopard's face right at the centre of the cross and in heraldry this depiction is referred to as a 'mask'.

# New Local Book Luton & Its People in the Great War 1914-1919 by Stuart Smith



The author, Stuart Smith, a well known local historian, has already published three books dealing with aspects of Luton history.

His other great passion is the First World War and this new book, coinciding with the centenary of the war, combines both of these interests and focuses on Luton and its people and their role during the Great War 1914-18.

Drawn from the local papers, from personal accounts of living relatives and from historical accounts of the war, it details the exploits of Luton men and women who volunteered for war service.

There are chapters dealing with all the major land, sea and air campaigns that featured local men; from the outbreak of war and the rush of men of all ages to join the colours. One aspect of the book is the publication of the many letters sent home from soldiers at the front telling of experiences gained during the various battles, large and small, which told of amusing and more often than not, tragic circumstances that the writer had faced. In excess of 350 men from Luton and its close environs are mentioned by name, whether killed, wounded, missing in action or as a prisoner of war.

The hat industry, the VAD Hospital at Wardown, the manufacturing of munitions and the task of the Luton Fire Brigade fighting major fires at factories engaged in war work are all mentioned.

Also documented is the part played by the Luton Town Football Club and those players who went off to fight, some never to return; the issues surrounding billeting, especially in the early months of the war and criminal activities.

The final chapter follows through to the early post-war days and the rise of feelings of consciences with the establishment of many Rolls of Honour, placed within the factories, schools and in some cases on the walls of houses in humble town centre streets from where men had left to do their duty. The accumulation of all of this grief and mourning came on 10th December 1922 when Lady Ludlow of Luton Hoo unveiled and dedicated a memorial in remembrance of her fallen son, followed later in the day by the unveiling and dedication of the town memorial in George Street.

This 700 page book is profusely illustrated with over 250 photographs, many being of Luton men who had either paid the ultimate price for peace or had been discharged from the forces as no longer fit for service due to illness or wounds received.

## Litter Picking in Northall and Edlesborough During 2017

Another year is coming to an end, and the indefatigable Edlesborough and Northall Litter pickers have been hard at work trying to keep the Villages tidy despite a never-ending flow of litter on the verges and hedgerows in the area. We have been out eight times officially, including joining in "The Great British Litter Pick" in March. Our approximate haul of 62 black bags during the year, plus numerous items items such as a strip light, a sandbag, a road sign, several pieces of car, and various "unmentionables, was mostly made up of wine bottles, cans, plastic bottles, and fast food debris, especially from the verges along Cock's Close, the Main Road, the lay-by at Traveller's Rest, Eaton Bray Road, Northall, and car parks on the Green. There have also been numerous "private" litter picks where community- minded residents have picked up litter from their local areas or on dog-walks and taken it home to dispose of in their dustbins.

Litter Picking is like housework – it keeps returning to spoil our lovely area. We find it difficult to do in the high summer when the verges and hedgerows are high, but that doesn't stop the litter louts, and once it has all died down it is there for all to see. You wonder why they don't just take it home to put in their bins! It must cost some effort to open the car window and aim at the back of the hedgerow!! Perhaps the person who leaves the wine bottles all along Cock's Close (and then, presumably drives away!!) doesn't want people to know about their habit....

We are fortunate to live in beautiful villages. Every year, the Parish Council enter us for the Bucks Best Kept Village Competition in July. One of the judging criteria is the presence of litter, and thanks to our band of helpers, we passed that part with flying colours (this got a mention this year!!) although other things were marked down. (The Beautification Team are addressing that one!) It doesn't take a lot of time to pop out and keep your own front area clear. We try to do the parts of the villages where there are no properties and where misguided people think it is OK to throw litter because there is no one around to see them.

So many thanks to all the wonderful volunteers who turned out this year, come rain or

shine (mostly rain -it seems that regardless of all the lovely weather, I always manage to choose the one wet day in months...) They are doing their best to keep our villages tidy. So slow down for us if we are on the road as you drive by and if you have time to help us we would love to meet you in 2018.







# Surviving the Winter with some Tips from St Judes

- Avoid trips and slips put rock salt on your steps and take extra care when walking a pair of trekking over-shoes are useful for giving you the extra grip needed in the snow.
- Shovelling snow watch that back! Keep the shovel close to your body and get your legs to do the work. Don't overload the shovel and take regular breaks.
- Don't be a couch potato staying active boosts your mood and helps you to stay in shape. Exercise helps to increase your immune system and keep the colds and 'flu at bay. If you're running or doing sports outside in the winter:

walking for about 10 minutes and gradually increase your pace and maybe try some walking lunges or high knee skips. Cool down by running at a slow pace for 5-10 minutes and do some stretches inside so you don't get cold.

• It's fine to exercise with a bit of a cold but listen to your body, and don't exercise if you have a fever.

# Beef Gulasz with Cracked Barley Groats. Sour Cream and Dill

We are lucky in the Three Counties to have a wonderful variety of food available and I love featuring different cuisines on the Weekend Kitchen. Back in 2010, I welcomed Ren Behan from St Albans on to the show. She had given up a career as a lawyer and was looking to build a new career as a food stylist and writer. I



strongly encouraged her to write a book on Polish food and, 7 years later, she fulfilled her dream and her book was published. Ren is passionate about her Polish roots and is keen to show that Polish food is imaginative, vibrant and delicious. This gorgeous and simple recipe comes from her book, Wild Honey and Rye, and is a perfect winter warmer.

### **Ingredients**

2 tbsp vegetable oil

2 onions, peeled, chopped

1 stick celery, washed, chopped

2 carrots, peeled, chopped

2 tbsp plain flour

500g beef braising steak or feather steak, cubed

Sea salt and freshly ground black pepper 250g mixed or chestnut mushrooms

2 ripe tomatos, peeled, de-seeded and chopped

2 tbsp tomato puree

500ml beef stock, made up

1 bay leaf

### To serve:

200g crushed barley groats/pearl barley or buckwheat cooked according to the packed instructions – at the Polish shop this is called Kasza Jęczmienna.

Fresh dill Sour cream

Heat the oil in a large cast-iron pan, add the onions and cook for 10 minutes on a low heat until golden and soft. Add the celery and carrots and continue to cook for 5 minutes.

In a large bowl, coat the beef in the flour, season well with salt and pepper. Add a drop more

oil to the pan with the onions, turn up the heat and brown the meat all over. Add the mushrooms, tomatoes, tomato puree, stir and then pour in the beef stock, add the bay leaf and stir again.

Cover the pan with a lid and simmer for 1 ½-2 hours over a low heat, stirring occasionally. Or, transfer to a slow cooker and cook for 4-5 hours.

Cook the barley or buckwheat according to the instructions on the packet. Serve the barley with the beef gulasz, drizzle over the sour cream and garnish with fresh dill.

# Dagnall Weather Station (AONB) Weather Conditions for October 2017


### Elevation: 450 ft - Latitude: 51° 50' 13" North - Longitude: 0° 33' 34" West



October was a much better month than September dry and mild. For the first  $3\frac{1}{2}$  weeks the weather was stable with sunny spells and the odd shower. Although we recorded rain on 17 days 6 of which were only 0.2mm if you blinked you would have missed it. The total months rain was only 28mm that's just 25% of the average for October. The temperature was above average and as you can see from the plot below fairly constant until the 26th when the temperature dropped and on 30th giving us the first frosty morning of the winter.



### A Man called Ove by Fredrik Backman

When we first meet Ove, he is fifty nine years of age, recently widowed and has just been given early retirement. A man of principle, diligent and hard working, his love of routine has been

disrupted by these two major changes to his life. He lives on a small estate and is the self styled caretaker of his local area. making sure that his neighbours adhere to the standards and rules that he holds dear. Since his wife Sonia's death six month ago, he has become more and more lonely and depressed and has decided to commit suicide. Being Ove, this entails elaborate preparation, but whatever method he tries, somehow fate steps in and contrives to thwart him. In between these failed attempts. Ove reflects on his life and we begin to understand what lies behind his curmudgeonly exterior and how events in his past have influenced him.

Life has not been kind to Ove. When he was six his mother died and he was brought up by his father, who instilled in him his love of engines and taught him practical skills. Ove's wife, Sonia, understood him and brought great joy to their marriage, but their life together had to withstand many setbacks. Gradually as we understand more about him we become fond of Ove and are pleased when his attempts at suicide fail. We are introduced to his new neighbours, Parveneh, her husband Patrick and their two little girls. Parveneh

chooses to ignore Ove's grumpiness and manoeuvres him into helping her and gives him gifts of Iranian food, which she has cooked. Somehow helping her and her family helps him to re-engage with life. He also re-kindles friendships and helps others in the neighbourhood, making him feel valued and part of the community once more. As one of our reading group commented, it is an adult fairy tale and we all enjoyed Ove's story, it seemed

simple, but there was an underlying depth that opened up many points for discussion. Originally written in Swedish, we commented on the brilliant translation by Henning

Koch. The English was excellent and the narrative flowed. A book that we would all recommend.

### Peace on Earth, Goodwill to Men

More than ever this world needs the message given to the shepherds on a hillside that first Christmas: 'Peace

on earth, good will towards men.' By proclaiming peace the angels were announcing God's desire for all people on earth to live in harmony and to enjoy peace in their everyday lives. Yet as we look around we see that peace is lacking in so many people's lives.

Many see and hear the sights and sounds of Christmas but despair that peace seems out of reach. During the American Civil War, Henry W. Longfellow wrote the lyrics of a carol, 'I heard the Bells on Christmas Day.' It's an old carol which you probably have not heard, but it has some poignant words. With heartfelt sincerity, he wrote, "For hate is strong and mocks the song, of peace on earth, good will to men."

The news headlines are discouraging. The reality of war and hatred among nations is too close to home and it is sometimes hard to know what to say to those enduring this season without their loved ones for the first time.

Although a century has passed since Henry W. Longfellow struggled writing the lyrics to his carol, we understand every word. Like so many at this time of year, his heart hurt with the despair, hatred, and horrors of war he saw. However something unseen nudged his writing: "And the bells are ringing... Peace on earth... like a choir, they're singing... Peace on earth... in my heart I hear them... Peace on earth..."

The Bible shows that Jesus came to earth to bring peace. Ephesians 2:14 states, 'For Christ himself has brought peace to us. He united Jews and Gentiles into one people when, in his own body on the cross, he broke down the wall of hostility that separated us.' And Jesus said of Himself, "Peace I leave with you, My Peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid" (John 14:27). As the angels' message rang through the air to the shepherds, so it rang out in Longfellow's heart. He was right; tragedies constantly bombard our doorsteps, yet there is an echo ringing through

the air. If we listen with our hearts we can hear it too. We hear God's message of peace to a hurting world: *Peace on earth and good will towards men.*'

Despite the news and our sense of loss, peace within is possible when we know Jesus. My prayer for you is that you may know that peace which is beyond our understanding this Christmas and always. 'May the Lord of Peace Himself give you peace always in every way. The Lord be with you all' (2 Thessalonians 3:16).
