It's getting closer. When you read this, we will be little more than a month away from another GREAT Beer Festival.

Elsewhere is this August publication you can see our advert which will give you all the information you need. So I thought a bit of history around the reasons for the event might be of interest.

As many of you may remember the Eaton Bray Village hall at the turn of the century was a rather run down state. There were many plans to completely knock it down and start afresh but this became financially impossible. So the trustees decided on a complete refurbishment, starting with the main hall. To enable this to happen we received some donations, from organisations and individuals, many of them anonymously. This was backed up by the Parish Council who granted a magnificent £85,000. Thus we started. But in all we have spent nearly £400,000 since we started and a lot of that has come from fund raising. The most recent project, being the refurbishment of the foyer and installation of electric doors.

The Beer Festival was only possible with the help of our friends from CAMRA who organise and give us all the profits from the beer sales. In all, I calculate that nearly £40,000 has been generated for the hall over the 15 years and we are truly grateful to them for their generosity. But of course there is another even bigger contributor and that is you, the folk who come to enjoy that beer and the food and help us to create the biggest and best Beer Festival in the area!

So do come along and make this year's event even better than before.

Don't forget the date:

Friday 8th and Saturday 9th June noon to 11pm each day.

Tennyson wrote in the *Idylls of the King* that 'More things are wrought by prayer than this world dreams of.' Prayer is an important element in many religions. And there are lots of people of no particular faith who pray. A TearFund survey in 2007 revealed that 20 million adults in the UK pray. Of those, 13 million pray at least once a month and 9 million pray on a daily basis. One in three people believe that God answers prayer. As a theological student in Cambridge I had to do a survey on prayer along with another student, which involved knocking on people's doors and asking for their views. The results were fascinating with the majority of people we asked saying that they had prayed at least once in their lives.

Ghandi once said: 'Prayer is not an old woman's idle amusement. Properly understood and applied it is the most potent instrument of action.' If we believe that prayer makes a difference to the world, then it means we can all be involved in changing things for the better. For the good thing about individual prayer is that it can happen at any time and in any place. For Christians and for people of other faiths there is also an important place in our lives for corporate prayer. This happens in our services, both on Sundays and during the week.

One of the most well-known and well used prayers is the one Jesus taught his disciples when they asked him how to pray. Known as the Lord's Prayer it encourages us to address God as 'our father in heaven' and to ask him for all our needs as well as giving praise and thanks.

During the period between Ascension and Pentecost from 10th -20th May 'Thy kingdom come' an initiative of the Archbishop of Canterbury will encourage people across the globe to pledge to pray. Now in its third year, participation has grown every year. In 2016 100,000 Christians pledged to pray. By 2017 more than half a million people participated from 85 countries as diverse as Ghana, Korea, Cuba and the Falkland Islands. This is an ecumenical event and last year more than 50 denominations were involved. The website www.thykingdom.come.global says: 'The positive impact of Thy Kingdom Come 2017 continues to unfold as numerous stories of personal and communal transformation pour in from churches, families and whole communities alike.'

This year at St Mary's we will be holding prayer times each morning and evening during the 10 days of 'Thy Kingdom Come'. These will be led by a variety of people and will last about 20 minutes. There will be a special service on Ascension Day, 10th May at 7.15pm. To find out more visit our website www.stmaryseatonbray.org.uk or look out for the posters on the notice

board. St Alban's Cathedral will be hosting a Thy Kingdom Come Beacon Celebration on Saturday 19th May at 6.30 p.m. with Archbishop Justin Welby. It will be a collaboration between Soul Survivor Watford, local and national youth organisations, ecumenical partners, the Diocese of St Albans and the Cathedral. The celebration will welcome people of all denominations and entry is free. Prayer and fun activities will run from 4 p.m. Do come along and get involved in this global prayer initiative.

FREE Defibrillator Training Sessions




On Saturday 12th May representatives from South Central Ambulance Service will be holding a FREE training session for Edlesborough residents on how to use an AED.







On Mothering Sunday Geoff Best led a delightful café service,

opening with a memorable quote from Julian of Norwich "If God is our father. God is also our mother". In our discussions we considered several women in the Bible, particularly comparing and contrasting Elkanah and Hannah. Our Communion Service, on the 3rd Sunday, was taken by Rev Nigel Bibbings, who helped us to focus on Jesus' mental preparation in the days running up to the Passover and his own death. As with the grain of wheat, the key to living is dying and we need to die to 'self' i.e. to overcome our self-preoccupation and develop a sense of where we are in relation to other people. In doing so Jesus promises eternal life to us all and he asked us to consider the words of one of the hymns that we had just sung "Christ is Alive, Let Christians sing". Our way of life should be modelled on that of Jesus and it is important to do the small things in life well, as they can lead on to bigger ones.

Iconic Chalk Lion Restored at ZSL Whipsnade Zoo

ZSL Whipsnade Zoo has finished restoration work on the Whipsnade White Lion, a famous chalk image that has overlooked the Dunstable Downs in Bedfordshire since 1933.

Following the donation of more than 800 tonnes – or 50 lorry loads – of chalk, the Zoo was able to start resurfacing the iconic landmark in September 2017. Winter weather and a steep incline made the restoration work challenging, but the final load of chalk was carefully smoothed out over the lion's mane on Tuesday 20 March 2018.

General Manager of ZSL Whipsnade

Zoo, Owen Craft said: "We are delighted to have restored this iconic landmark to its original glory. ZSL Whipsnade Zoo is incredibly proud of the Whipsnade White Lion, which has stood proudly overlooking the Dunstable Downs since 1933.

"As a site of Special Scientific Interest, the Whipsnade White Lion and the area around it are cared for by the Zoo all year round, using environmentally-friendly products to protect the native plants and animals. This new coating of chalk has made a huge difference to the eye-catching brilliance of the landmark and I can't wait for all our Easter visitors, as well as our wonderful, local communities, to see it looking so great, as they drive towards the Zoo." The Whipsnade White Lion was designed by R.B. Brook-Greaves, and work began to create it in November 1931. By the following April, the rough outline of the 147 metrelong lion was visible on the side of the Dunstable Downs. Ivinghoe Beacon was often used as a vantage point to check the accuracy of the outline. Almost two acres of land had to be

cleared to reveal the chalk, and the lion was finally finished in the spring of 1933. During the Second World War, the lion was covered to prevent it from being used by enemy aircraft as a navigation point. In May 1981, as part of ZSL Whipsnade Zoo's 50th anniversary celebrations, the lion was illuminated using 750 lightbulbs.

Some days I feel inspired. Today is not one of them. I'm sitting here gazing out of the window at a wet, grey and gloomy scene, wondering what delirious scribblings I can delight you all with before the Focus print deadline expires in a few hours time. And the answer is that I really haven't a clue. So, instead, I thought I'd offer you a couple of stories that I recently spotted, which show the stranger side of our favourite sport.

Remember Goran Ivanisevic? The Croatian who so cruelly ended Tim Henman's Wimbledon dream in that 2001 semi-final? Well, the previous year he'd entered the 2000 Samsung Open in Brighton with high hopes. A weak field gave him a great chance and a second round match against South Korea's Hyung-Taik Lee didn't seem much of a problem. Then in the first set, when he dropped his serve to go 6-5 down, he promptly smashed his racket. He recovered his composure to take the second set 7-6 after a tie-break but in the third set racket number two cracked.

Ivanisevic persevered with it until the next changeover before dumping that one too in the bin. Four points later a double fault presented Lee with two break points, Ivanisevic then smashed his third racket on the floor before telling the umpire that he had no more left.

There was no alternative but for the racketless Croat to retire, therefore becoming the first player in history to lose a match in such a way. Back on July 15, 1879, a Mr J T Hartley beat a Mr St Leger 6-2, 6-4, 6-2 in a fairly routine Wimbledon final. Our Mr John Thorneycroft Hartley was a vicar who, not expecting to progress very far in the tournament, had not even organised cover for his Sunday service.

His opponent was Irishman Vere Thomas "St Leger" Goold, and it would not be until 1907 when that match would acquire its notoriety. After falling on hard times Goold and his wife made the acquaintance of a wealthy Danish widow named Emma Liven, from whom they secured various "loans". On Tuesday, August 6, the Goolds took a train from Monte Carlo to Marseilles, where they deposited a trunk that was later discovered to contain the dismembered body of Mrs Liven.

The trial lasted three days with Goold admitting to the murder. He remains the only convicted murderer to have contested a Wimbledon final. Right, let's talk about Tennis for Kids. First, what is it? Tennis for Kids was launched in 2016 following Great Britain's historic 2015 Davis Cup victory to inspire the next generation to play. It proved such a hit that by the end of the year, 13,200 new children were introduced to tennis. In 2017 a further 22,500 new children signed up which means in the last 2 years, over 35,000 kids have been given the opportunity to pick up a racket and have fun on court. Now in its third year, Tennis for Kids is going bigger and better with an aim to introduce even more children to the sport we love. This year, we will be running Tennis for Kids for 4-11 year olds. The cost of the course is £25 and includes 6 coaching sessions, a racket and ball set and a personalised tennis shirt. They'll also be a follow on offer to enable them and their family to continue to play. This course is running at Eaton Bray Tennis Club with Sara Bamford as the Lead coach. Nigel's Thoughts Methodist Minister

Dear Friends, As I was looking out of a friend's sun room my thoughts turned to what I should write.

The room had rather a spectacular coastal view. Looking from left to right the distant vista across Morecambe Bay included Morecambe and Heysham, Fleetwood and (on a clear day – which most were) Blackpool Tower. Those who know me well will know that my binoculars were glued to my eyes, ship spotting, especially for the sailings to and from the Isle of Man from Heysham! I was also on the lookout for birds amid the sea grass which stretched out to meet the tide. I managed to spy the curlew, wheatear and little egret.

What preoccupied me more than all these things however, was the way in which weather patterns formed themselves (though distantly) in front of me and travelled across land and sea. Of particular significance were the cloud formations and the evidence of blustery or squally weather travelling southwards.

Words of encouragement came first to mind. William Cowper wrote of the God who "plants his footsteps in the sea, and rides upon the storm". "Ye fearful saints, fresh courage take, the clouds ye so much dread are big with mercy, and shall break in blessings on your head" (In the hymn 'God moves in a mysterious way').

Then, with the coming Pentecost season in mind sprang the words of Charles Wesley and the promise of God's blessing for those who are intent upon building his Kingdom.

"Saw ye not the cloud arise, little as a human hand? Now it spreads along the skies, hangs o'er all the thirsty land: Lo! The promise of a shower drops already from above; But the Lord will shortly pour All the Spirit of His love!" (In his hymn 'See how great a flame aspires')

It may be that many of us feel that we have already seen quite enough rain in the early months of this year! My prayer remains, that a cloudburst of blessing may soak us all and grant us the desire, and a hunger to know more and share more of our God's gracious love.

LOCAL HERALDRY

In this series, we take a look around local towns and villages to find interesting and unusual heraldry.

A SHIELD WITHOUT ARMS

OK, I have to admit it, this month's heraldry is not from this part of the world but I thought it was just too interesting to keep secret and there is a tenuous local connection. Very occasionally a nobleman marries a commoner and in such a case whilst the titled gentleman may be armigerous (i.e. entitled to bear arms), his bride may not be so fortunate. The problem then occurs of what to put on her half of the marital shield.

Such an instance occurred in the 1800s when George, 7th Earl of Stamford, a member of the Grey family, (linked to the same family that owned Wrest Park in Silsoe) had taken a shine to and married Bessie Billage, the daughter of his servant at Cambridge.

Looking at this funeral hatchment, made when Bessie Grey (nee Billage) died in 1854, the fact she was without arms is neatly side-stepped by the use of diapering on her side of the shield. This is a type of free-form design often used in stained glass to make otherwise plain areas more interesting.

The blue and white (Argent and Azure) Grey arms are quartered with those of Booth which have three boars' heads erect Sable i.e. black.

As normal, the board is black behind the deceased and white for the surviving

spouse. Note the use $\overline{\text{of}}$ ermine unicorns supporters the Earl's coronet of rank above. Not a bad result for a commoner. All the above are taken from heraldry displayed at Dunham Massey Hall in Cheshire, one of the seats of the 7th Earl. He married twice, once to Elizabeth (Bessie) Billage in 1848 and then again a year after she had died, in 1855 to Catherine Cox, a circus bareback rider!

A rare opportunity to acquire this historic, well-loved family home, and place of hospitality for centuries. The warm heart of this house is the huge, oak beamed farmhouse kitchen, where family and friends gather around the red Aga situated alongside an ancient bread oven. It has a large walled 'secret garden', where those seeking peace and quiet can sit in shady wooded areas, sunken garden, or around the naked lady pond and fountain. of you coming as guests, professional therapists and volunteers without whom we couldn't have flourished as we did.





Institute, held in March, the talk being entitled "From Plot to Pot". We enjoyed the company of two very enthusiastic ladies from the small village of Aley Green (near Caddington).

Lorraine and Ann met 26 years ago and needed something to do. Knowing nothing about gardening, they took over an empty allotment plot. All those years ago allotment tenants were all men, so as you can imagine, at first, the ladies were treated with some distain. They have, however, triumphantly overcome this and now work 3 and a ½ very productive plots and other ladies have also taken on other empty plots. Well done ladies!

Lorraine and Ann grow every type of fruit bush you can imagine, plus vegetables (not onions) and turn them all into a variety and mix of jams, jellies, pickles and chutneys and sell them in aid of their local Methodist Chapel. They also acquire hedgerow and windfall fruit, donations of sugar and empty jars from their local village community, plus some from further afield.

They cannot cook the produce at the time it is harvested as there is simply too much of it, so they freeze it in 3 freezers and make it as it is needed throughout the year. They literally produce 100lbs of preserves etc yearly and have over the years raised thousands of pounds to help their ailing chapel.

The ladies had brought along a large amount of their produce for display and for all of us to look at and buy if we wished. Lorraine and Ann are certainly a hardworking, jolly and very enterprising duo, and clearly loved what they undertake.

For your information, our February coffee morning in a member's home raised £178.80 for our own funds and our Institute is 90 years old this year.

April is our Members Night when the ordinary members take over the organisation of the monthly meeting to thank and to give their hardworking committee a rest. The April 2018 meeting was especially good. All the committee ladies were presented with a pretty pot of mini roses and our enjoyable speaker for the evening was Mark Niel, the Poet Laureate of Milton Keynes, and he entertained us royally as he talked us through his life interspersed with his poetry and songs with a guitar accompaniment. He explained that he was a "secret scribbler" for 8 years, writing poetry for friend's special occasions and some special Milton Keynes civic events. 





Sometimes someone walks into the Weekend Kitchen studio and one of their dishes just brings with it all the aroma and flavour of its country of origin. This Chicken Guvec (pronounced 'Goo-Vetch') has all of the evocative elements of classic Turkish cooking. The meltingly tender meat and the unmistakable flavour of sweet peppers. The recipe was created by Yuksel Couling, who set up her catering company (http:// www.pomegranatesumac.com) in Wilstead near Bedford when friends and family made it clear to her that her talents were being wasted just cooking for them! She uses the exact same principles her Turkish upbringing gave her - cook generously, simply and deliciously with fresh ingredients.

Don't worry if you don't have a clay pot to use. Any form of oven proof dish will be fine. If you can get to a Turkish shop, buy their proper Turkish pepper paste for this. If not, supermarkets have plenty of acceptable variants.

To serve 4, you'll need: 500g boneless chicken thighs, cut into slightly smaller pieces 1 large onion, thickly sliced 2 large green peppers thickly sliced. You can use any peppers you like here but the long green Turkish peppers are the most authentic 1 tbsp hot pepper paste 1 tbsp tomato purée 2 tomatoes, sliced 1 tsp dried thyme or oregano 1 tsp salt

50 ml sunflower oil 100 ml water Serves 4

Place the chicken and the rest

of ingredients (except for the oil and sliced tomatoes) into a mixing bowl. Mix everything well.

Pour the oil into your pot (it doesn't have to be a clay pot). Add the chicken mixture and sauté for 5 minutes. Add the water and stir.

Place the sliced tomatoes on top of the chicken mixture in the pot, and cover. Cook in the oven at 180C/ Gas Mark 4 for 30 minutes. To cook on the hob, simmer it for 30 minutes.

Serve with plain rice and salad.

Elevation: 450 ft - Latitude: 51° 50' 13" North - Longitude: 0° 33' 34" West


March began with an exceptionally cold easterly airstream, which brought snow with daytime temperatures staying below freezing. By the 5th the temperatures had risen to 9 degrees and by the 10th it had reached 12 degrees for a few days but all this time it was unsettled with rain showers most days. On the 17th the temperature plummeted again with sub-zero temperatures day and night, then a short dry spell before the rain came again on the 27th and rain continuously for 4 days.

So March was cold and wet, we all new that! Some facts. Temperature of -5.7° c were a lot lower than average for March. Rain we were twice the 10 year average rain fall for the month and 4 days from 27th-30th we recorded 39.8 mm (1.567 ins) that's over twice the rain we had in total for March 2017. Again I have shown in the data below this month's weather compared to March 2017.


You may think this is the coldest March we have had for a long time but March 2013 was colder with a mean temperature of 2.8° c and almost as much rain.

Eleanor Oliphant is Completely Fine by Gail Honeyman

This month's choice was another debut novel. a quirky story by Gail Honeyman, an Oxford graduate living in Scotland. The book won the Costa First Novel award and has topped the best seller lists world wide. It is soon to be made into a film by Reese Witherspoon.

It is a rather unusual concept for a novel, in as much as when Eleanor first starts to tell us her story, she doesn't appear to be very likeable. She works in an office, in a fairly routine capacity for which she seems over qualified. She deliberately avoids social contact with her colleagues, seeming to think herself slightly superior. They in turn, think her slightly strange and tolerate her. She seems to live completely within her head and insists that she is completely fine.

Her life in private is strictly regulated, at weekends buying the same frozen pizzas and two bottles of vodka which are to last her until Sunday evening. Even her lunchtimes consist of the same food bought at the same outlet. She has no friends and no social life, the only outside contact being a regular phone call from her mother.

Things start to change when she has to call on the services of the firm's IT engineer. She and Raymond embark on a friendship, tentatively at first, but thanks to Raymond's generous open nature, it develops gradually, until they are seeing one another at most lunchtimes. Then, together they help an elderly man who has collapsed in the street and again with Raymond's encouragement, Eleanor realises the joy of opening one's heart and being involved with others.

Alongside Eleanor's story, we are given glimpses of her earlier life, the difficulties that she has experienced and how they have influenced her as an adult. As we get to know her, we appreciate Eleanor and all her eccentricities.

She is a character one falls in love with gradually and her life journey is very entertaining.

Everyone in our book group was full of praise for Eleanor Oliphant is Completely Fine. We enjoyed the originality of the story, basically sad, but heart warming and funny as well. A book we heartily recommend.
