Time is a precious commodity which always seems in short supply. Is it because we are working harder than ever before? Or because there are so many choices of what to do? As the summer approaches and the evenings are lengthening, we hope for time to enjoy the outdoors as well as good weather in which to do it. There are lots of events coming up in our villages including fetes and the Carnival when we can come together and celebrate the beauty of our neighbourhood.

W. H. Davies in his 1911 poem, 'Leisure', wrote:

What is life if, full of care,

We have no time to stand and stare?

No time to stand beneath the boughs

And stare as long as sheep or cows.'

However much we feel we need to do, taking time out is important to get a better perspective on life.

The Bible establishes this principle right from the outset in the book of Genesis. In the Creation Story, God created the heavens and the earth in six days, and on the seventh day he rested. This established an important principle for the people to follow. It recognised our need as human beings to include down time as part of our lives. The idea of a day of rest is enshrined in the Ten Commandments. The Sabbath was set apart as a day on which everyone could take a well-earned rest. That also included animals who worked, like donkeys and horses.

The concept of a day of rest continued into the New Testament. But Jesus was careful to point out that adhering to the spirit of the Law was more important than obeying only the letter of the Law. The idea of Sabbath rest was to help human beings rather than to become a rigid structure. So Jesus healed people on the Sabbath if they needed it, despite criticism from the religious leaders. The Jewish Sabbath was a Saturday, but the early Christian church established Sunday as a day of worship, because that was the day on which Jesus rose from the dead. So Sunday became a day of rest, a day on which to worship God and to lay aside the usual pattern of the working week.

Jesus often took time out to be with his Father in the midst of a hectic schedule. Despite demands from many people who crowded in on him wherever he went, Jesus made time to be alone with God. For those of us who are Christians, time out with God is important for us too. It is an opportunity to make space for prayer and contemplation. That can happen anywhere, but some people find that a church building helps them to connect with a need for inner stillness. St Mary's church has been used as a quiet space for reflection for almost 800 years. The church is open daily so that anyone can come in and spend a few moments of quiet in that sacred space.

Whatever our preference, it is good to be able to take some time out of our own busy schedules. In the long, hot summer days that lie ahead (hopefully!) perhaps we can make time to 'stand and stare'. It may help us sift out what is truly important and let go of some of the things which are not.





Grass Verges

Two years ago Bucks CC devolved the cutting of the grass verges in the 30mph limit in the three

villages to EPC. As EPC now enter the third year carrying out this service the Council have now decided to include the verges in the 40mph limit ensuring greater consistency across the villages.

EPC requests that parishioners do not park their vehicles on the grass verges as this results in damage to the verges and prevents the contractor from cutting the grass

Hedges & Boundaries to Properties

The Parish Council asks parishioners to ensure that the planting around the boundaries of their properties does not

cause a danger or inconvenience to others.

IMPORTANT – Section 154 (1) Highways Act 1980 states that cut-back is required where a hedge, tree or shrub overhangs the highway or any



other road or footway to which the public has access so as to endanger or obstruct the passage of vehicles or pedestrians, or obstructs or interferes with the view of drivers or vehicles or the light from a public lamp.

Please check that the planting at the edge of your property does not overhang the highway/footpath so as to:

- 1. Endanger or obstruct the passage of vehicles or pedestrians
- 2. Obstructs or interferes with the view of drivers or vehicles
- 3. Obstructs or interferes with light from a public lamp
- 4. Potentially cause danger to the highway/road/footpath.

Streetlights

EPC continues to consult with residents and their streetlight contractor about the feasibility of installing additional streetlights in Edlesborough.

New Pavilion Update

The ECSC Trustees and representatives of the Council recently met to discuss the New Pavilion project. The group have agreed to apply for a grant from the New Homes Bonus Scheme. They are currently completing an Expression of Interest for this Scheme. Should the project qualify they will then submit a full application.

If the project does not qualify for the New Homes Bonus Scheme a revised plan will be developed.

Best Kept Village Competition

Edlesborough have once again entered the Buckinghamshire Best Kept Village Competition, judging will take place between 1st June and 7th July 2018.

Our volunteer litter picking teams have been out and about in the villages recently collecting over 20 sacks of rubbish during one pick. EPC thanks the volunteers for

One of the great appeals of moving out of a big town was the village and community feel - something that we've really found in Eaton Bray and the surrounding area. One of the times when everyone really comes together is the annual Beer Festival. Okay, we've only been to two, but what we see, hear (and drink) is a community coming together to enjoy themselves. So how does a typical beer festival weekend go for us?

On the Friday, I tend to work from home. Hearing the festival start up from midday can be a bit of a distraction from the task at hand, but as soon as the clock strikes 5pm I'm out of the door making the short walk to the Village Hall. £3 entry and a commemorative glass sees me into the area where the beers are set up and served by local CAMRA members. 20 real ales spanning all types of beer from breweries such as Tring, XT, Leighton Buzzard, and Dark Star. Start on the half pints (you can get more in that way) and outside for some time in the sun with views of Ivinghoe Beacon and the Chilterns. When my wife gets home from work she usually tries the Ciders and Perrys before we have dinner from the excellent barbecue. As the evening cools down, it's inside for the live music, more beers for me, and wine from the village hall bar for Jill - she's looking forward to the Prosecco this year! As 11pm rolls round it's time to wander back home reflecting on a great evening.

Saturday morning comes with a slightly fuzzy head but getting ready for another day. We usually invite friends and family and spend some time in the sun on the grass outside

(hopefully...). We chat with people of all ages around us, soaking up the atmosphere and watching the children's entertainment keep everyone amused. Having some more time today is a chance to work through the beer list savouring favourites from last night and ticking off untried brews, maybe even a couple of lagers from the hall bar. After an afternoon chilling in the sun it's time to wrap the weekend up with more live music.

Could you Volunteer with Samaritans?

The idea of a non-religious telephone Help Line was started by a young clergyman The Reverend Chad Varrah in 1937 after he had officiated at the funeral of a 13 year old girl. He

was shocked and saddened to discover that the girl had committed suicide because she thought she had some dreadful disease. She had nobody to whom she could talk to, nobody that she felt that she could discuss things with. She felt that the only option open to her was to take her own life. Because she committed suicide she was buried in unconsecrated ground. Chad Varrah decided there and then to try to help put an end to some taboos and to give ordinary people the opportunity to talk openly about sensitive subjects.

It took some time to set things up, but in 1953 he began pastoral counselling at St Stephen's Wallbrook in London and he was able to set up a 'non-religious' telephone help line.

There are now 200 branches in the United Kingdom and Ireland. Last year the entire Samaritan organisation received over 5,000,000 contacts. Every 5 seconds someone contacts the Samaritans; every 57 seconds Samaritans receive a contact from someone who is feeling suicidal.

We are a volunteer led organisation. Samaritans has a central office which prepares standard training materials, deals with the media, provides websites and manages the countrywide telephone platform. They have around 85 staff. That means there are 212 volunteers for every paid member of staff. The average ratio among the top 500 fundraising charities is estimated at 44 to 1.

Luton, South Beds and Harpenden Samaritans to give us our official title, usually shortened to Luton Sams have been in Luton since 1966. We try to man the phones 24/7 and to do this we should really keep our volunteer levels at around 100. Our ages range from 18 to over 80. Because we are a completely confidential service you will never hear about what, if anything, we achieve. We do not ask callers anything about their background or where in the country they are calling from, we just listen to what they want to tell us.

We currently have 90 listening volunteers and between us we took 19,689 calls, answered some 2,116 emails and 1,456 texts whilst seeing 83 Face to Face callers over the 12 months. Many of these callers are coping with some degree of suicidal feelings

All our volunteers are trained to an extremely high standard. Each volunteer receives about 6 weeks of intensive training (6 full days) and then are given a Mentor to work with and support them until they become a probationer. The probation period lasts for about 6 months after which they become a full Samaritan.

In our modern world of pressure and rush, there needs to be someone who just simply listens without any time constraints and who doesn't judge you. Sometimes talking to a stranger on the phone means you can tell that stranger things you have never been able to say before with the complete confidence that we will not tell them what to do.

We are never shocked or try to give advice

We simply listen

That's why we exist

That's why we are so busy

And that is why we need more volunteers

When do I start teaching my child to read?

LOCAL HERALDRY

BY JOHN HOCKEY

In this series, we take a look around local towns and villages to find interesting and unusual heraldry.

BERKHAMSTED RE-VISITED

Last time we visited St Peter's, Berkhamsted, we looked at a hatchment for a man who had had two wives. This time I want to look at a monument in the South Aisle, to Henry Johnson who died in 1760 aged 61. The monument tells us he was descended from the Barons of De Vesci who came over with William the Conqueror.

The monument is nice enough but I want to look at the coat of arms that is colourfully displayed underneath. Colourful, yes, but I fear here we have another instance where the colours are wrong!

These arms are what is called 'quarterly of six' that is, six separate coats denoting the families married into and I wager that at least four of



them have the wrong colours painted on. Rule number one in heraldry is 'No colour on colour, no metal on metal' referring to the colours of charges placed on the field or background. It is obvious that for the sake of clarity, contrast is best achieved if a charge in one of the colours (red, blue, black, green, purple) is placed on a background of one of the metals (gold or silver). In this case we have two instances of water bougets (the strange shaped devices on the two shields on the left) being coloured Sable (black) on a background which is Gules (red). Moving to the right-hand or sinister side we see the uppermost shield has what look like green frogs (but are probably fleur de lis) on black and below three black stars on blue.

The only parts of this coat of arms which appear correct are the two central shields where the lions rampant are gold (Or) on a background of green (Vert) – just to complete the bizarre nature of this monument, the lower lion has two heads, which strangely enough is quite correct!



Have I got gloves strong enough to withstand its beak when I pick it up? — were dispelled as it calmly folded its wings and started to pluck the young blackbird it had caught. Fortunately for the victim, our dog came rushing out into the garden and both attacker and attacked flew away — separately.

I then remembered that sparrowhawks spread their wings over their prey to stop others coming in — "mantling" I believe falconers call it.

This is my favourite time of year. Long summer days, the garden full of wildlife and flowers, and Springwatch on the telly when I can tear myself away from outdoors.

On days like this, it's easy to believe in a wonderful God who organises all of creation to be a joy to us. Then we see the blackbird helpless under the hawk, and remember not all nature is kind and beautiful. Yet there is an order to it—the hawk has chicks that need feeding too. One thing I like about Springwatch's approach to this, is that they don't shrink from showing that these things happen.

Human life is also capable of brutality and beauty in equal measure, and the Bible reflects that in full, from the battles and crimes in the Old Testament, inflicted by God's people, to the sufferings of Jesus himself. Yet God promises at the end of time, a world where there will only be joy, a world where suffering and violence will not exist, where "there will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away." (Revelation 21: 4)

If life is giving you more almonds than raisins at present (to quote a Jewish saying), then I invite you to trust in the God who is in charge even when it doesn't feel like He is, and to still rejoice in the beauty He sends us wherever and however you find it.

What does the word 'church' mean to you? It provokes many different reactions from positive to negative, interested to bored and approving to angry opposition.

The Bible says that a church can gather, pray and be spoken to. The Bible also says that Jesus died for the church. That's why we prefer to call the building we meet in a chapel, to emphasise that the church is the people.

A local church consists of people who have trusted in Jesus Christ, God's Son, as their Saviour and Lord and are committed to supporting and encouraging each other in following him and making him known. For that purpose we meet regularly to worship him and learn about him.

As a local church we have committed ourselves to do four things together - things the first church in Jerusalem devoted themselves to. First, we learn from God's word, the Bible. In this way we grow in understanding and knowing God and are helped to do what pleases him. Secondly, we treat one another like brothers and sisters, sharing, supporting, encouraging and helping each other. Thirdly, we remember Jesus Christ in the way he told us to, by sharing bread and wine together. We call it the Lord's Supper. The bread represents his body broken on the cross for us and the wine represents his blood shed for us. Fourthly, we pray together for one another, for those around us and for God's will to be done in the world.

Our Sunday services are open to all. In them we simply sing praise to God, pray, hear the Bible being read and then listen to it being explained and applied to our lives. Come and join us - you'd be very welcome. Everything is

explained as we go along. You won't be asked for money and don't need to dress up specially. You are also welcome to join

us on Wednesday evenings when we study the Bible, with opportunity for questions and discussion, and pray together.



Cherry Bakewell Tart

treat, and luckily we have them every week on the Weekend Kitchen. This

sumptuous Bakewell Tart was created by a highly talented young local cake maker and pastry chef called Victoria Chidgey. She set up her business, Little Tring Cakes, after several stints in top London businesses – and the pastry recipe here was given to her by a chef at the Savoy Hotel when she was 16 years old. She swears by it, and it creates an incredibly light, flaky and moreish tart.

You'll need 1 x 9" Pie Mould / Tart Ring or a 12 whole bun tray with round pastry cutter.

Pastry:

340g Flour

225g Butter

110g Golden Caster Sugar

1 Egg

Frangipane:

120g Butter

120g Golden Caster Sugar

120g Ground Almonds

2 Eggs

5g/1 teaspoon Almond Essence

25ml Brandy (if you have it knocking about)

Filling:

125g Black Cherry Compote

Topping:

Flaked Almonds

Icing Sugar (Golden is best but it doesn't matter too much)

Preheat the oven to 160C, 140C Fan, Gas Mark

Beat the butter (at room temperature) with the sugar until it is well incorporated and has lightened in colour.

Scrape the bowl and add the flour. Beat on a low speed and, when the flour is just incorporated, add the egg. Keep mixing until it all comes together. Wrap the pastry in clingfilm and leave in the fridge for an hour or so, or in the freezer for 15-25 minutes. The recipe is enough pastry for two tarts so you can freeze whatever you don't use.

I cannot resist a sweet For the frangipane, melt the butter in the microwave until it is very soft but still holds its shape.

> Mix in the sugar with a wooden spoon and lightly beat for around 3 minutes.

> Add the ground almonds and brandy (if using) and mix until incorporated. Add the egg and beat for 1-2 minutes.

Roll out the pastry to approximately 3mm thick. Line the tart case. Push the pastry into the corners and then use your fingers in an upward motion. If you have opted to do smaller individual tartlets, use a round cutter to cut a disk of pastry and line the bun holes.

Trim away any excess pastry with a sharp paring knife, leaving a slight lip if possible. Prick the bottom of the tart with a fork. Patch up any imperfections with pastry using your thumb.

Spread the cherry compote on the bottom of the tart case and place in the fridge or freezer. This prevents any of the filling bleeding through the frangipane.

Using a piping bag or the back of a hot spoon, spread the frangipane on top of the compote to just below the rim of the pastry. Scatter flaked almonds on top and bake for approximately 35-40 minutes. Once out of the oven dust the top with icing sugar while still warm.

Serve with brandy cream or crème fraiche mixed with some lemon zest.

Dagnall Weather Station (AONB) Weather Conditions for April 2018


Elevation: 450 ft - Latitude: 51° 50' 13" North - Longitude: 0° 33' 34" West

It was a very changeable month. April started very unsettled, cold, cloudy and wet. We had a brief interlude from the 5th as temperatures rose slightly with three dry days, then it was back to cloudy and damp. The 11th was a misty day and, by early evening, it had turned to fog to be more like November. Then it was all change again as winter conditions switched to midsummer with bright sun and record temperatures to 28.3°c between the 18th and 22nd. Just as quickly, it resumed to cold and wet, with the wettest day being the 27th when we had 14.6mm rainfall. Rainfall for the whole of the month was 72.7mm, which is 163% of the 10 year average, and a huge increase on April 2017's 9.8mm.


Over the last couple of articles, I have shown comparisons between months and years in the table of highs and lows. If this is of more interest, please let me know and I can incorporate them more often.

The Girl from Station "X" by Elisa Segrave

Elisa Segrave is a feature writer for the Guardian and other newspapers and literary magazines. She has had only one other book published, a personal memoir entitled The Diary of a Breast, which charted her experiences whilst suffering from breast cancer. This book, The Girl from Station "X" is also a memoir, but unusual in that it incorporates extracts from diaries written by her mother between 1930 and 1950, which were discovered shortly before she died from alcohol induced dementia.

The diaries came as a complete surprise to Elisa, who throughout her life had had a troubled relationship with her mother. She had come to the point of dismissing her as selfish and uncaring and, due to her dependence on alcohol very difficult to deal with. Clearing her mother's belongings, as she became more unable to live independently, Elisa discovered the diaries, written in 30 notebooks. Unfortunately, now, her mother was in the last stages of dementia and the two women had lost the chance to repair their relationship. It was as she read her mother's personal thoughts and experiences, that Elisa found a completely different personality revealed to the one she knew as Mother.

Anne Hamilton Grace was born into privilege. Her early life was one of ease and luxury, with nannies and servants and country houses with lots of land. Her life changed when her beloved son died in an accident

and she withdrew from normal life. This happened when Elisa was five and she was conscious of her mother changing into a self-absorbed depressive.

The diaries though, show the young Anne to be completely different, a vibrant adventurous and intelligent girl, who had travelled extensively. When war broke out, she eschewed what she saw as an idle life, volunteering for the W.A.A.F as she wanted to do something useful. The diaries show that her potential was recognised and she was given a series of interesting posts in Intelligence. She appears to be well thought of by her superiors and gives the impression that she enjoyed her wartime work.


The book gives us excerpts from the diaries, which are very interesting, giving an insight to life during that time, especially the work on Naval Surveillance at Bletchley Park. Alongside these Elisa Segrave makes her own comments, linking the different pieces from the diaries.

In effect the two different voices in the book take the attention away from the main subject, which are the diaries. Our group found this and the many characters and different time frames distracting and hard to follow. We found the author to be rather unkind and selfish and thought she was using the book as a kind of catharsis.

We thought the wartime information interesting, but overall did not enjoy the book.





