Dagnall Recreation Ground Play Equipment

Dear Dagnall Residents,

As I'm sure you are by now aware, we have sadly had to remove the play equipment from the Recreation Ground. This was because it failed its annual inspection and we had to shut it down and remove it immediately due to health and safety reasons. This was a big shock to us, we were actually looking at ways to re-surface the area, perhaps with rubber crumb or new bark, prior to this disaster.

Luckily our contractor was able to squeeze this job in and remove the equipment very quickly. He took all the metal and wood offsite, but we were left with a considerable heap of bark / soil / weeds residue after the original surface was scraped up. We allowed him to store this in temporary heaps in the Dell, which seemed preferable to leaving a big heap on the Rec itself.

The intention is for the natural woven cloth matting to be removed, then the bark residue will be spread over the far dell and left to biodegrade This will happen just as soon as he is able to do it. The important thing was to remove the equipment before a child was injured. This clearance task was an unavoidable expense for the DVH committee, but the additional cost for taking the bark offsite was prohibitive.

We felt the money would be better spent going towards new equipment.

We have tried to get word out via various emails, word of mouth, Facebook and the village newsletter. Many thanks to the Focus team for allowing us to include such a late article. Apologies for any distress or upset this has caused, it really was beyond our control. We hope to be able to replace the equipment but will likely need to instigate some fundraising initiatives to do so, and would welcome any input from villagers as what you would like to see in its place,

At this time of year, many of us will be going on holiday and that often involves a trip to the seaside. Sun, sea and sand make a winning combination. But there are growing concerns about our marine environment. 100 years ago, the shores of the British Isles teemed with fish. Today fishermen struggle to make a living. Cullum Roberts, Professor of Marine Conservation at the University of York writes: 'Where the bottom [of the sea] was formerly carpeted with sponges, sea fans, hydroids and weed, today it is possible to go diving and hardly see a single living thing.'

Years of overfishing, and the effects of pollution and climate change are leading to a breakdown in the functioning of the world's oceans. Considering that 70% of the earth's surface is water, healthy seas are essential to our wellbeing. But today there are whole areas which are dead or dying. Some of the symptoms include dead zones in which rotting matter has robbed the water of life-giving oxygen, plagues of jelly fish and disease epidemics. In some places, the whole ecosystem has begun to fall apart.

As the world's population increases so will the need for resources to provide food and drink. That is bound to have an impact on fish stocks. In order to preserve the oceans for future generations, it will require countries working together to limit overfishing. A recent report by the Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) of the United Nations has highlighted some of the issues. A third of the world's oceans are overfished, causing problems for those communities, often in the poorest regions, who rely on fish to survive. 'There is too much pressure on marine resources,' Manuel Barange, director of the FAO fisheries and aquaculture department told Reuters. 'We need significantly more commitments from governments to improve the state of their fisheries.'

Yet a staggering 35% of fish caught is wasted. One of the root problems is poor refrigeration which means that fish rot before they are able to be consumed. Food waste is a global problem. In the USA, total food waste accounts for around \$218 billion a year. Another major issue is plastic pollution in the oceans. BBC's 'Blue Planet 2' graphically highlighted this. The crew who produced it said there was rarely a time then they were filming and they didn't come across plastic in the sea. 'Some scientists think that entanglement in marine plastic is the most significant welfare threat of human origin in the ocean,' says executive producer James Honeyborne. There is also the problem of tiny plastic particles which could be contributing to high levels of chemical contamination in large predators, such as pilot whales. 'It is now thought that plastics may play a role in increasing the uptake of pollutants into the body,' says Honeyborne.

We can become immune to such doomsday scenarios. After all, things are often exaggerated. But for Christians, one of our priorities should be to care for the earth and to protect God's creation for future generations. So what can we do? Although our contribution will be tiny, like a drop in the ocean, the ocean is

made up of drops. We can make a difference, however small. We can ensure that the fish we buy is from sustainable sources. We can lobby politicians to ban the discarding of unwanted fish when it is caught up in fishing nets. We can be responsible in our use and disposal of plastics. Our concern for God's creation can inspire us to prayer and action to work to protect the future of our beautiful planet.





It is astounding to think that our scheme has already been running for two years and we are shortly to hold our second AGM. Our quarterly review reveals that our **Neighbours** service is in good health, our activities are both growing significantly and diversifying. Indeed the number of completed tasks has risen by 16%. Health transport still

forms the backbone of our work but the collection of prescriptions has increased by over 50%, while 'social transport' (e.g. lifts to shops / clubs/ hairdressers / friends) has risen too. We have done much more 'pet care' and have introduced new types of assistance e.g. on-line shopping support. Client numbers have also increased slightly with 6 new individuals approaching us for help. We are proud to say that during this quarter there has been no-one whom we have been unable to help if given the required notice. The Befriending team continues to be especially active; the main focus is on home visits for a chat or perhaps a table game like dominos but during the warmer weather we occasionally accompany our 'Friends' for walks in the local area. Sometimes people prefer a telephone call rather than a visit and this is an increasing area of support. A small group meet up regularly for a lunch of soup and rolls and from time to time a day trip takes place. In June we took a group on an outing to Rushmere Park.

The scheme would fail without the kind help of our strong cohort of volunteers (currently 44) and we are grateful that the telephone help-line team now has an additional member although we would welcome still more assistance in this respect. Holiday periods are difficult to cover when several members are away at the same time and we would not have managed if we had not had generous support of Claire Giblin and her team at the Estate Agency. Most volunteers are very busy people so finding a date when we can socialise is a tall order. However, a very pleasant summer social took place in early June at the home of our Chairman, Kay Griffiths.

Anne Thompson's Young Peoples Cup for Excellence

The Anne Thompson Young Peoples Cup for Excellence is an award presented by EPC to a young person in the Parish who has come to the attention of the Council. The cup may be awarded for excellent achievement, raising awareness, contributing to the local community or for another reason that makes the young person stand out to the Council.

This year EPC awarded the Anne Thompson Young Peoples Cup for Excellence to Millie Stansfield.

Millie is an 11 year old Edlesborough resident who was diagnosed with Type 1 Diabetes in October 2016. Despite the immense impact this has had upon Millie's health and life she continues to approach every aspect of her life with a smiley positive attitude.

Millie had been really thirsty and tired and had been losing weight despite eating more than ever. She had also been needing the toilet much more frequently. Her parents Becca & John now know these are 'classic' symptoms of type 1 diabetes - a lifelong condition whereby the body mistakenly attacks its own insulin producing cells in the pancreas (which control blood sugar). As a result, blood sugars can become dangerously high and cause damage to the body and, if left undiagnosed can be life threatening.

- Type 1 Diabetes is an entirely different condition to Type 2 Diabetes which classically presents later in life and is more strongly linked to diet, lifestyle and family genetics.
- Type 1 Diabetes is usually diagnosed in childhood or teenage years (the average age of diagnosis being age 11). The cause is unknown and there is currently no cure. It is in no way linked to diet or lifestyle.





Millie has a daily regimen of at least four injections. She injects herself with synthetic

insulin every single time she eats and at bedtime. She has to closely monitor her blood sugar - day and night - using her 'finger pricker' which draws a drop of blood to test her blood sugar with a monitor. She has to be incredibly disciplined in order to keep her blood sugars under control. She has to count the carbohydrate value in every single meal and calibrate her insulin to cover it. Any slight mis-calculation could have catastrophic consequences. Not only this, but her blood sugar levels can be influenced by what she eats, the air temperature, hormones and exercise. Adding all these factors together means that Millie's life is not that of a typical 11 year old. She sometimes has to sit out during sports activities if her blood sugar has dropped too low and sleep overs with friends are logistically too tricky to contemplate.



Despite all of this, Millie is a happy and healthy child and takes it all in her stride. She loves playing football with her friends for both Edlesborough School and E.B Lions and recently competed at district sports and also represented her school in cross country. She is a 'Sports Leader' at the school - helping younger children with sports by supporting them in the playground at lunchtimes and also on sports days.

When she had been diagnosed for six months, Millie decided that she wanted to became a JDRF Junior ambassador and help other children who had been newly diagnosed with the condition. The charity JDRF are unique in that they are a charity that solely raises money for Type 1 Diabetes. The money raised funds for research into the condition, in the hope that one day there will be a cure.

In October 2017, to help raise money for the charity, Millie single-handedly organised a 'Type-One-sie day' for Edlesborough School. All of the children really embraced the idea and came to school wearing their

'onesies' (of varying design and colour) in exchange for a donation to JDRF. Millie stood up in assembly - in front of the entire school - to explain about her condition and what she has to do on a daily basis. The pupils at the school really were incredibly supportive and generous and helped Millie raise over £200 for the charity.

Millie has also signed up to a new programme at Luton & Dunstable hospital, which means she can go and visit newly diagnosed children in hospital and offer them support and advice when they need it the most.

The Council believe Millie is an incredible young person and a credit to the community. Should any parishioner wish to nominate a young person from the Parish to receive this award in 2019 please contact the Clerk.

The Silent Soldier


The Silent Soldier stands as tribute to those who didn't return home and those whose lives would never be the same again.




EPC continue to work with BCC and the Local Area Forum with the intention of carrying out a Traffic Calming Feasibility Study at the following locations in the Parish:

Bus Service Changes

Arriva have informed Bucks CC that they are withdrawing the following commercial bus service:





From 29th July 2018 route 61 will be operated by Red Eagle instead of Arriva. Red Eagle are based in Aylesbury and a sister company of Redline Buses who run Service 164 to Cheddington.

There are also some minor timing changes to most journeys.

Some buses will operate as service 61A. These will divert between Aston Clinton and Aylesbury to serve Elm Farm (where Arriva have also withdrawn the service) instead of operating directly along the Tring Road, with some minor timetable adjustments to allow for this.

Within Aylesbury, in line with other services, buses will operate direct along Exchange Street and Friarage Road towards the bus station instead of operating around the town centre via High Street, New Street and Oxford Road – buses leaving Aylesbury will follow their current route.

Eaton Bray Village Hall Management Committee Chairman's Report for 2017

This year has seen the last major development of our hall. Namely, the extension of the entrance hall and total refurbishment along with electric doors. I think that now completes our required redevelopment which has taken us 18 years to complete. Obviously there is a "wish list" of developments that hopefully can still be undertaken and continued repairs and replacements, but the trustees have raised and spent nearly £400,000 in that time. I can only say that has been a magnificent achievement by the trustees, many of whom have served throughout that time. I feel I must mention Norman Lee who saw us through the major redevelopment of the first years (until 2009) and has continued to be a major part of our team.

One must not overlook the efforts of the fundraisers who oversaw the application for grants plus many fundraising events, which are still on going. Katrina Hurley led us very ably until recently and Paul Hurley, who is stepping down as a trustee this year after many years, but has agreed to continue of the fundraising committee. We also have 2 new members of the fundraising committee, which is another step towards ensuring we can carry on the good work.

We a have another new trustee, Robert Taylor join us, so the average age of trustees is coming down slightly and I feel that we now have the basis for the next generation of trustees.

The year on the financial side was mostly as planned, with a slight drop in total income, but the regular users were up whilst casual (one off hirers) were down slightly. We shall see where this goes over the next year, but the hall still has an operating profit before the planned expenditure is taken into account.

This is my last chairman's report as I am stepping down after 9 years, but Phil Noble has agreed to stand for the position at the AGM. Should he be confirmed, I am convinced he will do an excellent job for the Charity.



LOCAL HERALDRY

BY JOHN HOCKEY

In this series, we take a look around local towns and villages to find interesting and unusual heraldry.

A WADDESDON TABLE

I think we all know that the 'sign' of the Rothschild family at Waddesdon is five arrows – indeed there is the Five Arrows Hotel just outside to remind us before we enter the palatial grounds.

This symbol was chosen to represent the five sons of Mayer Amschel Rothschild, who were born between 1773 and 1792 - i.e. Amschel, Salomon, Nathan, Carl and James. Each one settled in a different country to pursue their banking interests. Five centres of power were established with each son resident in a particular city - Frankfurt, Vienna, London, Naples

and Paris.

In order to cement their relationship in a tangible graphic way, the brothers set upon establishing a coat of arms, under the jurisdiction of the College of Heralds. The proposed design was suggested by Salomon, resident in Vienna and included an eagle, a leopard and a lion plus an arm clutching five arrows to show the unity of the brothers. Then as now, the motto was to be 'Concordia, Integritas, Industria' referring to the qualities that led to their success.

All did not go smoothly though. The first design was rejected by the granting authority,

Austria, because Nathan had settled in England. The College of Heralds suggested that the arm should only hold four arrows and this design was accepted in 1817. In the next few years there were various re-workings of the arms (one can only imagine the heated discussions behind the scenes!) and eventually, in 1822 when the Austrian Emperor made all five brothers Barons, the arms were changed to include an arm clutching five arrows and that design stands today. Perhaps sensitive to the battle that had taken place, Nathan who was in London, did not use the title Baron and remained 'plain' Mr Rothschild.

If you go into the Smoking Room off the Armoury Corridor, open at Christmas, you may see as I did a small inlaid table dated between 1817 and 1822. It has the Rothschild coat of arms - but crucially with only four arrows clutched by the arm and I am grateful to the Senior Curator at Waddesdon for her explanation as to why this should be.

Shrimp Burger

So let's be clear, this is basically a delicious prawn cocktail, slathered onto a light and perfectly formed thick prawn fish

cake, served in a brioche burger bun. What's not to like? And my word it works! Layers and layers of flavour and texture make this a perfect alternative to a traditional burger. And its creator, Tom Bainbridge, a regular guest on my Weekend Kitchen programme, is no traditional chef. He taught himself how to cook when he took over the Tilbury in Datchworth and now holds two AA Rosettes there. He loves playing with the classics and usually cannot resist a sweet twist to his dishes. Here he recommends using sweetened brioche buns to do exactly that... This will make up to 6 burgers

Ingredients

500g raw king prawns (shelled)
100g diced raw cod
100g sweet brioche (failing that just use
good quality white bread)

1 x jalapeno chili 50g fresh coriander Zest and juice of 1 lemon

2 large banana shallots

2 garlic cloves

Salt, pepper and a squeeze of honey to season

For the shrimp cocktail:

200g cooked small prawns
50g mayonnaise
25g ketchup
Splash each of brandy, Worcestershire Sauce,
Tabasco and Lemon, to taste

To Serve:

Brioche Buns, iceberg lettuce, sliced tomato, crème fraiche

Dice up the brioche and toast it under the grill until lightly brown.

Roughly chop the shallot, garlic and chili then place all the burger ingredients into a food processor and blend until smooth. Take a small piece of the mixture and fry it to check for seasoning. Adjust the seasoning if it needs more

Form the mixture into six individual patties and place them in the fridge to allow them to firm up.

Once firm, fry them in a little oil on a medium heat for 6 minutes, turning every minute.

Meanwhile make the shrimp cocktail sauce. Squeeze any excess moisture from the shrimp, then place all the cocktail sauce ingredients, except the shrimp, in a bowl and mix well. Once mixed, add the shrimp back in.

To build the burger, first toast the brioche buns. Once toasted, place some shredded iceberg lettuce at the bottom, then add the shrimp cocktail, followed by the burger and a thin slice of tomato on top. You can finish the burger with a spoon of lime zest crème fraiche, but this is optional.

"The Power" by Naomi Alderman

This is the fifth and latest book Book Group by Naomi Alderman, an Oxford

graduate whose work has won many prizes, this book winning the Bailey's Women's prize for fiction. She is currently Professor of Creative Writing at Bath Spa

In "The Power" Naomi Alderman uses a very original device to tell her story. Our present, with its wars and gender inequality issues, is told from the distant future by an author from that time. The age-old problems of the female of the species of being subjugated by the male, become solvable by the discovery of electrostatic power in young women. Girls find that they have the ability to generate electric shocks from their bodies, enabled by "skeins", special muscles from which they can deliver sensations, ranging from mild stinging to lethal shocks of electricity. The power varies, but apparently all women have it and can harness it to some degree.

In the novel, four main characters are used to show how the power can be used. Tunde, a young Nigerian man, records the first known use of the power, after witnessing a young girl

defend herself against assault. He becomes a reporter, chronicling the changes in the world as they happen. Margot is a U.S senator, who pretends not to have the

power at first, in order to ingratiate herself with male voters. Then she realises the strength of power and uses it in a different way. Allie is a foster child who kills her abusive foster father in self-defence and Roxy who, after watching her mother's death in a gangland killing, uses the power for revenge. The women's lives become linked as the world evolves to a new order. Gradually the power is used carelessly and indiscriminately, bringing society to full circle. Although the story is part dystopian, part science fiction, it fits well with the zeitgeist of our present time and serves as a warning to the "me too" generation before they go too far in their battle for equality.

This-was a good choice for a book group as it engendered a lot of discussion. Most people liked the book, but some found it difficult to get into because of the plot device. Some also thought that the violence described was distasteful and rather gratuitous. But that is purely personal taste.





Grace Baptist Church Edlesborough


My name is Alister, and for those of you who might not know me.

I'm still a relatively recent addition to the village. I am currently serving as a Pastoral Trainee at the Grace Baptist Church, and this is my story of how I became a Christian. I was born in the Mid-South of the United States in the state of Arkansas, home to Bill Clinton and Johnny Cash. My parents were both committed Christians, and my father was pastor of a church. When I was born, things seemed to be ok, until various tests were run. These tests revealed that there was something wrong with my heart, that it wasn't beating properly. Arrangements were made for me to be transferred to another hospital, and it looked as though I might not make it very long. My parents and family and our church were praying for me. My parents in particular prayed for peace, regardless of the outcome. Every time my mother heard my dad's footsteps going through the hospital corridor, she was prepared for bad news.

The next morning, however, the nurse reported that 'there was a different baby in my place.' The problem was gone, and I would be able to go home very soon. God had done a miracle.

Life carried on, and then my family (at the time I had 3 siblings) moved to London, where my father became pastor of a church in Stamford Hill. Although my parents and brothers were Christians I was not, and although I believed in God, had never done anything about it. I remember when Dad asked me about it, and my parents talked with me about the Bible, and the good news of Jesus that we call the Gospel. It was a few weeks later that I publicly decided to follow Christ. Even though I was young, I knew

Elevation: 450 ft - Latitude: 51° 50' 13" North - Longitude: 0° 33' 34" West


June was warm, sunny, settled and dry. It was a month of records as, in various parts of the UK, they were reaching record temperatures of 30+ degrees. But here in Dagnall, at the end of the month, we had six days with temperatures in the mid to high 20s, peaking at 29.3°c, with a monthly mean temperature of 16.7°c. It may have felt unusually hot, but it was only last June (2017) when we had temperatures even hotter at 30 degrees for four consecutive days. The mean temperature was also higher at 17.1°c. I didn't remember that until I looked at the stats.

With a monthly rainfall of 2.8mm, it was unbelievably dry. In old measurements, that's less than 1/8 inch of rain. The average for June over the last ten years has been 51mm of rain, so we had just 5% of the average. In fact, in June 2012 we recorded a monthly rainfall of 154mm. With British weather so unpredictable, who would be a weather forecaster?

Put Your Best Foot Forward Tips by St Judes Clinic

benefits from good foot care.



Cracked heels are caused by dry skin, prolonged standing or mal-alignment of the foot or walking pattern. Use a pumice stone to reduce the hard skin and apply a suitable foot cream. Avoid wearing thin-soled or open-backed shoes and choose a good shock absorbing sole.

Corns are thickening of the skin usually on top of the toe, the sole or between the toes caused by pressure of the shoe. These may be swollen and painful to direct pressure. Often caused by ill-fitting shoes, you should avoid tight shoes and hosiery. Use a pumice stone to remove excess skin and moisturise with a good foot cream. Don't use corn plasters as these can destroy healthy skin.

Sweaty and smelly feet can be caused by hormonal changes such as hyperhidrosis (excessive sweating) and being on your feet all day. Wear cotton socks and rotate your shoe usage. Wash and dry your feet carefully every day. Surgical spirit or witch hazel between the toes may help.

Blisters are painful, fluid-filled lesions. often caused by friction and pressure from ill-fitting footwear and socks and excessive moisture between the foot and the sock. To help prevent them:

• Wear comfortable, good-fitting footwear.

- It doesn't matter how old you are everyone Choose moisture wicking socks that are the right size - specialist dual layer socks can be useful for walkers and runners and change your socks daily.
 - Keep your toenails trim and regularly check your feet for signs of rubbing. If you have a blister, do not pop it - cover with a breathable plaster.


