Giving and receiving gifts is at the heart of our Christmas celebrations. Some suggest that this tradition reflects the gifts the Wise Men brought to the infant Jesus. The Christmas story talks of gold, frankincense and myrrh, gifts of great value- and also rather strange presents to bring to a child! There are so many considerations when purchasing a gift. It can be quite a challenge deciding what to give to our families, friends and work colleagues. Consideration may be given to the price and whether the recipient will like the present, but there are also deeper questions of environmental and ethical impact to ponder.

Stacey Dooley is currently famous for appearing on Strictly Come Dancing. Her 'day job' is as a documentary maker tackling difficult and sometimes dangerous subjects. Recently the BBC aired her documentary 'Fashion's dirty secrets' which examined the environmental impact of cotton production, focusing on the area around the Aral Sea. The Aral Sea lies between Kazakhstan and Uzbekistan. Uzbekistan is the world's fifth biggest cotton exporter, and the process of irrigating the cotton and dying the cloth has had a huge impact on the local climate. The region has seen changing temperatures and rainfall as the Aral Sea has shrunk to one tenth of its original size and turned into a desert. As Stacey Dooley is driven across the sea bed now reduced entirely to dust, she comments: 'There used to be fish; now there's a carnel.'

Besides thinking of environmental impact, there are also ethical issues to consider. Workers often receive low pay for their work, with the profits going elsewhere. One way of ensuring that workers are given a fair wage is to buy products which have the Fairtrade logo. According to the Fairtrade foundation, 'Fairtrade is about better prices, decent working conditions, local sustainability and fair terms of trade for farmers and workers in the developing world. It enables them to improve their position and have more control over their lives.' Fairtrade doesn't only ensure a fair wage to workers; it also gives them a Fairtrade premium to invest in their local communities. This can be spent on areas such as housing, schools or training.

The Wise Men may not have faced these environmental and ethical considerations, but they were presented with a challenge. What do you give to a baby born to be king? In his gospel, Matthew tells us that they sought the baby Jesus in Herod's palace, assuming that was where a new king would be born. Herod told them to search diligently for the new king and then return to tell him so that he could pay homage. His plan was to kill his rival. The Wise Men eventually found the infant Jesus and presented him with their prophetic gifts. Gold represented royalty and was a sign that Jesus was destined to become king. In Old Testament times it was also a sign of holiness. Worth its weight in gold, frankincense was burnt and

used in religious rituals, representing the prayers of the people. It showed that Jesus was someone worthy to be worshipped. Mynh is a resin from a bushy tree found in the Arabian Peninsula. It is used in medicine to reduce swelling and also for anointing the dead. Another rare and costly gift, mynh looked forward to Jesus' destiny as the one who would die on the cross to bring salvation.

St. Mary's 800

2019 marks the 800th anniversary of the Parish Church of St Mary the Virgin, Eaton Bray. An 11th or 12th century church may have stood on the site, built of wood or wattle and daub, but for 800 years the church we recognise today has served as a focus for worship and prayer for the village of Eaton Bray and, since 1975 it has been the Parish Church of the newly created Parish of Eaton Bray with Edlesborough.

The eminent architectural historian Niklaus Pevsner says of the church, "Externally the church is not specially memorable – but its interior one will hardly forget. It is surprisingly splendid, thanks to the two arcades." Sir John Betjeman went even further in his praise when he wrote that St Mary's "has nave arches of absolute and quite unexpected magnificence."

The Domesday Book records that the manor of Eitone was granted to Odo, Bishop of Bayeaux and half-brother to William the Conqueror. It passed to Henry II and Eleanor of Aquitaine after which the manor was granted to one of King John's inner circle of advisors, William de Cantelupe and he began to build the church on a magnificent scale, although the church was completed on more modest lines. It is noted that in 1219 the vicarage was committed to the charge of Nicholas – the first known vicar of the parish.

In 1490 the Manor of Eaton was granted to Sir Reginald Bray, from whom the village takes its name. He is one of several men credited with finding the crown abandoned by the defeated Richard III after the Battle of Bosworth Field (1485) and placing it on the head of Henry Tudor. Bray rose to become High Treasurer and Chancellor of the Dutchy of Lancaster. He was an

accomplished engineer and architect and was closely involved in the building of St George's Chapel, Windsor. Bray is responsible for the present appearance of the church (apart from the tower which was restored in the 19th century) – the chancel was rebuilt, the nave roof raised and the clerestory windows installed.

By the late 19th century the church was in a parlous state and from February 1875 services were held in the schoolroom across the road. It was the Revd Edwin Sutton who guided the parish through the restoration of the church. His entire incumbency (1890 – 1916) was dominated by the task, which was accomplished with the aid of generous benefaction from the Wallace family who built a nursery with acres of greenhouses in which choice carnations and roses were grown.

The building is a fine testament to previous generations but its real importance lies in being the focus of the life of a community of Christians today, who worship here, thus maintaining an unbroken tradition of prayer and praise over many hundreds of years, and who proclaim the faith of Jesus Christ and serve the community in his name and after his example. That is why the present generation works hard to preserve and improve it so that it may inspire future generations to continue the tradition of prayer and service.





Dear Friends.



'Lighter' Cog au Vin

Coq au vin is a traditional autumnal dish. cooked to get all the flavour out of the meat. That said, it can be a little heavy. This simple version, created by Andrei Lussman (owner of the Lussmans restaurants in Hertfordshire), is a lighter take on the French classic. Andrei is a fascinating and charming character, almost an old-school restaurateur and raconteur from This dish bygone age.

would grace a midweek family supper or a dinner party alike.

Serves 2

2 large free-range chicken legs 150g tomato wedges 400ml beef stock Handful of fresh basil 150ml white wine 80g red onion, sliced 6g fresh red chilli, chopped 25ml oil 10g garlic, peeled and chopped Salt and pepper to season

If you do not have an oven-proof dish which can also be used on the hob, do this first part of the recipe in a deep skillet or frying pan and then transfer to an oven-proof dish.

Pour the oil into your dish, put it on a medium heat on the hob and and pop your seasoned chicken legs in.

When these begin to become nice and golden, add the red onions.

Cook until the onions are caramelised, then add the basil, garlic and chilli.

Pour over your white wine, stir through and finish with the stock.



Cover the dish and place in a pre-heated oven (180C/ Gas Mark 4) for between one and one and a half hours. The dish is ready when the meat falls off the bone.

Season with salt and pepper to taste and serve, preferably with some lovely crusty bread.

LOCAL HERALDRY

BY JOHN HOCKEY

In this series, we take a look around local towns and villages to find interesting and unusual heraldry.

ASHRIDGE

Inside the entrance hall at Ashridge House, the roof is supported by a number of corbels decorated with angelic winged figures each holding a coloured shield. The example shown is what is known as quartered, showing the Egerton arms (Argent a lion rampant Gules between three pheons Sable) in the 1st and 4th quarters and the Stanley arms (Argent on a bend Azure three stags heads caboshed* Or) in the 2nd and 3rd quarters. This is for John Egerton, 2nd Earl of Bridgewater, son of Lady Frances Stanley who married John Egerton the 1st Earl in 1602

Now here's the thing. Both Egerton and Stanley arms are shown on this, the shield of her son because she was an heiress in her own right. To be an heiress you must have no living brothers and your father must no longer be living, for however old he was, if alive, technically he could marry again (assuming his wife had died) and produce a son who would inherit. Whilst her father was alive, Lady Frances would be known as an 'heiress presumptive'. If she was not an heiress, any sons would only bear the Egerton arms and the link to the Stanleys would not be obvious at all.

In fact there have been several instances of the Egertons marrying into important families such as Cavendish (later Dukes of Devonshire), Churchill (Dukes of Marlborough) and Russell (Dukes of Bedford) but this would not be known by looking at later shields because none of those daughters was an heiress.

If Ashridge House is ever open to the public, do linger in the entrance hall as in addition to the corbels there is a running frieze of the coats of arms of ancestors plus a stained glass window showing the coronets of viscounts, earls and dukes.

*Caboshed is a term used to describe an animal's head facing vou which is cut off cleanly showing no neck.

Edlesborough W.I.

At our November meeting we were very interested to learn about the role of women in the

first World War. Prior to 1914 and the start of the war women were not considered able mentally or physically to do anything other than look after the home and the children, and those that did work were in domestic service which was poorly paid for very long hours.

With the start of the war and with much propaganda the men were vigorously encouraged to enlist in the forces and they did so with great alacrity and in vast numbers.

The Government at the time, had overlooked the fact that the country imported much of its

food stuffs and that we were only producing enough food for 36 days each year. The women of the country therefore had to be the ones to improve on this. There was also work to be done in the forests felling timber etc. for the war effort. Our armies too, didn't have enough shells so again this fell to the women of the country to rectify the situation and munitions factories sprang up all over the place (it was a rotten and dangerous job). All the other work that had once been the bastions of the men had to be taken on by the women too, for example, driving buses and trams, shipbuilding etc etc., and "horror of horrors" the ladies ditched their long baggy skirts and started to wear trousers. Lots of useful groups, societies and organisations were born during the duration of this dreadful war (including W.I.), which the women could attend. Prior to this they couldn't go anywhere without being chaperoned. The "bosses" were not too upset about the working women as they

were doing a man's job for half the pay. What's changed?

It wasn't considered appropriate for nurses to actually go out to the front, however they were eventually, from necessity, permitted to drive the ambulances. Towards the end of the war, women over 30 years of age and provided they owned their own home, were allowed to vote. It was obvious that the 14-18 war brought about a lot of changes for women, and all for the better.

Colin Oakes, our speaker for the evening, gave an informative and thought-provoking talk and although not fun, it was useful and enjoyable. "He did us girls proud".

It being a 'low news month' on the tennis club front, and with us just having passed the 30th anniversary

of that first ball being struck across the net (good job it wasn't me or it'd have gone into the net — what a hapless start that would have been to our illustrious history...) I got to thinking about what life was like on the small patch of recreation land where our courts now stand, in the days of old. So I've done some research, and I'd like to share with you, dear readers, a wonderful true story about a quite amazing event that took place on the very spot where we now ply our trade on those three magnificent courts.

Many many years ago, in days of yore, the 'rec' as we now know it, was a farmer's field. Mr Pocklington (known locally as Farmer Po) kept several animals in that field, including a very small horse. Now in those days, a horse was a horse. They didn't have fancy names for all the different types and sizes. There weren't Shires, Shetlands or Clydesdales. They were all Horses. In fact, this was evidenced in an episode of that popular comedy series 'Allo Allo', when Monsieur Alfonse, in his efforts to woo Madame Edith, describes his assets as 'a big hearse with a big horse, and a little hearse with a little horse'. Now this particular little horse, living in its field in Eaton Bray, was a few IQ ahead of the average horse, in as much as it could do basic arithmetic. You've probably seen similar since on TV, where a dog barks four times when it's proud (and fame-hungry) owner asks it what two plus two is. But back in the day, this was quite a big thing, especially for a horse. Particularly for a very small horse. People would come from miles around; from Edlesborough, Dagnall, even as far as Northall, to watch this small horse perform his calculations. Someone would shout across the fence 'what's four minus one?', and the little animal would rear up onto its hind legs, and knock its front knees together three times'. 'Five plus two'?, and up it would

rear again, to knock it's little knees together seven times, all without falling over. Quite a feat as you can imagine. This little horse's fame rapidly spread far and wide, until one day its reputation reached Fleet Street, London, home of the country's top newspapers, and also the Guinness Book of Records.

So out came the journalists in their hundreds, arriving on their own horses, of all shapes and sizes (the horses, not the journalists), all wanting a slice of the story of the famous counting horse, and with them came a representative from that famous book, to establish whether this small horse could be included as the world's first mathematically inclined equine. The little horse didn't disappoint, and gave the assembled throng a perfect display of its calculating capabilities. 'Hurrah' they all shouted, wrote their stories, and galloped back to London to write them up.

But the man from the Guinness Book of Records was more circumspect. 'I accept, Farmer Po', he voiced, 'that this small horse is indeed extremely talented, and is well worthy of inclusion in our famous volume, but we already have a horse in the book for having the loudest 'neigh'. I therefore propose that in order to giver this small horse the recognition it deserves, we give it another name, to distinguish it from the average horse'. So another man was invited along to the farmer's field, this time from the Oxford English Dictionary. Together, the three men discussed potential alternative names for this small horse. Then the man from the OED had a brainwave. 'I know!' he exclaimed. 'Let us call it partly after you, Farmer Po, and partly after the sections of its body that it uses to announce its mathematical results, which are, of course, its knees'. The three men were unanimously agreed. The small horse was to be called a Po-knee, which, over the many years which have passed since, has become, in modern English, the Pony.

And that, dear readers again, is the true story of how that very clever small horse from Eaton Bray, with the help of the newspapers, the Guinness Book of Records, and the Oxford English Dictionary, became re-nouned in its field.





IT'S CHRISTMAS

Most of us love Christmas as it changes a normal time of year into a special time of year.

What is it we love? The brightness in the dull winter months! The familiar Christmas music playing in the shops! The high streets all lit up! The Christmas pudding! The sprouts! A few days of holiday!

Whatever it is it's a time celebration and of sharing with family and friends. Although it can be a very difficult time for those who are lonely and away from family and friends. Church and Tithes

Gilbert of Ghent gave the parish church of St Mary in Edlesborough to the monks in Bardney Abbey, Lincolnshire. This was probably built of wood and might have been on the same sight as the present church. Work began on the present church at the beginning of the 13th century. The first Rector was Simon de Belecampo in 1199, and the first vicar was John Moget in July 1396.



A Rector held the office of presiding over an ecclesiastical institution such as a church or parish. He might appoint someone to perform the duties of his office, ie to act for him "vicariously", that person was termed his "vicar". Church and clergy were supported by tithes, traditionally 10%, levied on the personal and agricultural output of the village and they were the legal property of the person who held the office of Rector, not the vicar, who was his employee.

Tithes were classified as "great" and "small", the great tithes were usually corn, hay and wood; small tithes were all other produce including produce from stock and industry such as mills.

Parishes with rectors often had glebe lands attached to the parish. The rector was then responsible for the repair of the chancel of the church whilst the rest of the building was the responsibility of the parish.

The size of the 16th century tithe barn gives some indication of the parish's wealth at this time. When the Barn was built, the parish of Edlesborough was considerably larger than now so the large amount of tithe collected need a lot of storage room.



The construction was of oak and brick set on plinths of Totternhoe stone and originally it was thatched. It was tiled in the early 1900's.

Ownership of the lands passed through many hands and by the 16th century the Earl of Bridgewater owned half the village as well



as the rights to the great tithes of Edlesborough. The Bridgewaters lived at nearby Ashridge, which had been a monastery before the dissolution.

After the end of the 1914-18 war a Committee was formed to raise funds to erect a Memorial to those who had lost their lives. On an autumn afternoon in



1920 a large crowd came to witness Lord Brownlow unveil the memorial. This was his last public engagement, he died 17th March 1921.

The church was closed for regular Sunday services on 10th May 1971.

Healthy Bones & Pilates

Our bone density continues to grow until our mid 20's, however, after the age of 35, and following the menopause in women, the pattern changes. 1 in 3 women and 1 in 5 men over

the age of 50 will develop osteopenic (loss of bone) fractures.

We can make a change for the better - weight-bearing exercises 3-5 times per week, and resistance/strength exercise 2-3 times a week, have been shown to increase bone mass density (BMD) by stimulating bone growth. Balance-focused exercise have been shown to reduce a person's risk of falls by 25%. Pilates can offer all the above benefits to people with osteopenia (low BMD but not as low as osteoporosis.) A 2015 study (E Angin) showed that people who participated in Pilates saw an increase in their BMD as well as improvements in their physical performance and quality of life.

Pilates, the mind-body conditioning programme, can be used to strengthen your core (back and tummy) muscles and can also be adapted to do in standing to help 'load' the ones

Choose a fully qualified and registered Pilates instructor – the APPI Pilates instructors at St Judes are also Chartered Physiotherapists who carry out clinical rehab Pilates – participants in our small group classes and 1:1 sessions are fully assessed before starting an exercise programme specific to their needs.

Other ways you can help yourself include:

- 1. **Eat a varied diet rich in calcium** dairy products, tofu and spinach are all good.
- 2. Reduce your caffeine and salt and stop smoking as all of these can interfere with the absorption of calcium in our bodies.

Dagnall Weather Station (AONB) Weather Conditions for October 2018


Elevation: 450 ft - Latitude: 51° 50' 13" North - Longitude: 0° 33' 34" West

October started with high pressure giving us dry and sunny weather. On the 6th it rained followed by a week of exceptional warm weather for this time of the year, peaking at 22.9°c on the 10th. The 14th was the wettest day of the month with a total of 36.19mm which continued into the next day with a further 9mm of rain. Those two days were 75% of the total rain for the month. From the 16th to the 26th, the temperatures dropped to more like the normal levels for October. At the end of the month, the weather became more like winter, with frosty mornings reaching a low of 1.1°c on the 31st. The month's rain was 115% of the 10 year average.


October 2018 Temperature and Rain

Tiny Sunbirds Far Away by Christie Watson

Tiny Sunbirds Far Away, published in 2011, was Christie Watson's debut novel. Formerly a nurse, winning the Malcolm Bradbury bursary enabled her to take an MA in creative writing at the University of East Anglia. After graduating in 2009 she became a full time author, since then having had three books published.

Tiny Sunbirds Far Away is the coming of age story of Blessing, who lives a privileged life with her parents and brother Ezikiel in Lagos, Nigeria. When her parents' marriage breaks down due to her father's infidelity Blessing and her mother and brother are forced to leave the city to live with her maternal grandparents in a native compound in the Niger Delta.

At first the shock of facing life without all the comforts that she has taken for granted, is very hard for Blessing, but she gradually comes to appreciate that not everything about the native way of life is bad and that not all of her old way of life was good. She and her grandmother become very close, with the old woman showing Blessing the traditional way of life in the compound. Grandma is the local midwife and begins to take her along to confinements as an assistant. This is fascinating to the young girl and, much to her mother's disapproval, she becomes more and more involved with her grandmother's work. Although the adjustment to native life is difficult for Blessing and her mother,

Ezikiel, who is asthmatic and has serious food allergies, finds it hardest of all. A good student, he misses his studies and coping with the new diet is very difficult for him and he becomes withdrawn and rebellious. When her mother finds work at an oil company and acquires a white American boyfriend, things ease financially, but other problems present themselves.

This is a very thought-provoking book. It is written in the voice of a twelve year old and about the things that she observes and doesn't quite understand. The reader however, is aware of the problems in Africa and this story probes quite a number of them. There is widespread political corruption and the oil companies are criticised for their stranglehold on many of the African communities. Modern life, colliding with the old traditions and ceremonies, causes resentment and rebellion in many of the townships and Blessing also learns of the difficulties caused by female circumcision during childbirth and of the beliefs of the women who practise it.

In consequence it is a very good choice for a book group to read and discuss. Our group enjoyed it and would recommend it very highly.
