Our village is a very caring community as is revealed in our quarterly review of help by our wonderful team of volunteers. The Eaton Bray Good Neighbours have been very active in the last quarter, with some 225 completed activities, helping the local community. Client numbers increase each quarter, with many requests for collecting prescriptions from our local Pharmacy and help with transport to local hospitals.

The Volunteers, along with our clients, all met up for a Christmas Social in December. Some 40 people attended, with lots of cake and chatter. This was an excellent gathering for both clients and volunteers to meet up, helping to promote support and comfort which is mutually offered and accepted.

The Befrienders group continue to flourish, with monthly meetings when outings are planned for the Friends they visit. Afternoons out have been made to Rushmere Park and a Christmas visit to Poplars Garden Centre followed by afternoon tea. During the winter months they have met for soup and rolls followed by board games or memories of days gone by. We support 5 Friends with home visits, and also keep in contact with telephone calls to those living on their own. One Friend moved away and two have now moved to Care Homes. Our Befrienders are very kind and supportive, particularly during the winter months and there is equally a feeling of appreciation by everyone.

We have over 40 volunteers, some of whom gave their time to undertake tasks in the last quarter. They are rewarded with the gratitude and thanks extended to them. Volunteering can give you a feel good factor when you help somebody.

We are always looking for volunteers, in particular, those who are prepared to be Phone Holders. Too often we rely on a small group of people to provide this essential link in the provision of our services. As a driver, or Befriender, the time involved may only be an hour or two now and then. There are many people who find February a hard month, and I am certainly one of them. The excitement and wonder of Christmas has been and gone and those New Year resolutions, which we made with such earnestness and hope, seem like a distant memory. It is still cold and wet and the nights continue to be long and lights are switched on far earlier than we would like. The heralding of spring in snowdrops and daffodils and blossom, may be just around the corner, but in February, after all those dark evenings, Spring can still seem very far away. But we all know that Spring will come. The flowers will grow again and flower, the birds that have wintered in warmer climes will fly back to our gardens and our fields, and before we know it the warmth of Summer will be here.

The seasons often feature in the Bible. When the Bible was written the vast majority of people would have worked on the land, and even if they were city-dwellers their lives would still have been regulated by agricultural seasons: the time to sow the grain and the time to harvest. Until relatively recently, life in Britain would have been dominated by farming life too, from the way people worked and the jobs that needed doing, to the types of fruits and vegetables that were available in the shops. In our modern consumerist world, we don't really have 'seasonal' fruit and vegetable any more, most things are available all year round.

The changing of the seasons also had an important spiritual message for many people too. The progression from one season to another marked the passage of time and created a sense of order. A passage in the book of Ecclesiastes (which also appears in the song "Time, Time, Time" by Peter Seeger) says, 'For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven.... a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted' (Eccl. 3:1-2). And in the Psalms it says that God has made 'the moon to mark the seasons; the sun knows its time for setting' (Ps. 104:19). There is a rhythm to the year and, also, a rhythm in our daily lives. However much some of us may dislike the cold, long nights of winter, and however much the coming of Spring seems to drag in February, each of the seasons gives us that sense of time and rhythm that we really need.

For many Christian writers the way the earth could at one time be so cold and seemingly dead in winter, and suddenly be full of life in the Spring, was like the death and resurrection of Jesus. When Jesus died on the cross, it seemed that all was lost; but on Easter Day, Jesus was resurrected and

appeared to his friends: new life had come. The coming of spring was seen as a metaphor for the hope and promise of new life. This sense of hope for the future, can also be used of our lives. There will always be times when we feel like winter, because life is not always easy and life is not always joyful like the spring; but Christians draw hope in the new life that will come with the Spring. So in February, think about your hopes for the future and the new life and joys that may come.



Dog poo left will take a year to bio degrade so please don't flick it into the hedge. So please pick it up and put in the nearest dog bin or take it home and put it in your bin. There is no shame or embarrassment in using a bag to pick up dog poo, in fact, quite the opposite.

There are now bio degradable poo bags. Maybe this is something all dog owners should be using. Do our bit for the environment. We are so lucky to live where we do so let's look after it for our children and grandchildren.



# **Tuna Tartar with** Jalapeno Chilli. Avocado. **Cucumber and Radish**

Sometimes food takes us back to a moment in time. I'll always remember the first time I braved raw tuna (well, it felt like "braved" at the time!). It was nearly 20 years ago, on a trip to Reykjavik, and it was like nothing I'd ever tasted before. Fresh, delicate, textured - and full of flavour, thanks to clever use of Asian fusion ingredients. Recently, on my Weekend Kitchen show. I had the pleasure of welcoming Nick Male, head chef and owner of Loft. St Albans. Here's a chef who knows how to blend flavours from across the world to make classic dishes, and this tuna dish is just bursting with character and zing. Better still, it's really incredibly easy to make and is a real show-stopper way of opening a dinner party. The only requirement is buying high quality fresh tuna to give this dish its best chance of amazing your guests,

Serves 4


#### **Dressing**

50g lemon grass 50g Ginger 2 cloves garlic 1 small red chilli 100ml fresh lime juice 50ml soy sauce 50ml sesame oil 100ml veg oil

350gm Sashimi grade raw tuna

½ cucumber 20g jalapeno chilli, finely sliced 6 breakfast radishes 1 avocado Micro herbs/ edible flowers to decorate

First make the dressing. Blend all the dry ingredients to a paste using a pestle and 95.5 FM | 103.8 FM | 104.5 FM | DAB | bbc.co.uk/threecounties



mortar, then add all the wet ingredients to make a smooth dressing.

Dice the tuna into small cubes and keep them well chilled in a bowl. Dice up the cucumber and cut the breakfast radishes into quarters. Just before serving, dice up the avocado too. You're now ready to "build" the dish. You can do this in bowls or, for more of a wow factor, use a metal ring to build up a perfect cylinder, as you can see in the photo.

Start with a layer of avocado on the bottom. Next place some jalapeno peppers on top, followed by some diced cucumber.

Mix enough dressing into the tuna to just coast it and place the dressed tuna on top of the cucumber.

For a final flourish, garnish the top of the tuna with micro herbs and/or edible flowers. Serve and eat immediately.

## Nigel's Thoughts

Methodist Minister



Dear Friends, Some of you will be aware that by time you read this

I may very well be in India. A group of people of different faiths, and none, are travelling to West Bengal on an aid visit to a rural hospital. This is a part of my Sabbatical plans which mean that I shall not be generally available from now on until Holy Week in the middle of April.

I am aware that whilst we are in India we shall meet some of the world's poorest people, whose individual lives are likely to put my own life and struggles into perspective. I shall have to learn to 'get over' myself.

The area we shall be visiting is generally unaffected by the 'caste' system which permeates so much of Indian society and the way in which people think of themselves.

The people of the villages that the hospital serves are mainly tribal peoples, who are way more affected by grinding poverty and, for the most part do not seek the hospitals help – because they have no money to pay hospital fees. The hospital offers its services free of charge however and therefore much of its work is going out into the villages, to spread the word, identify diseases and bring people in for treatment. It offers a full range of treatments (maternity, paediatrics, male and female surgical wards, ophalmology and basic A & E), in a poor set of buildings mainly unrefurbished and reminiscent of the 1920s.

All that we shall see is perfectly 'normal' as far as their society is concerned, it is just the way things are out there. Individual people do not generally have more than a glimpse into the world that we live in, with its wonderful NHS and social and welfare

payments.

This got me wondering about the contexts of some of our arguments. Yes, I am thinking of the 'B' for Brexit word and the comparative insignificance of the way in which we order our lives alongside our European and Worldwide neighbours. The people we shall meet in India have far more important things to think about and fret over. So do many individuals and families in our own country and across the world. Everything is relative.

It is not that Brexit is unimportant, far from it.

Unfortunately some people in our nation have shown their intolerance of others and their views – and I can be like that myself at times. We have become so polarised. I hope that we can learn to be better than that and can reason carefully and considerately together to forge a common future, which while not satisfying everybody is good news for all the people of these islands – especially those who have the least.

I expect to be challenged and changed by our Indian travels and encounters. I will let you know how we get on.

### Who Draws the Lines?

After the blessed relief of Christmas, the daily sound and fury of Brexit has engulfed us again.

It is still the second week of January as I write; no-one knows what will have happened by the time you read this.

It is amazing how much turmoil can be caused by a line on a map - such as the border between Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland.

All around the world lines on the map either cause or result from trouble between neighbours. Think of Kashmir, Cyprus, Ukraine, Crimea, or Korea. That's before we start on the Middle East.

How the lines were drawn where they are is often buried in the morass of history. Sometimes it was population movement, sometimes armed conflict, or geographical logic or simply where a power struggle ground to a halt.

The Bible tells us that God decides where those lines are drawn. It says that God's sovereign control extends to deciding where each nation lives and what area each government controls.

Paul, the first great Christian missionary, took the good news of forgiveness of sins through Jesus Christ all around the north-eastern Mediterranean. In Athens he spoke about the living God to an elite group of influential people (see Acts 17 in the Bible). Here is part of what Paul said: "From one man [God] made all the nations, that they should inhabit the whole earth; and he marked out their appointed times in history and the boundaries of their lands."

So God determines not only where national borders and administrative areas lie but also how long they remain. Paul went on: "God did this so that they would seek him and perhaps reach out for him and find him, though he is not far from any one of us."



So God's purpose in deciding where the lines would be drawn and for how long was so that people would reach out for him and find him. He wants to be found by those who are separated from him through turning their backs on him - something we have all done.

Whatever happens to Brexit, will you reach out for God this year? The promise is that you will find him if you come to him through his Son, Jesus Christ. God sent him to bring us to God by dying on a cross for our sins.

Join us as we learn more of this good news each Sunday.



### Zookeepers Complete the Annual Stocktake at ZSL Whipsnade Zoo

ZSL Whipsnade Zoo's keepers began the mammoth task of counting every animal for their annual stocktake today (Thursday 10 January 2019).

Home to more than 3,500 animals, zookeepers at the UK's largest Zoo gathered their clipboards and calculators, to take stock of each invertebrate, bird, fish, mammal, reptile and amphibian.

Keepers have to count every animal; from the troop of curious squirrel monkeys to hundreds of Madagascan hissing cockroaches. They'll also tally up the individuals from eight different species of deer, the Bactrian camels and more than 60 species of birds, including the stunning military macaws, George and Inca.

2018 saw the UK's largest Zoo celebrate the birth of Amur tiger cubs, Dmitri, Makari and Czar, who were added to the census, along with their parents Naya and Botzman.

ZSL Whipsnade Zoo's animal manager, Matthew Webb said: "Today marks the start of the annual stocktake, where we make sure every animal is recorded as part of our official zoo license requirements.

"We'll also share the information with other zoos around the world, as the numbers are used to plan the conservation breeding programmes for endangered species. It's a really important task."

The information is shared with other zoos around the world via a database called Species 360, where it's used to help manage the worldwide conservation breeding programmes for endangered animals.

### LOCAL HERALDRY BY JOHN HOCKEY

In this series, we take a look around local towns and villages to find interesting and unusual heraldry.

### DUNSTABLE - HENRY FAYREY

Henry Fayrey who died in 1516, was a member of the Mercers' Company and is best known for donating a funeral pall or cloth-covering to the Fraternity of St John the Baptist (1442 - 1547). This magnificent coffin-covering is of rich crimson cut brocaded velvet on clothof-gold and was formerly on display in the Priory Church in Dunstable. It has, since 1976 been on permanent loan to the V&A in London.

Amongst the decoration on the pall are the coats of arms of the Mercers' Company and the coat of arms of Henry Fayrey, which is also to be seen in stained or coloured glass in a north aisle window of the Priory. It is a great example of what is known as counterchanging, that is where the shield is divided (in this case half gold (Or) and half blue (Azure)) and any charges placed on the shield are shown in the contrasting colour of the other half of the shield. This is a superb example of early heraldry which is usually very simple but also very effective graphically.

The full description or blazon is:

Per pale Or and Azure, a chevron between three eagles displayed all counterchanged and on a chief of the first three lozenges of the second. Look at the coat of arms and see if you can work that one out!

### St Mary's, Eaton Bray, Supports Disabled Children in Africa

### **Ten Years Ago**

Some readers may remember hearing about a young missionary who volunteered to work as a physiotherapist for three years in a remote Ugandan hospital? At the time Focus printed monthly articles about Rebecca Baldock's time at Kagando. You may wonder what happened to her? In her own words here is her continuing story ..... '2018 marks the 10th anniversary of Accomplish Children's Trust, (which St Mary's has supported for most of that time). I don't think that 10 years ago any of us, including the African organizations we work with, would have dared to believe that so much would have happened and so many disabled children's lives transformed. So now is a great opportunity to offer our heartfelt thanks for your support and believing in us.

'10 years ago when I left Uganda, I promised two tiny rural self-help organizations that I'd try and raise funds to support the work they were doing. They seemed to be trying to meet a big need in their community by reaching and

working with families of children with disabilities, with virtually no resources. Having struggled to raise any support for them in the UK it seemed like the only option was to set up our own charity. I remember being embarrassed by the fact we'd set up another charity when there were already so many. Yet none seemed willing to work with disabled children in remote rural regions of Africa. I also struggled to explain exactly what we would be supporting. After all it's very difficult for folk in prosperous countries to imagine the awful situation faced by these extremely poor, ignored and vulnerable children – and we were starting from scratch. I felt the burden of being responsible for needy people in Uganda trusting me and believing that they would be able to achieve their dreams if given the opportunity.'

So in 2008 Accomplish Children's Trust was born - with £10 in the bank and a **BIG** dream - to reach Africa's disabled children. There was no doubt about the need. The stories about babies being abandoned

and young children being ignored because they had a disability were heart breaking – and still are. So we prayed, after all God is Almighty and we needed a miracle; plenty in fact.

### Moving onto 2018

God provided lots and lots of miracles. For instance ACT now provides treatment for nearly 600 children with epilepsy (which if untreated leads to disability) and there



is demand for more clinics. The newest clinic is at our primary school for deaf or blind children, (which now has 200 pupils - and a waiting list). The therapy clinic ACT supports treated 450 severely disabled children during 2017!! A new therapy clinic (again supported by ACT) has opened near our primary school, a very exciting development. The dream to have a secondary school is making slow progress – but it now has 100 pupils even though the school is by no means finished. The two vocational training centres continue to expand, each with about twenty boarding disabled students receiving a year's vocational training plus lots of agricultural outreach projects in remote villages.

ACT is beginning to support a school for deaf children in the Democratic Republic

of Congo – a notoriously difficult country to work in so again an exciting new arena. Our fledgling project in Malawi needs your prayers as ACT seeks ways to constructively support the enormous needs faced by disabled children in that extremely poor country.

And Rebecca herself? She still works as a physiotherapist, now at the UCH in London. She's married and has two children – and she's still passionate about the work of ACT and eager to help transform the lives of more disabled children.



# The King and I


Recorded at the London Palladium during it's sold out run, it stars Kelli

Anna becomes a governess and English tutor to the wives and many children of the stubborn King Mongkut of Siam. Anna and the king have a clash of personalities as she works to teach the royal family about the English language, customs and etiquette, and rushes to prepare a party for a group of European diplomats who must change their opinions about the king.





### **Slow Horses by Mick Herron**

This month's choice was recommended by a group member. We have not chosen a thriller for some time, so this was a nice change for us. Slow Horses is the first novel in the Slough House series and since its publication in 2010, Mick Herron has added three more stories to the list.

The eponymous slow horses are members of MI5 who, as a result of failures in their assignments, have been banished to Slough House and given very mundane tasks. The reasoning behind this being, that the boredom of being underemployed will lead to their resignation. The building is uncared for and gloomy, matching the people who work there. A recent recruit to Slough House is River Cartwright, who managed to shut down a railway station whilst conducting a terrorist training exercise and through his eves we are introduced to the other members of staff. Their various crimes and misdemeanours are revealed to the reader but. not to one another, making them suspicious and wary. In short, not the ideal makings of a team, although that is what they become.

A video of a young Pakistani man is shown nationwide on television. He appears to have been kidnapped and his captors are threatening to decapitate him within 48 hours. Gradually the slow horses, instead of remaining on the side lines, get drawn into the drama, unaware that strings are being pulled by MI5 in the Regent's Park building by Diana Taverner the second in command

there, who is using the slow horses for her own benefit.

We, the readers, want to know the outcome of the kidnap and although the descriptions of the various characters are rather scanty and unappealing,



we want to cheer them on as they try to save the boy before the deadline.

The writing style is modern with short sentences, giving a staccato effect at times. Perhaps this is deliberate to add to the tension of the story. The book is described as a spy thriller and also as a satire. There are political characters that are recognisable and Mick Herron takes a few pot shots at them, but overall it is the workings of the Secret Service that takes the most ridicule.

There are a lot of characters to assimilate, which some of our members found difficult, but generally most of our group liked the book.



# Early Edlesborough History Courtesy of Friends of the Church on the Hill

## Occupations Agriculture

At the beginning the nineteenth century still Edlesborough had the traditional open fields, unhedged and divided into strips, though some by this time had been assembled into blocks. By 1865 the open fields had given way to the system of enclosures.

Most houses were clustered round the green, on which the villagers held common rights of grazing. The roads leading to the green were gated to prevent animals

from wandering. Each occupier of house or estate was entitled to graze 3 sheep, 2 cows or 1 horse on the common one time. No geese were allowed, the cows had to have knobs on their horns and grown pigs had to have rings in their noses. Animals were forbidden to graze on the highways unless

for any reason the commons were unusable. A hayward was appointed each year to enforce these rules, and to see that a rotational use of the green and other small commons or open fields were used from harvest to spring. If rules were broken the villagers could be fined up to 10 shillings, such fines being distributed to the poor on the Sunday after Christmas.

Many of the strips of land were rented from the Bridgewaters and on rent day each quarter the tenants marched up to Ashridge House, singing as they went, to pay their rents. Once they had paid the bailiff they were given a meal of bread, cheese and beer before starting the homeward journey.

#### **Prunes**

Prunes were grown on unenclosed land; they are peculiar to the Vale of Aylesbury. Every spare piece of ground in Edlesborough was planted with these trees and each resident was allowed to encroach on the common land 40ft in depth along the front of his property – many of the old houses that lay back from the road still have damsons in their front gardens. The prunes were of sufficient importance to the villagers to be mentioned separately from the other crops during the prayers for the harvest.

The railway van collected the baskets in the evening and delivered them to Stanbridgeford station to be dispatched to various markets. After a good season the station master stated that he had dispatched 1111 tons during the season. Most of the prunes were used to dye the fabric that was used to make sailors uniforms. The industry started to decline after the 2nd world war.

### **Straw Plaiting**

Straw plaiting was mainly a cottage industry in which the whole family took part when not required for farm work, and many yards of plait was eventually sewn into hats and bonnets in Dunstable and Luton factories. This industry had been in existence since before the 17th century, when Edlesborough was amongst the villages that petitioned against a Bill brought by felt makers to enforce the wearing of woollen hats. The representatives of the plaiters were heard at the Houses of Parliament and helped bring about the failure of the Bill.

The men usually prepared the straw by stripping it to lengths of 9-10 inches (about 250 cms), which were fitted into pottles (about half a gallon). The straws were then bleached and graded.

George Cook with his imperial measures:

1 bushel = 8 gallons or 32 quarts,
half a bushel = 4 gallons or 16 quarts,
1 peck = 2 gallons or 8 quarts,
1 pottle = half a gallon or 2 quarts (about 2.5 litres).

The women and children did the plaiting. The straw was tied in a small bundle and held under the arm, the straws were then drawn out and held in the mouth, the moisture making them more pliable. Many different patterns were plaited. The plaits were made into bundles of 20, which took about 6 hours to plait and earned about

1s (5p). One person could earn between 6s and 12s per week.

The children were often sent to other cottages, known popularly plaiting schools, to learn to plait and give their mothers more time for plaiting. One village school was open from 9am to 10pm each weekday. Indeed. straw plait was so important to Edlesborough that plaiting was even allowed for 3 hours a day in the village school. Both sexes attended the schools, though boys left earlier to do farm work.

Parents paid 2d per week and supplied their children with straws, reaping the profit from

She married George Tibbett and they lived in 2 cottages near Sparrow Hall Farm, where they had 11 children. At the age of 79 years she was invited to take part in the Easter Bonnet Parade at Luton and this photo was taken on that day. She died in 1965 aged 91 years.

the finished article. A child of 7 was expected to produce 5 yards of plait in the morning, 2 in the afternoon and 5 more at night, with an extra yard at lunch time and another at tea. The children could earn between 9d and 3/6 per week (between 4 and 17.5 pence).

A weekly plait market was held in the village. Two men worked full time as straw plait dealers and on market days other dealers came from nearby villages. One of the dealers, Walter Gray, lived at "Westleigh", the house next to the Methodist Chapel. The shed on the right was where the straws were issued to the women for plaiting.

### Flour Milling

The Domesday book records the mill at Edlesborough; it would have been a water mill as windmills did not exist for another century. The water comes from 3 springs

which join to make a tributary of the river Ouzel. The water mill was used until the 1920s but the windmill in the adjoining field, owned by the same miller, was struck by lightning in 1890 and never rebuilt.

There were another 2 mills on the same stream in Eaton Bray, one of which was Alfred Thorne's Two Counties Mill.

### Mining

In 1748 a Swede named Pehr Kaln visited England, including Totternhoe He observed that Edlesborough "carls" (stone workers) worked in the stone mines at Totternhoe. There were 3 entrances to the mines at this time, one went 660 feet underground. The tunnels were walled round for about 12 feet, but thereafter consisted entirely of natural rock. The tunnels were mostly about 6 feet wide and 7 feet high and went mostly horizontally into the hill, with side tunnels off. Water trickled down everywhere during the winter, but in the summer the tunnels were dry.

For the most part the miners appeared to enjoy good health, and were not aware that they were exposed to more illnesses or cramps than others.

When first hewn the stone was very soft and could be cut with a knife, it became harder and harder as it was exposed to the open air.

### **Highways**

In the 19th century the Parish Surveyor of the Highways inspected the roads at regular intervals and arranged for repairs. He also collected the Highway, or Stone, Rate which was levied on the parishioners to pay for the upkeep of the roads. In 1840 it was agreed in the parish that only residents who kept or used carts would be required to pay the rate.

The residents of the parish were supposed to undertake 'statute labour' which meant they should contribute towards the repairs by physical labour or by providing appropriate raw materials.

In Edlesborough the road repairs were carried out by the labouring poor. The chalk for the road and house repairs came from a small quarry between Edlesborough and Dagnall.

**November** started on the cold side, but by the 3rd it had turned mild and this lasted up until the 17th. We had rain in the second week. On the 18th, the east winds brought much colder conditions with the temperature dropping to -1.8°c on the 22nd. By the end of the month we were back to mild with rain again. The monthly rainfall was down by 14% on the 10 year average.

**December** The first week was mild and wet. Then, by the end of the second week, we had a quick cold snap with a low of -1.8°c on the 14th. 


