GORDON'S CHRISTMAS PUZZLE 2018 Another record breaking year

I received 343 entries for this year's Puzzle of which 80 scored full marks, among them a team comprising French and Swedish nationals, all with English as a foreign language. I am delighted that this year's chosen charities – Blesma, The Limbless Veterans, Cardiac Risk in the Young (CRY), Dorothy House, Rushjudo, and St Mary's Church - will share £7,200 bringing the total raised by the Puzzle since 1991 to £91,400. On behalf of all the charities supported "Thank you for your generosity" especially to those of you with an 'LU6' postcode.

A draw was held at St Mary's Church, Eaton Bray, on 3 February 2019 and three Puzzlers who scored full marks were selected at random to receive a £50 prize. These were: Doreen Chambers, Tessa Fulwood and HS Williams. Four additional names were drawn from 341 entrants who had submitted entries by that time. Each of the following receive a prize of £10: Dave Bradbury (119.5), C Carter (118.5), Enid Jones (118) and Mrs A Vincent (120). Unfortunately none of the winners are local to this area.

From its very beginning, the history of the Christian church has involved taking the message of Jesus out to others and crossing geographic and cultural boundaries. We read in the book of Acts in the Bible of how the message about Jesus was spread by his followers on their missionary journeys through the Middle East, Asia, Cyprus, Crete and into Europe culminating in Rome, the centre of the Roman Empire. From its origins in the Middle East, Christianity spread quickly into North Africa. It had reached India by AD53 and China by AD 635. So it has always been a global religion and different cultures adopted different approaches to worship. Many artists have been influenced by the Bible and the depictions of Biblical scenes often reflect their own cultural norms.

What did Jesus look like? There are no descriptions of Jesus' physical appearance in the Bible. We know that he was Jewish, born into a poor family, but we have no idea whether he was tall or short, muscular or slim. The gospel writers were not interested in those details. This means that artists have had great freedom in producing images of Jesus, often portraying him to relate to their own cultural context.



This year in our Lent Groups the North Chilterns Group of Churches will be looking at Jesus as portrayed by artists from around the world. Called 'The Christ we share' it will be an opportunity to examine our own preconceptions about Jesus and to reexamine them in the light of other interpretations from around the world. There will be the opportunity to view the art works, to ponder them and to engage in discussions with one another. Meetings will be held at Totternhoe Church Hall on the first five

Tuesdays in Lent: Tuesday 12, 19, & 26 March and 2 & 9 April gathering at 7.30pm for a 7.45pm start.

Everyone is welcome to come along. If you have never been to church before and you would like to think more deeply about who Jesus is, then this is a good opportunity to do so. It will be a relaxed approach with no pressure to join the discussion unless you wish to do so- and it is free!

The other thing worth noting is that although the sessions are linked, each one will stand alone. Viewing things through a different lens is often an enlightening experience. Other people see things that I miss. They take another viewpoint. I hope you will take this opportunity to explore and discuss 'The Christ we share.'







Chocolate Custard. Chocolate Crumble. Salted Caramel Sauce

Having made this dish myself, you have my word that it's wonderful. It should come with a health warning though, as the dusty chocolate crumble is utterly addictive. I found myself eating it off the spoon, and that was before I'd made the set custard! This dish is the creation of chef Steve Barringer, a former Masterchef The Professionals runner up. He's just taken the leap and opened his own relaxed fine dining restaurant, Eileen's, in the beautiful market town of Ampthill. This dessert enables you to serve food at home which looks like fine dining, but with a method which is very much open to all levels of cooking confidence.

Set custard

375ml double cream

60ml egg yolk

113g sugar

190g milk chocolate

1.5 leaves gelatine (soaked in water)

Caramel Sauce

200g sugar

200ml double cream

Chocolate crumble:

100g sugar

125g ground almonds

75g plain flour

50g cocoa powder

3g salt

65g melted butter

Whole hazelnuts, coarsely chopped to serve Serves 4

Chocolate Custard: Whisk the egg yolk and sugar, bring the cream to the boil. Pour this on to the egg and sugar mix, place it all back into the pan and cook on a low heat until the mixture coats the back of a spoon.

Whisk in the soaked gelatine.

Pop the chocolate into a bowl, pour the mixture on to the chocolate and mix until the chocolate has melted.

around 2 hours, or until set. You can also just pour it into individual ramekins.

Caramel sauce: place the sugar into cold plan and put on the heat. Cook it until it has reached a light caramel stage, add the cream and then whisk until the sugar has disappeared. Add salt and place into container to cool.

Chocolate crumble: mix all the dry ingredients in a bowl, melt the butter, add it to the dry ingredients, stir with a wooden spoon and then place it on a tray.

Bake at 180C/ Gas Mark 4 for around 10 minutes, stirring a few times. It'll come out dusty and powdery.

Pipe the custard into your serving bowls, top with the caramel and finish with the crumble and hazelnuts.

Red Velvet Cake

I find the science of baking fascinating. What makes the texture of one cake different to the texture of another one? How can seemingly similar ingredients create totally different effects? With this Red Velvet Cake, it is the addition of the buttermilk and the acids which contribute to a tighter, slightly denser crumb, somewhere between a Victoria Sponge and a brownie. It was made for my Weekend Kitchen show by a very talented young baker called Victoria Chidgey. Throughout her appearances on my show, I have watched her Little Tring Cake company grow through hard work and creativity. Seeing skilled young people take risks, open businesses and watching them grow is probably one of the biggest pleasures I get from being on the radio...

125g butter

325g caster sugar

40g cocoa powder

2 eggs

1 tsp red extra colour paste (you will need to buy the proper stuff, not the small bottles of red liquid)

1 tsp vanilla extract

250g buttermilk

325g self-raising flour

15g bicarbonate of soda

30g white wine vinegar

Beat the butter and sugar together until light and fluffy. Meanwhile add all the dry ingredients to a bowl and set aside.

Slowly beat the eggs into the butter and sugar mixture. Add the red colouring and the vanilla too, followed by half of the dry ingredients and half the buttermilk.

Repeat until everything has just come together.

Pour in the vinegar and beat until throughly mixed. Split between 3 x 6" cake tins or 2 x 8" cake tins. Bake in a pre-heated oven at 160C/ Gas Mark 3 for 27 minutes. The cakes are baked when a skewer comes out clean.



For the icing: 150g butter 150g cream cheese 450g icing sugar 1 tsp yanilla extract

Beat the butter, icing sugar and vanilla until it's very light in colour. Add the cream cheese one spoonful at a time, mixing well each time. Once all the cream cheese has been added beat on a high speed for 3 minutes.

Level off the cakes with a knife and put any off-cuts into a food processor to blitz into a fine powder.

Assemble the cake by putting a layer of cream cheese icing between each cake. Cover the rest of the cake with icing, smoothing the top and sides with a pallet knife.

Gently push the cake crumbs into the side of the cake to get an even layer.

Pancakes. Lent & Easter


Shrove Tuesday or Pancake Tuesday is on 5th March this year and comes immediately before Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, which leads up to Easter Day.

Pancakes were traditionally made to use up the spare fat and other ingredients before a leaner diet and some fasting during the 46 days of Lent. Sundays are not 'prescribed' days so that reduces the number of days to 40, reminding us of Jesus 40 days in the desert.

This year again, Churches Together will be holding a Prayer and Pancake evening, sharing worship and many scrummy pancakes.

Over 5 weeks during Lent, Northall Baptist Church will be sharing a Churches Together Lent study course entitled 'The Mystery of God'. I am looking forward to exploring this together.

The real focus for a Christian is the events we celebrate at Easter. The weekend starts with a Maundy Thursday Communion service. 
LOCAL HERALDRY

BY JOHN HOCKEY

In this series, we take a look around local towns and villages to find interesting and unusual heraldry.

SCALLOP SHELLS

Scallop shells, known heraldically as *escallops*, are a very common addition to coats of arms. This *charge* was employed by the Dukes of Bedford and can be found on the Russell coat, placed on the upper horizontal band (the 'chief') as seen here.



The full blazon is 'Argent a lion rampant Gules on a chief Sable three escallops of the first'. Traditionally this was the symbol of a pilgrim, allegedly used to ask for alms or perhaps even to sip water from if no other vessel were to hand.

A common pilgrimage was to the Holy Land but also to Santiago de Compostela in northern Spain. The latter site was supposedly where some relics of St James were found and as his symbol was a scallop shell, this became the honour displayed by those who had made the journey. Additionally, St James is actually the patron saint of Spain.

Among the families married into by the Russells were the Spencers. John the fourth Duke of Bedford married Lady Diana Spencer who died in 1735. The Spencer arms also has three escallops but this time on a diagonal bar called a bend. John's son by his second wife was Francis, Marquess of Tavistock and he married Lady Elizabeth Keppel. The Keppel arms again have three escallops but this time arranged in the normal way to suit the shield shape, i.e. in what is called 'two and one'.

Incidentally, the botanical name for the Mediterranean scallop is <u>Pecten jacobeus</u>, the second part of the name referring to James, in the same way that Jacobean refers to James I.

Inns, Pubs and Beer Houses

Traditionally, *INNS* were buildings where travellers could seek lodging and, usually, food and drink. They were typically located in the country or along a highway e.g. the Bell and Greyhound Inns. They were both fully licensed inns and both had good accommodation. They were well used by the waggoners who trundled slowly to London with heavy farm produce: they were not popular on the main Watling Street – and the country inns were cheaper.

The 1830 Beer Act introduced a new lower tier of premises permitted to sell alcohol, the *BEER HOUSES*.

Any householder who paid rates could apply, with a one-off payment of two guineas (approx £160 today), to sell beer or cider in his home (usually the

front parlour) and even to brew his own on his premises. The permission did not extend to the sale of spirits and fortified wines, and any beer house discovered selling those items was closed down and the owner heavily fined. Beer houses were not permitted to open on Sundays.

Beer was viewed as harmless, nutritious and even healthy. Young children were often given what was described as small beer, which was brewed to have a low alcohol content, as the local water was often unsafe. The beer was usually served in jugs or dispensed directly from tapped wooden barrels on a table in the corner of the room.

The Wine and Beerhouse Act was introduced in 1869 and required a licence from the local magistrate for the sale of beers, wines or spirits. Further provisions regulated gaming, drunkenness, prostitution and undesirable conduct, enforceable by prosecution or more effectively by the landlord under threat of forfeiting his licence. It prevented new beer houses from being created, but those already in existence were allowed to continue; most applied for the new licences and became *PUBLIC HOUSES*.

There were 4(?) such beer houses in Edlesborough in the late 19th century.

Situated in Brook Street (opposite the allotments), it became a private residence in about 1970.



Rule and Square

The license was held by Mr Henry Gray. He was twice married and it is said he was father of 15 children. Two of his daughters were born here, Ruth and Mary. Ruth became a servant in London after leaving school, where she met and married James Broyd. In August 1900 they came to Edlesborough and took over the licence of the Bell Inn from Harry Gray, James' brother in law. Mary married Jack Jaggard and lived at The Good Intent for some years, later moving to two cottages near Sparrow Hall Farm.



The Good Intent Beer House, now the two cottages at the end of the Good Intent Estate, was originally called the Axe and Compass. A Manchester Company, called Good Intent Insurance, rented a room there where they collected dues from people to pay out when unemployed or sick. When a man was asked where he was going he would often say "Just off to the Good Intent".

A new pub was built in 1888 next door to the original and it took the name the **Axe** and **Compass**. It provided a suitable location to view the cricket matches which became popular in the 1860s. The Rector of Little Gaddesden, C.G. Lane, played cricket for Surrey between 1856 and 1861 and then played for Edlesborough and Little Gaddesden in 1864/5. The local "gentry" sat on the balcony to watch many a cricket match played between the village team and a team led by farmers and gentlemen from Ashridge House. The Good Intent Insurance Company still had a room in the old building and so it became the **Good Intent Public House**.

How are your New Year resolutions going? Did you make any, or did you decide that it was all too much effort and a waste of time, since you weren't going to keep them anyway?

I read a survey statistic recently which said that only 8% of us keep our New Year's resolutions till the end of January.

The arrival of Lent on 6th March gives us another excuse to stiffen our flagging resolve, because we can tell ourselves it's only for six weeks — by which time the habit of going without may have become ingrained . . .

Christians believe there is another help for our weak willpower. We can ask God for strength to help us stay focused, whether it's giving up smoking or adhering to a regular plan of exercise, meditation or trying to change an attitude for the better.

Some people actually take things up for Lent. Charities like Tearfund have Lent challenges, where you can spend a few moments each day praying, or giving, or doing a random act of kindness in your community. Some volunteer for a charity (your local foodbank? Dog-walking for the nearest rescue centre?) Others take on a sponsored challenge.

There are carbon fasts, (walk or cycle to work/school for six weeks), Live below the Line (spend £20 – and no more – on your weekly food), or the Mean Bean challenge, where you live for a short period on the kind of diet that our neighbours in developing countries exist on all the time. Details of all these are on the Internet.

Whatever we do, or even if we do nothing, Lent is a time to think about our walk with God, to pray – and goodness knows, there's plenty to pray for at the moment – and to grow closer to the God who loves you more than anyone on earth, and only wants you to be near to him, every day.

Village Pubs Past & Present

Previously used in Focus in 2007. The list of pubs at the end has been updated with their current status.

As a "Newcomer" to Edlesborough, (I only moved here in 1970) I recently got to thinking of how the history of Public Houses is so closely associated with the changing faces of our villages. I pinched the idea of a story written around Public Houses from an article that I read and have applied the idea to the Pubs past and present in the four villages served by Focus. I have also tried to identify their original sites, but I am sure that some of the real locals from the four villages will be able to point out my errors and find for me some more forgotten pubs. I am willing to bet that no one remembers The Victoria, an alehouse that stood on the site of 8 High Street Edlesborough The original deeds once owned by me showed that it had been two cottages, then an alehouse, then a retail haberdashery, to be followed by Buckrods Hardware, which was demolished and rebuilt, eventually to become Janes Carpets.

I will be very pleased to hear from anybody who can cast any light on more Pubs, their locations, and possibly some of the stories connected to them. Many years ago in the reign of Reg & Marie Catchpole (publicans of the Bell, Edlesborough during the seventies) one regular at the Bell: living at the time in the Old Greyhound when it was a private residence, and others who visited his house, all swore that a man known to many elders of the village, whose name was known to them, (but which escapes me), was to be seen after his death regularly sitting in the lounge of the house in the position where he apparently always sat when alive, and would come and go on a regular basis. True or false? Would anyone who has any news or information regarding any of the items raised in this piece please contact me through the pages of "Focus" thus providing its readers with more information about our villages and their history.

- 7. The Victoria 8 High Street, Edlesborough. This was an alehouse, now Janes Carpet Shop
- **8.** The Prince of Wales Now a private dwelling just past the corner of Brook Street, opposite the allotments. Also thought to be an alehouse

- **22.** The Bedford Arms Was on the site of the Roebuck garage shop, now private housing.





Weather Conditions for January 2019


Elevation: 450 ft - Latitude: 51° 50' 13" North - Longitude: 0° 33' 34" West January 2019

It was mild and mostly cloudy but with some sunny spells, although on the 4th the temperatures dropped to -2.8° c. There was no rain for the first ten days and then it all changed on the 15th with wettest day of the month, while the temperatures started to drop it continued cold and unsettled. On the evening of the 29th it started to snow, but the next day was a lovely sunny day. It was then cold overnight and, the following day, we had more snow. Clear skies helped the temperature plummet to -5.9° c on the 31st.



You Don't Know Me by Imram Mahmood

As a criminal defence barrister with twenty years of experience at the Crown Court and Court of Appeal, Imran Mahmood is uniquely placed to write this, his debut novel. The story takes place in The Central Criminal Court where a young man is standing, accused of murder. So far, so predictable, but this is not a standard courtroom thriller.

In the first chapter we learn that, just before the closing speeches, the defendant has dismissed his lawyer and has decided to speak in his own defence. There are eight strong pieces of evidence stacked against him and he sets out to explain them, one by one. He believes that his barrister does not intend to deal with them thoroughly and believes that the judge and jury deserve to hear the whole story and its background. The defendant then addresses the court and we, the - readers, realise that we are the jury and must listen carefully and assimilate all the information that this man is giving us, whilst keeping open minds until the end of his story. The defendant is never identified and his narrative is written in the street slang of gangland London . As he takes us through the points of evidence that make up the prosecution's case, we learn about him and his life.

We gather that he is a young black man who deals in cars. He has a loyal friend, Curt and a girlfriend named Kira. He is close to his mother and Blessing, his sister. Unfortunately, Kira's brother is a small-time crook and gang member, at present serving a term in prison and because of him, the defendant and Curt become involved in the darker side of London life.



This is an original and intriguing book. We are given a glimpse of gangland and how its hierarchy works. The voice of the narrator sounds authentic and adds colour to the story and the evidence provided us with lots to think about. The only criticism is that we are not privy to the prosecution speeches and so are not able to form a balanced opinion of the case, which a jury would have done.

The group enjoyed the book and all agreed that it was an excellent choice for a book group to read.

March: An Ode by Algernon Charles Swinburne

Ere frost-flower and snow-blossom faded and fell, and the splendour of winter had passed out of sight, The ways of the woodlands were fairer and stranger than dreams that fulfil us in sleep with delight; The breath of the mouths of the winds had hardened on tree-tops and branches that glittered and swayed Such wonders and glories of blossomlike snow or of frost that outlightens all flowers till it fade That the sea was not lovelier than here was the land, nor the night than the day, nor the day than the night, Nor the winter sublimer with storm than the spring: such mirth had the madness and might in thee made, March, master of winds, bright minstrel and marshal of storms that enkindle the season they smite.

And now that the rage of thy rapture is satiate with revel and ravin and spoil of the snow, And the branches it brightened are broken, and shattered the tree-tops that only thy wrath could lay low, How should not thy lovers rejoice in thee, leader and lord of the year that exults to be born So strong in thy strength and so glad of thy gladness whose laughter puts winter and sorrow to scorn? Thou hast shaken the snows from thy wings, and the frost on thy forehead is molten: thy lips are aglow As a lover's that kindle with kissing, and earth, with her raiment and tresses yet wasted and torn, Takes breath as she smiles in the grasp of thy passion to feel through her spirit the sense of thee flow.

Fain, fain would we see but again for an hour what the wind and the sun have dispelled and consumed, Those full deep swan-soft feathers of snow with whose luminous burden the branches implumed Hung heavily, curved as a half-bent bow, and fledged not as birds are, but petalled as flowers, Each tree-top and branchlet a pinnacle jewelled and carved, or a fountain that shines as it showers, But fixed as a fountain is fixed not, and wrought not to last till by time or by tempest entombed, As a pinnacle carven and gilded of men: for the date of its doom is no more than an hour's, One hour of the sun's when the warm wind wakes him to wither the snow-flowers that froze as they bloomed.

As the sunshine quenches the snowshine; as April subdues thee, and yields up his kingdom to May; So time overcomes the regret that is born of delight as it passes in passion away, And leaves but a dream for desire to rejoice in or mourn for with tears or thanksgivings; but thou,

Bright god that art gone from us, maddest and gladdest of months, to what goal hast thou gone from us now? For somewhere surely the storm of thy laughter that lightens, the beat of thy wings that play, Must flame as a fire through the world, and the heavens that we know not rejoice in thee: surely thy brow Hath lost not its radiance of empire, thy spirit the joy that impelled it on quest as for prey.

Are thy feet on the ways of the limitless waters, thy wings on the winds of the waste north sea? Are the fires of the false north dawn over heavens where summer is stormful and strong like thee Now bright in the sight of thine eyes? are the bastions of icebergs assailed by the blast of thy breath? Is it March with the wild north world when April is waning? the word that the changed year saith, Is it echoed to northward with rapture of passion reiterate from spirits triumphant as we Whose hearts were uplift at the blast of thy clarions as men's rearisen from a sleep that was death And kindled to life that was one with the world's and with thine? hast thou set not the whole world free?

For the breath of thy lips is freedom, and freedom's the sense of thy spirit, the sound of thy song, Glad god of the north-east wind, whose heart is as high as the hands of thy kingdom are strong, Thy kingdom whose empire is terror and joy, twin-featured and fruitful of births divine, Days lit with the flame of the lamps of the flowers, and nights that are drunken with dew for wine, And sleep not for joy of the stars that deepen and quicken, a denser and fierier throng, And the world that thy breath bade whiten and tremble rejoices at heart as they strengthen and shine, And earth gives thanks for the glory bequeathed her, and knows of thy reign that it wrought not wrong.

Thy spirit is quenched not, albeit we behold not thy face in the crown of the steep sky's arch, And the bold first buds of the whin wax golden, and witness arise of the thorn and the larch: Wild April, enkindled to laughter and storm by the kiss of the wildest of winds that blow, Calls loud on his brother for witness; his hands that were laden with blossom are sprinkled with snow, And his lips breathe winter, and laugh, and relent; and the live woods feel not the frost's flame parch; For the flame of the spring that consumes not but quickens is felt at the heart of the forest aglow, And the sparks that enkindled and fed it were strewn from the hands of the gods of the winds of March.
