From Singing to the Cows to Britain's Got Talent Final and now to our Village



Sam Kelly grew up in a dairy farming family, and often recounts his experiences of singing in front of a herd of hurtfully disinterested Friesians. But by the age of 19 he was singing to millions in the final of ITV's Britain's Got Talent where, as Simon Cowell (never the easiest critic!) proclaimed, "Sam, you've nailed it... you have an amazing voice". What's more we now have the chance to see him for ourselves here in the village at EdleFest on June 15th.

And Sam hasn't been resting on his laurels. As well as growing up with a large number of cows, he also grew up surrounded by traditional music and songs. And this is the genre in which he has really made his mark. Touring as a trio with Jamie Francis (banjo) and Evan Carson (percussion), Sam has gained a reputation for an incredibly high class and dynamic live show. After a barnstorming performance to a completely rammed Club Tent at Cambridge Folk Festival 2015, the guys were invited to play their first session on Radio 2 live from the festival, and have never looked back.

"Amazing, thrilling music," said Mark Radcliffe, of BBC Radio 2, and Cara Dillon also extols his virtues, saying, "Sam has such a beautiful voice and sings with so much soul. I've seen him perform live a few times and he's amazing."

The Sam Kelly Trio will be just one of the acts at EdleFest 2019, which takes place in the special atmosphere of the Church on the Hill. Alongside Sam on Saturday 15th June are the Jaywalkers, who recently headlined at The Stables in Milton Keynes in their own right. Their combination of powerhouse double bass, flame-fingered mandolin, blistering fiddle and three-part harmony pack a virtuosic Americana punch as fiery as Jay's lead vocals. And if that isn't enough, Friday sees one of the greatest British song-writing icons come to the village – Chris Difford of Squeeze!



This year, St Mary the Virgin church in Eaton Bray celebrates its 800th anniversary. There was a place of Christian worship on the site from earlier times, but the first known vicar of the parish, Nicholas was recorded in 1219. William de Canteloup owned the Manor of Eitone and he began to build a stone church which forms the basis of the church we have today.

If you visit St Mary's you will see two rows of arches described by Sir John Betjeman as 'nave arcades of absolute and quite unexpected magnificence.' Yet they do not match. One row of arches is much less decorative than the other, but we are not quite sure why. The font dates from the 13th century and has carving very similar to that on the capitals of the north arcade which are probably of the same date. Also dating from the 13th century is the intricate ironwork on the south door. It is thought to have been made by Thomas de Leighton who also made ironwork for Westminster Abbey.

In 1490 the manor of Eaton was granted to Sir Reginald Bray- hence the name of Eaton Bray. He was closely involved in the building of St George's Chapel, Windsor. He applied his architectural skills to St Mary's and was responsible for the present appearance of the building. Other features, including the stained glass windows, have been added in more recent years.

The church building has faced challenges, particularly in the nineteenth century when it was in a serious state of disrepair. For several years services had to held in the schoolroom across the road. Eaton Bray was a place of poverty and the vicar a man of fiery temper. That changed which Revd Edwin Sutton became Vicar in 1890. In conjunction with Jeffrey Sharratt, a local builder, and Mr Wallace, who built the nursery, the church was restored.

In 1930, Mr and Mrs Wallace gifted the money to build the vestry in memory of their son. More recently, in 1991 the organ was replaced and in 2016 a new extension housing toilet and storage facilities was opened. Both of these were accomplished by fundraising, generous grants and donations. As part of our 800 year celebrations we are privileged to be having a Royal Visit. His Royal Highness Richard Duke of Gloucester, the Lord Lieutenant of Bedfordshire, the High Sheriff of Bedfordshire, the Bishop of Bedford, and other dignitaries will visit St Mary's on the afternoon of Wednesday 15th May.

There will be a short service of thanksgiving with choirs from Dagnall Church of England School, Eaton Bray Academy and Edlesborough School. Canon Malcolm Grant will give a brief guided tour of the church after which HRH will plant a tree and unveil a plaque in commemoration of the occasion.

There are a limited number of tickets available for the service. If you wish to apply for a ticket (these are free on a 'first come first served' basis) please contact us via the church email admin@stmaryseatonbray.org.uk There will be a limit of 2 tickets per household. The tree planting will take place in the church yard following on from the service.



Edlesborough's New Pavillon Progress!

Edlesborough Parish Council(EPC) is pleased to announce that the planning application to renew permission to knock down the existing pavilion and build a new two-storey building was approved by AVDC on the 29th March 2019.

The building plans show new showers, changing rooms, gym, sports club storage and toilets on the ground floor. On the upper floor it is planned to have a meeting room, toilets and a club room/lounge with kitchen and bar. A balcony overlooking

Edlesborough green is also included. The building will reflect current design criteria for people with disabilities including a lift for access to the first floor. The final internal content and layout will be determined following further consultation with sports clubs and parishioners.



Here's the building set in context of the surrounding area



In April 2018 the original planning application expired and the fundraising had stalled with the Lottery and the Football Association rejecting applications for funding. The Lottery considered Edlesborough as too affluent to need extra funding support. The FA funding was conditional on the installation of an all-weather pitch on the green. That was immediately rejected as unacceptable by both EPC and the Edlesborough Community Sports Club (ECSC). EPC with the help of ECSC then made a successful application to Aylesbury Vale District Council New Homes Bonus Fund. Approval was received in October last year and the project became viable again. In November EPC made a new application for planning approval.

In February, in anticipation of the renewal of planning permission, EPC commissioned a project 'board', including a councillor and two parishioners with specialist experience to, seek quotations for professional help in getting the project to the tender stage. At the EPC meeting in March approval was given to the chosen bidder. It is expected that detailed specifications will be issued sometime in May and that the tenders will come before the council at the end of June to make the final choice of who will be engaged to build this exciting new facility.

Alternatively you can visit the Edlesborough Community Sports Club Facebook pages. EPC continues to work with ECSC for the management and maintenance of the new pavilion once it has been built.

What's going on at the Church on the Hill?



The answer is lots! Our prized village asset is slowly regaining its former glory. Its visibility has improved in so many ways; the building is open more often and further changes are afoot...

Following its closure, the Church is owned by the Churches Conservation Trust (CCT) with the Parish Council (EPC) maintaining the grounds on behalf of the villages. Throughout this time, various individuals and groups have tried to preserve the relationship between the building and the local community: to name a few, - Jack & Joan Horne, Barbara Adams, June Thorne & family, Deirdre Ellins, Mike, Dorinda & Vera Pearson, John Plater, Fred Sear, Jean Bates, Sue and John Parker and many others. There is a long list.

Ambitions increased and to help achieve these the CCT insisted that a Friends' Group be formed to take a longer term view. Our group was formed in 2012 and we created a prioritised five year plan. The first major landmark was the completion of the long awaited and hard fought "EDaN" plans for floodlighting the Church, finally achieved in 2015. See our website www.edlesboroughchurch.org.uk

We are in the seventh year of our Music Festival, our major fund-raising event. Applications are received from artists all over the world. This year EdleFest 2019 is on June 14th & 15th, with tickets available from Janes Flooring or via our website edlefest. site123.me

The team of Friends regularly cleans the church, and hosts National Heritage Open Days in September. This is becoming a major event for us and is completely free to visitors. We display historical and more recent pictures and stories of life in our village. Visitors have recognised family members from photographs never seen before. Last year a small group of enthusiasts provided research on significant women through the ages with connections to our Church. Another team is researching burial records and graves with the aim of providing a map of the Churchyard. www. heritageopendays.org.uk

As well as celebrating Carols by Candlelight, the church was open every day in December until Christmas Eve, enabling visitors to place their

thoughts on the CCT Memory Tree. We have improved the signage and updated the notice board, incorporating a "Church Open" sign to encourage visitors, especially during the summer months as a new and very local team member has kindly offered to facilitate this whenever possible – but don't forget that the key can always be obtained from Edlesborough Post Office, except when an event is being held or there are "champers" in situ.....

Under the auspices of the CCT, our Church is available for 'Champing' so if you see lights in the middle of the night, people have paid to camp in the church. See www.visitchurch.org.uk and "Enjoy a Sleepover at our Place".

Our aim is to make the building more used and loved and our recent expenditure has been on ground clearance, improving sight lines and the overall impression of a place that is cared for. We will also be planting more bulbs. A current project is to convert the North Porch into a "Tea Point". We have obtained Listed Building Consent and have appointed local contractors, thanks to the support and generosity of a local trust.

We are in discussions with the CCT to open the tower, and are trying to overcome Health & Safety issues. Following the rediscovery of the Edlesborough Rose Brass, we are looking to have a replica for permanent display in the Church. Recently an art collector donated to us an etching of the Church, previously displayed in the Royal Academy, London, in the 1930's. We hope to have this installed for the Heritage Open Days. We restored the Victorian font lid, and financed repairs for bell ropes and the organ.

We work closely with the CCT, EPC, EDaN, Rev. Joy, Mike Pearson (Bell Captain) and volunteer helpers. We will always welcome new members or helpers (PLEASE!)

We like to think that we live in a "nice community" in a "smart village" and vet there are individuals such as the young man in the white car (Fiesta? - unfortunately he was too fast to get his number!) who roared past us as we were finishing our litter pick in Cow Lane on the 13th and as we watched, opened his car window and threw a can into the hedge we had just been clearing and then disappeared at speed down the Lane!!. This is the mentality of some of our residents and is why we must go out to litter pick at regular intervals. This is not a third world country! We all have dustbins and a regular collection. 

Edlesborough Parish Council Edlesborough & Dagnall Traffic Calming Consultation

Edlesborough Parish Council (EPC) thanks all the Parishioners who took the time to the respond to the Traffic Calming Proposals for Edlesborough & Dagnall.

At EPC's request Transport for Bucks (TfB) carried out a Traffic Calming Feasibility Study at the locations in Edlesborough & Dagnall which had been raised to Edlesborough Parish Council as areas of concern. Using the information and suggestions made by TfB in the Traffic Calming Feasibility Study EPC developed the Traffic Calming Proposals for Edlesborough & Dagnall.

This report aims to outline the responses, answer questions raised by parishioners and to outline what EPC plans to do next.

One concern that came up repeatedly was the high cost of any changes. The only explanation we have at the moment is that it covers both the installation and the all future maintenance as they would be adopted by TfB.

Edlesborough Traffic Calming Responses

Cocks Close / Ivinghoe Way B440 Traffic Island

In favour 27

Against 40 72 responses from 680 households = 10.6%

Not sure 5

Did not comment 2 (not all respondents commented on both Edlesborough proposals)

Pebblemoor / Ford Lane Junction Chevrons

In favour 43

Against 14 62 responses from 680 households = 9.1%

Not sure 5

Did not comment 12 (not all respondents commented on both Edlesborough proposals)

Questions & Answers:

Can we have double yellow lines at various locations in the villages?

AVDC & Bucks CC have always refused EPC's requests for yellow lines in the villages stating that they are not enforceable in village locations.

Would two traffic islands either side of the junctions of Ivinghoe Way & Cocks Close on the B440 be better?

Three locations were suggested for traffic islands, at a cost of £38,000 each. This was deemed to be too costly by EPC.

Can the speed limit be reduced to 20pmh at significant locations in the villages?

Bucks CC have informed EPC that research has shown that signed 20mph limits generally only lead to a small reduction in speed. Historically Bucks CC has always refused EPC's requests for speed limit reductions.

Can the speed limit be reduced on the B440 from the Travellers Rest roundabout through to Edlesborough?

To date Bucks CC have refused EPC's requests for a speed limit reduction on this stretch of road. Can the road markings be replaced with two continuous white lines, indicating that overtaking is not permitted on the B440 between the Travellers Rest roundabout and Edlesborough?

EPC will be exploring this option with Bucks CC.

Can speed bumps be installed in the villages?

Speed bumps are a very expensive option and cause excessive noise and vibration nuisance to

homes that they are placed outside.

Can we have a zebra crossing on the High Street by Edlesborough School?

The installation of a zebra crossing near Edlesborough School has been included as part of the High Street planning application, subject to Highways approval. It is the responsibility of the developers to install the zebra crossing and at this time EPC do not have a timeline for this.

Decisions/Actions

- Council agreed that provided Transport for Bucks grants permission for EPC to use their own contractor to install the chevrons at the bend in Pebblemoor/Ford Lane that they would proceed with this traffic calming measure.
- At this time the Council will not proceed with the installation of a traffic island at the junction of Cocks Close/Ivinghoe Way/B440.
- A summary of Parishioner's responses will be shared with Transport for Bucks.
- Council will investigate the feasibility of installing double white lines either side of the
 junctions of Ivinghoe Way & Cocks Close as these are seen as a greater deterrent in the
 prevention of overtaking.
- Council will continue to press the issue of 20mph speed limits with BCC Bucks CC

Dagnall Traffic Calming

The TfB feasibility study provided EPC with the following information about the traffic volume and speed measurements that were taken outside Dagnall School:

Comparing the 2004 and 2018 traffic volume studies:

- Overall traffic volumes have increased by approximately 10% since 2004
- The peak periods continue to be early morning southbound and late afternoon northbound.
- The number of vehicles travelling southbound at the early morning peak continues to be almost 50% higher than the number travelling northbound at the late afternoon peak. However the early morning peak of 980 vehicles southbound has reduced slightly to 916.
- The number of vehicles travelling southbound over a 24 hour period continues to exceed the number travelling northbound, although this discrepancy has narrowed slightly since 2004.

Examining the 2004 Traffic Speed Data:

- The speed of southbound traffic is slightly more than the speed of the northbound traffic outside the school. Both the 85th percentile and average speeds are 3mph greater.
- 14 vehicles per day in each direction travel at more than 70mph. However the 7 day average of over 70mph is lower than the weekday average, meaning that fewer vehicles exceed 70mph at weekends.
- Whilst the 7 day southbound 85th percentile and average speeds are the same as the weekday ones, the 7 day northbound speeds are slightly higher than the 5 day ones.

Dagnall Traffic Calming Responses

In favour 5

Against 7 15 responses from 210 households = 7.1%

Questions & Answers

Where have the costings come from?

The cost of the proposed traffic calming measures were generated by TfB.

Can traffic calming measures be introduced at the Edlesborough end of the village and on the Dunstable Road?

EPC considered a second build out at the Edlesborough end of the village. At this time EPC

considered the priority was to slow the traffic by the school. Historically EPC have worked with Bucks CC to implement traffic calming measures on the Dunstable Road, and several years ago we managed to obtain LAF funding for a build-out there. However the build-out was rejected by TfB on safety grounds, but we did manage to get them to install the Vehicle Activated Speed camera instead.

EPC only have limited funds for Traffic Calming and at the time of publishing the proposal EPC believed the suggested measures were the most effective and cost efficient.

Can the white lines be reinstated in Dagnall on the B440?

EPC have made repeated requests to Bucks CC for the white lining to be refreshed. Currently EPC continues to press Transport for Bucks for the reinstatement of the white lines and central studs on the B440 throughout Dagnall. Our Local Area Technician has advised EPC that TfB are currently waiting a programme of works from their capital maintenance team. This will identify whether the B440 in Dagnall has been identified for resurfacing, which will include new white lines and central studs. If the road has not been identified for resurfacing it is hoped that a works order will be raised for the reinstatement of the white lines and central studs on the current road surface.

Can the money earmarked for the Outdoor Gym Equipment be spent on Traffic Calming measures instead?

This money has currently been earmarked for outdoor gym equipment and cannot at this time be used for Traffic Calming Measures.

Can speed bumps be installed throughout the village?

This option was not suggested by TfB. Installing speed bumps is a costly procedure, which often results in traffic speeding up & slowing down at numerous locations throughout the village, often leading to noise & exhaust pollution. EPC do not believe this to be a viable option at this time.

Can speed cameras be installed and the revenue used to implement traffic calming measures?

To date it has not been possible to install speed cameras in the village. Revenue from would not be able to be used by EPC.

EPC regularly asks for volunteers for people to man the Sentinel Speed Device to enable evidence to be gathered to help reinforce the need for traffic calming measures. Unfortunately, a lack of volunteers means the device cannot be deployed regularly. Bucks CC believe that education for speeding drivers is the most effective way of changing driver behaviour. Sentinel is part of this initiative.

Decisions & Actions

Council agreed to the following:

- Installing a build out on the B440 is not the way forward.
- A summary of the responses from the consultation need to be shared with Transport for Bucks, in particular the parishioner's requests for a 20mph speed limit.
- To further explore the feasibility of a speed camera outside the school.
- To request an updated speed survey be carried out outside the school.

LOCAL HERALDRY

In this series, we take a look around local towns and villages to find interesting and unusual heraldry.

LEIGHTON-LINSLADE

Not all heraldry belongs to a particular person. It is not uncommon for civic organisations, commercial companies and even towns to have their own 'coats of arms'. These are often scrutinised or indeed prepared by the College of Arms, the body that oversees all things heraldic in England, Wales and Northern Ireland.

Leighton-Linslade is a case in point:



The arms contain both the bridge that separates the two towns and also, at the top (the crest) a water ouzel which is obviously a pun on the name of the river that flows under the bridge.

Origin/meaning

The arms were officially granted on January 5, 1966.

The gold and red quarters are taken from the arms of Bedfordshire and the Beauchamp family. Leighton Buzzard originally was situated in Bedfordshire, Linslade in Buckinghamshire. The Beauchamp family received the manoralty of Linslade in 1068 from William the Conqueror. The colours thus stand for both former councils.

The two crowns are a symbol for the parish of All Saints in Leighton Buzzard and the lilies for the parish of St. Mary in Linslade. The bridge represents the bridge over the river Ouzel, which connects both towns. The ear of wheat on the bridge refers

to the produce of the agricultural land in Buckinghamshire carried over the bridge to the market in Leighton Buzzard.

The two cog wheels symbolise local industry, and in particular the Lancer Boss Group, the donors of the Arms. The water ouzel symbolises the River Ouzel, which formerly separated the two towns but is now shown as joining them together. The mural crowns on which the cogs rest are common symbols of civic government.

The motto is derived from that of the de Lucy family, Lords of Linslade in the 15th and 16th centuries.

The arms may be seen on the entrance boards to the High Street and other areas in Leighton Buzzard.

Whipsnade Trees Van Gogh Style in 15 minutes by Dr Lorna Moore




Before all the trees have their leaves this is a great time of year to get out and explore some tree drawings. I have used Van Gogh as inspiration for my quick 15 minutes sketch of the line of trees in Whipsnade grounds next to the Village Hall. If you look at Van Gogh's

image entitled 'The Road to Tarascon' created in 1888 you can see some influence. Van Gogh's style of 'mark making' is to use bold thick lines, long and short strokes of the pen, and lots of cross hatching in which the lines cross over each other. Also he used a lot vertical lines, dots, dashes and scribble marks to suggest the landscape.

Activity

Find a tree of interest and draw an outline of it in pencil and then draw over it with a black fine liner pen or a black felt tip pen, not too thick and with a nice point. Once you have your tree outline, on a spare piece of paper experiment with pen marks. Try out some of my examples seen in the illustration. Vary the pressure of your hand to get lighter areas

and darker areas. Experiment with short vertical lines and thick lines/thin lines; cross your lines over each other without taking the pen off the page; try dashes and dots and scribbling. The wider your marks the lighter the tone and the closer together they are, the darker. Though this looks very simple it is quite hard to get a variety of tone just using these marks.

Once you feel confident experimenting on scrap paper, draw into your tree. Keep your outline nice and shapely and not too rigid. See if you can get the roundness of the tree trunk with tone and marks. If you feel good, draw another tree in the distance a bit smaller and a bit lighter in tone. Break up your outlines as you go further into the distance so it is not a continuous line, this will give your drawing more life and more depth.

Practise, practise, practise . . . and enjoy vourself.

Wolverine kits born for the first time at ZSL Whipsnade Zoo

Two adorable baby wolverines have been caught on camera by keepers at ZSL Whipsnade Zoo, following a breeding first for the international conservation charity ZSL. The kits, born on Monday 18 February, are rare additions to the species within the UK. The as-yet unsexed siblings were born to three-year-old mum Fi and ten-year-old dad Puff, as

part of a European-wide breeding programme. Numbers of wolverines, also known as "gluttons" or "skunk bears", in the wild are decreasing, so the breeding programme is of global significance. Visitors to the Zoo might be lucky enough to see them because Fi has started to pick up each one in her mouth and take them out into the paddock for short periods of time, feeding and licking them in a makeshift nest area outside before delivering them back to their warm, inside den. By May, they are expected to be out and about exploring for several hours a day.

Did You Do That?

There's a memorable scene in a Winnie the Pooh story

when Pooh is visiting Owl in his tree home. After the usual formalities, when Pooh expects to be offered a 'smackerel' of something and to accept it, there is a mighty crash, as a gust of wind blows down the tree. Floor turns to wall and wall turns to ceiling in a clatter and crashing of all Owl's possessions. When things stop moving, Owl looks at Pooh suspiciously and says, "Pooh! Did you do that?"

When things go wrong we like to blame someone, don't we? We do it even if we've brought the trouble on ourselves. When things go wrong, whether it's a natural disaster, such as Cyclone Idai in south-east Africa, or a man-made tragedy, such as the bursting dam at an iron ore mine in Brazil, many people blame God - even people who say they do not believe in God.

The Bible does not give explanations for every tragedy. It does, however, tell us what to learn from them. In Luke 13 verses 1-5 Jesus comments on two tragedies. The Roman governor, Pilate, had some Galilean Jews massacred while they were offering sacrifices in the temple. Also a tower had collapsed in Jerusalem, killing 18 people. Jesus said that these events, as well as stirring us to compassion, should remind us that the world is in a mess because mankind has turned its back on God. Unless we turn back to him, we are in danger of something much worse - being separated from God for ever.

If you blame God for things that go wrong, do you then thank him for things that go well? When a rescue succeeds or a tragedy is averted it doesn't make big headlines but do you thank God or only blame him for the bad things? Do you look at the beauty of emerging spring and thank God for the

wonder of it, or only blame him if there are floods? The Bible says that one of the worst things we can



do is to take all that God gives us and never thank him or even admit it comes from him.

Do join us in our Sunday services as we thank God for his good gifts, pray for those who suffer and confess our daily need of forgiveness. We'd love to see you!

200 years and still going A little Church with strong local links

Leaders – who are we

Instead of a full-time Minister, the Church has 3 Leaders. We share the responsibilities of running the organisation, each bringing different experiences of life and also abilities, both practical and intellectual and sharing in the care and concern of fellow members and friends.



I was age 17 when I became a Christian and joined my local church. Many of you reading this will remember the time when the illness diagnosed as cancer, and whispered about as 'the big C', was considered a death sentence, as often it was. I had two friends, also church members, Jeff, 1 month older and Hugh about 2 years older than me. Within 4 years of me joining them in church membership both Hugh and Jeff had married, started a family and died of cancer. It was a very present reminder that being a Christian does not guarantee good health or longevity. Much prayer had been given for them but they were taken. Much prayer was said for me and I survived. By faith, God calls us to himself when our work on earth is done!

Married in 1964, we then had two girls. 3 grandchildren had arrived by the time I was diagnosed with bowel cancer in 2005. Treatment was excellent and my partial colectomy was successful.

I want to relate to you the following story because (in the UK) 11,000 men each year die of prostate cancer (It is a 'men only' disease with no symptoms) and many deaths could have been prevented with earlier diagnosis and treatment. Many men are only diagnosed because of other problems coming up requiring investigation. In 1998 prior to my bowel cancer episode, a business contact living in Switzerland was holidaying in the USA and had a heart attack. The doctors checking his blood also found that he had a PSA (Prostate Specific Antigen) reading abnormally high and advised him, with some urgency, to see his doctor when he got home. He had prostate cancer, subsequently received treatment and was cured. He phoned me soon after and said

"John, you go to a 'well man's clinic don't you?"; Yes; "Make sure that you ask for a PSA test (this test is indicative, not absolute)". He explained that his cancer had been found in time and after treatment he was well.

After 12 years of having tests, in 2010, I tested positive for prostate cancer, had a radical prostatectomy and have been clear for 8+ years. I'm now up to 2 great-grandsons!

I thank God for that good advice which potentially saved my life and for the prayers of many people for my welfare. If you would like to discuss any of the above please feel free to contact the writer below.

Pot'

Dear Friends,

I was listening to a radio phone-in programme the other day, during which callers were speaking about the effects of workplace stress upon their daily lives.

We live in an age in which so much emphasis is placed upon being seen to be successful. When for many people just getting through all that they have to do in a day is a struggle.

How would you measure success? Is it about your impressive work rate - what you do or don't achieve? Or a need to be accepted by others?

I would venture to say that though these seem to be important they are, in fact, false measures.

Of course there may not be much (if anything) that we can do to change the expectations of others in our workplace, but I feel that if we are working to please others we may be working hard for the wrong reasons. St Paul writing in his second letter to the church in Corinth says "But we have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us" (chapter 4 verse 7).

A part of the meaning of this verse is that the measure of our success should be the extent to which we do not struggle to achieve things in our own strength, but rest within and seek to reflect the mighty power of God at work in us. He has principally demonstrated this power in Jesus, the 'treasure' that Paul is referring to.

We should therefore not be too dispirited if our efforts and strivings don't receive the appreciation from others that we feel they should - that is so often the ungrateful way of the world. Instead let us give thanks that God is well pleased with our efforts to do a good job, to work with others considerately, carefully and with integrity and so to reflect his love in Jesus.

Maybe we find it hard to believe that we can make a difference orthat our life has meaning? Like earthenware pots ('jars of clay') we are easily cracked and broken, but our vulnerability, openness and reliance on God throughout our struggles is, I think, a more important measure than the chasing of illusive 'success'.

May you experience God reminding you of his treasure within and reassuring you that he is at work in your life. Maybe you know the old parable of 'The Cracked

"A water bearer in India had two large pots, each hung on each end of a pole which he carried across his neck. One of the pots had a crack in it, and while the other pot was perfect and always delivered a full portion of water at the end of the long walk from the stream to the master's house, the cracked pot arrived only half full.

For a full two years, this went on daily, with the bearer delivering only one and a half pots full of water in his master's house. Of course, the perfect pot was proud of its accomplishments, perfect to the end for which it was made. But the poor cracked pot was ashamed of its own imperfection and miserable that it was able to accomplish only half of what it had been made to do.

After two years of what it perceived to be a bitter failure, it spoke to the water bearer one day by the stream. 'I am ashamed of myself, and I want to apologize to you.' The bearer asked, 'Why? What are you ashamed of?' The pot replied, 'For these past two years I am able to deliver only half of my load because this crack in my side causes water to leak out all the way back to your master's house. Because of my flaws, you don't get full

The water bearer felt sorry for the old cracked pot, and in his compassion, he said, 'As we return to the master's house, I want you to notice the beautiful flowers along the path.'

As they went up the hill, the old cracked pot took notice of the sun warming the beautiful wild flowers on the side of the path, and this cheered it somewhat. But at the end of the trail, it still felt bad because it had leaked out half its load.

The bearer said to the pot, 'Did you notice that there were flowers only on your side of your path, but not on the other pot's side? That's because I know and value your unique qualities. I planted flower seeds on your side of the path, and every day while we walk back from the stream, you've watered them. For two years I have been able to pick these beautiful flowers to decorate my master's table. Without you being just the way you are, he would not have this beauty to grace his house."


Weather Conditions for March 2019

It began on the streets of East London in 1865 when Methodists, William and Catherine Booth, abandoned the traditional concept of a church pulpit to take Gods word directly to the people.

It grew rapidly and arrived among the straw platters in Eaton Bray around 1888.
