

Walking pilgrimages are becoming more popular and recent TV programmes have highlighted different celebrities following ancient pilgrimage routes across Europe. On Saturday 22nd June, the Alban Pilgrimage takes place in St Alban's with a magnificent procession from St Peter's Church to the Cathedral. The publicity states: 'Our infamous 12ft carnival puppets take to the streets to reenact the moving story of Alban and Amphibalus, making a wonderful gathering of pilgrims from around St Alban's Diocese and beyond. Supported by hundreds of costumed children and thousands of onlookers, this wonderful celebration of the Christian faith is not to be missed.' The procession starts at St Peter's church at 11am. One of the reasons for the growing popularity of pilgrimage is that it enables people to focus on the here and now without being distracted. In her book 'An altar in the world-finding the sacred beneath our feet,' Barbara Brown Taylor explores ways in which we can become more aware of God in the everyday. One of these is by walking. 'Not everyone is able to walk,' writes Brown Taylor, 'but most people can, which makes walking one of the most easily available spiritual practices of all.'

Often our walking is a means to an end. We walk in order to get somewhere, and we do so as fast as possible to arrive at our destination as quickly as we can. The kind of walking Barbara Brown Taylor advocates is more like sauntering. It is about walking with awareness, paying attention to where we are, who we are with, and what is around us. The journey becomes more important than the destination.

This is the kind of walking which Jesus does in the gospels. He spent a lot of his ministry walking around. The gospel writers never give the impression that he was rushing. On his journeys, Jesus had time for people. He noticed those around him. Once, when Jesus and his disciples were leaving Jericho, two blind men called out to him as he was passing by. Jesus stopped, sought them out and healed them.

On another occasion, Jesus walked with two of his followers on the road to Emmaus. They were discussing the recent events of Jesus's death on the cross and puzzling over them. The risen Jesus drew alongside them and walked with them. As he did so, he explained the Scriptures to them and helped them to understand why he had to suffer and die. The disciples finally understood as they encountered the risen Lord.

St Augustine of Hippo wrote 'solviture ambulando' which means 'it is solved by walking'. The act of walking helps us to think things through, to ponder and reflect. And yes, sometimes we are able to reach solutions. Walking with the awareness of what is around us enables to appreciate the beauty of creation. Walking with an awareness of the presence of God gives us space to be renewed and refreshed. It is a form of prayer.

# His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester visits St Mary's Church, Eaton Bray

Bright sunshine welcomed the visit of His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester to the Church of St Mary the Virgin, Eaton Bray with Edlesborough, on Wednesday 15 May as part of the church's 800th Anniversary celebrations. The visit to the church concluded HRH's three-part visit to Bedfordshire having been to Bedford School and Wardown House Museum and Gallery in the morning.

HM Lord-Lieutenant of Bedfordshire, Helen Nellis, accompanied His Royal Highness on his visit. Other dignitaries present included the High Sheriff of Bedfordshire Meryl Dolling, the Bishop of Bedford The Rt Revd Richard Atkinson OBE, the Chief Executive of Central Bedfordshire Council Richard Carr and the Chief Fire Officer Paul Fuller CBE QFSM MStJ DL.

The visit was hosted by St Mary's Church Warden Catherine Hayden who introduced His Royal Highness to the Vicar of Eaton Bray with Edlesborough Rev Joy Cousans, the former retired Vicar of Eaton Bray with Edlesborough Revd Canon Malcolm Grant and the Reader of the Parish Gordon Gray.

The visit commenced with a Service of Dedication and Thanksgiving led by The Bishop of Bedford and Rev Joy Cousans during which a choir comprising pupils from the three schools in the parish (Dagnall Church of England School, Eaton Bray Academy and Edlesborough School) sang the anthem "Look at the world," by Rutter. After a blessing from the Bishop, His Royal Highness signed the Visitors' Book.

His Royal Highness has a background as an architect and Revd Canon Malcolm Grant, who has undertaken extensive research on St Mary's Church and has written a book on its history and architecture, provided a guided tour of St Mary's. He explained the marked difference in architectural style between the North and South arcades and highlighted several connections with the Royal Household, including the work of Reginald Bray, after whom the village was named and who was architect and builder of St George's Chapel, Windsor.

After His Royal Highness was presented with three books on the history of the church and village (Malcolm Grant's book plus two by the village

historian Peter Mayne), dignitaries moved outside the church to join members of St Mary's congregation and parents and pupils from the schools. His Royal Highness was introduced to tree specialist Brian McMahon who explained that the tree to be planted was a whitebeam that would grow to a medium height and prove a most attractive addition to the Churchyard.

Having ceremonially planted the tree, His Royal Highness spoke with members of the congregation and the choir children before being bid farewell by Rev Joy Cousans and the Lord-Lieutenant.

Speaking after the visit, the Lord-Lieutenant said, "It was a great pleasure for me to welcome HRH The Duke of Gloucester to Eaton Bray in this three-part visit to Bedfordshire. His Royal Highness visited some very special places in the county which showed many different

and successful aspects of living in our vibrant community. We hope His Royal Highness enjoyed his visit'.



#### Annual Parish Meeting

Three years ago Bucks CC devolved the cutting of the grass verges in the 30mph limit in the three villages to EPC. Last year EPC extended this grass cutting to include the verges in the 40mph limit ensuring greater consistency across the villages. EPC will be continuing with providing this service to the Parish. requests that parishioners do not park their vehicles on the grass verges as this results in damage to the verges and prevents the contractor from cutting the grass.





#### **Neighbourhood Plan**

Several months have passed since I last wrote in Focus, I imagine those of you who follow the Neighbourhood Plan (NP) have been wondering what has happened. The answer is quite a lot, most activities have been administrative with very little to report, but I am now able to give an update.

Following our consultation and village meetings held in the Coffee Tavern last summer we submitted our NP to Central Bedfordshire (CBC) at the beginning of December. CBC were then able to commence their review of our NP by holding a "Regulation 16 Consultation" early in 2019, this is a second check on our NP making sure that we comply with Neighbourhood Planning Law as well as giving various statutory consultees an opportunity to consider our NP again. Which is lucky that we did, the Chilterns Conservation Board who look after Dunstable Downs (and lots of other very important ANOB's) had a lot to say and gave us some important advice. The Reg. 16 Consultation completed at the

end of March and in April CBC appointed an independent examiner in accordance with current NP regulations. The examiner wrote to the Parish Council on 30th April, a copy of this letter can be found on the Parish web site along with his 30 questions, plenty for me to do over the next week, roll on my family holiday....

If we answer the examiner's questions to his satisfaction there will be a referendum (that dreaded word!) later in the year.

We hope that you found this update useful, I know planning stuff can be boring but the alternative may not be what we would like for the village.

# BBQ Buffalo Chicken Wings with a Blue Cheese Dip

It's amazing how many careers in food come about as a result of a big career change. People leave the rat race and set up a café, a cake making business, a food truck or a restaurant, making quality of life their key criteria. Although most say they've never worked harder than they now do in their new food career, they'll also say they've never had more fun. One such man is Harp Gill, who left a stressful career in recruitment in the City to set up a BBO and smoking catering company in Milton Keynes called The Rub BBQ. He is passionate about smoking and cooking meats perfectly. These Buffalo wings are a true classic - tangy, sharp, spicy and devilishly moreish.

#### You'll need:

1kg chicken wings (prepared how you like, in 3, 2 or 1 wing configuration).

#### For the dry rub

- 2 tbsp paprika powder
- 2 tbsp garlic powder
- 2 tbsp sea saltsep
- 2 tbsp ground pepper

#### For the buffalo sauce

- 250ml apple cider vinegar
- 100ml distilled white vinegar
- 2 tbsp ground cayenne powder
- 3 tbsp cayenne pepper powder
- 1 tbsp garlic powder
- 1 tbsp salt
- 150g salted butter

#### For the blue cheese dip

500g of your desired blue cheese crumbled as fine as possible

500g Greek yoghurt

A dash of lemon juice

1 tbsp extra virgin olive oil

1 tbsp milk salt and pepper to taste

Place the chicken wings in a bowl and add the dry rub ingredients. Mix everything together well to ensure all the pieces are equally covered.

Cover with cling film and place in a fridge

overnight (or for at least for 2 hours).

Place all of the sauce ingredients except the butter into a saucepan and bring to the boil over a medium heat.



Reduce to a simmer for between 20-25 minutes stirring occasionally.

Add the butter and simmer gently for a further 15 minutes. Place to the side once done.

To make the blue cheese dip, place all ingredients into a bowl and mix well. Pop it in the fridge until ready to serve.

Now it is time to grill the wings. Place them skin side down over a hot BBQ and cook until the skin starts bubbling (5-8 minutes) and then turn them over for a further 1-2 minutes or until done.

Pop the buffalo sauce in a bowl and roll the wings in it, giving it a good coating.

Return them to the grill for a further minute to crisp up the sauce and then give them one final coating of the sauce (without grilling them again). They are ready to serve now.

Serve with the blue cheese dip and a stick of celery. These give a real wow factor at any family BBQ and make a perfect starter or lunch snack.

NB: This recipe can also be done in the oven should you not have access to a BBQ. Cook the wings for an hour in the oven at 180C/Gas Mark 4, covered with foil. The final glazing process can be done under a hot grill. Hear wonderful recipes on Nick Coffer's

# THE NAME'S BOND - ENGLISH BOND! A STUDY OF SOME COMMON BRICK PATTERNS IN EDLESBOROUGH

Have you looked at your walls recently? If your house or garden wall is of brick construction, it will be built using one of a number of different patterns, and much can be learnt by taking a closer look at these 'brick bonds'. A brick has two long sides (stretchers) and two ends (headers) one or other of which are usually visible,

the large other faces where mortar is applied being concealed by the construction method.

The way the bricks are laid affects the strength of the building or wall and also the overall cost. Nowadays almost all buildings are laid in what is called stretcher bond, i.e. only the long sides are visible, alternating one row with another to avoid having joints in line which would be weak. This is not an inherently strong bond however, but as houses nowadays are tied to an inner breeze block cavity wall, that is not so relevant. It uses up space effectively though, so is quite cost effective.

From Tudor times, a pattern called 'English bond'

English Garden Wall Bond

was used extensively and it is still a very elegant design, comprising a row of headers then a row of stretchers, the pattern repeated throughout the build. The tithe barn in Edlesborough is of this construction.

A variant of this style, called 'English garden wall bond' used a row of headers and then two or more rows of stretchers to save money. The wall by the moat on the High Street is so composed. If the number of stretcher rows is five or over, saving even more outlay, it is known as 'Scottish garden

wall bond'!

A style that took over and was very popular in Victorian times when there was a massive amount of house building undertaken is called 'Flemish bond'. Here a header is placed next to a stretcher and this pattern is repeated on the next row with the header always centrally placed under the stretcher above. The Methodist Chapel in the High Street has this design. Sometimes the headers have burnt ends and this results in a very pleasing diamond pattern.

Where a tight radius is required, for example on gate piers or entrance drive walls, sometimes only headers are used. This avoids an inelegant polygonal result which would be the case if stretchers were used. The example here is at the entrance to a house on The Green. If a house front is

made entirely of headers, it is something very special as it is so expensive. Such designs may be found on the old buildings at the traffic lights in Hockliffe if you are turning towards Woburn.

There are other brick bonds occasionally found but the only instance of what is known as 'Rat Trap bond' (where the bricks are laid on edge) that I have found is, ironically, at Dunstable Police Station!


See if you can work out what bonds the houses and walls in your local villages are constructed of. It makes a pleasant distraction for adults and children alike!

#### LOCAL HERALDRY BY JOHN HOCKEY

In this series, we take a look around local towns and villages to find interesting and unusual heraldry.

#### TOTTERNHOE STONEMASONS

As there is little obvious heraldry in St Giles' church, Totternhoe, I thought I would take a look at the arms of the Worshipful Company of Stonemasons, whose tag line is 'Encouraging the Use of Natural Stone'. There can be little doubt that Totternhoe has played a significant part in English architecture through the widespread use of Totternhoe clunch, a hard chalk or soft limestone which is




easy to carve but sadly does not weather well when exposed to the elements. This dichotomy may be seen to great effect in nearby Eaton Bray church, which on the inside has, in the view of the great architectural historian Alec Clifton-Taylor 'beauty little short of a Wells in miniature'. In places however, particularly externally, such beauty is not so apparent and buildings such as Windsor Castle and Westminster Abbey, together with local examples like Woburn Abbey and Dunstable Priory Church have all had to be partially refaced.

Nevertheless, stonemasons have worked Totternhoe clunch from mediaeval times and like most ancient trades they formed themselves into a Worshipful Company to regulate practice and avoid abuse by those not skilled in their particular art.

The Company's arms have a black background (Sable) with a chevron Argent which has scalloped edges known heraldically as engrailed. On the chevron are a

pair of compasses, which would be used by all skilled masons. The other *charges* on the shield are castles, usually a spectacular example of the stonemasons' art. Within Totternhoe church is an example of carved clunch, namely a rebus or pun on the name Ashwell. The carving clearly shows an ash tree on the left and a well on the right. The Ashwells were a 16th century benefactor family.

#### **An Underwater World of Wonder**

ZSL Whipsnade Zoo opens the UK's first Aquarium this summer dedicated to conserving the world's most astonishing and endangered freshwater fish

Fish that can jump out of the water to pluck fruit from trees, have evolved to no longer need eyes, or even live out of water for more than two months, are among the incredible species that will call ZSL Whipsnade Zoo's new Aquarium home. Opening this summer, the Aquarium at ZSL Whipsnade Zoo will be the first in the UK dedicated to conserving threatened and extinct-in-the-wild freshwater fish. Taking visitors on a round-the-world journey through ten of the planet's most extreme and fascinating aquatic habitats, from a vibrant flooded forest in Brazil, to an African puddle, the Aquarium will bring families face-to-face with some of the rarest and most unique fish species in existence.

#### Six-foot Bundle of Joy

Baby giraffe makes debut at ZSL Whipsnade Zoo

Zookeepers are celebrating the birth of a giant after welcoming a baby giraffe to the herd at ZSL Whipsnade Zoo. The reticulated giraffe (Giraffa camelopardalis reticulata) was born to first time mum Luna and dad Bashu at midday on Friday 26 April and has been named Khari, which means 'King-like' in Swahili, because of his regal-looking ossicones - the tiny crown-like homs on a giraffe's head.

Born as part of the European Breeding Programme for the Endangered species, the adorable calf already stands head and shoulders above most of the residents at the UK's largest zoo – hovering at almost sixfeet tall. ZSL team leader Mark Holden, explains: "First-time mum Luna is doing a sterling job of looking after Khari - positively doting on her new arrival, while feeding and cleaning him regularly. "However, the birth was definitely a family affair; Dad Bashu was rubbing Luna's neck encouragingly during her

four-hour labour, while grandmother Ijuma helped to clean the youngster after the birth - and they've all since continued to be very involved in Khari's care."

Giraffe calves weigh more than the twenty times the average 7lbs human when they're born, weighing in at around 150lbs at birth. Giraffes also give birth standing up, meaning their calves make an epic entrance into the world: falling six feet, hooves first to the ground, before learning to walk within an hour.

Khari has even started to tentatively venture outside, so lucky visitors should be able to spot him stretching his legs.

# 200 years and still going A little Church with strong local links Leaders – who are we?

Instead of a full-time Minister, our Church has three leaders of which I am one, Robert Kirkman. We share the responsibilities of running the Church, each bringing different experiences of life and also abilities, both practical and spiritual and sharing in the pastoral care and concern of fellow members and friends.

I guess my story begins before I was born. My parents lived in London's Highgate during the Second World War. My mother and two brothers were evacuated to a beautiful eighteenth century stone cottage in a lovely country lane in Lancashire. While away their home was made uninhabitable by a German V1 flying bomb falling in their street. My father was in the house at the time and suffered head injuries from flying glass but survived. My mother and brothers were away and safe from the bombing of London. Later in life my brother said they were like refugees in their own land. Our family suffered the consequences of war for many years after the war had ended.

My father was in the Merchant Navy on convoys in the Atlantic and the Pacific and to North Africa. His ship sunk off the West Coast of Ireland when it broke in half but all the crew were rescued by two Corvettes. One of my interests is researching my family history and a couple of years ago I visited the Island of Inishark off the Atlantic Coast of Ireland where my father's ship was sunk.

From a boy I loved swimming and cycling. Some years ago I did the London to Brighton Bike Ride with the British Heart Foundation. My wife and I are members of the National Trust and I have always had an interest in history. I am a member of the Chiltem Vehicle Preservation Group and my wife and I appeared for picnics at Rallies in our old Morris.

I did not grow up in a Church family. My interest in God was awakened by a Christian teacher at my school and when I was away for a week's holiday as a teenager with my parents in Brighton. A youngish woman was speaking to a crowd on the promenade and said she was dying of cancer but she wanted to tell as many people as possible about the gift of eternal life in God before she died. She spoke on a verse in the Bible "For the wages of sin is death but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord". As a young teenager and having not come from a church family I still understood what she was saying. Some months later I went into a chapel in North London and hearing more about Jesus I decided to become a Christian. My wife's father was killed in the Second World War and he is buried in Berlin and she grew up with her mother and grandmother. My wife and I both grew up knowing we do not live forever nor do those around us. We are believers and we have our faith.

For some years now we have regularly attended Northall Baptist Church where we have found friendship and fellowship. I think of our Church as a hospital for sinners not a museum of saints. We are an imperfect people and in the words of the Rev. Kate Bottley on the Road to Santiago "we are not Jesus, we are his followers". Here at our Church is a smile for the joyful, friendship for the lonely and comfort for the sad.

When Jesus asked one of his twelve disciples called Peter if he wanted to leave or go away Peter answered Jesus "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." We are believers and trust in God the maker of the heavens and earth. When I read that an international team of astronomers have discovered a huge quasar 420 trillion times brighter than our sun around 12.8 billion light years away from earth I am never surprised at our God.

Our Sunday morning service is at 11am. Come and join us, you'll get a warm welcome. #### Nigel's Thoughts

**Methodist Minister** 

Dear Friends,
Many of you will know that I

have recently returned from a three month sabbatical leave. Although there were elements of 'holiday' in some of the things I did whilst away, the main emphasis was upon a change of pace and the opportunity for new experiences and fresh learning.

I was most looking forward to the opportunity to visit a Christian hospital in West Bengal, India. I have never travelled that far from home before, having previously been on holiday to mainly European destinations on package holidays.

Little did I know that I was in for a very rich, overwhelming and somewhat unsettling experience. Although I thought that I'd prepared myself pretty well, I had a lot of adjusting to do. Nothing had prepared me for the length (much delayed) of the journey and the conditions we experienced at the hospital and in the local community. What impressed me most was the quality of the life and work of those who worked in the hospital.

Working with almost nothing, and with mainly obsolete equipment that was functional but which had seen better days, they were cheerfully and faithfully changing and saving lives. It was amazing what they were able to achieve with so little, and it made me wonder about all that we take so much for granted and enjoy.

Since my return I have been thinking about the need for us all to determine what is 'enough'. Now that's a word that we do not hear very often, intent as our rich western society is upon the pursuit of production, consumption and profits. We have not helped of course with our need for instant gratification. Just yesterday an email offered me "an iPhone 6S with no

upfront cost. Amazing". I was not tempted. The reality is that we cannot continue as we are.

I am no 'Extinction Rebellion' protestor. Though their actions attracted much publicity they proved very inconvenient for many, as they pointed out some inconvenient truths. Last week (on 3rd/4th May) Tropical Cyclone Fani made land near Pune in Odisha, having been winding up to a severe storm over the sea for quite some time. It made its way inland, thankfully gradually decreasing in strength as it travelled towards and through West Bengal. For a time I feared the possible consequences of it passing, in strength (as it seemed projected to do) right over the hospital in Sarenga that I visited just a few short months ago, where so much is being done for so many with so little in the way of resources.

The severity of weather events in vulnerable parts of the world continues to increase. Admittedly, the situation in the Bay of Bengal is complex. The air pollution in Kolkata (Calcutta) itself is chronic and getting worse as the sprawling city grows.

I am no scientist. However it is no longer possible for us to continue to ignore the science that points to the truth that the careless consumption of humankind comes at a cost, especially to many of the world's poorest peoples.

I will always remember my Indian trip and the wonderful, committed, generous, friendly and joyful people that I met making so much out of so little and living so simply. I will therefore try to commit to living more simply and with less, to do what little I can to enable their flourishing. God bless,

#### Let's Create a Cezanne Apple

I think a lot of us may have heard of the French artist Paul Cezanne! (1839-1906). No worries if you haven't. Cezanne once said 'I will astonish Paris with an apple' so let's astonish ourselves using some of his techniques in drawing.

Get yourself an apple and place it on a dish or a table (or copy mine). Notice the shape of your apple. Now with a pencil (any B pencil will do) start drawing an oval apple



shape first very lightly on your page. Don't worry too much about getting your apple perfect (we are re-interpreting it Cezanne style). Look at my image of the first initial sketch. See the straight lines cutting across each other on the curve of the apples? I want you to do the same. Eventually these straight lines begin to create the round shape of the apple Cezanne style. Cezanne's' apples almost look like a wooden sculpture created from a wooden plane. We see the mass and form of the apple more through this technique. Now begin to draw the curve of the

apple more within these straight lines keeping your apple looking a bit angular. Rub out those straight lines now. You should end up with a slight geometric apple.

#### **Shading**

Look at example 2 and notice the cross over pencil marks. Try this out scribbling across the marks in different directions. This gives the apple more geometry. Explore light/dark shading depending on the pressure of your pencil and close marks. Leave some highlights. Also notice that some of the edges around the apple are very exaggerated and dark. Do this like Cezanne did. He used a lot of dark outlines. Have fun experimenting with your apples Cezanne style. He tried to




make his apples look geometric to emphasise the mass/form of objects.

Some say he's a post-impressionist painter but he was a modernist artist of his day who did not fit into any category of painting. His style was a precursor for the cubist art movement. See the below website for more information on Cezanne. Also check out cubism and see his influence.

#### A Month in the Country by J. L. Carr


One of the many benefits that we experience when joining a book group is the introduction to authors that we would not otherwise read. This month we read "A Month in the Country" by J.L.Carr. We had only a synopsis on which to base our selection, as none of us were familiar with his work.

The book is very thin, with a plot covering just the month of its title, but the characterisation and the precise and beautiful writing makes it a reading experience that stays in one's memory. Written in 1980 it won the Man Booker prize and the Guardian Fiction award. Expertly crafted, it introduces-many serious themes whilst telling quite a simple story.

Tom Birkin, looks back to the summer of 1920, when as a young man newly demobbed from service in the Great War, he accepts a

commission to restore a medieval wall painting which has been whitewashed over. The painting is in a church in the small village of Oxgodby in Yorkshire. When he arrives, he is penniless, damaged by his war experiences and has also learned that his wife has left him. He is welcomed icily by the church rector, Rev. Keach who disapproves of the restoration. He tells Tom that his accommodation will be in the bell tower and that his fee of 2Sguineas will be paid in instalments.

As well as acclimatising himself with the local villagers, Tom meets Moon; another veteran of the Great War. Moon is an archaeologist, his task is to locate a grave which was placed outside the church boundaries, which



meant that the deceased had been guilty of either suicide or some other act disapproved of by the church. The two men bond because of their war experiences and become friends, although Tom seems to blend in more with village life than Moon.

August, the month of the story brings cloudless skies and a heat wave. J,L.Carr's descriptions of the lazy summer days and the English countryside are so evocative, that the reader feels part of it. The Rev Keach, his young wife Alice and the villagers who welcome Tom into their lives are beautifully drawn. The book is a country idyll, the storyline subtle and heartbreaking at times. The description of the mural's restoration was very informative, and several themes made for a good discussion.

Unusually, for our group, everyone showered praise on the book, and we all said that we would like to read more by this author.

#### Elevation: 450 ft - Latitude: 51° 50' 13" North - Longitude: 0° 33' 34" West




On the 1st, April Fools' Day, it was dry and sunny and felt like spring. So, yes, we were fooled because, the following day, the temperature fell and it was the wettest day of the month. It turned colder on the 5th as winds turned to the east and the wind chill made it feel even colder. This stayed with us until the 14th and we recorded sub-zero temperatures four times during this period. On the 15th, as we moved into Easter week, the temperatures started to rise until we got to the weekend when winds from south lifted the temperature to 24.7°c. We then ended the month on a cooler and wetter note. April was a very dry month with only 25.4mm (1 inch) of rain which is only 55% of the ten-year average. As we saw in the press, we had record breaking temperatures at Easter and it did seem out of the ordinary – just like summer – but Easter was late this year. I looked back at the data to see if it was unusual for this time in April and I didn't have to go far: only to last year. See the comparisons in the chart below.
