The accounts of Jesus' birth are full of people making journeys. Mary and Joseph make the journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem to be taxed, the shepherds leave their fields and make their way to see Jesus lying in the manger, and the Wise Men travel from the East to Jerusalem and on to Bethlehem so that they can worship Jesus and can bring him their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. After Jesus' birth, an angel then tells Joseph that he and his new family need to escape Herod and flee to Egypt. So the Christmas story is one that is filled with comings and goings. Many people will also find themselves making journeys over Christmas and the New Year to visit friends and family, to exchange presents, and to share in the many joys that Christmas and the New Year can bring.

Amid all our to-ing and fro-ing during the festive season, it is important that we remember those who may live near us that have nobody to come and visit. For many, Christmas can be a difficult time, as it is often at Christmas that we remember those who are far from us, or who are no longer with us. So the first thing that I would encourage you to do, is to think about your neighbours and who among them might really appreciate a visit, who might want to not feel quite so alone, or who might want to share in the joy of the season, but has nobody to share it with.

It is also at this time that we should remember all those throughout the world who, like Mary, Joseph and Jesus, are fleeing their homes because of violence and oppression. Sadly, there are many people throughout the world who suffer, because of their ethnicity, their beliefs, and their political views. But what can we do to help refugees? It is really important to take some time to pray for those fleeing their own homes that they may be kept safe and also giving thanks for freedoms we received. But there are also many charitable organisations that are there to help those in need - organisations like Christian Aid, Refugee Action, Save the Children, and Unicef, amongst many others – perhaps this year you could donate something to one of these charities, or give unwanted things to one of their charity shops.

So the old year is coming to an end and we are moving into the New Year. When Mary and Joseph, the Shepherds, and the Wise Men set out on their journeys, they did not know

what to expect, or what would happen along the way; but each was rewarded at the end, by finding the baby Jesus, lying in the manger. Journey is not always easy, and life is not always easy either, but after all the hardship of their travelling, all those in the Christmas story found the peace of the Christ-child, a little baby surrounded by love the God. I wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year, and pray that you too may be surrounded by the warmth and love of God.



#### Watercourse/Mill End Close

Mill End Water Course Refurbishment Update.

Some months ago, Eaton Bray Parish Council (EBPC) met with Bedford Group of Internal Drainage Boards, the body responsible for maintaining the various water courses in the Region. We discussed what was potentially required for the water course at Mill End to restore the water level and flows to achieve the preferred design. A plan was agreed, which was for the IDB to clear the land, survey the damage and prepare costed recommendations for the most appropriate works.

Having cleared the land some months ago we have now received a technical proposal for the recommended works which, amongst other aspects, recommends sheet piling along the bank to the east side (Mill End Close side) of the water course. We are awaiting costed proposals and possibly alternative solutions for EBPC to review in the near future. The current technical proposal will be available to view on EBCPC web site, as will the fully costed proposal when it is received. In the meantime, this update is intended to inform Parishioners of progress and that the next stage is to review the funding options prior to commencing any works.

#### Litter Pick Day: Saturday 26th October 2019

Seven people turned out on Saturday 26th October to pick up litter in the village. Amazingly we collected about 30 bags of rubbish. A big thank you to those came along to help. Just think what we could do if more people took part. Perhaps next Spring?

#### Skate Park/School Lane

Local children addressed the Parish Council asking for improvements to the current skate park. A petition, containing 130 signatures, was presented to the Council. The proposal is for a street section to be added to the



skate park, the Parish Council to look further into suggested designs/costs.







# Portuguese Custard Tarts

It's been said over and again, food takes us back to a place, back to a memory, back to a moment in time. Whenever I smell fresh biscuits baking, I'm right back to my grandma's kitchen. Whenever I smell a fresh baguette, it takes me back to my time living in France and that unmistakable early morning aroma which fills the villages and towns (often mixed in with the smell of strong coffee too!). So often on my Weekend Kitchen radio show, I am taken back to happy places by the food which my guests make. One such happy place is Portugal, and the Algarve in particular, where I have spent days and days enjoying the perfect weather, wonderful hospitality and amazing fresh food. And nothing personifies Portugal better than their traditional custard tart moreish, light, and with the signature dark brown top crust, they will brighten any dark day. They're also surprisingly easy to make - as shown in this brilliant recipe by Victoria Chidgey. She's a highly talented young cake maker and baker, with her own thriving business called The Tring Cake Company. These tarts will put a smile on your face.

1 block of puff pastry Icing sugar for dusting 6 egg yolks 185g caster sugar 50g cornflour 600ml whole milk 10g vanilla extract

In a pan, bring together the yolks, sugar, cornflour and vanilla. Slowly stir in the milk. Put the pan onto a moderate heat and stir continuously until big bubbles appear in the middle.

Take off the heat, pour the mix into a bowl your early afternoon. and cover with clingfilm.



Put this bowl in the fridge to chill while you roll your pastry.

Roll out the puff pastry using the icing sugar to dust the surface and rolling pin.

Cut the pastry in half and place one half of the pastry on top of the other.

Roll the pastry again until 5mm thick.

Roll the pastry into a tight sausage and cut into 16 discs.

Push the pastry into each hole of a cupcake tray, applying pressure around the sides so that they are evenly covered, all the way to the top edge.

Dust with icing sugar.

Fill each tart 2/3 full with custard and bake at 200C/ Gas Mark 5 for 25 minutes.

Leave to cool and serve.

### Eaton Bray to Everest

It's safe for me to say that I'm not much of a trekker or a hiker and walking poles are not my friend, but over the past few years I have learnt to say 'Yes' a lot more to opportunities to broaden my love of travelling and keep up with my fitness.

I've said 'Yes' to an adventure in the High Atlas Mountains to summit Mt Toubkal (4167m/13,671ft) in Morocco in 2016. I've said 'Yes' to a fabulous weekend in Northern Spain trekking in the mountains of the Picos de Europa in 2017, and last year I said 'Yes' to an opportunity to visit Nepal and trek to Everest Base Camp (5365m/17,598ft).

So, after a year of keeping up some reasonable fitness levels, a trip to Snowdon, colossal researching that led to me freaking out about what I was going to encounter and a lot of friend therapy to aid the 'I've got this' mentality, I began my 16 day journey on the 9th October 2019 to Khatmandu via Istanbul.

I was travelling with 11 others (10 other women and James – poor James 0). We were all connected to each other in that we all knew at least one other person on the trip. We came from the UK, the Bahamas and the USA – we came with sisters, friends and work colleagues; finally all meeting for the first time in our Hotel in Khatmandu. These 10 women (and poor James) instantly became the most incredible people I have ever met and our strong bond was formed.

Sadly we didn't have a huge amount of time to fully explore Khatmandu, but a few of us managed to survive the road system (I say 'system' when actually it's probably fairer to say complete chaos), walking to the Thamel region of the city to explore the trekker markets and the alley bazaars (and partake in a Nepalese Ice beer and veg MoMo's).

The next day we began our EBC adventure – a 12 day trek in the Sagarmatha National Park region of the Himalayas – one of the world's greatest trekking destinations. But to get there we had to endure a 4 ½ hour road trip to Ramechhap airport – a few heart stopping moments as our car drove inches from a 100ft drop – so the best thing for me to do was just to close my eyes, go to sleep and hope for the best! And for the record, when I say 'airport' - what I really mean is a teeny tiny airfield and a cow shed for a check in desk. But our little Tara Air Twin Otter plane that held

16 passengers took off and landed 20 minutes later at Lukla Airport – considered the world's most dangerous airport due to the steep gradient of the short runway, and that it's surrounded by huge mountains with no margin for any error! Now THAT was an exciting plane trip and not for the faint hearted!

And then we began our walk along the 'Himalayan flats' – just a little bit up and a little bit down (as our guide liked to tell us). So, this seems a good time to introduce our incredible support team – Niroj (our team leader who's motto was 'everything is possible, never say no'), Ishwor (assistant guide and card magician), Sujan (trainee guide and pretty cool dancer) and our 6 phenomenal super human porters who carried our duffel bags every day to our overnight accommodation.

So for the next 8 days we slowly but surely made our way closer and closer to our ultimate goal, walking higher and higher every day. We began in hot sunshine, traversing pine forest valleys and marvelling at the colours of the flora and





the terraced vegetable fields as far as the eye could see, following the rushing Dudh Kosi River (known as the Milky River due to the creamy colour of the water coming from the melting ice of the Khumbu Glacier), feeling like Indiana Jones as we crossed the river over high, daunting-looking suspension bridges. We were surrounded by immense, dark mountains, and behind them the continuous view of the rocky snow capped mega mountains known as the 8000ers. The Khumbu region is home to 4 of the 6 highest mountains in the world (all over 8000m) and we got to see them in all their awe-inspiring grandness every day of our trek – getting closer and more intimidating every day.

We stayed in local tea houses each night. It's hard to describe a Himalayan tea house — but in short, it's a little hostel made out of plywood and a corrugated iron roof (with a non- cracked window if we were lucky!). Each tiny room had two small single beds

and if you were even luckier, a working light! Toilets were squat pots and we thought all our Christmasses had come at once if we came across an actual proper flushing toilet! But it was an experience we all came to share and giggle about — and our best friend became a bottle of anti-bacterial hand gel that was permanently attached to our bodies (as well as toilet roll).

But each tea house had a cosy communal room where we could meet other groups, warm ourselves by the stove and eat food together. Our guide had warned us that the food was 'not delicious and not plentiful'- but actually we found the food totally delicious and more than plentiful. We all kept away from the meat dishes (it's a long way for the meat to have to travel as animals cannot be slaughtered in the National Park) and so we pretty much stuck to the traditional Bhal Dat – a Nepalese veg curry, lentils and rice. We caved occasionally and went 'Western' with a veg burger or a pizza! The one thing that our guide insisted upon every day was garlic soup. Good for acclimatisation apparently – but if I ever have to eat that again, it'll be far too soon! But, highaltitude acute mountain sickness (HAMS) is a serious issue and we didn't mess about with our health. You take the risk of developing HAMS if you ascend too quickly from 3000m - which we got to on our first day. I think it's fair to say that everyone in our group felt headachy and nauseous at least once on our trip, but none of us needed additional treatment. I'd say that we were pretty lucky - but luck doesn't happen by chance and we had our guide keeping an eye on our symptoms and oxygen levels everyday. Each day we drank litres of water, climbed high but slept lower and had a few well needed acclimatisation days. It was not lost on us that only 65% of trekkers actually make it to EBC.

Namche Bazaar was one of our first highlights of the trek. The capital of the Khumbu region, it is a large buzzing village that we got to via 'Namche Hill'—a horrifically steep 2 hour climb that I have pretty much erased from my memory—Just one of the 'little bit ups' we were warned about! We visited the Sherpa museum and caught our first glimpse of Mt Everest—a hugely exciting moment for us all as at that point our final destination dream became very very real. We drank hot chocolate in the Irish Bar (yep, they get everywhere!) and we haggled hard for 'genuine' North Fake (sorry



Face) goods ©.

From here on in we started to see the panorama change as our trekking took us higher and higher with each step. We lost the lost greenery and pine forests, replaced with more desolate landscape of heather and rocky trails. It was hard at times to look up as we were focused on keeping our head down and making it up the 'little bit ups' – but when we did look up we were reminded of our goal – there always in the background – the immense snow-capped mountains. As the days went on we lost the heather, replaced with just desert like rocks and dusty, difficult to traverse terrain. We amused ourselves with stories of conspiracy theories and trying to remember the tunes to iconic 80's songs – not so easy when you're trying to breathe with limited oxygen pumping around your body! Our baseball caps and short-sleeved t-shirts were packed away and out came the woolly hats, the down jackets, the gloves and the thermal base

layers, and finally on day 8 of our trek, we made it to Everest Base Camp -5364 metres high. All of us. We all did it - together. We were the only group that our guide had managed to get 100% of us all to EBC - we were elated and exhausted!

There's nothing, simply nothing at EBC apart from rocks and the spectacular Khumbu Icefall that flows into the Glacier creating large ice peaks at the base of the camp. But with all 12 of us reaching our goal together, we felt a huge sense of achievement and that nothing was beyond our wildest dreams. A few high fives and massive hugs later, along with a sip of some smuggled port in a hip flask, we returned to our resting place for the night at Gorak Shep – which frankly was the most remote, coldest, dirtiest place I have ever stayed at – but did we care – not at all!!!! We were on cloud nine!

Day 9 saw the start of our 4 day descent back to Lukla. I use the term descent loosely as there were rather a lot of 'ups' as we made our way out of the valleys. I didn't seem to mind the 'downs' on the way up but I have to say I did find the 'ups' pretty challenging on the way down! Hey ho — that's

the Himalayan Flats for you I guess. We spent a night at a Monastery where we listened to the Monks chanting, and then we were entertained watching a large Russian party celebrating a birthday. We even had our first beer of the trek – a huge treat for all of us!

Our last night was back in Lukla where we had a big celebratory dinner with our guides and porters, ending with us taking over the music system of guest house restaurant. We even got the German group up and dancing too!

This trip was just unbelievably





brilliant, life changing but incredibly hard work. We got used to not washing, wearing our clothes all day and all night, then all day again. We got used to no flushing toilets, eating the same things every day, and being permanently cold in the evenings. But we got through it – through team work, compassion and raising each others spirits when it was needed. We shared everything together wild wee's, learning new card games, our sugary treats and our toilet rolls! We laughed at and with each other, supported each other and spent a lot of time howling over James' one monumental (over-tired) strop which kept us hugely entertained every step of the way. Poor James ©

And then .... it was over. But our memories

will last a lifetime. The world is a big big place and we have only scratched the surface of Nepal and the Himalayas. Nepal -I will be back. But for now, a little break to catch my breath - reflect and recharge. Get back to work and spend time with my family who have been awesome in letting me experience this dream.

I have made friends for life on this trip – an experience that will bind us together forever and I am privileged to have shared it with every single one of them.

And to my village friends — You pushed a letter into my hand before I left giving me instructions not to open it until things got tough. They did get tough and I read it one night with the others — you had us all in tears and I will never forget what that one simple act of kindness meant to me. Thank you all  $\boldsymbol{x}$

# LOCAL HERALDRY BY JOHN HOCKEY

In this series, we take a look around local towns and villages to find interesting and unusual heraldry.

### A STONE SEAT

How unusual to find a coat of arms on the end of a stone seat, but this is exactly what happened when a member of the Dunstable U3A Heraldry group took a breather in Stockgrove Park, now part of Rushmere Country Park, near Leighton Buzzard.

It transpired that the seat was placed there by Sir Ferdinand Michael Kroyer-Keilberg (1882 – 1958), a Danish-born businessman who had a large house built in the grounds for his family. He made his considerable fortune in molasses and became a British citizen in 1926, in which year he was granted a coat of arms by the London College of Arms.

He was also a considerable benefactor and was knighted in 1947.

Although we had the coat of arms in stone, we did not have any colours. The next step was to contact the College of Arms and speak to 'Mr Portcullis' (!), then a junior Herald, who looked up the description or blazon for us.

The shield is divided 'per chevron' which splits the shield into a two sections, gold (heraldically 'Or') above and blue ('Azure') below. In the upper part of the design are two

lions facing each other (this is called combatant and they are also coloured Azure). In the lower part is a Viking galley which is gold with a white sail. A red (Gules) pennon flies from the mast. The firm rule that colours should be placed on metals and vice versa for good contrast is well shown here. (Incidentally, this is a rule that all runners and cyclists would do well to heed!).

As there was no picture of a coloured shield, I had a go at creating the design myself (so apologies for any inaccuracies).

In our group we have a saying 'Heraldry is everywhere' and this little piece of detective work proves the point perfectly!


Mandy's family, husband Kevin, daughter Laura and son James, know first-hand how Rennie Grove's nurses can help families spend a last Christmas together.

Dear Friends,
It is so easy to get caught up

of Christmas. Already we are counting

army instead of the few relatives or friends
we might have round on Christmas Day.

As I frequently say to my family – "The shops are only closed for one day!"

But how necessary is all this? How much of it is just the pressure put on us by businesses determined to make a profit, at what would otherwise be a slow time of year?

What is Christmas really all about?

For some people, Christmas is hard. Relatives may be separated by long distances, and for others, the enforced togetherness pulls the wallpaper off the cracks in a relationship. Or maybe this is your first Christmas without a loved one.

Christmas and New Year is a very special time of year – celebrating Jesus, the Christ child's birth. John 12 v 47 Jesus said 'I have come to save the world and not to judge it.'

In many households particularly where there are small children, there is great excitement well before Christmas Day. There are Nativity Plays to be rehearsed and performed hopefully in front the family and Carols to be sung. There's special Christmas bazaars to buy all those gifts for friends and family, there's mince pies to be sampled, Christmas puddings to be stirred, turkey to be ordered, parties to be organised, crackers to be chosen.

What is all this excitement about? What is there to celebrate?

Well, the answer to these questions will vary according to your point of view. It may be that it's just an opportunity to eat, drink and be merry. Or it may have some special significance because you are celebrating the birth of Jesus in a stable in Bethlehem 2,000 years ago as foretold by people

who lived hundreds of years earlier.

We read the story of the Shepherds, in Luke 2. They visited Jesus as soon as they heard, from the angel, the good news of Jesus birth. There are two reasons we give gifts at Christmas, firstly Jesus is a gift to us if we believe he is the son of God who came to die for us on the cross at Calvary. Secondly because the Magi, or wise men travelled from Eastern lands, following a new star to Bethlehem, bringing gifts. They found Jesus, by now a small child, as recounted in Matthew 2, in the house where he was living with Mary and Joseph. Their gifts were Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh.

What do these things represent and why give them to a small child? Gold is valuable and symbolised kingship, Frankincense is a perfume representing Jesus deity and Myrrh is an embalming oil foretelling Jesus death.

We don't give these sorts of gifts to our children these days but it may be a good idea to give fewer but more relevant gifts.

- Avoid trips and slips put rock salt on your steps and take extra care when walking - a pair of trekking over-shoes are useful for giving you the extra grip needed in the snow.
- Shovelling snow watch your back! Keep the shovel close to your body and get your legs to do the work. Don't overload the shovel and take regular breaks.
- Don't be a couch potato staying active boosts your mood and helps you to stay in shape. Exercise helps to increase your immune system and keep the colds and 'flu at bay. If you're running or doing sports outside in the winter:
- Dress for the cold wear layers rather than heavy clothing. A light weight moisture wicking base layer and leggings or running tights underneath a pair of shorts will help you stay warm. Avoid losing heat by wearing gloves and a hat/ fleece headband.
- Stay safe be seen. Don't wear dark colours –choose clothes that are bright, white or fluorescent yellow and add a reflective bib or strap.

- Warm up and cool down essential to avoid injury, start by walking for about 10 minutes and gradually increase your pace and maybe try some walking lunges or high knee skips. Cool down by running at a slow pace for 5 10 minutes and do some stretches inside so you don't get cold.
- It's fine to exercise with a bit of a cold but listen to your body, and don't exercise if you have a fever.

## Dagnall Weather Station (AONB)


#### Weather Conditions for October 2019

#### Elevation: 450 ft - Latitude: 51° 50' 13" North - Longitude: 0° 33' 34" West

October can only be described as being "wet" with rain on 24 days. On the 1st, we had the wettest day – with 17.81mm of rain – and it was also the warmest day, reaching 17.4°c. The following day, the temperature dropped and we had bright sunshine. In the following few days, the temperature rose and became cloudy with frequent showers. From the 13th, low pressure systems brought waves of rain showers and it remained unsettled for days. It wasn't until the 27th that high pressure brought in dry, cold, sunny weather. With 105.4mm of rain in October, it was the wettest month this year so far, but only just, as September had 100mm. So, in the last two months, we have had more than 200mm (8 inches) of rain.
