#### South Central Ambulance Community First Responder

For several years now, Edlesborough and surrounding villages have been fortunate to be served by Nicky Lack who is one of your neighbours and has been your volunteer Community First Responder providing your villages with a rapid response for emergency medical calls. Providing a fast ambulance response to 999 calls in a relatively isolated part of Buckinghamshire is challenging for the ambulance service and having a trained local responder can be a real life saver.

Nicky recently completed training to go front line on our emergency ambulances and is now working full time from Stoke Mandeville ambulance station. We wish her every success in this demanding new role. This means that Nicky has stood down as your first responder and we need to find a local person to replace her.

This is a position for any community minded person who is fit and healthy, self motivated and willing to freely give their time to help others. Our responders are volunteers and do not require any prior medical background, South Central Ambulance will provide full training and supply you with all the equipment needed to do the job. You can choose your own working hours, the only stipulation is that you must be available for a minimum of 20 hours per month.

Usually at this time of year the four villages are getting ready to celebrate St Mary's village carnival. Currently the Foodbank is experiencing a huge rise in need with activity 43% higher than this time last year. If you want your entry to be judged, that can be done via the St Mary's Facebook page or by contacting Sue on 07772 901816 or via the email on the church website. Entries will be judged by committee with two judges from each village (Eaton Bray, Edlesborough, Dagnall, and Northall) who will then liaise to decide the winners. People could also photograph their favourite scarecrow and upload the picture to Facebook. There will be three prizes for the top voted entries. These will be cups and certificates.

I know that people in the villages spend a lot of time and effort decorating their houses each year for the procession of floats through Eaton Bray and Edlesborough. This year, anyone in the four villages can enter the Scarecrow festival as the judges will not be just covering the usual Carnival route and the festival will take place over the whole weekend. I hope you will want to participate in the Scarecrow festival with the same

enthusiasm that Carnival generates and that the villages will look great with a wonderful display of heroes in people's gardens. And hopefully we will all be together again for St Mary's Village Carnival on July 3rd 2021.



Now is the time to offer to open your garden. It can be large or small – all



New Pavilion – all phases funded to completion!



Edlesborough Parish Council (EPC) is delighted to announce that full funding for the completion of the new pavilion on Edlesborough Green has been achieved. As agreed at last month's EPC meeting, a loan application was made to the Government via the Public Works Loan Board for the remaining £175,000. This will enable the building to be completed and equipped.

Councillors expressed their thanks to Cllr Kevin Cubbage at the April EPC meeting for developing an excellent application Dagnall for the funding.

The intention is that this loan will be repaid from future S106 funding, allocated specifically to Leisure and Sports facilities, from two of the three remaining building sites in the Edlesborough Parish Neighbourhood Plan.

EPC looks forward to the completion of the building and full opening in due course, Covid-19 conditions permitting.

EPC continues to work very closely with the Edlesborough Community Sports Club (ECSC) charity who will manage this wonderful new facility. Full details of those eligible for membership will be published shortly by ECSC but certainly all Edlesborough parishioners will have free membership.

Work has resumed on site and the contractors will be following Social Distance Guidelines whilst on site. Any concerns about this should be directed to the Parish Council via the Clerk.

#### **Healthy Banana Muffins**

This healthy banana muffin recipe makes eating cake for breakfast guilt-free! Ripe bananas add sweetness to muffins, so you don't have to use much sugar. Wholemeal flour give the muffins plenty of fibre, keeping you full for longer.

#### **Equipment**

You will need a six-hole muffin tin. Each muffin provides 206 kcal, 4.5g protein, 30g carbohydrate (of which 13g sugars), 7.5g fat (of which 0.8g saturates), 1g fibre and 0.4g salt.

#### **Preparation time**

less than 30 mins

#### Cooking time

10 to 30 mins

#### Serves

Makes 6 muffins Ingredients

 $125g/4\frac{1}{2}$ oz wholemeal flour

3 level tbsp light muscovado sugar

2 level tsp baking powder

1 medium free-range egg, beaten

50g/13/40z low-fat plain yoghurt

50ml/2fl oz rapeseed oil, plus a little extra for greasing

2 ripe bananas (175g/6oz peeled weight), roughly mashed

#### Method

1. Preheat the oven to 200C/180C Fan/Gas 6. Line a six-hole muffin tin with muffin cases or grease it.

- 2. Mix together the flour, sugar and baking powder in a bowl. In a separate bowl, beat together the egg, yoghurt and oil. Make a well in the flour, pour in the liquid and mix well. Stir in the mashed bananas, taking care not overmix.
- 3. Spoon the mixture into the prepared cases and bake for 20–30 minutes, or until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Transfer the muffins to a wire rack to cool.

#### **Recipe Tips**

These muffins freeze well, so make a batch and freeze for up to three months.



### Warning: Increased Fraudulent Activities

Whilst looking after the IT requirements of both commercial and domestic customers in and around our villages as well as receiving similar calls and emails ourselves, we are aware of an increase recently in fraudulent activities.

These activities can take many forms;

- Phone calls advising you that your broadband has an issue or you are about to be disconnected.
- Phone calls purporting to be from Microsoft or Apple saying that they have noticed that you have an issue with your device.
- Phone calls claiming to be from the Police advising you that you have been caught up in identify theft.
- Emails alleging to be from your bank, HMRC, TV Licence, DVLA etc. possibly claiming that there is an issue or requesting payment and requesting that you click on a link. Often the link then asks you to log into a website that looks to be genuine, but isn't, and requests personal information. This then supplies them with your user id and password as well as the other personal information you have keyed which they can use for identity fraud.
- Automated phone calls impersonating companies such as Amazon Prime and credit
  card fraud departments instructing the recipient to select 1 to be connected. The caller
  then tries to convince recipients to give them remote access to computer equipment or
  pass bank account details over the phone.

Some of these are very elaborate and convincing and it is sometimes difficult to identify those that are valid and those that are not. From our experience, most are not genuine.

Here are some simple rules to follow to try and ensure you do not become a victim:

- 1. Never click on a link on an email unless you are 100% sure that the email and link are genuine, or you are expecting it
  - If you move your mouse over the link, it will normally show you the full link address, i.e. where the link is going to take you. If it does not look right, don't click it.
  - Even if you are currently dealing with the company the email is claiming to be from, e.g. a government department, this does not make the email genuine. Unless you are expecting the email, don't click on it.
- Use your Internet browser (e.g. Internet Explorer, Chrome, Firefox, Safari etc) to using
  a search engine, search for the company or department who is trying to make contact
  with you. Use this to go to the official website and look for the information that the
  email is referring you to.
- 3. NEVER dial a number given to you by someone who has called you that you are not expecting or know.
  - Ask for the department that the person is claiming to be from and the reference/ account number relating to the query, so YOU can call them using a number you know from paperwork you have or have found on the company's website.
  - If you have been called by the Police, ask for the Police Station or department and

the reference/crime number relating to the query. Then search independently for the number of the Police station/location and check the reference number when you get through to the number.

- 4. If you receive a call purporting to be from your broadband supplier saying that there is an issue or they are going to disconnect you, take the details regarding the query (reference number, department the person is from) and then call the company back using a number from their website or your own paperwork.
- 5. If you receive a call from a bailiff saying that they will be visiting to enact a court order, get the details of which court has issued the order, reference number and the person you are talking to. Then independently find the phone number of the court and ask to speak to the court bailiff and verify the details.
  - Ask them to email you the details about the court order.
  - Be aware; these calls tend to be late in the afternoon or late on a Friday in the hope that you can't get hold of the court. Never agree to pay any fine without doing your own research first.
  - Be aware that the person you are speaking to may send you details. Don't assume they are genuine until you have checked them independently.

We received a call similar to this stating that a summons had been raised against us for non-payment late on a Friday afternoon and were advised if we paid immediately it would be significantly cheaper. We stated that we wanted a contact number for this person and court details and when we check with the court there was no such reference or case.

- 6. Emails about Covid or selling items related to Covid;
  - Again, don't click on the links, go via your Internet browser and search for the genuine web address of the company and look on their website for the information, independently.
  - Look at the spelling and grammar on the email, if its wrong then it is more likely to be a scam.
- 7. If you are looking to buy products from a website, investigate the company
  - Have they got a website? Do they show contact details (name, address, phone number etc)?
  - If a UK company, do they exist on the register at Companies House?
  - As a guide, look for lots of reviews, see what others think of the company and their services.
  - Search on the Internet for the company or product and use words like "issues", "fraud", "poor service", "reviews" etc.

In all cases, where you believe you have received or even been involved in this type of activity, report it to the Police via Action Fraud - https://www.actionfraud.police.uk/

If you believe that you have allowed someone, that you have not instigated, to have access to any of your devices, you need to get the devices checked to ensure they have not been compromised. If you believe you may have given out passwords and personal information, change the passwords immediately and contact the relevant authorities and companies regarding any accounts or official documents which may have been compromised.

#### **Red Kites**

## What effect has the re-introduction of red kites had on the other wildlife of the Chilterns?

Red kites mainly scavenge on dead animals, so they have had little impact on the populations of the species they eat. They will occasionally take live prey, such as rats, mice, voles and fledgeling birds, but these make up a very small proportion of their diet. Although they do not habitually take larger prey, isolated reports of red kites



attempting to take prey such as rabbits, squirrels, chickens and partrigdes have been received.

There is no evidence to suggest that the national decline in garden and farmland birds is linked to the presence of red kites.

There is circumstantial evidence that buzzard populations have risen in the Chilterns since the re-introduction of red kites, but there is no proof of a direct correlation between the two species.

#### How long do red kites live?

In the wild, it's common for kites to live well into their teens, and they can live for up to 25 - 30 years.

#### How do you tell males and females apart?

Coloration is identical in both sexes. Males are slightly smaller than females but there is wide overlap. Females have proportionately longer and broader wings. Males tend to have a more deeply notched tail, which they twist and flex more than the females. It is difficult to tell the sexes apart unless you have two to compare directly.

#### Do red kites mate for life?

Red kites usually take the same mate year after year, but 'divorces' aren't unheard of! They will often also re-use the same nest year after year.

The association between the pairs is looser during the winter than in the breeding season. Their courtship displays in February and March re-establish their pair bond.

#### What's their courtship behaviour like?

The pair perform high circling displays, particularly in the early part of the day. They will often fly one behind the other, with deep, exaggerated wing-beats, followed by a vigourous chase. They may pass close together, twisting apart at the last moment, and will sometimes pass food between them. They often perform these flights above the wood they are nesting in, calling to each other and finally dropping into the canopy.



Talon locking (observed in other bird of prey species is) not commonly reported.

#### What is the biggest threat to red kites?

Red kites have no natural predators, so their biggest threats come from the actions of humans.

A major threat is still the risk of poisoning. Persecution of red kites is much reduced nowadays, but it does occasionally still happen. Red kites have perished as a result of eating illegally poisoned baits left out for other animals (e.g. foxes), they have also been known to die after picking up the corpses of legally poisoned rodents. A leaflet about rat poisons and the threats to birds of prey is available by calling Natural England's Enquiry Service on 0845 600 3078.

They are also very susceptible to disturbance when they are nesting so should be left alone during the breeding season.

#### Should we feed red kites?

Red kites can survive well in the Chilterns without artificial feeding, so it is not necessary to supplement their diet. It is acknowledged that feeding has helped the local re-introduced kite population to increase more rapidly than it might otherwise have done and has kept the population at a level that chicks can be re-located to other parts of the country. However, it is feared that providing too much additional food can prevent the population from spreading naturally and cause the birds to cluster in large numbers where food is offered. The Chilterns Conservation Board urges the public not to feed red kites. We believe they should be left to feed naturally in the wider countryside, thus enabling them to find a naturally sustainable level.

# Accessing Devices, Emails & Services for a Departed Relative

Recently, we have been asked to help access departed relatives' email addresses, their devices, IT systems and accounts. This has proved to be very difficult or even impossible if you have not planned for this.

Unless you have planned for someone else to access your email account, online website, device etc., it can be very difficult for them to gain access. Often a factory reset does not allow you to access the device.

#### **Apple**

For you to be able to access a deceased family members account or device associated to this account, Apple require a number of pieces of information, including a court order giving you the permissions to access their accounts/devices.

#### Google/Gmail

Although Google in the UK do not need a court order, they will not grant you access to the account, but can make some of the content available to you, if you provide a number of appropriate documents.

#### Microsoft

Again, Microsoft requires a court order to allow someone access to your accounts or services.

Due to the onus upon these companies to keep your data secure and in line with current legislation, they all tend to have similar requirements.

#### How do I plan for this?

Some companies, such as Google, allow you to provide "authorised users" who are permitted to access your account. In most cases the companies provide guidance on how to do this. You should set these up now.

It is good practice to store usernames and passwords in a secure location. This can be in a notebook which is securely locked away, or using specific password applications where all of this information can be secured for you, making sure you have a very secure password for the application as this is effectively "the keys to the kingdom".

Either way, make sure your relatives know where this information is kept and how to gain access to it. Without this, they could be left with expensive devices that they can't use or accounts they can't access or close down.

It is also good practice that when a relative dies, you close all their accounts and services, so that they can't be used fraudulently. Each service is different so look in their help section or contact us for assistance on this.






#### **Nigel's Thoughts**

# LOCAL HERALDRY BY JOHN HOCKEY

In this series, we take a look around local towns and villages to find interesting and unusual heraldry.

BACK TO BASICS 1



Sometimes heraldry can seem a bit complicated, not least because everything seems to have a different word to that used in everyday parlance. With this in mind, I thought it might be useful to go back to basics and look at the full heraldic achievement for William, 1st Duke of Bedford, who died in 1700.

[Achievement: Name given to the complete armorial bearings including shield, supporters, coronet of rank, helm, wreath, mantling, crest, motto etc. as shown in the drawing]

Main components are underlined:

Shield:

Argent a lion rampant Gules on a chief Sable three escallops of the first

Meaning:

Argent – the background or *field* is silver (*Argent*) always shown printed white. [There are only two metals in heraldry – *Argent* and *Or*; there are five colours – *Gules* (red), *Azure* (blue), *Vert* (green), *Purpure* (purple) and *Sable* (black)]

A lion *rampant* - a lion standing ready for battle, facing to the left (*Dexter*) with one leg on the ground, supposedly chosen to portray courage

Gules – heraldic name for the colour red

Chief – top third of the shield

Sable – heraldic name for colour black

Escallops – scallop shells, perhaps chosen to commemorate a pilgrimage made

Of the first – refers to the first metal or colour mentioned in the description – in this case Argent

Coronet:

Duke's coronet

Meaning:

Each member of the peerage has a different coronet of rank, in order of precedence these are Duke (a duke's coronet is composed of strawberry

leaves), Marquess, Earl, Viscount and finally Baron.

NB the *helm* or helmet is not described in the blazon but the one shown here is common for all peers of the realm.

# Edlesborough, Northall and Ivinghoe Aston Walk

#### By Steve Davison, courtesy of Berks and Bucks Life

This walk is based in Edlesborough, which was known as Eddinberge in the Domesday Book, we follow the river Ouzel, which is little more than a stream at this point, for a while to reach Eaton Bridge; the river forms part of the boundary between Buckinghamshire and neighbouring Bedfordshire.

We then head through Northall, home to the Swan Inn, before heading south-west past Butler's Manor, where you can still see the remains of a moat, to reach Ivinghoe Aston. A quick walk along the village street takes us past the aptly named Village Swan pub, saved by local residents from property developers.

The final leg of the walk heads north-east, with views of the Dunstable Downs ahead. On the way, keep a lookout for a memorial to Bridget Elizabeth Talbot – a woman of many achievements – who was born at Little Gaddesden.

During the First World War, she served with the Anglo-Italian Red Cross and in 1920 she received an OBE for her work with the Red Cross; she remained an active supporter of the organisation all her life. She invented a water-proof torch for lifebelts and was instrumental in getting this made compulsory, thereby saving the lives of many seamen. She also helped save a large swathe of the Chiltern Hills by heading a national campaign to secure the Ashridge Estate for the National Trust following the death of Earl Brownlow in 1921.

We soon pass the Church of St Mary the Virgin which stands on a small hill to the south-west of the village, affording a great view. The church, which is now cared for by the Churches Conservation Trust, dates back to the 13th century. Although it is normally locked, the key is available from the village shop and post office, and is usually open on the first Sunday of each month between May and September, between 2 and 4 pm. If you get the chance to see inside it is well worth the effort; there is some fine medieval woodwork including the chancel screen and some lovely Victorian wall paintings and stained glass.

From the church it's a short walk back through the village, passing the former 16th century brick and timber barn on the way.

#### Information

- Start/finish: car park at the recreation ground in Edlesborough (SP973194) at the junction of the High Street and Pebblemoor
- Map: OS Explorer 181
- Distance: 4.5 miles (7.3km)
- Terrain: Gates and stiles, fairly level paths and tracks, sections of country road/pavement
- Time: 2 hours
- Refreshments: Edlesborough Heirloom Cafe (01525 229565); Northall The Swan Inn (01525 220444); Ivinghoe Aston The Village Swan (01525 223555)

#### The walk

1 (SP973194) - Exit the car park, turn right and then turn right along the High Street for

200m, with the park on the right and turn left across the road into Cow Lane; you can also reach this point by walking through the park, then exiting on the left and crossing the High Street. Some 200m further along the High Street is the Heirloom Cafe, with the post office a village shop a further 60m. Follow Cow Lane north-westwards for 600m, cross stile beside gate and keep ahead through the field staying beside the right-hand hedge following it as it swings right to a path junction at the field corner. Stay in the field and turn left, with a ditch – the river Ouzel – on the right. Cross the footbridge and follow the right-hand margin through the next field to join Eaton Bray Road beside Eaton Bridge.

**2** (SP964203) - Turn left along the road towards the village; take care as there is no pavement for part of the way. At the T-junction turn right alongside the B440 to a junction just before The Swan Inn and turn left along South End Lane for 850m; later the Two Ridges Link path joins from the right. Just before the cattle grid go through a kissing gate on the right and follow the right-hand fence, ahead through the field, soon passing Butler's Manor (moat) on the left. Go through the gate and continue through field. Go through a gate, cross the footbridge and then through another gate. Keep ahead across field to the opposite side, passing under the power lines.

3 (SP952187) – Go through into next field and follow left-hand edge. Cross a stile at the corner and keep ahead, cross the footbridge and bear diagonally left to a track at Vine Farm. Keep ahead with a pond over to the right to join a road in Ivinghoe Aston. Cross over and turn left along the pavement for half a mile, passing The Village Swan pub on the way. After the last house, continue alongside road for 100m to a crossing track and turn left.

**4 (SP956178)** – Follow the track for half a mile, pass the memorial stone, and keep ahead to cross the footbridge in the bushes. Go straight on alongside the left-hand fence



with Edlesborough church visible ahead, later passing under power lines. the Continue along the track (church the left) to a road junction at Church End. Cross straight and follow over the High Street for 500m, passing the brick and timber barn on the way to arrive back at the junction with Pebblemoor on the right.

And the well-known hymn 'Cornerstone' begins with 'My hope is built on nothing less'. That is the message for now and our futures will be secure.

Today we have discovered through Zoom and other similar services, we can keep in touch with family and friends all together, right across the world bringing hope for 'we'll meet again some sunny day'. This is a new experience found during isolation, but may continue as distance has been proved no longer the barrier that it was.

#### The History of Tiggywinkles

#### In the beginning...

Even though domestic animals were well catered for in Britain, in 1978 when Sue and Les Stocker and their son Colin started taking in wildlife casualties in earnest, there were very few facilities available. There was certainly no written work or experience accessible in this very different field and no training available on wildlife for veterinary surgeons.

Quickly the Stockers began to realise the enormity of the problem and when the general public and other animal welfare bodies became aware of their willingness to care for injured wildlife, casualties began to flood into their home.

Soon they were coping with all species from toads, badgers and deer to wrens, owls and



swans. Every patient was an unknown and together with a local sympathetic vet, they learnt the idiosyncrasies of wild animals that demand such a different regime to that required by their domestic counterparts.

Until 1983 the Stockers funded their work from their savings. Then in February of that year the project became a Registered Charity with the official title of The Wildlife Hospital Trust, Registered Charity No. 286447.

#### **Hedgehogs and Tiggywinkles**

As the casualties continued to come in, it soon became apparent that this intake provided a barometer of happenings in the environment. This particularly came to light during the drought of 1984 when the whole hedgehog population seemed to be arriving at the door. A nationwide awareness campaign was launched to make people conscious of the plight of hedgehogs and soon thousands of people were putting out bowls of water and dog food to support their neighbourhood pricklies. At the same time the campaign highlighted the perils of "bread and milk" the traditional, but harmful, food for hedgehogs.



More people were looking at their local hedgehogs and consequently more noticed if their visitor was injured, so they brought it along for treatment. So great was the influx that the Stockers had to install a new shed as a 'hedgehog only' ward. This was duly opened amid great fanfare by Susan Hampshire on 9th August 1985 and christened 'St. Tiggywinkles', the world's first bespoke hedgehog unit.

Every casualty is given a chance; we only ever use euthanasia as a last resort. Any animal or bird unable to be released back to the wild is maintained at the Hospital, in as natural conditions as possible. Veterinary treatment is carried out by a team of trained veterinary nurses and specialist consultant veterinary surgeons.

This enables us to give our patients ground breaking treatment and the best possible care.

Our veterinary team has pioneered much of the treatment now used for wildlife throughout the country. Our expertise and knowledge on all species is used worldwide. Over the years we have perfected techniques for hedgehogs, badgers, deer and other species and have a commitment to passing on this information through books, papers, courses and lectures to veterinary schools.

The experiences of our Hospital staff are helping many of the millions of casualties across the world, most of which are now being looked after thanks to the positive attitude of Tiggywinkles.



Tiggywinkles survives on a solid base of membership and relies on donations from the general public and sponsors to thrive. It receives no state funding of any kind and no financial assistance from other animal welfare or conservation groups.

#### Covid 19

During these difficult times, your support is much needed and greatly appreciated. We are still as busy as ever, with dozens of animals and birds arriving every single day in need of our care. We are still here 24 hours a day, 365 days a year to ensure our wonderful wildlife patients get the lifesaving care they so desperately need.

During this ongoing crisis we are running on a reduced team to protect our staff, volunteers and members of the public. We have also had to make the difficult decision to close our Visitor Centre until further notice. The Visitor Centre is of course an important part of our fundraising activities, so I'm sure you can understand just how much your kind support will mean to us and the animals in our care.




### **Horsing Around at ZSL Whipsnade Zoo**

Horse play at UK's largest zoo as keepers celebrate birth of endangered

wild horse

at ZSL Whipsnade Zookeepers Bedfordshire, have shared the first images of a newborn Przewalski's foal – once declared extinct in the wild - born during the nationwide lockdown at the UK's largest zoo.

The female foal was born to mum Charlotte and dad Nikki on the 13 April, and mum was at



zookeepers who were eager to get a proper look at the new arrival.

An endangered species of wild horse native to the steppes of central Asia, the Przewalski's horse is known in Mongolia as Tahki, meaning spirit. Once classified as Extinct in the Wild, the Przewalski's horse was reintroduced to its native habitat in Mongolia, thanks to conservation breeding efforts by organisations including ZSL Whipsnade Zoo.

Team leader at ZSL Whipsnade Zoo Mark Holden said: "The birth of a Przewalski's foal is a real cause for celebration - they're considered to be the last remaining truly wild horse in the world, and ZSL Whipsnade Zoo is proud to be part of their conservation success story. "This is the first female we've had born in a little while at ZSL Whipsnade Zoo, as the last three foals were boys, so we're hoping to ask our ZSL colleagues in Mongolia to help us choose a name!"

Zookeepers say that now mum has loosened her watch on the youngster, she can often be seen racing around the paddock.



A rare penguin chick which will grow up to sport a head of blonde feathers has been named after British Prime Minister Boris Johnson's newborn son, Wilfred.

Zookeepers at ZSL Whipsnade Zoo were delighted when the tiny rockhopper penguin chick hatched following successful matchmaking efforts as part of an international conservation



"Rockhoppers are famous for their crest of bright yellow head feathers and little Wilfred



will see their blonde crown appear after their first moult. Unlike other birds, penguins shed their feathers all at once, with infants losing their downy, fluffy coat in favour of slick black and white waterproof feathers.

"The rockhopper penguins are part of an internationally-coordinated breeding programme to ensure that a safe and healthy back up population of these animals are protected for generations to come – an important project we're proud to be part of."

### ZSL Whipsnade Zoo Celebrates Birth of Fourteen Extinct-In-The-Wild Deer

Zookeepers at the UK's largest Zoo have got a spring in their step, after welcoming 14 fawns to the Père David deer herd, a species which is officially classified as extinct in the wild.

Born with Bambi-esque white spots on their backs that fade as they get older, the fawns have been spotted by keepers skipping around their Passage Through Asia home – an exhibit which visitors can usually drive around to see the deer, and the camels that they share their home with.

Known for their unique antlers which point up and backwards, the rare deer are a part of the European Endangered Species Breeding Programme (EEP) - a tool used by zoos, aquariums and wildlife parks across Europe to manage conservation breeding programmes to ensure a healthy and diverse population of animals.

Zookeeper Gracie Gee, who captured the pictures said: "It's great to see our herd growing so much this year as they are such an important group - helping to ensure the survival of this species.

"We've had 14 new arrivals and we all wish






that our visitors were able to see them too, as they're absolute proof of the incredible work we are doing to conserve precious species at ZSL Whipsnade Zoo."

Already facing threat from habitat loss, the deer were hunted to extinction in the wild in the early 1900s, but thanks to conservation breeding programmes managed by zoos, some of the deer have been successfully reintroduced to the wild in selected areas of China.

The closure of ZSL Whipsnade Zoo due to COVID-19 means ZSL, the international charity which behind the Zoo, finds itself in an unthinkable position. Reliant on income from zoo visitors, the future of this iconic national institution hangs in the balance – putting its global science and conservation work at risk. Whipsnade's elephants, tigers and penguins need as much care today as any other day, and ZSL needs help. ### Weather Conditions for April 2020






April started off cloudy with some sunny intervals and, on the 1st, we recorded the lowest temperature of the month:  $-3.0^{\circ}$ c. After a few days, it turned sunny and the temperatures rose, so by the 11th we had reached 23.8°c before temperatures dropped again. Late evening on the 17th, we had a few showers which continued overnight and then at 07.30 the next morning, the heavens opened and we had 16.2mm of rain in one hour. The following day returned to blue skies and sunshine, pushing temperatures up until the 27th when we ended the month with three showery days. It was warm overall and the month felt more like summer than April.


