We are still facing really challenging times, and at times hope can seem far away. At this time in the church's year we are moving through Lent towards Good Friday and eventually Easter. On Good Friday, which this year falls on 15th April, Christians remember Jesus' death on a cross. The cross was a Roman instrument of torture, used to punish and deter criminals. It led to an agonising and very public death. The death of Jesus is recorded in all four Gospels. It is also written about by Roman historians Tacitus and Suetonius, and Josephus, a contemporary Jewish historian. Jesus' enemies thought they had got rid of him. But then something truly astonishing happened.

On the first Easter morning, the women who were followers of Jesus got up very early to go to the tomb and anoint his body ready for burial. They had been unable to do this on the Sabbath, the Jewish Holy Day, so it was 'very early on Sunday morning' that they arrived at the tomb. The women are described by the Gospel writers as being 'distressed', 'afraid', 'perplexed' and 'terrified' when they find that Jesus' body has gone. Their plan to come and anoint Jesus, to pay their last respects, has gone terribly wrong. They fear that someone has stolen the body in an act of desecration. Why are they so surprised? Because no one was expecting Jesus to rise from the dead.

When the women go to tell the other disciples what has happened, they are not believed. Luke says the Apostles think it is 'an idle tale' and that the women are talking nonsense. It is not surprising that people are sceptical. After all, this kind of resurrection had never before happened in the history of the world. In his Resurrection, Jesus came alive never to die again. God had done something completely new by bringing his Son back from death to new life which would go on for ever. That is why Easter Day is the most joyful day in the Christian calendar.

Through the good news of Easter, we too can have hope. The intuition deep in our hearts that life has a meaning and fulfilment which death will not be able to frustrate is assured through the death and resurrection of Jesus. For he promises his followers a share in that eternal life. It is central to the Christian faith.

As the truth about what had happened to Jesus dawned on his first disciples, they were overjoyed. Through their hope and faith in Jesus, they were empowered to face all kinds of daunting obstacles. Their lives were completely changed. God still has the power to change lives. He wants us to follow him into new things and new ways of being.

God desires us to have a relationship with him which is not dulled by familiarity but constantly refreshed and renewed. Jesus compared it to life giving streams of water welling up. Through prayer and worship and in our daily lives, we can find places of refreshment and renewal in our relationship with God in Christ. Easter is a timely

reminder that God can do new things in and through us. He longs to bring us to know his love more fully and to experience his hope in our lives.



Planning Permission Granted for Land North of Good Intent


EPC wishes to inform parishioners that following two appeals the Planning Inspector has approved the application for 14 new homes on the land at the bottom of Good Intent. This approval is conditional on the Highways Authority approving the proposed build out in the High Street.

The Inspector's decision granting permission for the 14 houses does not authorise the build out, but it does make it a condition of the permission. It is the Highways Authority that will have to approve the build out and they have stated that will be subject to a public consultation.

Edlesborough Green

Edlesborough Parish Council has applied to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for consent under section 38 of the Commons Act 2006/section 23(2) of the National Trust Act 1971/article 12 of the Greater London Parks and Open Spaces Order 1967* to carry out restricted works on the Southern (Pebblemoor) End of Edlesborough Green. The Planning Inspectorate will decide the application on behalf of the Secretary of State.

The proposed works are:

- Installation of several items of children's play equipment on the southern side of
 the current children's play area, covering an area of approximately 700 square
 metres. The play items will be constructed primarily of wood. Standard plastic
 safety matting will be placed on the grass to provide the necessary safety surface.
 Within a few months, grass will grow through the matting which will then become
 almost invisible. The grass will then be cut as normal. No new fences will be
 erected.
- 2. Installation of a new path between the pavilion car park and the tennis courts to allow wheelchair access.

20mph Zones

At the February EPC meeting Council agreed to;

- 1. Support the principle of traffic calming on South End Lane adjacent to the Children's Play Area and Village Hall.
- 2. To fund the Speed Limit Assessment and Speed Survey by Buckinghamshire Council.
- 3. To pursue the rest of South End Lane, Northall being changed from a declassified speed limit to 30mph to bring it in line with other no through roads in the Parish.

Council also considered requests for 20mph zones in Dagnall and on Cow Lane near the Surgery. Council agreed that as the other locations are currently all 30mph limits the Council would prioritise South End Lane, Northall as the first road to test out the process of introducing 20mph zones.

The winter months have been busy for Eaton Bray Good Neighbours.

Neighbours They have been helping many people in the village with medical appointments, shopping or collections from the Pharmacy.

During the last 3 months of 2021, Eaton Bray Good Neighbours were actively helping our village community. We received calls from over 80 local residents during this period. Of these there were 10 people who contacted us for the first time.

We had requests from over 40 people for lifts to hospitals and medical appointments. About 10 more were driven to social or well being areas. We collected and delivered 38 prescriptions and helped 20 villagers with the delivery of their shopping. We also helped 9 people with transport to Vaccination Centres, during the Pandemic.

Through our Befriending, we have been in touch with 55 members of the community. Over this time this has mainly been with a friendly phone call. We have also had requests to provide company whilst going for a walk, particularly after an illness or operation.

During this period we helped the local Food Bank with their deliveries.

All our local people who use our service received a Christmas card and a small present.

Eaton Bray Good Neighbours' drivers will help with requests for lifts to Hospitals, doctors Surgeries or any necessary journey. We make a small charge for the journeys, which is given direct to our drivers.

Some of our volunteers continue to help with our "In Touch" programme. We aim to telephone anyone in our community who would like a friendly telephone call. If you live on your own, having a chat on the telephone can make a lot of difference to your day.



Welcome to the Little Theatre Dunstable

Did you know Dunstable has two theatres? Most people know the Grove theatre, that's the new kid on the block. The older Little Theatre started presenting shows and supporting the development of performers and production teams in 1968. The Little Theatre, on High Street South, is home to the Dunstable Rep Theatre Club. A vibrant community of volunteers, producing a huge variety of plays and some social events.

About every eight weeks a new in-house play runs for eight performances and between these, a few co-productions with other companies. On non-performance nights, there's more activity. Monday, Wednesday and Friday are regular rehearsal nights. Tuesday and Thursday evenings and Sunday mornings, regular set-build sessions. Technical set-up and building maintenance sessions fit in around this lot. The Little Theatre is active most days.

As well as the active members, the Rep has many supporters who join the club just to see the plays. In return, they get early and discounted booking.

All of this happens in the Victorian building which has seen numerous upgrades over the years. From the first installation of a stage and flat floor seating, through new seating, a raked auditorium, building extensions, electrical refurbishment and most recently, new ventilation systems. The theatre now provides a 99 seat auditorium, changing rooms, Green Room, workshop, box office, coffee room and bar. The historic building hides some of the latest technology providing surprising comfort, safety and production standards often only seen in London.

The intimate and welcoming interior has seen numerous theatre enthusiasts develop their skill to a level where it becomes their profession. Many more choose to keep theatre as a hobby. The appeal is different for everyone: some like the challenge, some like the break from the everyday and for some it's about sharing a common interest with others.

Brief History of "The Rep"

Dunstable Rep Theatre Club, fondly known as 'The Rep', was formed in 1945 after a group of young people performed the play 'Quiet Wedding'. They enjoyed it so much they decided to form a theatre group.

The Rep performed at Dunstable's old Town Hall, built sets in a garage next door and performed 3 productions a year to packed houses.

In 1964 the Town Hall was demolished. The Rep mainly performed comedies and farces at several different venues using simple travelling sets. The shows were well supported but it wasn't the same as having a permanent home.

The old Dunstable library next door to Chews House had become vacant in 1964. The Chews Foundation agreed to lease the building to The Rep who converted it into the Little Theatre. The Rep first performed at the Little Theatre on 7th October 1968.

Brief History of the Little Theatre building

- 1883 To provide extra accommodation for the boys of Chews Charity, the Chew Trustees opened a second school (now The Little Theatre building) next door to Chew's Charity School.
- 1938 Dunstable Library opened at Chew's School building (now Little Theatre).
- 1964 Library moved to Vernon Place, leaving the Chews building vacant.

 1968 - Dunstable Rep Theatre Club re-opens the building as The Little Theatre on 7th October.



Wild Rabbits

Most people have spotted these adorable animals grazing in long grasses looking for their favourite foods. They were first introduced to the UK by the Normans for food and fur but are now a common sight for many. They live in large groups in underground burrow systems known as 'warrens'. Female rabbits, called 'does' produce one litter

of between three and seven babies every month during the breeding season – that's a lot of little ones! Rabbits make a tasty snack for stoats, buzzards, polecats and red foxes, which is why having a warren to hide in for shelter is so important. The rabbit is grey-brown in colour, with long ears and hind legs, and a fluffy white tail. It is smaller than the brown hare and does not have black tips on its ears.

Rabbits don't often live for more than 3 years. Over 90% die in the first year of life, and most of these in the first three months.

Church Farm in 1915

2 High Street is a splendid half-timbered for the Macnamaras and Church Farm building which was listed by the former Department of Environment in September 1980 as Grade II, of special interest. The department dated the structure to the late 16th or early 17th century. Between the timber-framing is whitewashed brick infill or nogging. The house has two storeys beneath an old clay tile roof. It was originally built in a T-plan with a jettied west wing (in other words the first storey overhangs the ground floor). The east wing was added later.

A very full history of the property was undertaken in 2001 by Debrett Ancestry Research Limited. It runs to twenty pages and is available for study in the Bedfordshire and Luton Archives and Records Service Searchroom, being in pamphlet box 130 for Eaton Bray.

The building is known as Church Farm and was part of the Manor of Eaton Bray, which, by the end of the 19th century was in the hands of the Macnamara family. The archive of Brown & Merry estate agents in Leighton Buzzard includes significant correspondence as part of their work is mentioned as early as 1881. Arthur Macnamara was the owner in 1901.

The Eaton Bray part of Pedley Settled Estates was sold at auction by Macnamara's executors in October 1915 and the sale particulars were as follows:

Adjoining, Timber-built and Tiled, of Cow Houses for 18, Stabling, Root

House, Loose Boxes, Barn, Cattle Sheds, Implement Shed and Fold and Rickyards, together with a

Grass Orchard, Sound Pasture and Fertile Arable lane

Let to Mrs. W. Ruffett on a Yearly (Michaelmas) tenancy, at the Rent of £120 per annum.

The particulars are annotated at the back with the names of those who bought each lot and how much it cost. Sadly Lot 13 is blank and so did not, presumably, sell at the auction.

The Ruffett family had been farmers in the village for at least twelve years. Directories of Bedfordshire were not produced annually but every few years. Louis Ruffett is given as a farmer in Kelly's Directory for 1903, William Ruffett in 1906 and Emma Ruffett in 1910 and 1914. The name of the farm is never stated but it is reasonable to suppose that it might have been Church Farm – which is not named in a directory until 1920 when the farmer was John Costin. He bought the farm in 1917. He is also listed as the farmer in the last few directories for the county published in 1924, 1928, 1931,

1936 and 1940.

The Rating and Valuation Act 1925 specified that every building and piece of land in the country was to be assessed to determine its rateable value. Eaton Bray, like most of the county, was assessed in 1927. The valuer visiting Church Farm duly found it owned and occupied by John A. Costin.

The farm comprised 48 acres, 2 roods and the valuer noted: "Bought farm in 1917. Useful little range of buildings" and "Big House, nice homestead". The farmhouse comprised two reception rooms, a kitchen, a scullery and a dairy with four bedrooms above and a brick and tiled lean-to store shed outside. The homestead comprised: a brick, weather-boarded and tiled coal barn; a loose box ("small"); a two bay open fronted shed; a chaff store; a cow house for ten beasts; a loose box; a brick and tiled trap house ("bad open fronted"); a weather-boarded and tiled earth closet; a fowl house; a mixing room; a three bay open fronted cart shed; three pigsties; a stable for four horses with a chaff house at end; a three bay open fronted shed and a granary.

Daton Bray Methodist Church

Our first service in February was led by Geoff Best who, as usual, gave us an excellent sermon, this time focusing on mission. Quoting the examples of Isaiah, Simon Peter and St Paul, he spoke of those who had answered

Jesus' call. How do we respond? An eminent Buddhist once said." Once there is seeing there must be acting; otherwise what is the use of seeing?" Humanity is the answer to inhumanity. On the second Sunday in February we went to join in the service of our fellow Methodists in Kensworth. The third Sunday saw our own Minister, Rev Nigel Bibbings presiding with great care over our worship. In his sermon he tackled the difficult issue of anxiety. We often worry when we shouldn't, especially as worry is unproductive and, indeed, displays a lack of trust in God. We will never eradicate all our concerns but we need to keep them in check and by asking for God's help with our problems, reach a state of peace. Our final Sunday in February was a communion service under the able guidance of Roger Owers. The full significance is not clear even today but in all Christian lives there are moments of glorious and meaningful insight, which we can recognise and treasure, which leave a deep memory and which are fundamental to an understanding of God.

Dick Turpin Visits Northall - A Chostly Tale

Wikipedia states: Richard Turpin (c.1705 – 1739) was an English highwayman whose exploits were romanticised following his execution in York for horse theft. Turpin may have followed his father's trade as a butcher early in his life but, by the early 1730s, he had joined a gang of deer thieves and later, became a poacher, burglar, horse thief and killer. Turpin's involvement in the crime with which he is most closely associated, highway robbery, followed the arrest of the other members of his gang in 1735. He then disappeared from public view, only to resurface in 1737 with two new accomplices, one of whom Turpin may have accidentally shot and killed. Turpin fled from the scene and shortly afterwards killed a man who attempted his capture.

Later that year, he moved to Yorkshire and assumed the alias of John Palmer. While he was staying at an inn, local magistrates became suspicious of "Palmer" and made enquiries as to how he funded his lifestyle. Suspected of being a horse thief, "Palmer" was imprisoned in York Castle, to be tried at the next assizes. Turpin's true identity was revealed by a letter he wrote to his brother-in-law from his prison cell, which fell into the hands of the authorities. On 22 March 1739, Turpin was found guilty on two charges of horse theft and sentenced to death; he was hanged at Knavesmire on 7 April 1739.

Turpin became the subject of legend after his execution, romanticised as dashing and heroic in English ballads and popular theatre of the 18th and 19th centuries and in film and television of the 20th century.

It is local legend that Dick Turpin used an attic room of Butler's Manor in Northall which commanded a view of laden stage coaches passing Ivinghoe Beacon. He would then ride cross country to hold up the coach at the old road at Dunstable. On dark nights it is said that the ghost of Dick Turpin rides the road leading from St Mary's Chuch, Edlesborough towards the Tring Road.

Compositing

The benefits of composting your garden and kitchen waste are two-fold. You're reducing the amount of waste collected by your council and providing a habitat for a range of minibeasts. The community of minibeasts who live among the waste help the decaying process, and in turn, these beasts are a delicious food source for hedgehogs and other animals.

Using your own compost will increase the organic content in your soil. Think of your home-made compost as a soil improver — meaning you should mix it well with your existing soil or bought compost. This will boost fertility and help plants to build up resistance to disease and insect attack, thus reducing the need to use chemical controls. Using your compost will also improve the structure and health of your soil, increasing its water retention and nutrient content. Healthy soil feeds the micro organisms that are responsible for digesting the organic matter in the first place, as well as keeping the worms happy!

How to get started

All you need for a successful compost heap is waste, air and water! A simple heap covered with old carpet or plastic is just as effective as a 'bin'. The only advantage of a container is they look tidier and can be easier to manage. Try to pick a shady spot to keep things moist, and water any dry ingredients you may be adding.

What to put in your compost:

- Grass cuttings and dead leaves.
- Fruit and vegetable scraps and peel.
- Plain cardboard (not the glossy cereal box kind).
- Old cut flowers and bedding plants.
- Prunings and dead plants.
- Coffee grounds.

- Tea bags (check your teabags don't contain **plastic** first!).
- Pet droppings from any healthy vegeating pets, including gerbils, rabbits, hamsters and birds, along with any bedding made from natural material or newspaper.
- Eggshells these help to keep the heap from smelling.
- Newspapers shredded paper can help to soak up excess moisture in a heap.

Top tips for composting:

- Ensure you have a good mix of items. If you have large amounts of compostable items to dispose of, such as hedge trimmings or bags of cut grass, it is worth using your garden waste bin (if you have one) or contacting your council to see if they have a municipal composting scheme.
- Composting works best if you add a fair quantity of material at a time, so it is best to save up your kitchen scraps and add them to the heap along with some prunings or old bedding plants.
- It is important to mix the contents of the heap every now and again to aerate it wait at least three months to turn the heap with a gardening fork.
- Your compost is ready to use when it becomes dark and crumbly.

Do not compost:

Cooked food, coal and coke ash, meat and fish, bones, cat litter, dog poo, disposable nappies or human poo, glossy paper, weeds, woody stems, or diseased plants.

Remember! Be careful when you turn or fork your compost, especially in winter, as there may be animals hiding or hibernating in there – everything from smooth newts to hedgehogs!



Down the Lane

March is here and I have cowslips flowering in the garden! Perhaps they are a domesticated variety as not even the leaves of the ones in rough grass have appeared yet. Where I grew up there was a meadow with a stream running through it so it was left as pasture and was full of flowers in the spring; ladies smock, early purple orchids, cowslips, meadow sweet, irises by the water and bluebells, foxgloves and primroses under the trees. I'm sure that it's still in the same state, a rarity these days. Seeing cowslips always reminds me of the field.

Many of my perennials die back completely in winter. Now that the soil is warming up, they are sprouting again. Some will need splitting as new growth is usually on the outside of the plant and the middle dies leaving a bare patch, very noticeable with irises. Paeonies are showing their red shoots. I soon learnt that they need staking early as the flowers are always top heavy and would otherwise disappear under the foliage! I have some scented ones which are lovely when cut and displayed in the house.

Last month I visited Houghton Hall Park in Houghton Regis. It covers about 40 acres, mainly parkland with trees but has a glorious walled garden for fruit and vegetables. Most of the gardening is carried out by volunteers organized by a member of staff. There are fruit trees trained against the walls, a cutting garden for flowers and raised beds, made from oak sleepers, for growing an amazing variety of vegetables. If you are interested in growing fruit and vegetables, it's well worth a visit. I took a picture of the wildlife pond in the

garden – an important feature for attracting predators and pollinators.

The hellebores (known as Christmas Roses though they don't flower until January) in the garden, are looking splendid at present and, when the weather is warm enough, are attracting bees. When the flowers are finished new foliage grows and gives good ground cover for the rest of the year. I have lots of foxglove seedlings in the garden so I will move some to grow up through the hellebores.

The birds are singing and building their nests. I was watching a long-tailed tit through the kitchen window. It had a feather in its beak which flew away. The bird managed to catch the feather only to lose it again and re-catch it and dive into a shrub where, I presume it's building a nest.

The month started dry, mild and a little cloudy at times. It rained from the 4th to the 6th, followed by a dry spell and then three days of rain from the 13th.


As Storm Dudley moved in from the west, winds started to increase and the temperature rose to 14.1°c. Strangely, that night the temperature only fell to 8.3°c – unusual for February. On the 18th, Storm Eunice blew in with some force bringing high winds all day, which peaked at 55mph. I was sitting at my computer at that time, watching the weather station dials changing all the while. The 19th and 20th were rainy days followed by high pressure bringing calmer weather and colder mornings. February was a warmer month than average the temperature only dropped below zero for 3½ hours the whole month. We had much more rain than last month with 84mm, which is 138% of the February average.

Easter Nest Cake

Ingredients

For the chocolate sponges 200ml vegetable oil, plus extra for the tin 250g plain flour 6 tbsp cocoa powder 2 tsp baking powder 1 tsp bicarbonate of soda 280g soft light brown sugar 250ml buttermilk 2 tsp vanilla extract 3 large eggs For the nest 200g marshmallows 100g butter, chopped into chunks 2 tbsp cocoa powder 75g salted pretzels, crushed 4 shredded wheat biscuits, crushed chocolate eggs, to decorate For the icing 150g slightly salted butter, softened 2 tbsp cocoa powder 300g icing sugar

4 tbsp milk Method STEP 1

Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Oil and line two 20cm round cake tins. Add the flour, cocoa powder, baking powder, bicarb, sugar and a large pinch of salt to a bowl. Mix with a whisk, squeezing any large lumps of sugar through your fingers, until you have a fine, sandy mix.

STEP 2

Whisk the oil with the buttermilk in a jug. Stir in the vanilla and eggs, then pour the wet ingredients into the dry and mix until there are no more streaks of flour. Divide the mixture between the tins and bake for 25 mins. Test the cakes by inserting a skewer into the centre - if there is any wet mixture on the skewer, return the cakes to the oven for 5 mins more, then check again. Leave the cakes to cool in the tins for 15 mins, then transfer to wire racks to cool fully.

STEP 3

Next, make the nest. Clean one tin and line it with some oiled baking parchment. Put the marshmallows and butter in a heatproof bowl and microwave on high for 1 min, stirring halfway through (or heat gently in a pan on the hob). Continue microwaving in 20-second blasts until you get a runny mixture. Stir in the cocoa, pretzels and shredded wheat until well combined. Tip the mixture into your lined tin and use the back of your spoon to create a nest shape. Leave to cool at room temperature for a few hrs, or chill in the fridge if you need it to set faster.

STEP 4

To make the icing, beat the butter, cocoa, icing sugar and milk together until smooth, adding a splash more milk if the mixture is too stiff. Assemble the cake by stacking the sponges with icing in between, topping with more icing and the nest. Fill your nest with as many chocolate eggs as it will hold, then serve. It may be easier to cut the cake if you remove the nest – you can then chop the nest into chunks and serve alongside the cake.

When this issue will be sent out we will just have celebrated the greatest event of all time, 'The death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ.!'
